## USE OF PRIVATE POST CARDS.

USE OF PRIVATE POST CARDS.

III S Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, pursuant to the provisions of the Post Office Acts, has approved that private cards bearing adhesive stamps be allowed to he used as post cards to the United Kingdom and foreign countries under the following conditions, namely:—

That they be made of ordinary cardboard, not thicker than the material used for the official post card, and measure not less than 4 x 3 inches nor more than 5½ x 3½ inches.

That the words "post card" be written or printed on the face thereof, and in the case of "reply post cards" the reply half bear the words "reply post card."

That on the face of the card there be allowed to be written or printed, the name and address of the sendet.

That engravings or advertisements may be printed on the face, but must not interfere in any way with the clear indication of the address or with the stamping and marking of the postal service.

That on the reverse side any communication may be written or printed, but nothing whatever may be attached except adhesive stamps in payment of stamp duty should dutiable instruments be written thereon.

In all other matters private cards will be subject to the same conditions as official post cards.

FRENCH PASS, COOK STRAIT.

CAPITAIN MCLEAN, of the S.S. Penguin, having reported the existence of a sandbank at the eastern entrance to the French Pass, a survey of the locality has been made by Mr. T. Perham, Assoc. M. Inst. C.E., who reports that he found the bank, which is composed of fine sand and broken shell, with here and there small patches of close-growing dwarf kelp. The bank, which is narrow, and a quarter of a mile in length, trends easterly into Admiralty Bay from Reef Point at the Fisherman's Pass, all within the 3-fathom line, with from 2\tilde{\text{to}} to 2\tilde{\text{fathoms}}, low water spring-tides, on its shallowest part. There is a passage of from 8 to 10 fathoms, one cable in width, between the western end and Collinet Point there is a passage 2\tilde{\text{c}} cables wide, with from 9 to 12 fathoms of water. The extreme eastern point of the shoal bears N.W. \(\frac{1}{2}\) N. from Collinet Point, and N.E. \(\frac{1}{2}\) N. from the heacon in the Pass; and from Reef Point, E.N.E.; all bearings angulatic.
