CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE RELATIVE TO TUNIS.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosures, are published for general information.

Sir,

With reference to Lord Carnarvon's circular despatch of the 2nd November, 1875, enclosing a copy of the General Convention between the Governments of Great Britain and Tunis of the 19th July, 1875, I have the honour to transmit to you, for C. 8,678, publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between Great Britain and France relative to Tunis, which was signed at Paris on the 18th September, 1897, and ratified in that City on the 15th October, 1897. It will be observed that under Article I of this Convention the Treaties and Conventions of every kind in force between the United Kingdom and France are extended to Tunis.

I also enclose a copy of the Decree of the Bey of Tunis declaring the abrogation of the Treaties and Conventions of every kind concluded with Great Britain relative to Tunis other than this Convention and the Arrangement of 31st December, 1889, which had already extended to Tunis the provisions of the Anglo-French Extradition Treaty of 14th August, 1876. The text of that arrangement is contained in the Order in Council of the 1st May, 1890, for giving it effect, which was enclosed in Lord Knutsford's circular despatch of the 27th May, 1890.

I take this opportunity to state that the wish expressed by the Premier of the Colony whose Government you administer and the Premiers of the other self-governing Colonies except Newfoundland, at the Conference of Colonial Premiers on the 5th July last, that the Colonies should not be included in the most favoured nation stipulations of the Convention, was communicated to the Foreign Office on the 9th of that month, and that effect was given to that view in the subsequent negotiations.

CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE RELATIVE TO TUNIS.

SIGNED AT PARIS, 18TH SEPTEMBER, 1897.

[Ratifications exchanged at Paris, 15th October, 1897.]

WITH a view to determine the relations of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and France in the Regency of Tunis, and to clearly define the position as established by Convention of the aforesaid United Kingdom in the Regency, the Undersigned, duly authorized by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:—

EN vue de déterminer les rapports du Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande et de la France en Tunisie, et de bien préciser la situation conventionnelle du dit Royaume-Uni dans la Régence, les Soussignés, dûment autorisés par leurs Gouvernements respectifs, sont convenus de ce qui suit:—

Article I.

The Treaties and Conventions of every kind in force between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and France are extended to the Regency of Tunis.

The Government of Her Britannic Majesty will abstain from claiming for its Consuls, its subjects, and its establishments in the Regency of Tunis other rights and privileges than those secured for it in France.

Moreover, the treatment of the most favoured nation, which is secured on either side by the afore-mentioned Treaties and Conventions, and the reciprocal enjoyment of the lowest Customs Tariff are guaranteed to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in the Regency of Tunis and to the Regency of Tunis in the United Kingdom for a period of forty years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Agreement.

All merchandise and all manufactured goods, the produce of the United Kingdom, imported into the Regency of Tunis, either directly, or after transshipment at Malta, shall enjoy the advantages conceded by the present Article.

It is further understood that the treatment of the most favoured nation in the Regency of Tunis does not comprise the treatment enjoyed by France.

Article II.

Cotton goods, the produce of the United Kingdom and of British Colonies and possessions, shall not be subject in the Regency of Tunis to import duties higher than 5 per cent. *ad valorem* at the port of discharge. They shall not be charged with any other tax or impost whatsoever.

This provision shall remain in force until the 31st December, 1912, and, after that date, until the expiration of six months from the day on which one of the Contracting Parties shall have notified to the other its intention of terminating its operation.

Article III.

The present agreement shall be ratified, and the ratifications thereof shall be exchanged at Paris as soon as possible.

It shall come into force immediately after the exchange of ratifications.

The existing Customs Tariff on imports into the Regency of Tunis shall, however, continue to be applied until the 31st December, 1897.

DÉCRET DU 16 OCTOBRE 1897.

NOUS, ALI-FACHA-BEY, POSSESSEUR DU ROYAUME DE TUNIS, Vu la déclaration échangée entre le Gouvernement français et les Gouvernements suédois et norvégien, le 5 mai 1897, et les arrangements intervenus avec le Gouvernement britannique les 31 décembre 1889 et 18 septembre 1897.

Avons pris le décret suivant :

Article Premier.

Sont et demeurent définitivement abrogés les traités et conventions de toute nature relatifs à la Tunisie conclus avec les Gouvernements suédois, norvégien et britannique antérieurement aux déclarations précitées.

Art. 2.

Sont étendus à la Tunisie et y seront appliqués, sans autre promulgation que celle du présent décret, les traités et conventions en vigueur entre la France, d'une part, les Royaumes-Unis de Suède et de Norvège et le Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, d'autre part.

Le délai de quatorze jours stipulé à l'article 9 de la convention franco-anglaise d'extradition du 14 août 1876 est porté à deux mois en Tunisie.

With reference to Lord Knutsford's Circular despatch of the 18th November, 1887, enclosing copies of the Convention concerning the creation of an International Union for the protection of Literary and Artistic Works, signed at Berne on the 9th September, 1886, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your Government, copies of a Parliamentary Paper containing an Additional Act, signed at Paris on the 4th May, 1896, modifying certain Articles of that Convention, together with *Procès-Verbal*, dated 9th of September, 1897, recording the deposit of ratifications of the Additional Act.

ADDITIONAL ACT MODIFYING THE INTERNATIONAL COPYRIGHT CONVENTION OF 9TH SEPTEMBER, 1886.

SIGNED AT PARIS, 4TH MAY, 1896.

[Ratifications deposited at Paris, 9th September, 1897.]

Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, Impératrice des Indes; Sa Majesté l'Empereur d'Allemagne, Roi de Prusse, au nom de l'Empire Allemand; Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, Sa Majesté le Roi d'Espagne, en son nom, Sa Majesté la Reine-Régente du Royaume; le Président de la République Française; Sa Majesté le Roi d'Italie; Son Altesse Royale le Grand-Duc de Luxembourg; Son Altesse Sérénissime le Prince de Monaco; Son Altesse le Prince de Monténégro; le Conseil Fédéral de la Confédération Suisse; Son Altesse le Bey de Tunis, également animés du désir de protéger d'une manière toujours plus efficace et plus uniforme les droits des auteurs sur leurs œuvres littéraires et artistiques, ont résolu de conclure un Acte Additionnel à la Convention signée à Berne le 9 Septembre, 1886, concernant la création d'une Union Internationale pour la protection des dites œuvres, et ont nommé pour leurs Plénipotentiaires, savoir:

Lesquels, après s'être communiqué leurs pleins pouvoirs respectifs, trouvés en bonne et due forme, sont convenus des Articles suivants:—

Article I.

La Convention Internationale du 9 Septembre, 1886, est modifiée ainsi qu'il suit:—

1. Article II.—Le premier alinéa de l'Article II. aura la teneur suivante:—

“Les auteurs ressortissant à l'un des pays de l'Union, ou leurs ayants cause, jouissent, dans les autres pays, pour leurs œuvres, soit non publiées, soit publiées pour la première fois dans un de ces pays, des droits que les lois respectives accordent actuellement ou accorderont par la suite aux nationaux.”

Il est, en outre, ajouté un cinquième alinéa ainsi conçu:—

“Les œuvres posthumes sont comprises parmi les œuvres protégées.”

2. Article III.—L'Article III. aura la teneur suivante:—

“Les auteurs ne ressortissant pas à l'un des pays de l'Union, mais qui auront publié ou fait publier, pour la première fois, leurs œuvres littéraires ou artistiques dans l'un de ces pays, jouiront, pour ces œuvres, de la protection accordée par la Convention de Berne et par le présent Acte Additionnel.”

3. Article V.—Le premier alinéa de l'Article V. aura la teneur suivante:—

“Les auteurs ressortissant à l'un des pays de l'Union, ou leurs ayants cause, jouissent, dans les autres pays, du droit exclusif de faire ou d'autoriser la traduction de leurs œuvres pendant toute la durée du droit sur l'œuvre originale. Toutefois, le droit exclusif de traduction cessera d'exister lorsque l'auteur n'en aura pas fait usage dans un délai de dix ans à partir de la première publication de l'œuvre originale, en publiant ou en faisant publier, dans un des pays de l'Union, une traduction dans la langue pour laquelle la protection sera réclamée.”

4. Article VII.—L'Article VII. aura la teneur suivante:—

“Les romans-feuilletons, y compris les nouvelles, publiés dans les journaux ou recueils périodiques d'un des pays de l'Union, ne pourront être reproduits, en original ou en traduction, dans les autres pays, sans l'autorisation des auteurs ou de leurs ayants cause.”

“Il en sera de même pour les autres articles de journaux ou de recueils périodiques, lorsque les auteurs ou éditeurs auront expressément déclaré, dans le journal ou le recueil même où ils les auront fait paraître, qu'ils en interdisent la reproduction. Pour les recueils, il suffit que l'interdiction soit faite d'une manière générale en tête de chaque numéro.”

“A défaut d'interdiction, la reproduction sera permise à la condition d'indiquer la source.”

“En aucun cas, l'interdiction ne pourra s'appliquer aux articles de discussion politique, aux nouvelles du jour, et aux faits divers.”

5. Article XII.—L'Article XII. aura la teneur suivante:—

“Toute œuvre contrefaite peut être saisie par les autorités compétentes des pays de l'Union où l'œuvre originale a droit à la protection légale.”

“La saisie a lieu conformément à la législation intérieure de chaque pays.”

6. Article XX.—Le deuxième alinéa de l'Article XX. aura la teneur suivante:—

“Cette dénonciation sera adressée au Gouvernement de la Confédération Suisse. Elle ne produira son effet qu'à l'égard du pays qui l'aura faite, la Convention restant exécutoire pour les autres pays de l'Union.”

Article II.

Le Protocole de Clôture annexé à la Convention du 9 Septembre, 1886, est modifié ainsi qu'il suit:—

1. No. 1.—Ce numéro aura la teneur suivante:—

“1. Au sujet de l'Article IV. il est convenu ce qui suit:—

“(A) Dans les pays de l'Union où la protection est accordée non seulement aux plans d'architecture, mais encore aux œuvres d'architecture elles-mêmes, ces œuvres sont admises au bénéfice des dispositions de la Convention de Berne et du présent Acte Additionnel.”

“(B) Les œuvres photographiques et les œuvres obtenues par un procédé analogue sont admises au bénéfice des dispositions de ces Actes, en tant que la législation intérieure permet de le faire, et dans la mesure de la protection qu'elle accorde aux œuvres nationales similaires.”

“Il est entendu que la photographie autorisée d'une œuvre d'art protégée jouit, dans tous les pays de l'Union, de la protection légale, au sens de la Convention de Berne et du présent Acte Additionnel, aussi longtemps que dure le droit principal de reproduction de cette œuvre même et dans les limites des Conventions privées entre les ayants droit.”

