## REGULATIONS.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

## REGULATIONS.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

## 9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

*Mathematics.*

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

\* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

*Levelling, &c.*

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.]

*Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:*—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

*Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.*

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

## CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

In By-law No. 3, section (xii.), after the words "from time to time direct" the following is added, viz.:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law, the rate to be charged for water supplied during the period when the surface of the water in the Malsbury reservoir is above the level of the permanent sills of the flood escapes under and in terms of this by-law shall be One farthing (¼d.) per 1,000 gallons from the 10th day of August, 1898.

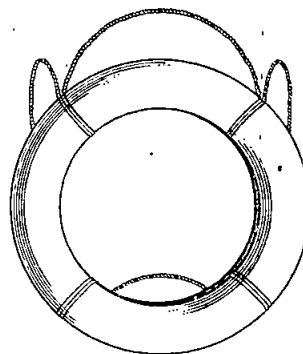

**SOUTHERN ENTRANCE TO HINCHINBROOK CHANNEL.—  
ALTERATIONS IN BUOYS AND BEACONS.**

NOTICE is hereby given, that on and after 1st September the following alterations in the buoys at the southern entrance to Hinchinbrook Channel will be made in consequence of the extension of the Bar seawards, viz.:

Fairway Buoy, which will be painted red, will be moved to the following approximate position, viz.:

Hillock Point, bearing N. 22° W.  
North end of North Palm Island, bearing S. 80° E.,

this position being about 1 cable west of the line of lights and beacons, in a depth of 5 fathoms at low-water springs.

A small black buoy will be placed in the position originally occupied by the fairway buoy, the depth at present there being 9 feet at low-water springs.

The red buoy at the entrance to Enterprise Channel will be discontinued.

A red buoy will be placed in 10 feet at low-water springs in the following approximate position, viz.:

White Beacon, Hinchinbrook Island, bearing N. 39° W.,  
distant 39 cables, marking the edge of the sandbank, which has extended into the channel.

A small red beacon will be placed on a sandbank, which dries 2 feet at low-water springs, situated in the following approximate position, viz.:

#### SHIRE OF LEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 4.

A By-law of the Shire of Leigh made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, No. 1093.

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Leigh, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, do hereby rescind the by-laws made by the Local Board of Health of the said shire on the 11th day of February, 1885, and in lieu thereof hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law the following terms, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, viz.:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed houses, factories, work-rooms, common and other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, square, court, alley, or passage (whether a thoroughfare or not).

"Slaughter-house" or "slaughter-yard" shall include any abattoir, or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

"Earth-closet" means a seat similar to the seat of a privy, and having underneath a pan as receptacle for excrement, with convenient apparatus for supply of as much dry powdered earth or other deodorizing material as will cover the excrement every time the closet is used.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter above or below the ground.

2. *Premises to be kept clean.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or other such refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once in every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Council may remove the same.

4. *Removal of refuse from yards, &c.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to 2 cubic yards or at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the Council may remove the same.

5. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing clauses shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any

premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used as manure on any garden or land contiguous to such premises, so that the same be not so removed, or kept, or used so as to contravene any by-law of the Council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. *Refuse of noxious trades.*—Every occupier and person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and in the meantime to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom, and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid the same may be removed by the Council.

7. *Removal of blood from slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime, in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

8. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which there may be any offal shall effectually deodorize the same forthwith, and shall remove the same from the said premises within twenty-four hours.

9. *Earth closets and pans.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with two suitable pans of galvanized iron or other suitable material to receive night-soil, one pan to be under the seat while the other one is being emptied and cleaned. Such pans are to be approved by the Council, and must be properly riveted and soldered, so as to be absolutely watertight, and shall be fitted with suitable handles for lifting. They shall have a capacity of not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and shall be placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and its contents. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a slope or inclination towards the door or front access of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

10. *Deodorizing material for earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

11. *Earth-closets and pans to be emptied.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall periodically empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises, so that such earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place shall not at any time be a nuisance or injurious to health.

