WESTERN PACIFIC.—LIQUOR PROHIBITION ORDERS AND TRADING LICENCES IN THE GILBERT AND ELLICE ISLANDS.

THE following Regulations, received by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government from Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, are published for general information.

QUEEN'S REGULATION.

(Made in the name of, and on behalf of, Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893.)

To provide for the issue of *Liquor Prohibition Orders in the Gilbert and Ellice Protectorates.*

[L.S.] G. T. M. O'BRIEN.

1. This Regulation shall apply only to the Protectorates of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands.

2. (a) In this Regulation the term "Resident Commissioner" shall include any officer appointed as an Assistant to the Resident Commissioner.

(b) "Police" shall include all constables and any persons acting as such under the orders and authority of the Resident Commissioner.

3. It shall be lawful for the Resident Commissioner, upon satisfactory proof that any person is of confirmed intemperate habits, to prohibit such person, for such period as to the Resident Commissioner may seem fit, from drinking intoxicating liquor or having it in his possession.

4. Any prohibited person who shall be convicted of drinking intoxicating liquor or having it in his possession shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or, in default of payment, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month; and any intoxicating liquor found in the possession of a prohibited person shall be seized by the police, and shall be sold or otherwise disposed of according to the orders of the Resident Commissioner.

5. Any person, whether on board ship or otherwise, who shall sell, give, or supply to, or aid or abet in procuring intoxicating liquor for, a prohibited person, unless for medical purposes—the burden of proof of which shall be on the seller, giver, supplier, aider, or abettor—shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or, in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

6. Every order of prohibition made hereunder shall be filed in the Court of the High Commissioner in the Protectorate; and every such order shall remain in full force until the date of expiry (if any) named therein, or until cancelled by the Resident Commissioner; and such order shall not become void merely by reason of the prohibited person leaving the Protectorate.

7. Lists of persons prohibited under this Regulation shall be exhibited from time to time on all court-houses and in such public places as the Resident Commissioner considers desirable. This Regulation may be cited as "The Gilbert and Ellice Liquor Prohibition Regulation 1897."

QUEEN'S REGULATION.

(Made in the name of, and on behalf of, Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893.)

To amend Regulation No. 2 of 1894 "For the purpose of Raising a Revenue to Defray the Expenses of Government within the Protectorate established by Her Majesty in the Gilbert Group."

1. Section 4 of the Regulation No. 2 of 1894 is hereby cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:—

For every licence to trade on shore (hereinafter called a "trading licence") a sum of Twelve pounds shall be paid, and a separate licence must be obtained by every person engaged in trading on shore.

2. This Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1898.

QUEEN'S REGULATION.

(Made in the name of, and on behalf of, Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893.)

To provide for the amendment of "The Gilbert and Ellice Liquor Prohibition Regulation 1897."

1. All proceedings taken under "The Gilbert and Ellice Liquor Prohibition Regulation 1897" shall be taken in open court, and any person aggrieved by the issue of any order or the passing of any sentence thereunder shall be entitled to forthwith appeal to the High Commissioner, and, pending the result of the appeal, the execution of such order or sentence shall be suspended, provided that, in the case of a penalty imposed under section 4 or section 5 of the Regulation aforesaid, the appellant when he makes appeal do furnish security approved by the Resident Commissioner, and not exceeding twice the amount of the penalty imposed, to appear in due course and abide by the decision of the High Commissioner.

2. This Regulation may be cited as "The Gilbert and Ellice Liquor Prohibition Regulation 1898."

Sir, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that, in pursuance of directions from Her Majesty's Government, the Solomon Islands Protectorate has recently been extended so as to include all the Islands which lie between the Solomon and Torres Groups. A complete list of the Islands thus brought under British protection is enclosed.

2. Search was made for Motuiti or Kennedy Island, shown on the Admiralty charts as "existence very doubtful," but it was not found to exist in the space between lat. 8° 25' and 8° 45' S. and long. 166° 38' and 168° 58' E.

