PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

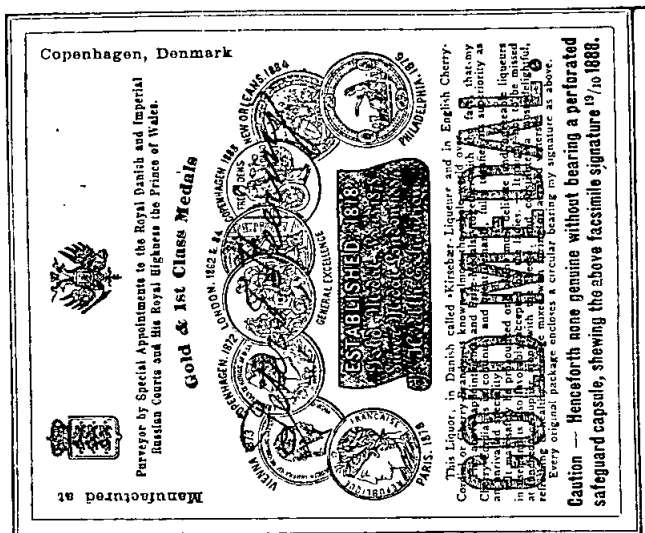

WAIMAKARIRI RIVER.—ERECTION OF TEMPORARY FLAGSTAFF ON SOUTH SPIT.

THE Waimakariri Harbor Board has given notice that, owing to changes in the Waimakariri River at its mouth, a temporary flag-staff has been erected on the South Spit, on which bar signals will be shown for the guidance of vessels entering and leaving the river. This flag-staff is about 40 feet high, and stands about

three-quarters of a mile to the eastward of the permanent signal staff. It is near the present bar, and will be shifted as may be necessary for safe navigation.

FOG-SIGNAL, PENCARROW HEAD, ENTRANCE TO WELLINGTON HARBOR.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 4 of 1898, issued by this department on the 12th January last, it is hereby notified that on and after Monday, the 11th July, 1898, the following fog-signals will be sounded near Pencarrow Head Light-house. The signals consist of explosions of cotton-powder charges at intervals of fifteen minutes, and will be made when the land is likely to be obscured at a distance of about three miles from seaward by either fog, mist, falling snow, or continuous rain.

It is anticipated that these sound-signals will be heard at any distance under ten miles, varying according to the state of the atmosphere and the force and direction of the wind.

Special warnings to mariners concerning fog-signals, published by the Board of Trade, are as follow:—

Sound is conveyed in a very capricious way through the atmosphere. Apart from wind, large areas of silence have been found in different directions and different distances from the signals, in some instances even when in close proximity to the sound-signal.

The mariner should not assume—

1. That he is out of ordinary hearing distance because he fails to hear the sound.
2. That because he hears a fog-signal faintly that he is at a great distance from it.
3. That he is near it because he hears the sound plainly.
4. That the distance from and the intensity of the sound on any one occasion is a guide to him for any future occasion.
5. That the fog-signal has ceased sounding because he does not hear it even when in close proximity.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1898.

THE births of 51 boys and 39 girls, or in all of 90 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June. Of these, 33 occurred in Ballarat East, 45 in Ballarat West, 10 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts. In the previous month the births numbered 108, viz., 61 of boys and 47 of girls.

The deaths registered in June numbered 73, viz., 41 of males and 32 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 17. In May the recorded deaths numbered 85; in June, 1897, they numbered 53; in June, 1896, they numbered 70; in June, 1895, they numbered 73; in June, 1894, they numbered 67; in June, 1893, they numbered 67; in June, 1892, they numbered 72; in June, 1891, they numbered 57; in June, 1890, they numbered 65; in June, 1889, they numbered 50; and in June, 1888, they numbered 54.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 60 per cent.; females, 40 per cent.; under five years, 18 per cent.; over five years, 82 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 55 and 45 per cent.; under and over five years, 14 and 86 per cent. respectively.

Thirty deaths, or 41 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 16; Benevolent Asylum, 12; Lunatic Asylum, 2.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

On the other hand, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system fell from 9 to 6. Only one case of measles occurred previously during the current year.

*Health Act 1890.***BOROUGH OF FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON.**

A By-law (No. 8) of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington made under the *Health Act 1890*, for regulating the mode of carriage and precautions to be observed in carrying meat.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington, being the Municipality of the said Borough, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of efficiently enforcing the provisions of the said Act within their jurisdiction, do order as follows, that is to say:—

1st. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2nd. From and after the date of this by-law coming into operation no person shall carry or cause to be carried to or from any abattoirs or butchers' shops or premises, or through or along any street of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington, in any cart, carriage, waggon, or other vehicle any meat or carcass of meat, unless such cart, carriage, waggon, or other vehicle be clean, and be so constructed that the rays of the sun or rain or dust shall not fall on or reach such meat or carcass of meat, and so that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof: nor shall any person bring or cause to be brought, or carry or cause to be carried, to or from any abattoirs or butchers' shops or premises through or along any street of the said borough, in any cart, carriage, waggon, or other vehicle, any butchers' meat or carcass of meat the covering or screen for protection whereof from sun, rain, or dust shall be in a foul or uncleanly state.