12. *Cesspools, &c., to be emptied and cleansed from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.*—The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within 1 foot from the top of the walls, sides, or linings of such cesspools: Provided that the contents of such cesspools shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quantity and quality to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same. The contents of cesspools shall be removed between the hours of Seven (7) p.m. in the evening and Seven (7) a.m. in the morning, and at no other time during the day or night.

13. *Earth-closets to be emptied once a week.*—Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, between the hours of Seven (7) p.m. in the evening and Seven (7) a.m. in the morning, empty and cleanse, or caused to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

14. *Night-soil, &c., to be deposited only in duly appointed depôts.*—All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to, and finally placed in, such a place or places only as shall be appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and every person removing such night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall bury the same in a trench, and shall forthwith cover and keep the same covered with earth to a depth of at least nine (9) inches, and shall effectually prevent any nuisance being caused thereby.

15. *Swine or dogs not to be kept at slaughtering-places.*—Every occupier or person in charge of any abattoir or slaughtering-place who keeps or permits or suffers to be kept in or about such abattoir or slaughtering-place any swine, unless intended for immediate slaughter, or any dog unless constantly chained when

not used for yarding purposes, and every person who suffers or permits any swine to feed on any blood, offal, manure, night-soil, filth, or other refuse matter shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law.

16. *Except by written permission of the Council.*—Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law, it shall be lawful for the Council to grant written permission to any occupier or person in charge of any abattoir or slaughtering-place to keep swine on the following conditions:—1st. That the swine are kept at such a distance from and so kept apart from any abattoir or slaughter-yard as the Council shall direct. 2nd. That such swine shall not be fed with offal obtained from such abattoir or slaughter-yard, or from any other abattoir or slaughter-yard, unless such offal has been first thoroughly boiled and cleansed. Any such occupier or person who keeps or permit or suffers to be kept any swine contrary to or without such written permission, or who fails to observe the conditions thereof, shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law.

17. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

18. *Night-soil, &c., deposited to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land (whether by way of manure or otherwise) any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than nine (9) inches in thickness.

19. *Earth-closets not to be emptied into drains, &c.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain or sewer.

20. *Pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

21. *Pollution of water.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.

22. *Dangerous accumulations to be removed by owner or occupier of land.*—Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property, if unoccupied (otherwise by the occupier of the property), upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Council or by one of its officers.

23. *Animals.*—No person shall keep an animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

24. *Not to be kept so as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

25. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

26. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

27. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

28. *Clauses Nos. 9, 12, 13, and 14 shall refer to and be in force only in the places hereinafter named and described, viz:—Rokewood, which shall mean and comprise all the land, streets, roads, and creeks within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment No. 59, parish of Corindhap; thence east by the north boundary of allotments 59, 60, 61, 62, 69, 70, 81, 80, 79, and 78, to the Corindhap Creek; thence by the Corindhap Creek southerly to its junction with the Kurruc-a-ruc Creek; thence again southerly by the Kurruc-a-ruc Creek to the west boundary of allotment 142; thence south by the east boundary of Rokewood Township Reserve to the south-east angle thereof; thence west by the boundary between the parishes of Corindhap and Kurruc-a-ruc to the south angle of allotment 2 of block 11, Corindhap; thence north-easterly by the east boundary of said allotment 2, and the east boundary of allotment 1 of block 11, to the north-east angle of said allotment 1; thence west by the north boundary of said allotment 1 to the Kurruc-a-ruc Creek; thence northerly by the Kurruc-a-ruc Creek to the south-east corner of allotment 19 of block 1; thence north by the east boundary of allotments 18 and*

*19 of block 1 to the north-east angle of said allotment 18; thence west by the north boundary of allotments 18 and 17 of block 1 to the north-west corner of said allotment 17; thence north by the west boundaries of allotments 10 and 5 of block 1 and of allotment 15 to the commencing point, all in the parish of Corindhap.*

Corindhap which shall mean and comprise all the land, streets, roads, and creeks within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the north-east corner of section 122, parish of Corindhap; thence west by the north boundary of said section 122 to the Corindhap Creek; thence by the Corindhap Creek and the Break-of-day Gully northerly and easterly to the north-east corner of Corindhap Town Reserve; thence by the east boundary of the Corindhap Town Reserve to the south-east angle thereof; thence by the south boundary of the Corindhap Township Reserve west to the south-west corner thereof; thence north by the west boundary of the Corindhap Town Reserve to the commencing point, all in the parish of Corindhap.