REGULATIONS.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects :-

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

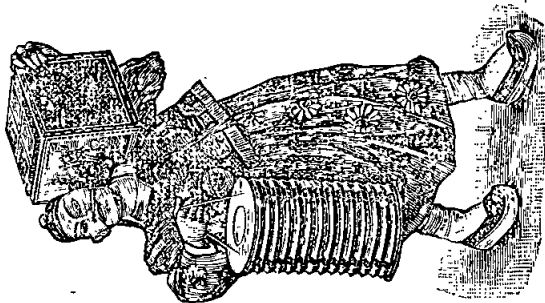

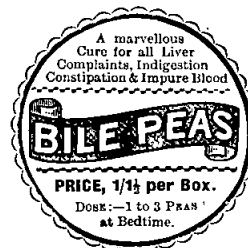

Health Act 1890.
SHIRE OF RIPON.
BY-LAW No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into operation, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. Every pan or other movable receptacle provided by any household for the reception of night-soil shall be constructed of suitable impervious material, and shall be provided with handles, and the capacity of every such pan and receptacle shall not exceed three cubic feet.

2. No person shall remove or contract for the removal of night-soil except by permission, and with the authority of the Council of the Shire of Ripon.

3. Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

4. This By-law No. 4 shall only apply to and have operation in that part of the Shire of Ripon situated within the boundaries of the township of Beaufort.

5. This by-law shall come into operation from and after the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

The above by-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Ripon this 5th day of November, 1891, and the seal of the council ordered to be affixed thereto.

INTRODUCTION OF CATTLE, HORSES, SHEEP,
AND DOGS INTO VICTORIA FROM SOUTH
AUSTRALIA, NORTH OF QUARANTINE
BOUNDARY LINE, PROHIBITED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of September, 1898.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act, and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and that such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, prohibit the introduction of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs into Victoria from South Australia, north of the quarantine boundary line, as follows:—

QUARANTINE BOUNDARY LINE.

Commencing at the four hundred and fiftieth mile post on the boundary between the Northern Territory and Queensland; thence north-westerly by a straight line to the south-east corner of pastoral lease 1676; thence west along south boundaries of leases 1676, 1449, 1511, across 761 in a straight line to the south-east corner of lease 1726, along south boundaries of leases 1726 and 971 to the south-west corner of the latter lease; thence south to the south-east corner of lease 783A; thence west along south boundary of said lease to its south-west corner; thence south to the south-east corner of lease 1718; thence west along south boundaries of leases 1718, 760, and 759 to the south-west corner of the last lease; thence south-westerly by a straight line to the south-east corner of lease 1809; thence along south boundaries of leases 1809 and 1811, and true west to the boundary between the Northern Territory and Western Australia.

And the Honorable John William Taverner, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF
CATTLE, HORSES, SHEEP, AND DOGS FROM
QUEENSLAND, VIA SOUTH AUSTRALIA, INTO
VICTORIA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of September, 1898.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

Mr. Peacock | Mr. Gavan Duffy.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, No. 1141, it is among other things provided that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time make such Regulations under the said Part of the said Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes in Section 4 of the said Act mentioned; and may rescind the same: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to make the following Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power him enabling in that behalf, make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations shall come into force forthwith on the making of the same.

2. In the construction of these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, the following words shall include the meanings respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

“Owner” shall include overseer or drover having the care, custody, or control of any stock.

“Stock” shall include all animals, whatever their sex, description, or age, of the horse, ox, sheep, or dog kind.

“Stabled Horses” shall mean horses which have constantly and habitually been groomed and stabled for a period of not less than one calendar month immediately preceding the date when it is intended to introduce them into Victoria.

3. Any owner desiring to introduce into Victoria stock from Queensland, *via* South Australia, shall give not less than 48 hours' notice, in writing, of such his desire to the inspector of stock at the appointed crossing-place at which he desires such stock to cross, or, in the case of “stabled horses,” proposed to be introduced by sea, to the inspector of stock at the port of Melbourne.

