

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Land Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead tumber, or particular description of timber or back, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are moused in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conterred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Cunneil thereof, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall, unless he hold a special permit issued under the authority of the Minister of Lands, cut, dig, or remove live pine, box, or bull-oak timber on or from the Crown lands comprised in the mallee border.

This prohibition, however, shall not extend to any such timber on a mallee block or allotment, provided it be cut or removed by the lessee thereof solely for the purposes of fencing or building or making any such like improvements on the block or allotment comprised in his lease.—(1889)[157.)

VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—ADDITIONAL DRESS REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of October, 1898.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Defences and Discipline Act 1890 it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amond the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Dress Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

After the end of Part XIII. of the said Regulations the following Regulations are added, viz.:-

PART XIIIA .- VICTORIAN SCOTTISH REGIMENT.

OFFICERS.

Doublet.—Scarlet cloth, with collar and cuffs of yellow cloth. The collar ornamented with §-in. lace along the top, and silver Russia braid at the bottom. Gauntlet cuffs 4 inches deep in front and 6 inches at the back, edged with ½-in. lace round the top and down the back seam. Three loops of silver braid with buttons on each cuff. Eight buttons in front and two at the waist behind. Inverness skirts, 6½ inches deep, with skirt flaps 6 inches deep; three loops of silver braid with buttons on each skirt flap. The front, collar, skirts, and flaps edged with white cloth ½ inch wide, and the skirts and flaps lined with white. Shoulder straps of twisted round silver cord, universal pattern, lined with scarlet, small button at top, badges of rank in gold. Field Officers have a second bar of lace round the top of the cuffs, and ½-in. lace round the skirts and skirt flaps. Lieutenant-Colonels have a line of braid within the lace on the cuffs. Lieutenants have a line of braid within the lace on the cuffs. Lieutenants have the same lace on the cuffs as the Captains, without the line of braid. The several bars of lace and lines of braid on the cuffs are to be ¼ inch apart.

Facings .- Yellow cloth.

Pantaloons.—Tartan of authorized pattern.

Boots.—Black leather.

Spurs.—Steel. Brass for Field Officers when in Mess Dress.

Belted Plaid, Shoulder Plaid, Kilt, Trews, Hose, Garters, Skean Dhu, Gaiters, Shoes, and Buckles.—Of authorized regimental pattern.

Brooch.—Of authorized regimental pattern. The diameter not to exceed 3% inches. Undress brooches are not to be worn.

Sporrans.—Of authorized regimental pattern. The sporran top is not to exceed 6 inches in width. The breadth of the sporran leather is not to exceed 8½ inches. The length of the top and leather together will not exceed 11 inches. Officers may wear undress sporrans resembling those of the men.

Helmet, White.—As per scaled pattern. Universal badge to be worn in front of helmet.

Claymore.—Steel, basket hilt, lined with scarlet cloth, straight cut-and-thrust blade, 1½ inches wide at the shoulder, and 32 inches long. In the hilt for Field Officers the basket-work is cut away, so that the hilt resembles an ordinary Infantry sword hilt.

Scabbard.-Steel, for all ranks.

Waist-belt.—White leather, 11 inches wide, with slings 1 inch wide hanging from two white-metal rings.

Sword-belt (Dress) for Field Officers.—Dress Dirk-belt, with slings 1 inch wide hanging from two white-metal rings.

Shoulder-belt, for Company Officers.-White leather, 3 inches wide, with slings hanging from white-metal rings.

Waist-plate, Breast-plate, Dirk, Dirk-belt and Plate, Dress Dirk-belt, Undress .- Of authorized regimental patterns. The dirk is not to exceed in length 171 inches over all, from extreme length of dirk-handle to the point of the sheath. The blade should not be more than 13 inches in breadth at the broadest part. The undress dirk-belt is to be of plain white or black leather.

Sash .- Crimson silk, Highland pattern. Dimensions; unstretched-15 inches wide in the middle and 7 inches at the commencement of the fringe.