29. The foregoing clauses, numbered 1 to 28, both inclusive, shall apply and have operation within the Shire of Leigh, excepting as hereinbefore described relative to clauses, 9, 12, 13, and 14, which clauses shall apply to and have operation in the places described only, i.e., Rokewood and Corindhap. Provided that all the other clauses in addition to these shall apply to and have operation in the places described as Rokewood and Corindhap.

30. If any person commit a breach of any portion of this by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the Council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

This By-law No. 4 was made by special order by the Council of the Shire of Leigh this 9th day of March, 1898.

#### Health Act 1890.

#### BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

#### By-law No. 3 under the Health Act 1890.

A By-law of the Borough of Stawell, made under the provisions of Sections 31, 32, 33, 253, and 259 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 3, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet-pans, dung, soil, and other manures named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stawell make the following By-law:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Stawell.

4. The council may, upon the recommendation of the health officer and the inspector of nuisances, exempt any premises within the Borough of Stawell from the operation of this by-law.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

6. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the borough council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the borough council.

7. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the borough council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the council may direct, in a suitable cart, and the council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the said pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

8. A pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the borough council shall be left in place of the one removed.

9. Every closet within the borough shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings and flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of any earth or deodorizing material to the contents

thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

10. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the borough council, or be trenched or ploughed into the land in such locality as may be provided by the borough council.

11. The occupier of any land in the Borough of Stawell on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, or cattle shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same may be removed by order of the borough council at the expense of such occupier.

12. No occupier or person shall use such a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

13. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil; and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

14. Every occupier or person shall not employ any other persons save those authorized by the borough council for the removal of night-soil, and no other person shall remove any night-soil, except in cases of exemption.

15. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the borough council over all premises, which may be inspected by the borough council or its officers from time to time, or any person duly authorized by the council.

16. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

#### SHIRE OF TOWONG.

By-law No. 5 under the Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Towong, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. *Pans for night-soil.*—The ordinary system of open pans for night-soil shall be abolished.

2. *Double-pan service.*—In lieu of such ordinary system of pans every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be fitted with air-tight lids and the pans removed for cleansing at least once a week.

3. *Removal of night-soil.*—No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the council of the said shire; and any such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied alternately as the council of the said shire shall direct.

4. *Use of Deodorant.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

5. *Power of council to make a charge.*—The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

6. *Extent of application of by-law.*—This By-law 5 shall apply to and have operation within the township of Bethanga, in the shire of Towong.

*Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a

penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for every day such offence is continued after any conviction.

*Defences and Discipline Act 1890.*VICTORIAN SCOTTISH REGIMENT OF VOLUNTEERS.—  
REGULATIONS.\**At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1898.*

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof : Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

After Part V. of the regulations the following regulations are added :—

## PART VA.—VICTORIAN SCOTTISH REGIMENT OF VOLUNTEERS.

SECTION I.—CONSTITUTION AND  
REGULATIONS.

1. The Victorian Scottish Regiment shall consist of such commissioned, warrant, non-commissioned officers, and men as may from time to time be duly appointed and engaged under the provisions of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890*, and amendments of the same.

2. Engagement shall be for a period not exceeding three years, but members may, with the sanction of the Commandant, re-engage during the last year of their service for a further period of one, three, or five years.

Any person so engaged may (with the approval of the Governor in Council if an officer, or of the Commandant if below the rank of an officer) resign from the regiment by giving fourteen days' notice in writing to the commanding officer.

