VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1898.

THE births of 44 boys and 49 girls, or in all of 93 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of July. Of these, 44 occurred in Ballarat East, 42 in Ballarat West, and 7 in Sebastopol; included were 2 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 90, viz., 51 of boys and 39 of girls.

The deaths registered in July numbered 81, viz., 52 of males and 29 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 12. In June the recorded deaths numbered 73; in July, 1897, they numbered 46; in July, 1896, they numbered 60; in July, 1895, they numbered 75; in July, 1894, they numbered 62; in July, 1893, they numbered 112; in July, 1892, they numbered 43; in July, 1891, they numbered 59; in July, 1890, they numbered 57; in July, 1889, they numbered 63; and in July, 1888, they numbered 59.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban

Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The high mortality of the month was partly due to the prevalence of measles, which caused 11 deaths as against 5 in the preceding month, and partly to the high mortality from diseases of the respiratory system.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from measles rose from nil to 11; those from diphtheria from 1 to 3; those from septic diseases from nil to 2; those from dietic diseases from nil to 2; those from diseases of the nervous system from 4 to 9; and those from diseases of the respiratory system from 9 to 20.

The births of 1,012 children, viz., 528 boys and 484 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. The number was, it will be observed, 72 lower than in July, 1897, about the same as in July, 1896, slightly lower than in July, 1895 and 1894, but much lower than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 273 below the average of the previous ten years, or 279 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 630, viz., 320 of males and 310 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 382, or by 61 per cent., as against 105 per cent. in 1897 and 100 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 99—nearly one-fifth—in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and more numerous than those recorded in the month of July for any of the years since 1890, with the exception of 1893; they were 14 below the average of July during the same period, or 17 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.98 and of deaths registered 16.17 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 28.29 and 13.84 respectively, and during the last ten years of 33.39 and 16.77 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 64.0° on the 14th, and the lowest was 35.0° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (48.6°), was one-third of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.0°) took place on the 2nd, and the least range (0.9°) on the 15th. The mean daily range was 12.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.337 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.229 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.940 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on twelve days, the amount being 1.90 inches, which was about half-an-inch lower than in July, 1897, and two-thirds of an inch below the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on one day during the month.

Males contributed 51 per cent., and females 49 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 25 per cent. to that mortality, as against 20 per cent. in July, 1897; 22 per cent. in July, 1896; 27 per cent. in July, 1895; 27 per cent. in July, 1894; 50 per cent. in July, 1893; and 29 per cent. in July, 1892.

Sixty-six persons—as against fifty-eight in July, 1897—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a tailor, aged 75, died of diabetes; two females, each aged 75, of apoplexy and pericarditis respectively; a gate-keeper, aged 75, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 75, of nephritis; a female, aged 76, of influenza; a miner

and a female, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a gardener, a storekeeper, a laundress, and a female, all aged 76, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 77, of cancer; two females, each aged 77, of insanity and heart disease respectively; two females, both aged 77, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 77, of pneumonia and cirrhosis of the liver respectively; a gentleman, aged 78, of cancer; a miner, aged 78, of dilatation of the heart; a gentleman and a labourer, both aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 78, of cystitis; a female, aged 79, of influenza; a dairyman and a female, both aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 81, of bedsores; another, aged 82, of influenza; a teacher, aged 82, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of dropsy; two females, each aged 83, of paralysis and endocarditis respectively; a gardener, aged 83, of nephritis; a gentleman, aged 83, of cystitis; a female, aged 84, and a male of no occupation, aged 85, of bronchitis; a land-owner, aged 88, of influenza; a female, aged 88, of apoplexy; a bootmaker, aged 88, of bronchitis; three females, each aged 89, of paraplegia, bronchitis, and enteritis respectively; a gentleman, aged 91, of cancer; a carpenter, aged 92, of asthma; a female, aged 93, and a blacksmith, aged 99, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 75, three females, aged 76, 77, and 78 respectively, a bricklayer, aged 79, a carpenter and an ex-pilot, each aged 80, three females, aged 82, 84, and 85 respectively, a carpenter, aged 87, and six females, aged 89, 90, 90, 91, and 97 respectively, of old age.