Mess Jacket.-Scarlet cloth, of the same pattern as the Infantry.

Mess Waistcoat .- As for Infantry.

Jacket. - Brown tweed. Skirts rounded off well in front. Collar, stand and fall with two hooks and eyes, fall edged round base and front with 1-in. black mohair braid, traced inside with one row of black mohair Russia braid forming eye in corners. Five small linen buttons on inside for white linen or celluloid collar. Four 1-in, pleats down the centre of back. One breast patch pocket (51 inches wide by $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches deep), with $1\frac{1}{2}$ -in. box pleats, corners square at top and slightly rounded at the bottom, pointed flaps to button with small silver-plated button on each breast. Five jacketsize white-metal buttons down the front. White linen or celluloid square-cornered stand-up collar, buttoning to inside of collar of jacket and showing 4 inch above it, to meet in front. Cuffs braided as an imitation gauntlet with 3-in. black mohair braid; height at back seam, 71 inches; and at front, 31 inches. Three small W.M. buttons. Three double rows of black Russia tracing braid.

Shoulder Knots.-Special design of round silver lace and scarlet cord. Screw button and socket badges of rank on shoulder knots.

Forage Cap.—As for Infantry, with diced bands of regimental pattern. Regimental badge in silver over rosette of regimental colour, to be worn in front.

Glengarry.—Blue, of pattern similar to that worn by the men, with diced band. Bottom of cap bound with black silk. Regimental badge in silver over rosette of regimental colour to be worn on the left side $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches from the point in front, and the lower part of the badge to be 1 inch from the bottom of the cap.

No. 1106, Part I.) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in Part I. of the said Act, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS DATED 3RD JULY, 1893.

Chapter XI.—Licences.—State Forests and Timber Reserves.

There may be issued special permits to cut and remove props from that portion of the Wombat State Forest described in Proclamation bearing date 14th June, 1898, and published in the Government Gazette of 17th June, 1898, p. 2443.

Every such permit shall be for a term not exceeding , and shall be subject to the conditions specified

The payment to be made for the props shall be on the following

12-inch props, 8s. per 100 running feet.
10-inch props, 3s. per 100 running feet.
8-inch props, 1s. 9d. per 100 running feet.
6-inch props, 9d. per 100 running feet.

Conditions.

1. The cutting of props to be performed under the supervision of the district forester and in accordance with his instructions, but in no case shall any timber be felled on the area until the trees that require cutting down have been marked by the Forest Officer

Officer.

2. Receipt for payment of fees must be produced at any time, on the request of a bailiff of Crown lands.

3. The permit-holder only to be employed felling young timber, but others employed by him may cut the same up in lengths for props only.

4. Boundaries of area to be clearly defined before operations

4. Boundaries of area to be clearly defined before operations commence.

5. The permit-holder shall be responsible for the due protectection of all timber on the block, and shall not permit any damage to the same. He shall also stack and burn all débris when directed to do so by the officer in charge.

6. The permit-holder may cut upon this block as late in the year as is consistent with safety from bush fires. Upon receiving fourteen days' notice the permit-holder must at once clear up his block to the satisfaction of the officer in charge, and must entirely cease work within the period mentioned.

7: This permit is not available for obtaining piles, telegraph poles, poppet heads, beams, or bridge timber.

8. Fires will not be permitted within the forest during the period from 15th December to 28th February in each year, except special precautions be taken in light such fires in a bare cleared space of at least twenty (20) feet in diameter, and in a hole dug for the purpose. Small wood only is to be used, and every fire is to be extinguished by being covered with earth or being put out by water. The burning off of débris during the period mentioned above is strictly prohibited.

9. The holder of this permit will not be permitted to cut any timber in the forest during the months of January and February in each year; but all timber cut prior to those months may be removed at any time, after being passed and branded by the Forest Officer. The period for which the Forest may be closed to the holders of permits may be varied at the discretion of the Forest Officer.