3. No person shall be engaged unless he was born in Scotland or is of Scottish descent, and is between the ages of 18 and 35, but persons who were born in Scotland or are of Scottish descent, and who have previously served in the Imperial Regular or Auxiliary Forces, or in any Colonial Militia or Volunteer Force, may be enrolled if under the age of 45. Persons who have served in a Volunteer Cadet Corps for a period of not less than two years may be engaged between the ages of 17 and 18, if fulfilling all other conditions.

The standard height shall be 5ft. 6in. and upwards, with proportionate chest measurement.

The minimum chest measurement for recruits of 5ft. 6in. will be 33 inches, and proportionate measurement of half-an-inch for every inch over minimum height.

4. Boys may be engaged for the purpose of being trained as drummers or buglers. Not more than two boys per company will be allowed. Age, 14 to 18 years.

5. All applicants for engagement in the ranks must attend recruit drill until passed into the ranks. Any recruit who fails to pass into the ranks within three months of the date of his enrolment shall be recommended for discharge, unless in the opinion of his commanding officer there are extenuating circumstances.

6. After being passed into the ranks members will be required to undergo a minimum of twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills per annum.

7. No member of the regiment shall be classed as effective unless he shall have completed twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills during the twelve months between 1st July and 30th June in each year, and have completed his course of musketry training.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st July and 30th September must attend twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills, and have completed the course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st October and 31st December must attend six daylight drills and six night drills, and have completed the half-yearly course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st January and 31st March must attend three daylight drills and three night drills, and have completed the quarterly course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st April and 30th June must attend two daylight drills and two night drills.

**Absentees to be struck off.** 8. Any combatant member of the regiment who fails to carry out the provisions of para. 6 by the 30th June in each year may be struck off the strength, unless such failure was caused by illness, to be certified to by a medical officer of the corps.

**Church parades and funerals.** 9. Attendance at church parades or funerals shall not be allowed to count towards effectiveness.

**Extra drills.** 10. Any extra number of parades and drills may be called in order to allow members the opportunity of qualifying as effectives.

**Annual inspections.** 11. When the Commandant or officer deputed by him inspects the regiment, every officer, warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or man must be present, unless prevented by sickness or urgent necessity. In the former case, a certificate from a medical officer of the corps to be produced; in the latter, leave may be granted by the commanding officer of the regiment, but only in urgent cases.

**Musketry training.** 12. Annual musketry training will be carried out in accordance with instructions which will be issued under the authority of the Commandant.

**Free kit.** 13. Every member of the regiment on enrolment will be supplied, free of charge, with the following articles, which remain the property of the Government, and must be kept in good order, and returned whenever called for:—

M.-E. rifle, complete, with bayonet and sling.  
Waist belt, pouch, and frog.  
Haversack.  
Water bottle.

**Officers to be effective.** 14. Any officer who does not qualify as an effective shall not be allowed to retain his commission, unless it be represented by the Commandant that there are special reasons for a relaxation of this regulation.

15. The services of officers on the Reserve are at all times to be at the disposal of the Commandant, but they are not to perform any duty unless he authorizes them to do so, and in carrying out such duty may, on the approval of the Commandant, be classed as effective reserve officers.

**N.-C. officers, appointment of.** 16. Non-commissioned officers will be appointed by the commanding officer of the regiment.

**N.-C. officers to be effective.** 17. Any non-commissioned officer who does not qualify as an effective shall be reduced to the ranks, unless it shall appear to the Commandant that there are special reasons for the relaxation of this regulation.

**Service in the field, release from.** 18. After the regiment or any portion thereof has been called out for actual military service, it shall be released from such service only by order of the Governor in Council; and before the regiment or such portion is released from actual military service it shall be returned to its district.

**Corps not to quit district without authority.** 19. Neither the regiment or any portion thereof is to quit, as a military body, its district, unless the sanction of the Commandant be previously obtained; and no member is to quit the district for a period of more than one month without returning his complete free kit to the commanding officer of the company to which he belongs.