Thirteen of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with as many as 33 in July, 1897—were from external causes, all being set down to accident. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A platelayer, aged 33, was passed over by a railway train; a presser, aged 73, by a vehicle; a female, aged 51, and a grocer, aged 64, died of injuries, the result of being thrown from vehicles; a storeman, aged 32, and a labourer, aged 55, of injuries, caused by an explosion of bursters; a labourer, aged 57, of fracture of the thigh, and a female, aged 38, of meningitis from a scalp wound, consequent on falls in both cases; a clerk, aged 38, of rupture of the urethra, no evidence to show how caused; a clerk, aged 33, was "found drowned" in the River Yarra; a female child, aged 1 year, was suffocated whilst attempting to swallow a piece of orange; a female infant, aged 4 months, was overlain; and a new-born female infant died of umbilical hemorrhage.

One hundred and forty-five deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 51 in the Melbourne, 14 in the Alfred, 2 in St. Vincent's, 2 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 8 in the Homeopathic, and 14 in the Austin Hospitals; 8 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 17 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 155, of which 81, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 74, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 101 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five. As compared with the corresponding month of the previous years, deaths of children under five years increased by 48, of which 25 were under one year and 18 between one and two years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 475. Of these, 239, or 50 per cent., were males, and 236, or 50 per cent., were females; 35 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty and sixty-five, 45 were between sixty-five and seventy, 53 were between seventy and seventy-five, 33 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were between eighty and eighty-five, 11 were between eighty-five and ninety, 6 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 2 were between ninety-five and one hundred.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, an increased mortality is noticeable under all classes of disease, except violence, under which there was a falling off of 20; deaths from zymotic diseases having increased by 26, those from constitutional diseases by 23, those from local diseases by 47, those from developmental diseases—chiefly by 1, and those from ill-defined causes by 2. Under the zymotic class, measles caused an increase from nil to 24, and influenza from 7 to 20; whereas septic diseases show a falling off from 12 (including 6 cases of puerperal fever) to 4. Under the constitutional class deaths from rheumatic fever, rheumatism, and gout increased from 5 to 11, cancer from 24 to 32, tubercular meningitis from 8 to 12, phthisis from 67 to 75, and scrofula, &c., from 5 to 8. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system rose from 53 to 64, from those of the respiratory system (chiefly bronchitis and pneumonia) from 87 to 128, and from those of the digestive system from 32 to 36; as against which, deaths from diseases of the urinary system fell from 31 to 25. Under violence, there was a conspicuous absence in the month under notice of cases of homicide and suicide, although 2 from the former, and 9 from the latter cause were recorded in July, 1897; whilst cases of accidental drowning fell off by 5, and other accidental deaths by 4.

The present epidemic of measles, which culminated in April with 99 deaths, is gradually abating—the deaths having fallen to 41 in June, and to 24 in July. Since its first outbreak, in December last, this epidemic has carried off 365 persons—principally children. During the last 25 years there have been six conspicuous epidemics of measles, of which the most fatal was the epidemic of 1874-5, which caused 733 deaths; the next that of 1893, which caused 386 deaths; and the next that now prevalent. Such epidemics have recurred at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 25 years:—

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1897, and the first seven months of 1898, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that no deaths from typhoid fever occurred in July, 1898, a circumstance without parallel in the corresponding month of any of the eight previous years, although in the first five months of this same year the mortality was by far the highest recorded since 1890:

EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40—20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A. B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

Levelling, &c.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

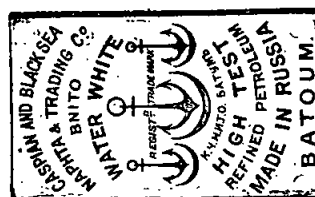

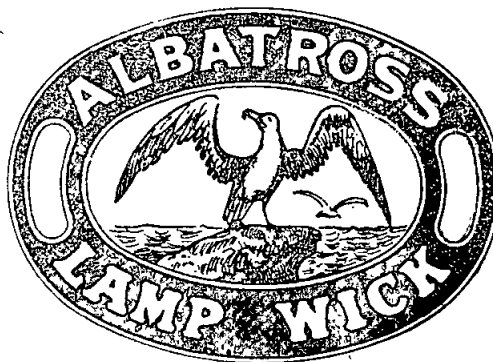

THE SHIRE OF BORUNG AND THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 373 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of its municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Borung is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire, that is to say, a sum of Four hundred and forty-seven pounds eighteen shillings and eightpence sterling (£447 18s. 8d.) for the purpose of paying interest on moneys borrowed by and liabilities transferred to the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust: His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council has therefore consented to the Municipal Council of the said Shire of Borung applying the said sum of Four hundred and forty-seven pounds eighteen shillings and eightpence sterling (£447 18s. 8d.) from the municipal fund of the said shire for the purpose aforesaid.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

