PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honourable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. (b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

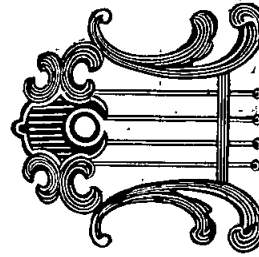

BENJEROOP AND MURRABIT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 3.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure, and the quantities of water supplied for such purpose shall be determined by the officer of the Trust in charge of the distribution of such water, who shall measure the area of the land irrigated.

2. No water shall be supplied for any purpose from any of the Trust channels excepting through a properly constructed outlet, unless otherwise specially sanctioned by the Trust in writing, or pending the construction of an outlet, already applied for, nor unless a suitably constructed channel be made to convey the water from the outlet to where it is required: provided nevertheless that, where practicable, more blocks than one owned or occupied by the same person may be supplied with water from one outlet, where proper connecting channels are constructed.

3. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets, at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Water Committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence (excepting in the cases of gardens, applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of which may be dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such agreement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient), and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays, as well as on ordinary working days.

4. The water bailiffs shall receive all applications for water for the various areas in which they are employed respectively, and shall enter same in an order book supplied to them for that purpose, with the several particulars required therein, which shall be signed by the applicant, and all applicants for water may request, and shall be entitled to, the inspection of such order book.

5. Each applicant for water will be supplied in the order in which his application appears in the order book, and the water will be supplied to the applicant as near as practicable to the time at which such water is required, if available, but the Trust will not be responsible for the non-supply of water applied for under any circumstances.

6. No person shall receive water for the irrigation of land to a greater extent at each time than is equal to 30 acres for each allotment on the channel then working when there are other applicants awaiting service, unless special instructions are given by the Water Committee or the Trust to do otherwise.

7. No persons shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works on adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

8. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet or junction sluice, or interfere with any stop, or do any act that may cause the escape

of water from the Trust's channels or works, excepting as hereinafter provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

9. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or do any act which may cause such works to be injured or damaged, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

10. Garden irrigation rights must be paid for at the time the application is made for the said rights.

11. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against, or breach of, this Regulation, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 9th day of July, 1898.

Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally appointing such Trust;
Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust;

And whereas by a certain Order in Council, dated the 2nd day of December, 1889, the Carrum Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was duly constituted: And whereas it is deemed expedient to repeal clause 9 of the aforesaid Order in Council, dated the 2nd day of December, 1889, and to substitute a new clause in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order as follow:—

That clause 9 of the Order in Council before mentioned, dated the 2nd day of December, 1889, shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be, and be deemed to be, and may be cited as, clause 9 of the said Order in Council:—

9. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Carrum Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balances due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Twenty-seven thousand one hundred and forty-two pounds sterling (£27,142); and no rate made by the Carrum Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Ten shillings in the £1 upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust District.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette* the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to and all petitions which have been

received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal district or districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust shall have authority to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And it is further enacted that the Governor in Council might, where a Waterworks District is either wholly or, with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors of the Central Riding of the Shire of Yea, for a loan of Three thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£3,500) to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of the Township of Yea, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust.
- (2) That the Councillors for the Central Riding of the Shire of Yea, for the time being, and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Three thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£3,500) for the purpose of constructing works for the supply of the Township of Yea with water, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the lands within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing at a point on the Yea River, the south-west angle of allotment 30AA, in the parish of Yea; thence south-westerly by the southern boundary of last-named allotment and Yea township boundary to the north-east angle of allotment 7; thence westerly by township boundary and the southern boundary of allotment 5 to the south-west angle of latter; thence northerly by the west boundaries of allotments 5, 4, 3, and 2, a line across three-chain road, and the west boundaries of allotments 18 and 23, to the Yea River; thence south-easterly, north-easterly, and south-easterly by said river to the point of commencement.