## SECTION II.—REGULATIONS.

1. Members of the Victorian Scottish Regiment must appear in authorized uniform or in purely civilian dress, the unsoldier-like appearance of the members of the regiment dressed partly in uniform and partly in civilian dress bringing discredit not only on themselves, but on the force to which they belong. Authorized uniform to be worn.

2. Members of the regiment must be properly dressed when going to and returning from parade. Parades. Proper dress to be worn.

3. Any member of the regiment may, for any offence against good order and discipline, be placed under arrest by his superior officer. Arrest.

4. Arrest shall signify suspension from all military duty and participation in rifle shooting; and any member placed under arrest shall deliver up his arms and accoutrements to such person as his commanding officer may direct. Definition of arrest.

5. If any member of the regiment, while under arms or on duty with the company to which he belongs, or any portion of the military forces, or while engaged in any military exercise or drill, either in uniform or in plain clothes, or while going to or returning from any place of exercise or assembly, disobeys any lawful order of the officer under whose command he then is, or is guilty of misconduct, any superior officer may order the offender, if an officer, into arrest, and if not an officer, into the custody of any non-commissioned officer or private, but so that the offender be not kept in such custody longer than during the time such portion of the military forces as aforesaid remains under arms or on duty. After which his case will either be disposed of by the commanding officer on the spot, or he will be suspended from duty under para. 3, and reported to higher authority. Disobedience of orders or misconduct.

6. Duty with a company, or any portion of the military forces, is held to mean not only presence under arms on parade, but the performance of all administrative duties of a military nature in or out of uniform. Military duty.

7. Commanding officers shall, immediately after parade, receive the reports of officers as to any members of the regiment who have misconducted themselves, and shall either deal summarily with the case or report it to a higher authority. Mode of punishment for misconduct.

8. Any member of the regiment who fails to produce for inspection, when required, any arms, accoutrements, or other property intrusted to his care may be proceeded against under the Act, and steps taken for his summary discharge for disobedience of orders. Every member failing to become effective shall, on demand, immediately return to the head-quarters of his company all arms, accoutrements, clothing, stores, &c., which may have been issued to him. Public or other property, responsibility for.

9. Any member of the regiment whose services are dispensed with shall deliver up in good order, fair wear and tear only excepted, all arms, ammunition, accoutrements, clothing, or appointments, or any public stores or property issued to him, and if he refuse or neglect to comply with this regulation he may be proceeded against under the Act. Public property to be returned.

10. Any loss, damage, or destruction of arms, accoutrements, uniform, or stores which may be traced to any member, unless caused by circumstances beyond his control, will be required to be made good by him, or, in default thereof, proceedings against him will be instituted under the Act. Damage to be made good.

11. The Commandant may summarily reduce in rank any non-commissioned officer, or may dismiss or discharge any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or private for misconduct. Reduction or dismissal.

12. Any member of the regiment absent without leave for a period of three months shall be discharged, unless, in the opinion of the Commandant, there be extenuating circumstances. Absent without leave.

13. The commanding officer of a company will keep a muster roll of the whole company, showing the date of enlistment, &c., of each man in it. Division of companies.

## SECTION III.—MEDICAL STAFF.

Uniform.	1. The officers of the Medical Staff will wear the uniform of their corps, and will perform duty with their corps only.
Authority of P.M.O.	2. Whenever the regiment is brigaded with other troops the officers of the Medical Staff will be under the general direction of the principal medical officer of the military forces, and will take rank with officers of the Victorian Medical Staff in accordance with the dates of their commissions.
Relative rank.	
No pay given to officers.	3. No emolument is attached to any of the above appointments.

## SECTION IV.—LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

Leave of absence.	1. Leave of absence, not exceeding three months, may be granted by the commanding officer to all officers, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men of the regiment under his command (those permanently employed excepted), or he may delegate this power to commanding officers of companies. Beyond this period application must be made to the Commandant through the proper channel.
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## SECTION V.—DRESS AND EQUIPMENT.

