ELECTION OF A MEMBER (BEING A REPRESENT-ATIVE OF EMPLOYES) OF THE SPECIAL BOARD FOR FIXING THE LOWEST RATES OF PAY. MENT FOR MANUFACTURING MEN'S AND BOYS' CLOTHING.

The births of 1,012 children, viz., 528 boys and 484 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. The number was, it will be observed, 72 lower than in July, 1897, about the same as in July, 1896, slightly lower than in July, 1895 and 1894, but much lower than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, an increased morcality is noticeable under all classes of disease, except violence, under which there was a falling off of 20; deaths from zymotic diseases having increased by 26, those from constitutional diseases by 28, those from local diseases by 47, those from developmental diseases—chiefly those affecting old people—by 8, those from dictic diseases—absent from the list in July, 1897—by 7, those from parasitic diseases 7 to 20; whereas septic diseases show a falling off from 12 (including 6 cases of puerperal fever) to 4. Under the constitutional class deaths from rheumatic fever, rheumatism, and gout increased from 5 to 11, cancer from 24 to 32, tubercular meningitis from 8 to 12, from 57 to 75, and scrofula, &c., from 5 to 8. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system rose system from 32 to 36; as against which, deaths from diseases of the urinary system flow 37 to 128, and from those of the digestive conspicuous absence in the month under notice of cases of homicide and suicide, although 2 from the former, and 9 from the latter cause were recorded in July, 1897; whilst cases of accidental drowning fell off by 5, and other accidental deaths by 4.

The present epidemic of measles, which culminated in April with 99 deaths, is gradually abating—the deaths having fallen to 41 in June, and to 24 in July. Since its first outbreak, in December last, this epidemic has carried off 365 persons—principally of 1874-5, which caused 733 deaths; the next that of 1893, which caused 386 deaths; and the next that now prevalent. The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1897, and the first seven months of 1898, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that no deaths from typhoid fever occurred in July, 1898, a circumstance without parallel in the corresponding month of any of the eight previous years, although in the first five months of this same year the mortality was by far the highest recorded since 1890.



DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST,—RATING REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

THAT the Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supply by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 1st August, 1898.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, the annual minimum sum of One pound (£1) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), the sum of Two shillings in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of Two shillings in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to building, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to circlet or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, one shulling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps. One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time). 14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.