THAT the Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supply by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 1st August, 1898.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, the annual minimum sum of One pound (£1) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), the sum of Two shillings in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of Two shillings in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to building, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, brickwork, and plastering.

The foregoing Regulation was hereby made by the Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust on the 25th July, 1898.

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON WATERWORKS TRUST.— DISTRICT INCREASED.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in any such Order (among other things)—

(a) Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally constituting such Waterworks Trust.

(b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the 19th December, 1892, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the extent and boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were in and by the said Order in Council, and by two subsequent Orders in Council bearing date respectively the 12th January, 1897, and 4th October, 1897, duly defined and limited: And whereas it is deemed necessary to repeal the two last-mentioned Orders: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order—

That the said Orders in Council bearing date respectively the 12th January, 1897, and the 4th October, 1897, as aforesaid, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby ordered that the district of the said Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust, as limited and defined by the Order in Council of the 19th December, 1892, aforesaid, shall be increased by the addition thereto of the land comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of subdivision A of allotment 60A in the parish of Currawa, distant three chains forty-eight links and one third from the north-western angle of said subdivision; thence by a line across three-chain road from Shepparton to Benalla N. 3° 32' W. to a point on the southern boundary of subdivision A of allotment 60; thence in a westerly direction by the southern boundaries of allotments 60 and 63 to the south-west angle of the latter; thence by a line across road to the south-east angle of allotment 73A; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 73A, 74A, a line across road to the south-east angle of allotment 75A, the southern boundaries of allotments 75A, 76, a line across road to the south-east angle of allotment 79B, and southern boundaries of allotments 79B, 79A, and 80, to a point in the latter distant one hundred and fifty links from the eastern bank of the Pine Lodge Channel; thence northerly and north-westerly by a

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* (No. 1141), it is among other things provided that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time make such Regulations under the said Part of the said Act as may be deemed expedient for, among other purposes, regulating and fixing the conditions upon which certain kinds of stock may be introduced into Victoria, and for the inspection of newly-introduced stock, and for regulating the introduction into Victoria of any fittings, and for the seizure, sale, or destruction of any such fittings landed without the written authority of an Inspector of Stock: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to make the Regulations following, fixing the conditions upon which certain kinds of stock, namely, Poultry, may be introduced into Victoria; and for the inspection of such newly-introduced stock, and for regulating the introduction of fittings, and for the seizure, sale, or destruction of any such fittings landed without the written authority of an Inspector of Stock: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in exercise of the powers conferred by the hereinbefore recited Act, and of all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1898.

2. In the construction of these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires it, the following words shall include the meanings respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

“Fittings” shall include any cage, pen, box, hamper, basket, or other receptacle at any time theretofore used for carrying or confining poultry.

“Inspector” shall include the Chief Inspector and any Inspector of Stock under the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*.

“Owner” shall include any carrier, forwarding or other agent, servant, or other person having for the time being the care, custody, or control of any poultry.

“Poultry” shall include any kind of living land or water bird ordinarily bred or reared in a domestic state.

3. No owner shall bring, introduce, or permit to come into Victoria any poultry or fittings, either by land or sea, except in accordance with the conditions prescribed by these Regulations.

4. No owner of poultry or fittings suffering from or infested with poultry ticks (otherwise argads, hereinafter referred to as “ticks”), or of poultry or fittings which have within six calendar months from the date of their proposed introduction suffered from or been infested with ticks, or which have been in contact with animals or birds suffering from or in contact with fittings or in places infested with ticks shall bring, introduce, or permit the same to come into Victoria.