Uniform will be as authorized by the Dress Regulations

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

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### BY-LAWS OF THE QUEEN VICTORIA HOSPITAL FOR WOMEN.

#### INTRODUCTORY.

1. In these by-laws contributors shall include life governors and annual contributors of £1 and upwards.
2. Office-bearers shall refer to and include president, vice-presidents, treasurer, and secretary.

#### OBJECTS OF HOSPITAL.

3. The object of the hospital shall be to afford to women and children in poor and distressed circumstances the opportunity of obtaining medical and surgical treatment by qualified women medical practitioners.

#### COMMON SEAL.

4. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in the custody of the secretary, and shall be affixed only under the order of the committee, by and in the presence of the secretary or some one deputed by the committee in her or his place, and one other member of the committee, both of whom shall sign their names as witnesses.

#### LIFE GOVERNORS.

5. Every contributor of £20 or upwards in one donation, or in two donations in consecutive years, shall be a life governor.

#### PRIVILEGES OF CONTRIBUTORS.

6. Contributors of £1 per annum shall be entitled to recommend four out-patients in each year, and shall have one vote at all meetings of contributors.
7. Contributors of £20 in one donation, or in two donations in consecutive years, or contributors of £2 per annum, shall be entitled to recommend four out-patients and one in-patient in each year, and shall have one vote at all meetings of contributors.
8. Contributors of £50 in one donation, or in two donations in consecutive years, or contributors of £5 per annum, shall be entitled to recommend seven out-patients and two in-patients in each year, and shall have two votes at all meetings of contributors.
9. Contributors of £100 in one donation, or in two donations in consecutive years, and contributors of £10 per annum, shall be entitled to recommend ten out-patients and three in-patients in each year, and shall have three votes at all meetings of contributors.

10. Any person (not being a paid servant of the hospital) who shall collect and pay to the hospital in any one year in one sum collections to the amount of £20 or upwards, no portion of which shall be annual subscriptions, shall be enrolled and have for the period of five years all the privileges of a contributor of £1 per annum.

11. Every local committee of the Queen's Shilling Fund which has heretofore contributed £30 or upwards to the hospital shall be entitled to nominate a commemoration member, who shall have for life the right to recommend four out-patients in each year.

12. All such local committees hereafter collecting £20 or upwards for the funds of the hospital shall be entitled, in each year in which such collection shall be made, to nominate one individual in respect of every £20 so collected, who shall have for one year all the privileges of a contributor of £1.

13. When a public or corporate body is a contributor to any or either of the amounts hereinbefore specified, it shall be entitled to nominate some one person, who shall have and be entitled to all the privileges attached to such contribution.

14. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through some one member of such firm.

15. Persons who shall have conferred signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscription, may, on the recommendation of the committee, be elected life governors at any general meeting of contributors, and shall enjoy the same privileges as contributors of £20.

16. Any contributor being absent from the colony of Victoria may, by power of attorney, exercise all the privileges to which he or she would be entitled if personally present; but such power of attorney shall be deposited with the secretary of the hospital for record at least four days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

17. The executor or executrix first named in any will, or the administrator or administratrix of any estate, through whom the hospital shall receive any sum exceeding £5, shall have all the privileges of a contributor of one-fourth of the sum contributed.

18. All subscriptions shall be payable in advance. Upon the expiration of the period for which the last subscription shall have been paid the individual shall cease to be a contributor.

19. No first yearly subscription shall entitle to a vote at any general or special meeting within three months from the date of payment.

#### OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE.

20. The committee shall consist of fifteen elected members, of whom eleven shall be women and four men. Five members shall form a quorum.

21. One-third of the fifteen elected members shall retire annually in the month of June, prior to the annual meeting, but shall hold office until the appointment of their successors, and shall be eligible for re-election.