4. The owner of stock (other than stabled horses) from any part of Queensland the introduction into Victoria of stock by land from which has not been prohibited under some law for the time being in force travelling or located in any part of South Australia, south of the boundary line described in Schedule “F” hereto, shall, before being entitled to introduce the same into Victoria, produce to the Victorian Inspector of Stock, at the appointed crossing-place, a certificate under the hand of one or more South Australian Inspectors of Stock at the appointed crossing places on the boundary line between South Australia and Queensland, or places where inspections are made prior to authority being given for the introduction of Queensland stock in the form or to the effect of that contained in Schedule “A” hereto, indorsed under the hand of some one or more South Australian district inspectors of stock along route travelled by such stock.

5. The owner of stabled horses or dogs from any part of Queensland the introduction into Victoria of such horses and dogs from which has not been prohibited as aforesaid shall, before being entitled to introduce the same into Victoria, if travelling or located in any part of South Australia south of the boundary line described in Schedule “F” hereto, produce to the Victorian Inspector of Stock at the appointed crossing-place, or, in the case of stabled horses or dogs proposed to be introduced by sea, to the inspector of stock at the port of Melbourne, a certificate in the form or to the effect of that contained in Schedule “B” hereto, under the hand of the South Australian Inspector of Stock for the place where such horses or dogs were crossed into or landed in South Australia.

6. In addition to the certificate heretofore provided for on the introduction of stock or stabled horses, as the case may be, such owner shall, at the same time, furnish to the Victorian Inspector of Stock a statutory declaration in the case of stock, other than stabled horses or dogs, in the form or to the effect in Schedule “G” hereto, and in the case of stabled horses or dogs in the form or to the effect in Schedule “E” hereto, declaring that none of the stock proposed to be introduced into Victoria has been affected with ticks or tick, or Texas fever, or during the preceding six months from the date of such declaration been in direct or indirect contact with stock so affected, and have not during that time been in that portion of the Northern Territory of South Australia to the north of the boundary line described in Schedule “F” hereto, and have not during that time been in that portion of Queensland to the north of the boundary line the introduction of stock from which has been prohibited, and where such stock consists of or includes any cattle or horses other than stabled horses, that such stock has been in South Australian territory south of the prohibited line for a period of not less than three calendar months immediately preceding the date of the making of the statutory declarations; or, where such stock consists wholly of stabled horses or dogs or stabled horses and dogs, that such horses or dogs or horses and dogs have been in South Australian territory south of the prohibited line for a period of not less than one calendar month immediately preceding the date of the making of the statutory declaration, and where such horses or dogs are proposed to be introduced by sea, that the vessel in which such horses or dogs have been

brought to Victoria has not called at or been at any port or place in the Northern Territory of South Australia, or in the colony of Queensland, within a period of three calendar months from the date of making of such declaration.

7. Before any stabled horses or dogs are permitted to be introduced into Victoria under these Regulations the same shall, at the time of their introduction, be thoroughly disinfected to the satisfaction of the Victorian Inspector of Stock so as to effectually exterminate all ticks or tick, if any there be, about such horses or dogs.

8. If required by the Victorian Inspector of Stock the owner of all stock (other than an animal of the dog kind) proposed to be introduced into Victoria shall cause such stock to be yarded in some suitable place provided with a crush, and shall provide all the assistance necessary in the opinion of the inspector to fully and closely inspect such stock, and give the inspector every assistance in the carrying out of this duty.

In the case of an animal of the dog kind such owner shall cause the same to be brought to the inspector and aid and assist the inspector in closely inspecting the same.

9. If the Victorian Inspector of Stock is satisfied that all the stock proposed to be introduced into Victoria is free from tick or ticks, or Texas fever, and that the owner has complied with the provisions of these Regulations, such inspector may give such owner a permit authorizing the introduction of such stock into Victoria at Serviceton or Penola, or such other place as the Chief Inspector of Stock may appoint, or, in the case of stabled horses, at the port of Melbourne.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

THE Furniture Board has fixed the 17th of October, 1898, as the date from which the following Determination of the Board shall come into force:—

1. That paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6 of the Determination of the Furniture Board, gazetted on the 13th of April, 1897, be repealed; and paragraph 8 of the same Determination be amended by striking out the following words, viz.:—

“Cohen Bros. and Co.’s, 107 Lonsdale-street, Melbourne;
 G. A. Teels and Co.’s, 634 Elizabeth-street, Melbourne;
 J. T. Mullaney’s, 29 Little Latrobe-street, Melbourne;”

also that the subsequent Determination of the Board, gazetted on the 13th of August, 1897, be repealed, the whole to take effect from and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force.