Portion II.—A strip of land 25 links wide on each side of the centre line of pipe-track, which extends easterly 18 chains from the north-west angle of allotment 30, parish of Yea, to a point on the Yea River opposite the north-west angle of allotment 30, together with a circular piece of land, whose centre is at the pump, and whose radius is two chains.

All of which boundaries are as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne.

- (5) That the principal works to be constructed shall consist of a weir and offtake at the Yea River; a gravitation main, 9-inch diameter, wrought-iron pipes; pump well lined with brickwork; pumping plant of 17 I.H.P.; rising main, 6-inch diameter, cast-iron pipes; a service basin; and the reticulation of the township of Yea.
- (6) That the name of the Trust shall be the Yea Waterworks Trust.

*Defences and Discipline Act 1890.*VICTORIAN SCOTTISH REGIMENT OF VOLUNTEERS.—
REGULATIONS.*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1898.*

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations and orders respecting the enrolment and disbanding of any volunteer corps, the appointment, promotion, and rank of all volunteer officers, and the relative rank of such officers and of the officers of any military and naval force and officers holding any military or naval staff appointment in the service of the Government of Victoria, the requisites to require a volunteer to be deemed an effective, the constitution, assembling, and proceedings of courts of inquiry to hear, receive, and examine evidence relating to and to report on any matter connected with the government or discipline of the volunteer force, or of any corps thereof, or on any charge brought against a member of any such corps, the maintenance of discipline, the power of arrest, the payment and recovery of subscriptions, fines, and penalties, and the general government, discipline, and management of the volunteer force and the several corps thereof, and the persons appointed to the paid staff of or serving for pay in the said force, and may from time to time alter or repeal any such regulations and orders, and may call for such returns as may from time to time seem requisite: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations for a Victorian Scottish Regiment of Volunteers, that is to say :—

SECTION I.—CONSTITUTION AND
REGULATIONS.

1. The Victorian Scottish Regiment shall consist of such commissioned, warrant, non-commissioned officers, and men as may from time to time be duly appointed and engaged under the provisions of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890*, and amendments of the same.

2. Engagement shall be for a period not exceeding three years, but members may, with the sanction of the Commandant, re-engage during the last year of their service for a further period of one, three, or five years.

Any person so engaged may (with the approval of the Governor in Council if an officer, or of the Commandant if below the rank of an officer) resign from the regiment by giving fourteen days' notice in writing to the commanding officer.

3. No person shall be engaged unless he was born in Scotland or is of Scottish descent, and is between the ages of 18 and 35, but persons who were born in Scotland or are of Scottish descent, and who have previously served in the Imperial Regular or Auxiliary Forces, or in any Colonial Militia or Volunteer Force, may be enrolled if under the age of 45. Persons who have served in a Volunteer Cadet Corps for a period of not less than two years may be engaged between the ages of 17 and 18, if fulfilling all other conditions.

The standard height shall be 5ft. 6in. and upwards, with proportionate chest measurement.

The minimum chest measurement for recruits of 5ft. 6in. will be 33 inches, and proportionate measurement of half-an-inch for every inch over minimum height.

4. Boys may be engaged for the purpose of being trained as drummers or buglers. Not more than two boys per company will be allowed. Age, 14 to 18 years.

5. All applicants for engagement in the ranks must attend recruit drill until passed into the ranks. Any recruit who fails to pass into the ranks within three months of the date of his enrolment shall be recommended for discharge, unless in the opinion of his commanding officer there are extenuating circumstances.

6. After being passed into the ranks members will be required to undergo a minimum of twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills per annum.