3rd. From and after the date of this by-law coming into operation no person shall sit, lie, or stand on any meat or carcass of meat while being so carried.

4th. Any person guilty of any breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or less than Five shillings.

*Health Act 1890.***BOROUGH OF CRESWICK.**

By-law No. 36 under the *Health Act 1890*.

A By-law of the Borough of Creswick, made under the provisions of Sections 31, 32, 33, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 36, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet-pans, house and yard refuse, and other matters named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Creswick make the following By-law:—

1. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Creswick.

3. The council may, upon the recommendation of the health officer and the inspector of nuisances, exempt any premises within the Borough of Creswick from the operation of this by-law.

4. That every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause all house or yard refuse to be rendered inoffensive until the same shall be dealt with by the borough council, or that every such occupier and person shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.

5. That as frequently as the borough council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles be removed, and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor.

6. That every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in streets or lanes, and they shall be removed and replaced by the scavengers employed by the borough council from time to time as often as occasion shall require.

7. That every such occupier or person shall be responsible for the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

8. That the ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

9. That instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the borough council with a double-pan service, and that such pans shall be and remain the property of the borough council.

10. That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the borough council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the council may direct, in a suitable cart, and that the council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the said pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

11. That a pan cleansed by super-heated steam, or some other equally efficient means approved by the borough council, be left in place of the one removed.

12. Every closet within the municipality shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings or flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of any earth or some deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

13. That the night-soil removed be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desicator, or incinerator provided by the borough council, or be trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the borough council.

14. The occupier of any land in the Borough of Creswick on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yards, cattle-shed, or pig-stye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect to cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by order of the borough council at the expense of such occupier.

15. That no such occupier or person shall use a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

16. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, cinders, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil: and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

17. Every such occupier or person shall not employ any other persons save those authorized by the borough council for the removal of night-soil or other refuse, and no other person shall remove any night-soil or other refuse, except in cases of exemption.

18. That stringent supervision shall be exercised by the borough council over all premises, which may be inspected by the borough council or its officers from time to time, or by any person duly authorized by the council.

19. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

20. Sections 3, 4, 5, 11, 12, 13, 14, 16 of By-law No. 12 are hereby repealed.

*Health Act 1890.***SHIRE OF GORDON.****BY-LAW No. 5.**

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Gordon, made under the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Gordon, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Gordon, hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall apply to the townships of Boort and Pyramid Hill, in the Shire of Gordon. The township of Boort shall mean the area comprised within a radius of forty chains (40 chains) from the Boort Post and Telegraph Office. The township of Pyramid Hill shall mean the area comprised within a radius of forty chains (40 chains) from the Pyramid Hill Post and Telegraph Office.

2. Each and every permit granted by the council to any person whosoever to move, use, or deposit night-soil upon land shall be and is hereby cancelled and withdrawn.

3. On and after the day of publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, the ordinary system in use up to that date of removal of night-soil from privy-pans within the said townships

of Boort and Pyramid Hill shall be abolished, and from and after the said date of publication in the *Government Gazette* of this by-law every closet shall be furnished with a double pan service.

4. No person, unless duly authorized and licensed in this behalf by the Council of the Shire of Gordon, shall be employed to remove or empty any privy-pan used in or belonging to any closet or privy within the townships of Boort and Pyramid Hill.

5. The council shall provide double pans with tight-fitting lids, and no other pans than those so provided shall be used.

6. Once in each week the person contracted with by the council shall remove the pans in use and leave thoroughly cleansed ones in their places.

7. No occupier of any house or premises shall permit any closet door or trap to abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding sixteen feet in width.

8. The Council of the Shire of Gordon shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

9. If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF DONALD.

BY-LAW NO. 1, AS TO THE PREVENTION OF ANY NUISANCE OR THE KEEPING OF ANY ANIMAL OR THING OF ANY KIND, SO AS TO BE A NUISANCE OR INJURIOUS TO HEALTH, AND THE PREVENTION OF THE BURIAL OF NIGHT-SOIL WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF ANY TOWNSHIP IN THE SHIRE OF DONALD.

THE Council of the Shire of Donald, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, doth hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 1 of the said Council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire, except clause 12, which shall apply to and have operation within the townships of Donald, Watchem, and Corack East, situated in the said Shire.

4. All occupiers of houses or premises shall provide boxes or other receptacles for the temporary deposit of all house refuse, and no such refuse shall be swept, deposited, or emptied into any street drain or gutter running into any open channel of any street.

5. The occupier of any premises shall, within 24 hours from the service of notice by an inspector, remove all refuse so temporarily deposited as aforesaid, as also any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, and soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, shed, or place whatsoever, to the depot provided by the said Council for that purpose; and, in case of the occupier neglecting to comply with such notice, the Council may itself carry out such removal at the expense of the occupier.