2. No. 4.—Ce numéro aura la teneur suivante:—

“4. L'accord commun prévu à l'Article XIV. de la Convention est déterminé ainsi qu'il suit:—

“L'application de la Convention de Berne et du présent Acte Additionnel aux œuvres non tombées dans le domaine public dans leur pays d'origine au moment de la mise en vigueur de ces Actes aura lieu suivant les stipulations y relatives contenues dans les Conventions spéciales existantes ou à conclure à cet effet.”

“A défaut de semblables stipulations entre pays de l'Union, les pays respectifs régleront, chacun pour ce qui le concerne, par la législation intérieure, les modalités relatives à l'application du principe contenu dans l'Article XIV.”

“Les stipulations de l'Article XIV. de la Convention de Berne et du présent numéro du Protocole de Clôture s'appliquent également au droit exclusif de traduction, tel qu'il est assuré par le présent Acte Additionnel.”

“Les dispositions transitoires mentionnées ci dessus sont applicables en cas de nouvelles accessions à l'Union.”

Article III.

Les pays de l'Union qui n'ont point participé au présent Acte Additionnel seront admis à y accéder en tout temps sur leur

demande. Il en sera de même pour les pays qui accéderont ultérieurement à la Convention du 9 Septembre, 1886. Il suffira, à cet effet, d'une notification adressée par écrit au Conseil Fédéral Suisse, qui notifiera à son tour cette accession aux autres Gouvernements.

Article IV.

Le présent Acte Additionnel aura même valeur et durée que la Convention du 9 Septembre, 1886.

Il sera ratifié, et les ratifications en seront échangées à Paris dans la forme adoptée pour cette Convention, aussitôt que faire se pourra, et au plus tard dans le délai d'une année.

Il entrera en vigueur, trois mois après cet échange, entre les pays qui l'auront ratifié.

En foi de quoi, les Plénipotentiaires respectifs l'ont signé et y ont apposé le cachet de leurs armes.

Fait en un seul exemplaire à Paris, le 4 Mai, 1896.

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India; His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, in the name of the German Empire; His Majesty the King of the Belgians; Her Majesty the Queen-Regent of Spain, in the name of His Majesty the King of Spain; the President of the French Republic; His Majesty the King of Italy; His Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Luxembourg; His Most Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco; His Highness the Prince of Montenegro; the Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation; His Highness the Bey of Tunis; being equally animated by the desire to protect in a more effective and more uniform manner the rights of the authors over their literary and artistic works, have resolved to conclude an Additional Act to the Convention, signed at Berne on the 9th September, 1886, respecting the establishment of an International Union for the protection of such works, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Mr. Henry Howard, Minister Plenipotentiary in Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy at Paris; Sir Henry G. Bergne, Head of the Commercial and Sanitary Department of the Foreign Office;

His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, His Excellency M. Paul Reichardt, Privy Councillor, Director in the Department of Foreign Affairs; His Excellency Professor Dr. Otto Dambach, Privy Councillor; Dr. Franz Hermann Dungs, Privy Councillor, Referee to the Department of Justice; M. Felix von Müller, Councillor of the German Embassy at Paris;

His Majesty the King of the Belgians, Baron Auguste d'Anethan, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Majesty the King of the Belgians to the French Republic; M. Jules de Borchgrave, Secretary of the Chamber of Representatives; Chevalier Edouard Descamps, Member of the Royal Academy of Belgium, Senator;

Her Majesty the Queen-Regent of Spain, in the name of His Catholic Majesty the King of Spain, the Marquis de Novallas, First Secretary of the Spanish Embassy at Paris;

The President of the French Republic, M. Charles de Saulce de Freyinet, Member of the French Academy, Senator; M. Henri Marcel, Minister Plenipotentiary, Assistant in the Commercial Department in the Ministry for Foreign Affairs; M. Charles Lyon-Caen, Member of the Institute, Professor of the Faculty of Law of Paris; M. Eugène Pouillet, President of the Order of Barristers; M. Louis Renault, Professor of the Faculty of Law of Paris, Legal Adviser of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs;

His Majesty the King of Italy, Commander Luigi Roux, Doctor of Laws, ex-Deputy; Chevalier Georges Polacco, First Secretary of the Italian Embassy at Paris;

His Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Luxembourg, M. Henri Vannerus, Chargé d'Affaires of Luxembourg at Paris;

His Most Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco, M. Hector de Rolland, Councillor of State, Advocate-General of the Superior Court of Monaco; M. Louis Mayer, Head of the Cabinet of His Most Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco;

His Highness the Prince of Montenegro, M. Henri Marcel, Minister Plenipotentiary, Assistant in the Commercial Department of the French Ministry for Foreign Affairs;

The Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation, M. Charles Edouard Lardy, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the Swiss Confederation to the French Republic;

His Highness the Bey of Tunis, M. Louis Renault, Professor of the Faculty of Law of Paris;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

Article I.

The International Convention of the 9th September, 1886, is modified as follows:—

1. Article II.—The first paragraph of Article II. shall run as follows:—

“Authors belonging to any one of the countries of the Union, or their lawful representatives, shall enjoy in the other countries for their works, whether unpublished, or published for the first time in one of those countries, the rights which the respective laws do now or shall hereafter grant to nationals.”

A fifth paragraph is added in these terms:—

“Posthumous are included among those to be protected.”

2. Article III.—Article III. shall run as follows:—

“Authors not belonging to one of the countries of the Union, who shall have published or caused to be published for the first time their literary or artistic works in a country which is a party to the Union, shall enjoy, in respect of such works, the protection accorded by the Berne Convention, and by the present additional Act.”