7. No member of the regiment shall be classed as effective unless he shall have completed twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills during the twelve months between 1st July and 30th June in each year, and have completed his course of musketry training.
- Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st July and 30th September must attend twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills, and have completed the course of musketry.
- Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st October and 31st December must attend six daylight drills and six night drills, and have completed the half-yearly course of musketry.
- Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st January and 31st March must attend three daylight drills and three night drills, and have completed the quarterly course of musketry.
- Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st April and 30th June must attend two daylight drills and two night drills.
8. Any combatant member of the regiment who fails to carry out the provisions of para. 6 by the 30th June in each year may be struck off the strength, unless such failure was caused by illness, to be certified to by a medical officer of the corps.
9. Attendance at church parades or funerals shall not be allowed to count towards effectiveness.
10. Any extra number of parades and drills may be called in order to allow members the opportunity of qualifying as effectives.
11. When the Commandant or officer deputed by him inspects the regiment, every officer, warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or man must be present, unless prevented by sickness or urgent necessity. In the former case, a certificate from a medical officer of the corps to be produced; in the latter, leave may be granted by the commanding officer of the regiment, but only in urgent cases.
12. Annual musketry training will be carried out in accordance with instructions which will be issued under the authority of the Commandant.
13. Every member of the regiment on enrolment will be supplied, free of charge, with the following articles, which remain the property of the Government, and must be kept in good order, and returned whenever called for :—
- M.-E. rifle, complete, with bayonet and sling.
 - Waist belt, pouch, and frog.
 - Haversack.
 - Water bottle.
14. Any officer who does not qualify as an effective shall not be allowed to retain his commission, unless it be represented by the Commandant that there are special reasons for a relaxation of this regulation.
15. The services of officers on the Reserve are at all times to be at the disposal of the Commandant, but they are not to perform any duty unless he authorizes them to do so, and in carrying out such duty may, on the approval of the Commandant, be classed as effective reserve officers.
16. Non-commissioned officers will be appointed by the commanding officer of the regiment.
17. Any non-commissioned officer who does not qualify as an effective shall be reduced to the ranks, unless it shall appear to the Commandant that there are special reasons for the relaxation of this regulation.
18. After the regiment or any portion thereof has been called out for actual military service, it shall be released from such service only by order of the Governor in Council; and before the regiment or such portion is released from actual military service it shall be returned to its district.
19. Neither the regiment or any portion thereof is to quit, as a military body, its district, unless the sanction of the

Commandant be previously obtained; and no member is to quit the district for a period of more than one month without returning his complete free kit to the commanding officer of the company to which he belongs.

SECTION II.—REGULATIONS.

1. Members of the Victorian Scottish Regiment must appear in authorized uniform or in purely civilian dress, the unsoldier-like appearance of the members of the regiment dressed partly in uniform and partly in civilian dress bringing discredit not only on themselves, but on the force to which they belong. Authorized uniform to be worn.
2. Members of the regiment must be properly dressed when going to and returning from parade. Parades Proper dress to be worn.
3. Any member of the regiment may, for any offence against good order and discipline, be placed under arrest by his superior officer. Arrest.
4. Arrest shall signify suspension from all military duty and participation in rifle shooting; and any member placed under arrest shall deliver up his arms and accoutrements to such person as his commanding officer may direct. Definition of arrest.
5. If any member of the regiment, while under arms or on duty with the company to which he belongs, or any portion of the military forces, or while engaged in any military exercise or drill, either in uniform or in plain clothes, or while going to or returning from any place of exercise or assembly, disobeys any lawful order of the officer under whose command he then is, or is guilty of misconduct, any superior officer may order the offender, if an officer, into arrest, and if not an officer, into the custody of any non-commissioned officer or private, but so that the offender be not kept in such custody longer than during the time such portion of the military forces as aforesaid remains under arms or on duty. After which his case will either be disposed of by the commanding officer on the spot, or he will be suspended from duty under para. 3, and reported to higher authority. Dis-obedience of orders or misconduct.
6. Duty with a company, or any portion of the military forces, is held to mean not only presence under arms on parade, but the performance of all administrative duties of a military nature in or out of uniform. Military duty.
7. Commanding officers shall, immediately after parade, receive the reports of officers as to any members of the regiment who have misconducted themselves, and shall either deal summarily with the case or report it to a higher authority. Mode of punishment for misconduct.
8. Any member of the regiment who fails to produce for inspection, when required, any arms, accoutrements, or other property intrusted to his care may be proceeded against under the Act, and steps taken for his summary discharge for disobedience of orders. Every member failing to become effective shall, on demand, immediately return to the head-quarters of his company all arms, accoutrements, clothing, stores, &c., which may have been issued to him. Public or other property responsibility for.
9. Any member of the regiment whose services are dispensed with shall deliver up in good order, fair wear and tear only excepted, all arms, ammunition, accoutrements, clothing, or appointments, or any public stores or property issued to him, and if he refuse or neglect to comply with this regulation he may be proceeded against under the Act. Public property to be returned.
10. Any loss, damage, or destruction of arms, accoutrements, uniform, or stores which may be traced to any member, unless caused by circumstances beyond his control, will be required to be made good by him, or, in default thereof, proceedings against him will be instituted under the Act. Damage to be made good.
11. The Commandant may summarily reduce in rank any non-commissioned officer, or may dismiss or discharge any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or private for misconduct. Reduction or dismissal.