6. All earth-closets, privies, cesspools, and places for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter shall be emptied, cleansed, and disinfected at such times so that the same shall always be clean, and in no way a nuisance or injurious to health. Provided that the contents of any cesspool, closet, privy, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and provided also that such contents shall not be so removed until such have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect same.

7. All buildings or structures or places used for keeping or holding pigs shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any such buildings or structures.

8. All buildings or structures or places used for keeping or holding pigs shall be regularly swept and kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the

Officer of Health or Inspector of Nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. No pigs shall be kept in any sheds, buildings, or milking yards, in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered, by any cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or allowed to wander in any public thoroughfare or place; so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to public health.

10. No building or structure or places used for keeping or holding pigs shall be allowed to be erected closer to any inhabited premises than 50 feet.

11. If any occupier or owner neglect or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law by neglecting or failing to remove any nuisance as hereinbefore stated, such nuisance may be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier or owner.

12. All night-soil, offal, blood, or any other refuse shall be conveyed to the manure depot in the night-cart provided by the Council, or in a cart approved by the Council; and no night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse shall be allowed to be buried within the boundaries of any township, but only in the manure depot provided.

13. In the interpretation of this By-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law or any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or less than Five shillings; or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; and every inspector of the Council shall and is hereby empowered to take proceedings against any person offending against any by-law of the Council, as provided by section 37 of the *Health Act 1890*.

BY-LAW NO. 2.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c., and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Council in and for the Shire of Berwick, in the Colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling the said council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 2 of the said council, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the Shire of Berwick.

3. The occupier of every house and premises within the said Shire of Berwick shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

4. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 3 cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said Shire of Berwick shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of 1 foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed

therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

7. No person shall empty any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

8. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of same.

9. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

10. The occupier of any premises within the said shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be any abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if any such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

11. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

12. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding fifteen feet in width.

13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or of Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such penalty not being less than Five shillings to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Water Act 1890.

WYCHEPROOF WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulations:—

No. 1.

Regulation for determining rates to be paid for supply of water for domestic and other use, for preventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connexion with water supply for the Urban District situated within the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust District, and which Urban District was proclaimed and defined on the 29th April, 1898.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers, or for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house-walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure for other than domestic use, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- (a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- (b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- (c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- (d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- (e) Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
- (f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.
- (g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case (except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust) where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure. For all water used in excess of such minimum quantity, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by meter for manufacturing or other purposes otherwise than provided in clauses 2 and 3 hereof, shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year.

5. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

6. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated within the Urban District, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within the Urban District to have water from any public service-pipe in the Urban District at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.

9. The Trust may direct that a meter or meters be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

10. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and no such pipe shall exceed in any case that known as a 1-in. pipe; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

11. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

12. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

13. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

14. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

15. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

17. Any person whether licensed or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

18. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and, if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

20. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

21. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of the Regulations, or fail to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

22. The water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

23. In the construction of these Regulations, the word "Trust" shall mean the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing Regulation No. 1 was made by the Commissioners of the Wycheproof Water Works Trust this 5th day of May, 1898.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 3 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber, which, at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground, is of less diameter than twenty-four inches, on or from the Crown lands hereinafter defined, viz.:—

Not more than one allotment will be granted to any one person, and no person who already holds 640 acres of mallee lands will

be eligible to select, but holders of less than 640 acres will be entitled to apply for the difference between 640 acres and the area held.

Married women are not eligible to select.

The Crown reserves to itself the right to withdraw any area which may be required for timber, water supply, or any other purposes, and when subdividing the area will make such reservations as may be deemed necessary for future requirements and the protection of existing tanks or other improvements.

The rent payable under agricultural allotment licence is 1s. per acre per annum, and at the end of six years, if conditions with regard to residence, cultivation, improvements, and all other usual conditions have been complied with, a lease for fourteen years will be granted at the same rental, and a Crown grant will issue when such payments amount to £1 per acre, or, if desired, on the expiry of the licence a Crown grant will be issued on payment of 14s. per acre.

Rent payable under perpetual lease will not exceed 2d. per acre per annum until 1903, after which, at every successive period of ten years, the rent is calculated at 2 per cent. on the unimproved value of the land.

The survey fees must be paid within seven days after an allotment has been granted.

The price payable for the resumption of the land is One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) per acre, as representing the value of the outgoing tenant's interest; this amount must be paid by the applicant either in cash within one month from the date of allotment or by half-yearly instalments, of such sums extending over the whole or any part of the licence, or over so many years of the perpetual lease not exceeding six (6), as the Board of Land and Works may determine, with interest at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum added.

Fencing, water, or other improvements on the allotments granted must be paid for in like manner.

Lessees must either reside on or within 5 miles of their land or else cultivate up to one-half of the area of their allotment before the end of the fourth year.

SECT. 6. The council may employ any person or persons to destroy sparrows or minnows, and may make regulations for the effective destruction of such birds.