3. Article V.—The first paragraph of Article V. shall run as follows:—

“Authors belonging to any one of the countries of the Union, or their lawful representatives, shall enjoy in the other countries the exclusive right of making or authorizing the translation of their works during the entire period of their right over the original work. Nevertheless, the exclusive right of translation shall cease to exist if the author shall not have availed himself of it, during a period of ten years from the date of the first publication of the original work, by publishing or causing to be published in one of the countries of the Union, a translation in the language for which protection is to be claimed.”

4. Article VII.—Article VII. shall run as follows:—

“Serial stories, including tales, published in the newspapers or periodicals of one of the countries of the Union, may not be reproduced, in original or translation, in the other countries, without the sanction of the authors or of their lawful representatives.

“This stipulation shall apply equally to other articles in newspapers or periodicals, when the authors or editors shall have expressly declared in the newspaper or periodical itself in which they shall have been published that the right of reproduction is prohibited. In the case of periodicals it shall suffice if such prohibition be indicated in general terms at the beginning of each number.

“In the absence of prohibition, such articles may be reproduced on condition that the source is acknowledged.

“In any case, the prohibition shall not apply to articles on political questions, to the news of the day, or to miscellaneous information.”

5. Article XII.—Article XII. shall run as follows:—

“Pirated works may be seized by the competent authorities of the countries of the Union where the original work is entitled to legal protection.

“The seizure shall take place conformably to the domestic law of each State.”

6. Article XX.—The second paragraph of Article XX. shall run as follows:—

“Such denunciation shall be made to the Government of the Swiss Confederation. It shall only be effective as regards the country making it, the Convention remaining in full force and effect for the other countries of the Union.”

Article II.

The Final Protocol annexed to the Convention of the 9th September, 1886, is modified as follows:—

1. No. 1.—This clause shall run as follows:—

“As regards Article IV., it is agreed as follows:—

“(A.) In countries of the Union where protection is accorded not only to architectural plans, but also to the architectural works themselves, these works shall be admitted to the benefits of the Berne Convention and of the present Additional Act.

“(B.) Photographic works and works produced by an analogous process shall be admitted to the benefits of these engagements in so far as the laws of each State may permit, and to the extent of the protection accorded by such laws to similar national works.

“It is understood that an authorized photograph of a work of art shall enjoy legal protection in all the countries of the Union, as contemplated by the Berne Convention and by the present Additional Act, for the same period as the principal right of reproduction of the work itself subsists, and within the limits of private arrangements between those who have legal rights.”

2. No. 4.—This clause shall run as follows:—

“The common agreement contemplated in Article XIV. of the Convention is established as follows:—

“The application of the Berne Convention and of the present Additional Act to works which have not fallen into the public domain within the country of origin at the time when these engagements came into force, shall operate according to such stipulations on this head as may be contained in special Conventions either actually existing or to be concluded hereafter.

“In the absence of such stipulations between any of the countries of the Union, the respective countries shall regulate, each for itself, by its domestic legislation, the manner in which the principle contained in Article XIV. is to be applied.

“The stipulations of Article XIV. of the Berne Convention and of the present clause of the Final Protocol shall apply equally to the exclusive right of translation, in so far as such right is established by the present Additional Act.

“The temporary stipulations noted above shall be applicable to countries which may hereafter accede to the Union.”

Article III.

The countries of the Union which are not parties to the present Additional Act, shall at any time be allowed to accede thereto on their request to that effect. This stipulation shall apply equally to countries which may hereafter accede to the Convention of the 9th September, 1886. It will suffice for this purpose that such accession should be notified in writing to the Swiss Federal Council, who shall in turn communicate it to the other Governments.

Article IV.

The present Additional Act shall have the same force and duration as the Convention of the 9th September, 1886.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Paris, in the manner adopted in the case of that Convention, as soon as possible, and within the space of one year at the latest.

It shall come into force as regards those countries which shall have ratified it three months after such exchange of ratifications.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Des circonstances particulières ayant empêché de procéder, dans le délai primitivement fixé à l'échange des ratifications sur l'Acte Additionnel du 4 Mai, 1896, modifiant les Articles II., III., V., VII., XII., et XX. de la Convention du 9 Septembre, 1886, et les Numéros 1. et 4 du Protocole de Clôture y annexé, ainsi que sur la Déclaration interprétant certaines dispositions de la Convention de Berne du 9 Septembre, 1886, et de l'Acte Additionnel signé à Paris le 4 Mai, 1896, il a été entendu, d'un commun accord, que ce délai serait ajourné jusqu'à ce jour.

En conséquence, les Soussignés se sont réunis pour faire le dépôt des instruments de cet Acte.

Circumstances having prevented action being taken within the period of delay originally fixed for the exchange of the ratifications of the Additional Act of the 4th May, 1896, modifying Articles II., III., V., VII., XII., and XX. of the Convention of the 9th September, 1886, and clauses 1 and 4 of the Final Protocol annexed thereto, as well as of the Declaration interpreting certain stipulations of the Convention of Berne of the 9th September, 1886, and of the Additional Act signed at Paris on the 4th May, 1896, it has been unanimously agreed that that period should be prolonged until this day.

In consequence whereof, the undersigned have met together in order to deposit the instruments in question.

Germany, Belgium, Spain, France, Italy, Luxembourg, Monaco, Montenegro, Switzerland, and Tunis have ratified both engagements.

