WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.

BRITISH PROTECTORATE OVER THE BELLONA, STEWART, AND RENNELL ISLANDS, THE SANTA CRUZ AND REEF GROUPS, AND THE ISLAND OF TUCOPIA.

Post Office Acts.

USE OF PRIVATE POST CARDS.

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, pursuant to the provisions of the Post Office Acts, has approved that private cards bearing adhesive stamps be allowed to be used as post cards to the United Kingdom and foreign countries under the following conditions, namely:—

That they be made of ordinary cardboard, not thicker than the material used for the official post card, and measure not less than 4 x 3 inches nor more than 5½ x 3½ inches.

That the words "post card" be written or printed on the face thereof, and in the case of "reply post cards" the reply half bear the words "reply post card."

That on the face of the card there be allowed to be written or printed, the name and address of the sender.

That engravings or advertisements may be printed on the face, but must not interfere in any way with the clear indication of the address or with the stamping and marking of the postal service.

That on the reverse side any communication may be written or printed, but nothing whatever may be attached except adhesive stamps in payment of stamp duty should dutiable instruments be written thereon.

In all other matters private cards will be subject to the same conditions as official post cards.

FRENCH PASS, COOK STRAIT.

CAPTAIN McLEAN, of the s.s. *Penguin*, having reported the existence of a sandbank at the eastern entrance to the French Pass, a survey of the locality has been made by Mr. T. Perham, Assoc. M. Inst. C.E., who reports that he found the bank, which is composed of fine sand and broken shell, with here and there small patches of close-growing dwarf kelp. The bank, which is narrow, and a quarter of a mile in length, trends easterly into Admiralty Bay from Reef Point at the Fisherman's Pass, all within the 3-fathom line, with from 2½ to 2¾ fathoms low water spring-tides, on its shallowest part. There is a passage of from 8 to 10 fathoms, one cable in width, between the western end of the bank and Reef Point; and between its eastern end and Collinet Point there is a passage 2½ cables wide, with from 9 to 12 fathoms of water. The extreme eastern point of the shoal bears N.W. ½ N. from Collinet Point, and N.E. ¼ N. from the beacon in the Pass; and from Reef Point, E.N.E.; all bearings magnetic.

It is intended to place a buoy off the end of the shoal. The position of the buoy will be duly notified. Charts, &c., affected: Admiralty Charts Nos. 1096, 2054, 2616, 2634, and 2655; *New Zealand Pilot*, Chapter v., pages 222 and 223.

PROTECTION OF FISH IN THE RESERVE FOR A NATIONAL PARK.

It is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Administrator of the Government to issue a Proclamation for a close season for the whole year for all Fish within the limits of the Reserve for a National Park as under:—

Wilson's Promontory, 91,000 acres, more or less, county of Buln Buln, parishes of Beek Beek, Warreen, Kulk, and Tallang; Commencing at a point on the shore of Bass Strait, in line with the east boundaries of blocks 74 and 76, parish of Yanakie

South, bounded thence by a line, the said blocks and a line bearing north to the shore of Corner Inlet; thence by that shore north-easterly and northerly to the south boundary of the township of Seaforth; thence by that boundary bearing east to the shore of Bass Strait aforesaid; and thence by that shore southerly, westerly, and north-westerly to the point of commencement, excepting the Light-house Reserve and the allotments at Refuge Cove surveyed for Matthew Watson, Alexander Watson, and James Watson respectively, and the roads in connexion therewith.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visé voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining; if deemed necessary.

5. CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette* the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust shall have authority to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted, by section 25 of the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid, that whenever a Waterworks District is either wholly or, with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud, for a loan of Forty-four thousand pounds sterling (£44,000) for the purpose of purchasing the existing waterworks and constructing certain others for the supply of a portion of the Borough of St. Arnaud with water, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks;
- (2) The Municipal Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud for the time being, and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Forty-four thousand pounds sterling (£44,000), and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the lands within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing on the south boundary of parish of St. Arnaud at the south-west angle of borough boundary; thence northerly, westerly, and northerly by the said borough boundary to its north-west angle; thence easterly to its north-east angle; thence southerly, easterly, southerly, north-easterly, southerly, south-westerly, and westerly by borough boundary to the point of commencement.

Portion II.—Commencing at the west angle of allotment 11, sec. I, parish of Moollerr; thence easterly by the south boundary of Borough of St. Arnaud to the intersection of borough boundary and three-chain road from Avoca to St. Arnaud; thence south-easterly by the west boundary of said three chain road about one hundred and twelve chains; thence south-westerly by a line from three-chain road, in allotment 116a, twenty chains; thence north-westerly by a line to the north-east angle of allotment 9a; thence north-westerly along the north boundaries of allotments 9a, 9, and 10, sec. WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in any such Order, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Trust: And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the 2nd February, 1886, a Waterworks Trust known as the Shire of Kara Kara Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, having authority as such Waterworks Trust within certain lands, the limits whereof were, in and by the said Order in Council, duly proclaimed and defined: And whereas it is deemed necessary to diminish the District of the said Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order that the District of the said Shire of Kara Kara Waterworks Trust shall be and the same is hereby diminished by the excision therefrom of the lands comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing at the west angle of allotment 11, sec. I, parish of Moollerr; thence easterly by the south boundary of Borough of St. Arnaud to the intersection of borough boundary and three-chain road from Avoca to St. Arnaud; thence south-easterly by the west boundary of said three-chain road about one hundred and twelve chains; thence south-westerly by a line from three-chain road, in allotment 116a, twenty chains; thence north-westerly by a line to the north-east angle of allotment 9a; thence north-westerly along the north boundaries of allotments 9a, 9, and 10, sec. DELIVERY OF MILK IN THE CITY OF PRAHRAN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of September, 1898.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act 1886* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, upon receiving a petition certified by the municipal clerk of any municipal district as having been signed by a majority of the bakers or butchers or vendors of milk respectively having shops in such district, may make regulations prohibiting the delivery of bread or meat or milk (as the case may be) from a cart or in the street, or at any house or premises, on any one specified day in each month, or on any specified afternoon in each week after One o'clock; And whereas a petition has been received so certified as having been signed by a majority of the vendors of milk having shops in the municipal district of the City of Prahran praying that a Regulation be made prohibiting the delivery within the said municipal district of milk from a cart or in the street, or at any house or premises, on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation (that is to say):—

No person shall within the municipal district of the City of Prahran deliver or cause or permit to be delivered any milk from any cart or in the street, or at any house or premises, on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATION OF PAWNBROKERS' SHOPS, CITY OF PRAHRAN.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Acts* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, on obtaining a licence to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said *Factories and Shops Acts*, and during such hours as shall be specified in such licence, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council, and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within such district: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the City of Prahran all pawnbrokers' shops (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid) may be permitted, on obtaining a licence, to keep open until Eight o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, and until half-past Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday in each week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class

within such district: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for any pawnbroker's shop in the municipal district of the City of Prahran to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Eight o'clock and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until half-past Ten o'clock on obtaining a licence to keep open during such hours from the Chief Inspector of Factories.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