Absent without leave. 12. Any member of the regiment absent without leave for a period of three months shall be discharged, unless, in the opinion of the Commandant, there be extenuating circumstances.

Division of companies. 13. The commanding officer of a company will keep a muster roll of the whole company, showing the date of enlistment, &c., of each man in it.

SECTION III.—MEDICAL STAFF.

Uniform. 1. The officers of the Medical Staff will wear the uniform of their corps, and will perform duty with their corps only.

Authority of P.M.O. 2. Whenever the regiment is brigaded with other troops the officers of the Medical Staff will be under the general direction of the principal medical officer of the military forces, and will take rank with officers of the Victorian Medical Staff in accordance with the dates of their commissions.

No pay given to officers. 3. No emolument is attached to any of the above appointments.

SECTION IV.—LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

Leave of absence. 1. Leave of absence, not exceeding three months, may be granted by the commanding officer to all officers, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men of the regiment under his command (those permanently employed excepted), or he may delegate this power to commanding officers of companies. Beyond this period application must be made to the Commandant through the proper channel.

SECTION V.—DRESS AND EQUIPMENT.

Uniform will be as authorized by the Dress Regulations.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

VICTORIAN NAVAL AND MILITARY FORCES.—
ALTERATION OF FINANCIAL AND STORE
REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART VII.—STORES.—SECTION I.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.—
ORDNANCE STORES.

After paragraph 159 the following paragraph is added:—
Recovery of Kit.

159A. Should any member leaving the Victorian Military Forces and quitting the district with articles of Government property in his possession fail within a reasonable time to deliver up the same on demand, the final notice of demand for the return of the property will be served by the police on being sent to the office of the Chief Commissioner, through the A. A. General. In all cases the last-known address to be given when the final notices are forwarded for service.

Should the final demand not be complied with, the authority of the Minister is to be obtained, through the Commandant, to proceed against the defaulter. On this authority being obtained, the Commanding Officer is authorized to arrange direct with some local solicitor to prepare the information and summons thereon, also any summons to witness, and to conduct the case in court. An agreement in writing should be obtained for the performance of these duties by the solicitor for fees not exceeding £2 2s. In the event of an adjournment, the Commanding Officer is authorized to incur additional expense to the extent of £2 2s.

The claims are to be sent to the A. A. General, to be forwarded to the Crown Solicitor for certification.

Land Act 1890, Part I.
ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1898.

WHEREAS by section 142 of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I.) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in Part I. of the said Act, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS UNDER PART I. OF THE LAND ACT 1890.

Chapter V.—Method of making Application for Leases and Licences under Sections 32, 42, 65, 67, 97, and 99, Land Acts 1890-91, and Section 22, Land Act 1891.

The Regulation made on the 18th July, 1898, is hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS MADE ON THE 3RD JULY, 1893.