Great Britain has ratified the Additional Act alone, on behalf of the United Kingdom, as well as of all the British Colonies and possessions.

Norway has only ratified the interpretative Declaration.

The respective ratifications having been produced and found to be in good and due form, have been handed to the French Minister for Foreign Affairs, in order that they may be deposited in the archives of the Ministry, such deposit to be held equivalent to an exchange of ratifications.

In faith of which the undersigned have prepared the present record of deposit, to which they have affixed their seals.

ADDITIONAL GENERAL REGULATION
RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

for a period of eight weeks from the 1st February, 1898, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty females or more than fifteen boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty females and fifteen boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings and Twelve shillings respectively per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continuously posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

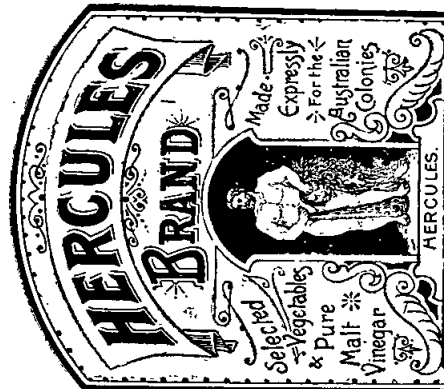

The births of 923 children, viz., 453 boys and 470 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, 127 lower than in December, 1896; and, for the first time in December in the last eleven years, it fell below 1,000. The number was, moreover, 281 below the average during the previous ten years, or 284 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 919, viz., 483 of males and 436 of females; or only 4 less than the number of births—a most unusual circumstance, for in the previous ten years the average excess of births over deaths was 46 per cent., and the lowest was 14 per cent. in 1888. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 184 in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and were more numerous than in the month of December for any other of the previous ten years except 1888 and 1889: they were also 92 above the average of December during the same period, or 90 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.09 and of deaths registered 23.98 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1896 of 27.34 and 19.14 respectively, and during the last ten years of 31.92 and 22.20 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 34.55 and 18.37. Thus, as compared with the previous year, there was a decrease of 34 in the birth rate, but an increase of nearly 5 in the death rate.

A heat wave of unusual intensity passed over the colony during the month under review, the thermometer on five days having risen to over 100 degrees, and on two of them to 107 degrees. The severity of the heat is to some extent also indicated by the deaths from sunstroke, as well as in the general increase in the mortality.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 107.3° on the 30th, and the lowest was 48.2° on the 11th, the former having been exceeded on only five previous occasions in the month of December, on two of which a maximum of 110.7° was recorded, whilst the maximum ever recorded was 111.2° in January, 1862. The mean temperature of the month (68.5°) was nearly 4½° above the average, and nearly 2° higher than the maximum recorded during the previous ten years. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (53.1°) took place on the 16th, and the least range (5.2°) on the 17th. The mean daily range was 22.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.221 inches on the 5th, and the lowest was 29.370 inches on the 31st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.911 inches) was a thirteenth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on five days, the amount being 2.20 inches, which although 1.04 inches higher than in December, 1896, was a little below the average of the previous ten years.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against the same proportion in December, 1896; 42 per cent. in December, 1895; 39 per cent. in December, 1894; 45 per cent. in December, 1893; 49 per cent. in December, 1892; and 54 per cent. in December, 1891.

Seventy-four persons whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years, as compared with only 48 in December, 1896. Of the former a female, aged 75, died of influenza; an ex-police magistrate, aged 75, of softening of the brain; a farmer and a fruit expert, both aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 75, of syncope; a male, of no occupation, and a female, both aged 75, of heart disease: an ex-railway employe, aged 75, of heat apoplexy; a warehouseman, aged 76, of stricture of urethra; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a male, of no occupation, aged 76, of dilatation of the heart; and a saddler, aged 76, of heart disease (undefined); a stonemason and a female, both aged 76, of bronchitis; a jam manufacturer, aged 76, of ulcers; a gentleman, aged 77, of dysentery; a carpenter, aged 77, of phthisis; a brickmaker and a female, both aged 77, of dilatation of the heart, and two females, of the same age, of heart disease (undefined); a carter and a female, both aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 77, of Bright's disease; three females, all aged 78, of diarrhoea; three more, of the same age, of cancer, valvular disease of the heart, and syncope respectively; a blacksmith, aged 78, of asthma; a cook (female), aged 78, of bronchitis; an accountant, aged 78, of enlarged prostate; a farmer, aged 79, of paralysis; two females, each aged 79, of bronchitis and enteritis respectively; a butcher, aged 80, of valvular disease of the heart; a carpenter, aged 80, of senile gangrene; a blacksmith, aged 80, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 80, of hernia; a doctor of medicine, aged 80, of abdominal tumour; two females, each aged 81, of diarrhoea and paralysis respectively; a pensioner, aged 81, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 82, of influenza; a tailor, aged 83, of pneumonia; a collector and a female, each aged 84, of paralysis; a blacksmith, aged 84, of brain disease; a cook, aged 84, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 84, of nephritis; a shepherd, aged 85, and a labourer, aged 86, of bronchitis; a female, aged 86, of hepatitis; a dressmaker, aged 88, of fracture of the skull, the result of being accidentally knocked down by a bicycle; a laundress, aged 89, of cancer; a chemical manufacturer, aged 75, a labourer, aged 77, a bootmaker, a carpenter, and two females, each aged 79, a labourer, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a gentleman and a female, each aged 82, a bricklayer, a cooper, and a female, each aged 85, a gardener, aged 86, a farmer and a male, of un stated occupation, each aged 93, and a gardener, aged 100, of old age.