5. No owner shall bring or introduce any poultry or fittings into Victoria except at some port or place from time to time appointed by the Governor in Council for that purpose, or, in default of such appointment, at some port or place for the time being appointed by the Governor in Council for the bringing or crossing into Victoria of other kinds of stock.

6. Any owner of poultry or fittings, the introduction of which is not prohibited, desiring to bring or introduce such poultry or fittings into Victoria shall give not less than 48 hours’ notice, in writing, of such his desire to the Inspector of Stock for the appointed port or place at which he desires such poultry to be brought in or introduced, giving particulars of the person whose property they are, of the place whence the poultry or fittings are being brought, and the route followed and mode of transport, and, in the case of poultry, of the kind or kinds, number or numbers, and sex of all poultry proposed to be introduced, and, in the case of fittings, of the kind and number. Every such notice may be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the first schedule hereto.

7. At or before the inspection by an inspector in accordance with any such notice, the owner shall furnish to such inspector a statutory declaration declaring that none of the poultry or fittings the subject of such notice are suffering from or infested with ticks, and that such poultry and fittings have not, within six calendar months from the date of such notice, suffered from or been infested with ticks, nor been in contact with animals or birds suffering from nor in contact with fittings nor in places infested with ticks. Every such declaration may be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the second schedule hereto.

8. At the time appointed for inspection in accordance with any notice as aforesaid, the owner shall produce, at a place to be appointed by the inspector, all poultry and fittings referred to therein to the inspector, and aid him (providing such assistants as the inspector may require) in fully and closely inspecting such poultry and fittings, giving such inspector every assistance in carrying out his duty.

9. After such inspection as aforesaid the owner shall, if so required by the inspector, disinfect all such poultry or fittings in or with some disinfectant to be approved by the inspector in his presence and to his satisfaction.

10. If the inspector is satisfied that the provisions of these Regulations have been complied with, and that such poultry or fittings are free from ticks, such inspector may give to the owner a permit authorizing the introduction of such poultry or fittings into Victoria at the place named therein; such permit may be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the third schedule hereto.

11. All fittings brought or introduced into Victoria in contravention of these Regulations may be seized by any inspector wherever found and forthwith destroyed.

WHEREAS by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Additional Regulation, is to say:—

REGULATION.

Subject to due compliance with the drawback regulations in so far as the same are not inconsistent with the following conditions, drawback may be allowed at the rate specified in such regulations on duty-paid hessians manufactured into bags in Victoria and exported containing goods, upon the production of the following evidence and any further evidence that the Collector of Customs may require.

1. The bag manufacturer to produce the original invoices and make a declaration to the following effect:—

- That the bags on which drawback is claimed have been supplied to for the purpose of being filled for export.
- The number of bags, and the quantity of hessian therein.
- That the hessian was imported and duty paid, and is identical with that mentioned in the "original invoice" produced.

2. The miller, or the exporter of the goods, to make a declaration:—

- That bags, containing yards of hessian, were obtained from for the purpose of being filled for export, and that all of such bags have been exported.
- That the goods in such bags were *bond fide* sold outside the colony of Victoria.
- That the particulars of such sale, showing the number of bags, are recorded in his books.

3. The bags to be shipped under supervision and drawback to be subsequently claimed by the exporter.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is among other things enacted that in order to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, any particular articles of clothing or wearing apparel, the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, from time to time appoint a Special Board consisting of not less than four or more than ten members, elected as may be prescribed, and a chairman, and that of such members one-half shall be appointed as representatives of occupiers of factories or work-rooms in which such articles are prepared or manufactured, and one-half as representatives of persons employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing such articles: And whereas by an order in Council dated the 7th day of July, 1898, it was directed that a Special Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates to be paid for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing all articles of women's and girls' underclothing except stays and corsets, also nightgowns, blouses, pinafores, aprons, and infants' gowns and underclothing: And whereas after due notice of an election had been given in the prescribed manner no representatives of occupiers of factories or work-rooms in which articles of women's and girls' underclothing except stays and corsets, also nightgowns, blouses, pinafores, aprons, and infants' gowns and underclothing are prepared or manufactured, and no representatives of persons employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing such articles were nominated or elected: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896* in the event of any failure or neglect to elect, doth hereby appoint