Regulation 4 is hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation is made in lieu thereof, namely:—

The applicant shall, before lodging his application, pay to the nearest Receiver and Paymaster the sum of One pound (£1) (except as provided in section 5 following) for a certificate of registration, which must accompany the application. Should the granting of such application not be recommended by a Local Land Board subsequent to 18th July, 1898, the unsuccessful applicant shall be entitled to a refund of Seventeen shillings and sixpence (17s. 6d.) out of the fee paid, provided application for such refund be made within twelve months from the date of the application for the land. If the applicant, however, does not desire a refund, he may lodge one or more further applications, as provided in section 5 following; but not more than one application at such reduced fee is to proceed at one and the same time. But an applicant for a licence under section 42, out of a grazing area leasehold, or under sections 67 and 99, or for a lease under section 97, shall not be required to lodge a certificate of registration with such application.

Chapter XI.—Licences.—State Forests and Timber Reserves.

From and after 20th August, 1898, there may be issued special permits to cut and remove live timber from that portion of the Wombat State Forest described in Proclamation bearing date 14th June, 1898, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th June, 1898, page 2443, on the following conditions, namely:—

1. The fee shall be One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum, payable quarterly in advance.
2. No live tree which at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground is of less diameter than twenty-four (24) inches shall be cut down.
3. One tree only shall be felled at a time, and must be cut up into laths, &c., before another is operated on.
4. No live tree shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
5. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any path or road in use for transport of timber or stores.
6. When a permit-holder has completed the cutting-up of a tree into firewood, laths, &c., he must at once stack the branches in a heap and afterwards burn them when directed to do so by the Forest Officer.
7. When felling trees or burning debris the utmost care must be taken that no young timber is broken down, injured, or burnt by fire.
8. This special permit is personal, and must be produced by the holder thereof when asked to do so by any police constable or bailiff of Crown lands.
9. This permit is not available for obtaining piles, telegraph poles, poppet heads, beams, or bridge timber.
10. Fires will not be permitted within the forest during the period from 15th December to 28th February, except special precautions be taken in lighting such fires in a bare cleared space of at least twenty feet in diameter, and in a hole dug for the purpose. Small wood only is to be used, and every fire is to be carefully extinguished by being covered with earth or being put out by water. The burning-off of debris during the period mentioned above is strictly prohibited.
11. The holder of this permit will not be permitted to cut any timber in the forest during the months of January and February in each year; but all timber cut prior to those months may be removed at any time, after being passed and branded by the Forest Officer. The period for which the Forest may be closed to the holders of permits may be varied at the discretion of the Forest Officer.
12. This permit may be cancelled for any breach of or non-compliance with any of the conditions hereof.

Chapter XI.—Licences.—State Forests and Timber Reserves.

Chapter XIII.—Timber Licences.—Licences on Crown Lands (not being State Forests or Timber Reserves).

To Condition 5 of the Schedule to the Regulation relating to sleeper hewing, made on the 31st May, 1898, the following words are added, namely:—Sleepers six feet and under in length may be cut either from live wood or from dead wood on payment of a royalty charge of Twopence (2d.) each:

Chapter XIII.—Timber Licences.—Licences on Crown Lands (not being State Forests or Timber Reserves).

All the conditions relative to sleeper hewing imposed by Regulation made on the 31st May, 1898, shall apply equally to sleeper hewing on areas leased under section 32 of the Land Act 1890-91.

Schedules 67 and 68a.

The following condition is added to Schedules 67 and 68A, namely:—This licence does not empower the licensee to fell timber for the purpose of hewing sleepers therefrom.

SPECIAL REGULATION RELATING TO STATE FORESTS.

Smoking in the open air or the lighting of fires out-of-doors for any purpose whatsoever, including the burning of logs in order to obtain rabbits or other vermin, is strictly prohibited within the boundaries of any State Forest during the months of December, January, and February, except under "Special Permit."

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, and 4 of the classes mentioned in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