Thirty-seven deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 31 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A dressmaker, aged 88, died of fracture of the skull, through being knocked down by a bicycle; two boys, each aged 15, and a labourer, aged 41, of injuries, caused in each case by a fall from a horse; a labourer, aged 19, and a stationer, aged 27, of fracture of the spine, caused by diving into shallow water; a female, aged 30, of hæmorrhage from a wound in the head, the result of a fall; another, aged 45, of rupture of the heart, caused by a fall down a cutting; a male child, aged 1 year, a miner, aged 68, and six females, aged 3, 4, 5, 7, 47, and 67 respectively, of burns; as many as eight persons died of heat apoplexy, viz., a male infant, aged 5 months, a labourer, aged 37, a hotel-keeper, aged 39, an ironmoulder, aged 45, a miller, aged 49, a groom, aged 58, an engineer, aged 61, and an ex-railway employe, aged 75; a female child, aged 1 year, and a boy, aged 14, were accidentally drowned, the latter in the River Yarra; also a milkman, aged 26, in Port Phillip Bay whilst swimming a horse; and a seaman, aged 41, in the River Yarra, through falling overboard; a male, of unknown occupation, aged 49, and a labourer, aged 58, were "found drowned" in the River Yarra; and a new-born male infant was suffocated, the evidence being insufficient to show how caused. The homicidal deaths were those of two male infants, who were murdered by suffocation. The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 25, who shot himself; a station hand, aged 63, who poisoned himself; a male, of unknown occupation, aged 25, and a pensioner, aged 72, who hanged themselves.

Two hundred and one deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole—as compared with 148, or 20 per cent. in December, 1896—took place in public institutions, viz., 76 in the Melbourne, 16 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 8 in the Women's, 17 in the Children's, 5 in the Homœopathic, and 5 in the Austin Hospitals; 16 in the Metropolitan and 8 in the Yarra Bend Llanatic Asylums; 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 19 in the Benevolent and 5 in the Infant Asylums, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 398, of which 215, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 183, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 316 were under one year of age, 53 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five. As compared with December, 1896, there was an increase of 85 in the deaths of children, of which 48 were of children under twelve months, and 20 of those between one and two years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 521. Of these, 268, or 51 per cent., were males, and 253, or 49 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 44 were between twenty-five and thirty, 32 were between thirty and thirty-five, 36 were between thirty-five and forty, 42 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty and sixty-five, 57 were between sixty-five and seventy, 44 were between seventy and seventy-five, 43 were between seventy-five and eighty, 19 were between eighty and eighty-five, 9 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of 100 years. As compared with December, 1896, there was an increase of 99 in the number of deaths of persons over five years, distributed chiefly over the ages 25-30, 40-50, and 65 and upwards.

The large increase in the mortality during the month under review as compared with the corresponding one of the previous year is noticeable mainly in the zymotic and local classes—the deaths from the former having increased by 39, and from the latter by 126. There were also increases of 14 in the ill-defined class (chiefly under atrophy and debility), 7 in the dietic, 6 in the developmental (mostly of aged persons), and 1 in the parasitic, whereas there was a decrease of 7 in the constitutional, and of 2 in the violence class. In the zymotic class, deaths from measles rose from nil to 6, diphtheria from 5 to 11, typhoid fever from 10 to 14, diarrhoeal diseases from 37 to 45, syphilis from 1 to 5, pyæmia, &c., from 2 to 10, and puerperal fever from 1 to 3. In the local class there was an increase of 49 under diseases of the nervous, 14 under those of the circulatory, 48 under those of the respiratory (chiefly bronchitis and pneumonia), 18 under those of the digestive, and 6 under those of the urinary system. Under violence, moreover, 8 deaths from sunstroke (which includes heat apoplexy) were recorded in consequence of the excessive heat referred to in another paragraph, as against only 1 in December, 1896.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1897, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November; also, taking the year as a whole, that the mortality from diphtheria was far higher in 1897 than in any previous year since 1891, but that the mortality from typhoid was below the average.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1897.

THE births of 63 boys and 48 girls, or in all of 111 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December. Of these, 44 occurred in Ballarat East, 58 in Ballarat West, 7 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births and 3 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 113, viz., 52 of boys and 61 of girls.

The deaths registered in December numbered 73, viz., 41 of males and 32 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 38. In November the recorded deaths numbered 50; in December, 1896, they numbered 64; in December, 1895, they numbered 76; in December, 1894, they numbered 69; in December, 1893, they numbered 53; in December, 1892, they numbered 53; in December, 1891, they numbered 80; in December, 1890, they numbered 65; in December, 1889, they numbered 72; in December, 1888, they numbered 57; and in December, 1887, they numbered 51.

On the other hand, deaths from cancer fell from 7 to 2; and those from diseases of the circulatory system from 9 to 5.

In the year 1897 the births registered in Ballarat and suburbs numbered 1,336, viz., 680 of males and 656 of females. The deaths registered during the same period numbered 765, viz., 417 of males and 348 of females. The apparent gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was thus:—Males, 233; females, 338; total, 571.

SHIRE OF AVOCA.

BY-LAW UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Avoca, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, viz:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

PREMISES TO BE KEPT SO AS NOT TO BE A NUISANCE.

2. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM HOUSES.

3. Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of default of such occupier the council may remove the same.

RECEPTACLES FOR HOUSE REFUSE.

4. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM PLACES WHERE ANIMALS ARE KEPT.

5. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the council may remove the same.

POWER TO USE REFUSE AS MANURE.

6. Nothing hereinbefore contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used, as to contravene any by-law of the council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM PLACES WHERE NOXIOUS OR OFFENSIVE TRADES ARE CARRIED ON.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the council.

REMOVAL OF BLOOD FROM PLACES WHERE ANIMALS ARE SLAUGHTERED.

8. Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in a proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

REMOVAL OF OFFAL.

9. Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVIES.

10. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed four cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an inch to the foot.

SUPPLY OF DEODORIZING MATERIAL TO EARTH-CLOSETS.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

EMPTYING RECEPTACLES FOR NIGHT-SOIL.

12. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

REMOVAL OF NIGHT-SOIL TO BE BY PROPERLY CONSTRUCTED CONVEYANCES.

13. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

HOURS WITHIN WHICH NIGHT-SOIL MAY BE REMOVED.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven (11) p.m. and Four (4) a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

CONSTRUCTION OF CESSPOOLS.

15. Every cesspool shall be furnished with a watertight cover or roof, and every cesspool formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be provided with watertight walls or sides which project on all sides at least six (6) inches above the surface of the ground.

EMPTYING OF CESSPOOLS.

16. Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises on which there shall be any cesspool, shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

TIMES WITHIN WHICH CESSPOOLS MAY BE EMPTIED.

17. No person shall empty, or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool, or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of Eleven (11) p.m. and Four (4) a.m., or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any cesspool, shall remove or cause to be removed the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

CONVEYANCES BY WHICH CESSPOOLS MAY BE EMPTIED.

18. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

DISPOSAL OF REFUSE AND OFFENSIVE MATTER.

19. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil, or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

NIGHT-SOIL, ETC., REMOVED FROM ANY EARTH CLOSET, ETC., AND DEPOSITED ANYWHERE TO BE COVERED WITH EARTH.

20. Every person placing or depositing, or causing, or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing, or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

EARTH-CLOSETS, ETC., NOT TO BE EMPTIED INTO DRAINS OR SEWERS.

21. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

PREVENTION OF POLLUTION OF WATER.

22. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man or beast for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

CESSPOOLS-NOT TO BE EMPTIED INTO WATER USED FOR DRINKING OR DOMESTIC PURPOSES.

23. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by stock or man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

24. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by stock or man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one (1) week of notice given by the council or by one of its officers.

KEEPING OF ANIMALS.

24A. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

24B. No swine, sheep, or cattle shall be kept on any butcher's premises for slaughtering purposes within that portion of the

township of Avoca contained within the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 2; thence north-east by the southern side of North-street to the north-east angle of allotment 1, section 27A; thence south-east by the western side of Poyce-street to where it intersects the southern boundary of the township of Avoca; thence westerly by the said boundary to Rutherford's Creek; thence north-westerly by the said creek and the Avoca River to the commencing point.

ANIMALS NOT TO BE SO KEPT AS TO POLLUTE WATER.

25. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

SUPPLY OF WATER TO SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

26. Every occupier, or licensee, or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

DRAINAGE OF NEW BUILDINGS.

27. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

DRAINAGE OF EXISTING BUILDING.

28. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired, shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

REGISTRATION OF COW-KEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

29. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the 1st day of May in every year, register himself with the local council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the shire secretary an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five (5) shillings.

30. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the shire secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received; and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

MILK STORES AND SHOPS TO BE KEPT CLEAN.

31. Every person following the trade of a cow-keeper, or dairyman, shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

DAIRYMEN, ETC., TO REPORT DISEASE TO THE HEALTH OFFICER.

32. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the officer of health the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

PENALTIES.

33. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed thereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

EXTENT OF APPLICATION OF BY-LAW.

34. This by-law, containing sections 1 to 34 inclusive, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the shire of Avoca, save and except clause B of section 24, which shall apply to and have operation only in that portion of the township of Avoca described therein.

The foregoing by-law was adopted at a meeting of the Council of the Shire of Avoca, held at the Council Chambers, Moonambel, on the 13th October, and confirmed at a meeting held at the Shire Hall, Avoca, on the 16th November, 1897.

SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

A By-law, No. 15, under Section 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, in the interests of the public health.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bellarine order as follows, for that part of the said shire contained within the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:— Commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Port-Arlington, at the junction of Mercer-street and Smythe-street; thence proceeding north along the east boundary line of Mercer-street to Port Phillip Bay; thence proceeding westerly along the shore of Port Phillip Bay to Sprout-street; thence proceeding southerly along the west boundary line of Sprout-street to the intersection of Sprout-street and Smythe-street; and thence proceeding easterly along the south boundary line of Smythe-street to the commencing point.

That all house, yard, and street refuse be rendered inoffensive or be incinerated in destructors, desiccators, or incinerators provided by the municipality, or that rubbish from houses and yards be placed (without delay) in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall have been introduced when necessary.

That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles be removed, and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor.

That the receptacles be not placed in streets or lanes by the householders, but be taken from the yards and replaced by the scavengers.

That the householders be held responsible for the keeping of the receptacle in an inoffensive condition.

That every closet be furnished with a double-pan service for night-soil.

That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart; and that the council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

That a pan cleansed by super-heated steam, or some equally efficient means approved by council, be left in its place.

That the use of a suitable disinfectant or deodorant be compulsory.

That the night-soil removed be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or be trenched or ploughed into land; that failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made, or from the manager of some approved depot for night-soil, for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

That the officers of the council exercise stringent supervision over all such depots or places of deposit.

