ARREST OF SEAMEN DESERTERS IN THE CASE OF JAPAN.

The Merchant Shipping Act 1894, Section 238.

With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 1st March last, enclosing copies of a Provisional Order of the Queen in Council, applying section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, respecting the arrest of seamen deserters in

Present :

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it is provided that, where it appears to Her Majesty that due facilities are, or will be, given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant-ships in that country, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order;

And whereas it appears to Her Majesty that due facilities are given by the Government of Japan for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant-ships in that country;

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, on the 3rd day of February, 1898, to pass a Provisional Order applying section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, in the case of Japan;

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of *The Rules Publication Act 1893* have been complied with;

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that the said section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894* shall apply in the case of Japan.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 1,048 children, viz., 551 boys and 497 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. The number was, it will be observed, 93 lower than in June, 1897, and much lower than that recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 311 below the average of the previous ten years, or 318 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 657, viz., 360 of males and 297 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 391, or by 60 per cent., as against 89 per cent. in 1897 and 120 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 55 in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and more numerous than in the month of June for any of the previous ten years, except 1889; they were also 40 above the average of June during the same period, or 37 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.80 and of deaths registered 17.43 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month of the same year of 30.77 and 16.26 respectively, and during the last ten years of 36.53 and 16.64 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 67.3° on the 1st, and the lowest was 32.3° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (49.7°), was the same as in June, 1896, but lower than in any other corresponding month in the previous two years, and 1.5° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.1°) took place on the 9th, and the least range (2.8°) on the 3rd. The mean daily range was 12.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.471 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.384 inches on the 16th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.033 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on twelve days, the amount being 1.57 inches, which was lower than in the corresponding month in any of the previous ten years, with two exceptions, and was half-an-inch below the average of the same ten years.

Fog occurred on one day during the month. Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 27 per cent. to that mortality, as against 25 per cent. in June, 1897; 25 per cent. in June, 1896; 21 per cent. in June, 1895; 28 per cent. in June, 1894; 35 per cent. in June, 1893; and 27 per cent. in June, 1892.

Eighty-one persons whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a bookbinder, aged 75, died of cancer; a carpenter, aged 75, of meningitis; a female, aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; a compositor and a freeman, each aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of renal disease; a labourer, aged 76, of cancer; an actress and a female, both aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a seaman, aged 76, of a carbuncle; seven

females, each aged 77, of cancer, diabetes, cerebral hæmorrhage, syncope, asthma, pneumonia, and hæmatemesis respectively; an ex-civil servant, aged 77, of heart disease; a pensioner and a female, both aged 77, of enteritis; five females, each 78, of phthisis, apoplexy, heart disease, bronchitis, and pneumonia respectively; a bricklayer, aged 78, of syncope; a male, of no occupation, aged 78, of heart disease; a farmer, aged 78, of necrosis; a clergyman, aged 79, of influenza; four females, each aged 79, of apoplexy, fatty degeneration of the heart, heart disease, and œdema of lungs respectively; a printer, aged 80, of paralysis; a female, aged 80, of heart disease; and two of the same age of bronchitis; a miner, aged 80, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 80, of nephritis; a gardener, aged 81, of apoplexy; a female, aged 81, of hemiplegia; a plasterer, and a female, each aged 81, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 81, of disease of the lungs; a female, aged 82, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 82, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a female, aged 83, of tumor of the liver; two females, each aged 85, of syncope and bronchitis respectively; a picture-dealer and a female, each aged 85, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 86, of diabetes; a sawyer, aged 86, of valvular disease of the heart; two females, each aged 88, of heart disease; and one of the same age, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 88, of disease of the prostate gland; a labourer, aged 89, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 93, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 95, of congestion of the lungs; two gentlemen, and a female, each aged 77, a gentleman, and three females, each aged 78, a female, aged 80, a carpenter, a male of no occupation, and a female, each aged 81, a female, aged 82, a carrier, aged 84, a female, aged 86, a gentleman, a seaman, and a female, each aged 87, an architect, aged 88, and a brickmaker and a female, each aged 91, of old age.

Twenty-one of the deaths recorded during the month were from external causes, of which 15 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A plater, aged 54, was passed over by a railway train; two females, aged 4 and 37 respectively, by tram-cars; and a female, aged 8, by a cab; a carpenter, aged 45, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a building; a bandmaster, aged 28, of rupture of the urethra, and a female, aged 74, of injury to the arm, the result of falls in both cases; a boy, aged 8, of traumatic tetanus; a male child, aged 9 months, of burns; an auctioneer, aged 50, of opium poisoning; a labourer, aged 33, was drowned by falling into the River Yarra; a female, aged 48, and a slaughterman, aged 65, were found drowned, the former in the River Yarra and the latter in the Saltwater River; a labourer, aged 16, was suffocated by being crushed in a lift; and a male child, aged 2 months, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born female infants, who were suffocated; and a female, aged 21, who died of septic peritonitis, caused by an illegal operation, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a blacksmith, aged 44, who shot himself; a fishmonger, aged 34, who cut his throat; and a carpenter, aged 22, who poisoned himself.