22. All office-bearers shall be appointed annually by the committee from their own number or otherwise, and shall retire annually in the month of June, but shall be eligible for re-election.

23. In the case of any office becoming vacant at any time, otherwise than by effluxion of time, the committee shall fill the same, and the office-bearer or officer so elected shall hold office until the following June, but shall be eligible for re-election.

24. Any extraordinary vacancy occurring in the committee may be filled by the remaining members, in accordance with the provisions of the Act No. 1099.

25. The committee shall direct all the business of the hospital, appoint, suspend, and discharge all medical honorary and paid officers and servants, and may from time to time, as occasion requires, make regulations, not inconsistent with these by-laws, for the regulating of their own proceedings, for defining the duties of medical, honorary, and other officers and servants, for maintaining order among the patients, and generally for all matters connected with the management as they may consider necessary.

26. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the hospital, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the committee, or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association, but no member of the committee shall vote, or take part in, or be present at the discussion of any matter in or before the committee in which he shall directly or indirectly have any pecuniary interest; and no member of the medical staff shall be eligible for or hold office as an office-bearer or member of committee.

27. None but contributors shall be eligible for appointment as members of the committee.

#### AUDITORS.

There shall be two auditors, who shall not be members of committee. The auditors, jointly or severally, may at any time call for the production of all books, papers, accounts, and other documents relating to the affairs of the hospital. They shall, prior to the annual meeting, examine the Treasurer's balance-sheet and statement of accounts, compare the same with the books, papers, vouchers, and documents of the hospital, and if correct shall sign the same. The auditors shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors, and shall hold office until the next annual meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

28. The president, or, in his or her absence, either of the vice-presidents, shall preside at all meetings of the contributors. Should none of these officers be present the meeting shall elect its own chairman.

29. At all meetings all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present. The chairman shall have a casting vote only. All questions other than the election of members of the committee, which shall be by ballot, shall be decided by a show of hands. Provided that five persons present at the meeting may, either before or immediately after a show of hands, demand a ballot of those present on any question.

30. An annual meeting of the contributors shall be held in the month of July in each year, at such time and place as the committee shall appoint, to receive the report of the committee for the year ending 30th June previous, to receive and adopt the balance-sheet of the institution, to fill any vacancies in the committee, to elect two auditors for the ensuing year, and to transact any other business of which notice shall have been given in the advertisements convening the meeting.

31. At any general or special meeting of contributors ten shall form the quorum.

32. Should a quorum not be present within half-an hour after the time appointed for holding the meeting, then the meeting shall be adjourned for one week, to be held on the same day of the week and at the same hour. Should no quorum be present at such adjourned meeting within half-an-hour after the time appointed, then the meeting shall be adjourned *sine die*. It shall not be necessary to give notice of an adjourned meeting.

33. Candidates for the position of member of committee and of auditor shall be nominated in writing by two contributors. All nominations shall be delivered to the secretary five clear days before the day appointed for the election; but if at the time of the meeting less than the number to be elected shall

have been nominated the meeting shall have power to elect without nomination a sufficient number of eligible persons to fill all vacancies.

34. The committee may at any time convene a special meeting of contributors.

35. Upon the requisition of not less than 20 contributors, setting forth the objects for which they desire the meeting to be convened, the committee shall convene a special meeting of the contributors within 21 days from the date of the receipt of such requisition. Should the committee neglect to convene such meeting, then any 20 contributors shall have power to convene the same upon giving notice thereof, as provided in the following clause.

36. Notice of every meeting of the contributors shall be given, by advertisement in one of the daily papers published in Melbourne, at least ten days preceding the date of such meetings.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

37. The honorary medical staff shall consist of eleven persons, exclusive of the consulting staff. The committee may also appoint such number of duly qualified medical practitioners as they from time to time shall think fit to be members of the consulting staff.

38. The visiting and resident medical staff shall consist entirely of women, but either men or women may be appointed to the consulting staff.