That individual householders shall not contract for the removal of either night-soil or any other refuse, except in accordance with this by-law or any other by-laws or regulations of the council.

That all fowl-yards shall, if possible and where necessary for health, be at least 25 feet from any dwelling-house; and

That all buildings be provided with spouting, down-pipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District the water rate for the year 1898 shall be One shilling and ninepence in £1 on the municipal valuation for the year 1897-8, with a minimum charge of £1 upon all lands and tenements valued at or under £11, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 120 of the *Water Act 1890*.

2. All rates and charges on land and tenements having no water meters shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, that is to say, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1898. And all rates and charges on lands and tenements where water meters are affixed payments shall be due and payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1898. All payments shall be payable at the Trust's Offices, Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

KILMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Clauses numbered 1, 2, and 3 of the regulation made and adopted by the Trust on the 5th day of March, 1894, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1898, from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:— For street water-troughs Twenty shillings per year. All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

3. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) Sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at Sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

2. If for other than domestic purposes only, 60,000 gallons per half-year.

THE WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 7.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1898 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months; commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Three pence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements, according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Nine pence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Eleven pounds or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre. For every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1898, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1898, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1898, and the 1st day of July, 1898.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGU-
LATIONS BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS
IN RESPECT TO THE SUPPLY OF WATER AT
KERANG AND CASTLE DONNINGTON.

WHEREAS default having been made by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust in payment of the interest due on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Trust, and the said Trust having also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans, and the Board of Land and Works having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust, and is now maintaining and managing the same.

And whereas the said Board is now desirous of framing Regulations dealing with the maintenance and management of those portions of the works of the Trust comprised within the Urban Districts (towns of Castle Donnington and Kerang) that have been duly so proclaimed by the Governor in Council.

Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each.
2. The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Fourpence per 100 gallons.
3. On all buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate to be charged shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, excepting in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement.
4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity the charge for which at Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) If for other than domestic purposes, only 6,000 gallons per quarter.
5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, stand-pipe, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting, connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Board shall see fit; and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employé, committing any breach of these by-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or with any service-pipe therefrom, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

| Diameter of Pipe. | Weight of Pipe per yard. |

| 1/2 inch | 5 lbs. |
| 3/4 inch | 6 lbs. |
| 1 inch | 7 1/2 lbs. |
| 1 1/4 inch | 9 lbs. |

| 1 3/4 inch | 16 lbs. |
| 2 inch | 20 lbs. |

All fittings must be of good quality, and of strength sufficient to bear with safety the maximum pressure to which they may be subject. Ordinary connexion with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock, screwed ferrules, and with 2 feet of lead piping with brass unions. One service-pipe only for domestic supply for each tenement will be permitted. The maximum size of service-pipes, unless by special consent of the Board, shall be, for tenements of annual value not exceeding £40, 1/2-in. bore for tenements exceeding £40 annual value, 3/4-in. bore.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall be responsible for keeping the same in repair, and in every instance in which, after notice that repairs to service-pipes are required, damage is caused by reason of their leaking or being otherwise out of repair or broken, the occupier or owner shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. All water-troughs supplied from the pipes of the Board shall be lined with metal, so as to be perfectly water-tight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water-trough, the supply to which is charged under sub-section (iv.) of section 2 of these by-laws, shall be of greater capacity than 25 gallons. Should any trough or the fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto will be cut off until the same has been properly and efficiently repaired.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

17. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

18. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Board as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

19. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Board, unless for the purpose of repair, as mentioned in the last preceding section, in which case notice, in writing, must be given to the officer in charge of the works of the Board six days at least before removal.

20. A separate meter shall in every case be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

21. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6ft. 3in. in length along the centre line, by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1ft. 9in., the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted.

22. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

23. No person who may be supplied by measure shall use the water for irrigation purposes after the blowing of the tower whistle at Eight o'clock each evening; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

24. If any person supplied by water by the Board does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

25. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same Regulations, and not otherwise.

26. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

WHEREAS by a Regulation made on the 14th day of December, 1896, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Factories and Shops Acts, directed (1) that it should be lawful for any hairdresser and barber's shop within the municipal district of the Town of Geelong to keep open on the evening of Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until half-past Ten o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until half-past Ten o'clock, on obtaining a licence to keep open during such hours from the Chief Inspector of Factories, and (2) that all hairdressers and barbers' shops within the said municipal district of the Town of Geelong should be closed on Wednesday in each week from the hour of Nine o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas since the making of such Regulation a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council, certified to by the Town Clerk of the municipal district of the Town of Geelong (being the municipal clerk of such district) as being signed by a majority of the hairdressers and barbers keeping shops in the said Town, praying that such Regulation may be rescinded so far as it relates to the closing of all hairdressers and barbers' shops within the said Town on Wednesday afternoon in each week: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the said Regulation made on the 14th day of December, 1896, so far only as it relates to the closing of all hairdressers and barbers' shops within the municipal district of the Town of Geelong, on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, limiting the hours during which shops mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890 within such district may be kept open, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class within such district to be affected thereby: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that a regulation may be made limiting, in the municipal district of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington, the hours during which tobacconists' shops (being shops mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890 aforesaid) may be kept open by directing that they shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class to be affected thereby: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All tobacconists' shops in the municipal district of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermin District shall be Five shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District shall be Four shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District shall be Seven shillings and Sixpence per square mile.