One hundred and fifty-one deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 52 in the Melbourne, 12 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 7 in the Women's, 9 in the Children's, 14 in the Homeopathic, and 8 in the Austin Hospitals; 12 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 175, of which 106, or 61 per cent., were of males, and 69, or 39 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 86 were under one year of age, 49 were between one and two, 19 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 14 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 482. Of these, 254, or 53 per cent., were males, and 228, or 47 per cent., were females; 29 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 21 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 55 were between sixty-five and seventy, 44 were between seventy and seventy-five, 41 were between seventy-five and eighty, 20 were between eighty and eighty-five, 16 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-five.

In June, 1898, as compared with June, 1897, deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 34, those from constitutional diseases by 33, and those from developmental diseases by 3; but deaths from violence were fewer by 8, and those from ill-defined causes by 7; whereas in other cases the numbers were the same in both months. Under the zymotic class, deaths from measles show an increase of 41, from venereal diseases of 7, and from septic diseases of 3; but those from diphtheria fell off by 16. Under the constitutional class, an increase of 16 was due to phthisis, 8 each to cancer and diabetes, and 5 to scrofula, &c. Under the developmental class, although deaths from congenital malformations fell off by 6, those from old age increased by 10. Under the local class, there was a decrease of 11 in the deaths from diseases of the circulatory system, and of 10 in those from enteritis; but an increase of 16 in those from diseases of the nervous system; although, on the whole, the decreases in some sub-classes were counterbalanced by the increases in others.

The present epidemic of measles, which culminated in April with 99 deaths, appears to be abating—the deaths having fallen to 80 in May, and to 41 in June. Since its first outbreak, in December last, this epidemic has carried off 341 persons—principally children. During the last 25 years there have been six conspicuous epidemics of measles, of which the most fatal was the epidemic of 1874-5, which caused 733 deaths; the next that of 1893, which caused 386 deaths; and the next that now prevalent. Such epidemics have recurred at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 25 years:—

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1897, and the first six months of 1898, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever in the first five months, and from diphtheria in the second and third months, of 1898 was by far the highest recorded since 1890.

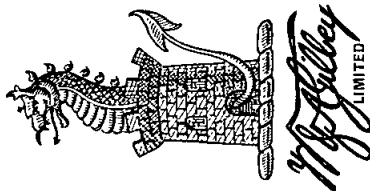

RIGHTS AND POWERS OF THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST AND THE WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST IN REGARD TO THE DIVISION AND DIVERSION OF WATER FROM THE WIMMERA RIVER AND YARRIAMIAC CREEK.

In the proportion of the areas of territory of the said Trusts north of the Wimmera River.

And His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby appoint the respective engineers of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust and the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the time being to conjointly determine the proportions of the waters to be divided as herein provided, and to manage and control all works for the diversion of the proportionate quantities so determined.

And it is hereby further provided that in case of any disagreement arising between such engineers as to determining the proportionate quantity to be divided or as to the diversion of the same, in any case whatsoever, an appeal by either engineer may be made to the Minister of Water Supply, whose decision in writing shall be final on the matter at issue.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the date hereof, and remain in force until the 31st day of December, 1898, unless repealed or amended meanwhile.

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan to such Waterworks Trust, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands within the municipal district or districts of the council or councils making the application, and within which such Trust shall have authority to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (d) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is further enacted by section 25 of the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid that whenever a Waterworks District is either wholly or, with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth by this Order approve of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Shire of Birchip, for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust, for the purpose of taking over from the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust the whole of the waterworks constructed by that body within the Shire of Birchip, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

It shall be lawful for any hairdresser and barber's shop in the Township of Dandenong, within the municipal district of the Shire of Dandenong, to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until half-past Eight o'clock and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until half-past Ten o'clock on obtaining a licence to keep open during such hours from the Chief Inspector of Factories.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

A by-law of the Shire of Violet Town, made under section 191 of the Local Government Act 1890, and numbered four, for suppressing nuisances caused by obstructions, &c., to streets by cattle, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1890, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Violet Town order as follows:—

That the following provisions contained in subdivision 9 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act be and the same are hereby adopted in and for and declared applicable as By-law Number 4 (four):—

Section 41. If any cattle are found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "Owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of 24 hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

Section 42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.