ADULTS.—Wages.

2. That the lowest rate of wages to be paid to any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture usually made or partly prepared by cabinet-makers, chair and couch makers, upholsterers, wood carvers, french polishers, and wood turners, shall be One shilling per hour.

MALE APPRENTICES.—Number.

3. That for each of the following six branches of the furniture trade, viz.:—

Cabinetmakers,	Wood carvers,
Chair and couch makers,	French polishers,
Upholsterers,	Wood turners,

the number of male apprentices who may be employed within any factory or work-room shall be in proportion to the number of journeymen employed for the past nine months in each such branch of the trade as follows, and no more, viz.:—

One male apprentice to four or under four such journeymen, two male apprentices to eight such journeymen, three male apprentices to twelve and over twelve such journeymen.

MALE IMPROVERS.—Number.

4. That for each of the following six branches of the furniture trade, viz.:—

Cabinetmakers,	Wood carvers,
Chair and couch makers,	French polishers,
Upholsterers,	Wood turners,

the number of male improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room shall be one male improver only for each such branch of the trade in which at least four journeymen have been employed for the past nine months.

MALE IMPROVERS.—Wages.

5. That the following shall be the lowest rates of wages to be paid to any male improver employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any articles of furniture, viz.:—

To any male improver having under 2 years’ experience	10 0	per week
To any male improver having over 2 and under 3 years’ experience	15 0	"
To any male improver having over 3 and under 4 years’ experience	25 0	"
To any male improver having over 4 and under 5 years’ experience	32 6	"
To any male improver having over 5 years’ experience	...	the minimum wage

FEMALES.—Wages.

6. That the lowest rate of wages to be paid to any female with over 4 years’ experience in the furniture trade, employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any articles of furniture, shall be Twenty shillings per week of 48 hours.

FEMALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.—Number.

7. That the number of female apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room shall be in proportion to the number of females employed with over 4 years’ experience in the furniture trade, as follows, and no more, viz.:—

One female apprentice or improver to three and under three such females; two female apprentices or improvers to four such females; three female apprentices or improvers to eight such females; four female apprentices or improvers to twelve and over twelve such females.

FEMALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.—Wages.

8. That the following shall be the lowest rates of wages to be paid to female apprentices or improvers employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any articles of furniture, viz.:—

To any female apprentice or improver with under 1 year’s experience	5 0	per week
To any female apprentice or improver with over 1 and under 2 years’ experience	7 6	"
To any female apprentice or improver with over 2 and under 3 years’ experience	12 6	"

BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the Borough of Inglewood, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 31, for the regulation and government of drivers of bicycles and other velocipedes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Inglewood order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between the hours of sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or machine, or any horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger proceeding or standing in the street or carriage-way he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, machine, horse, or other beast of burden, or foot passenger, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine by sounding a bell or whistle, and shall pass at a distance of not less than 6 feet on the off side, and shall maintain such distance for at least 30 feet ahead of such vehicle, machine, horse, or other beast of burden, or foot passenger, before crossing to the near side of the roadway.

5. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. No person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater pace than at the rate of 8 (eight) miles per hour upon or along any of the streets or public places within the borough of Inglewood.

7. No person whilst driving, riding, or impelling a machine through the said streets or public places shall ride with his hands off the handle bars, or otherwise ride the machine carelessly or negligently, but shall so ride, drive, or impel the machine that he shall at all times retain full control thereof.

8. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the borough of Inglewood.

9. Any person offending against or failing to observe this by-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (£5) five pounds.