39. The present honorary medical staff, consisting of Lilian Alexander, Amy Castilla, Freda Gamble, Jean Greig, Lindsay Greig, Gertrude Halley, Bertha Main, Helen Sexton, Clara Stone, Constance Stone, Mary Page Stone, shall hold office, subject to these by-laws, for a period of four years from the 1st day of January, 1898, but shall thereafter, from time to time, be eligible for re-election, and shall be re-elected unless a resolution to the contrary be passed at a duly convened meeting by a majority of the whole number of the committee, which resolution shall be recorded in the minutes, together with the names of those members voting in favour thereof. All members of the honorary medical staff shall hold office for a period of four years, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided that no member of the honorary medical staff shall hold office after reaching the age of 60 years.

40. In all future appointments to the honorary medical staff no person other than members of the present honorary medical staff shall be eligible for election unless, in addition to the requirements of the Medical Practitioners Act, she possesses a degree in medicine or surgery of the University of Melbourne, or of some University whose degrees are recognised by the University of Melbourne, under the statute for admission *ad eundem gradum*, or a diploma granted by one of the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons of the United Kingdom, and unless she has been in private practice for three years, or has had one year of hospital practice and one year of private practice.

41. All appointments to the medical staff shall be made by the committee.

42. No appointment to the medical staff save as hereinafter provided shall be made, except on the recommendation of a majority of the existing members of the medical staff, provided that no such recommendation shall be necessary for the re-election of any member of the staff under clause 39 hereof.

43. When any vacancy occurs or is about to occur in the honorary medical staff which is not or cannot be filled by re-election of any existing member of the staff, the secretary shall convene a meeting of the existing members of the staff, of which meeting seven days' previous notice shall be given to each existing member, and such meeting shall proceed to nominate such number of eligible persons as they may think fit for such vacancy, and the names of the persons so nominated shall, within three weeks from the receipt of the notice convening the meeting, be submitted to the committee. Should the committee refuse to appoint any of the persons so nominated, the secretary shall again, upon every such refusal by notice as before provided, convene a meeting of the existing members of the staff for the nomination of other persons eligible for the vacancy: Provided that when the staff has nominated for any one vacancy at least four persons the committee shall appoint one of such four nominees: Provided further that where the same persons are nominated for more than one vacancy, and one or more of these persons has been appointed, the person or persons so appointed shall not be deemed one of the four required to be nominated.

44. In the event of the members of the medical staff not making any nomination for any vacancy within three weeks after receipt of the notice convening the meeting under the foregoing clause, the committee may proceed to elect some eligible person to such vacancy without such nomination.

45. No member of the honorary medical staff shall be dismissed unless a resolution to that effect be passed at two duly convened meetings of the committee, one of such resolutions to be passed by a majority of the whole number of the committee: Provided that an interval of not less than four weeks nor more than eight weeks shall intervene between such meetings: And provided further that the member of the staff dealt with by the fresh resolution may be suspended during the interval between the said meetings.

#### GENERAL.

46. No lunatic, or person suffering from any contagious or incurable disease or chronic epilepsy, or pregnant woman, for purpose of confinement, shall be admitted as a patient.

47. All sums received on account of the hospital shall be paid into such bank as the committee may appoint to the credit of one of the following accounts:—

Queen Victoria Hospital Maintenance Fund.  
Queen Victoria Hospital Building Fund.  
Queen Victoria Hospital Endowment Fund.

48. Any moneys of the hospital may be invested in such manner as the committee may direct.

49. No new by-law or alteration or suspension of any by-laws shall be made save by the committee or by an annual or special

meeting of contributors. And notice, in writing, shall be furnished through the secretary to the committee of any such intended alteration not less than fourteen days prior to such meeting. And no alteration and no new by-law shall have any force or effect until the same shall have been confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, and until one month after the same shall have been subsequently published in the *Government Gazette*, as required by the Act No. 1099.

The above were agreed to as the By-laws of the Queen Victoria Hospital, at a meeting of the committee held on the 26th day of July, 1898.
