PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- “An Act to authorize the construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Jeparit towards Albury.”
- “An Act to limit the issue of certain Government Stock Debentures and Bonds.”
- “An Act to provide for the creation and issue of Victorian Government Consolidated Inscribed Stock and for converting the public debt of Victoria into such Stock.”
- “An Act to establish a Victorian Government Consolidated Inscribed Stock Redemption Fund.”
- “An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Railways and Irrigation Works and Water Supply.”
- “An Act to authorize the Expenditure of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Railway Works Public Works and other purposes.”
- “An Act to authorize the raising of money for certain purposes by increasing the amount of Victorian Government Three per cent. Stock.”
- “An Act to establish a Victorian Loans Redemption Fund and for other purposes.”
- “An Act to authorize the Expenditure of certain sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Railways.”
- “An Act to authorize Advances to be made to certain Municipalities.”
- “An Act to amend the ‘Mining Development Act 1896.’”
- “An Act to authorize certain Deductions to be made out of Moneys payable to Pilots.”

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT 3 PER CENT. STOCK.

TENDERS will be received at this office until Two o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday, the 16th day of November, 1898, for the purchase of the whole or any part of Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds (£250,000) of Victorian Government 3 per cent. Stock, authorized by the Victorian Government Three per cent. Stock Act 1898, and to be inscribed under Act No. 1468.

The amount tendered for must be stated in amounts of Five pounds, or some multiple of Five pounds.

A deposit in cash or by bank cheque of 10 per cent. of the face value of the amount tendered for must accompany each tender, and, if the tender be accepted in full, or *pro rata*, the balance must be paid at the Treasury, as follows:—On 23rd November, 1898, so much as will leave 80 per cent. of the par value of the stock to be paid as under, viz.:—40 per cent. on or before 16th February, 1899; 40 per cent. on or before 16th May, 1899. The Stock will bear interest from 1st October, 1898. Purchasers must pay, in addition to the price offered, accrued interest from the 1st October, 1898, to the date of the respective payments.

FISHING IN THE MERRI RIVER, LADY BAY, AND HOPKINS RIVER.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, to move His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council to issue a Proclamation under the provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1890* revoking all previous Proclamations relating to fishing in the Merri River, Lady Bay, and the Hopkins River, and, in lieu thereof, defining the mouths of the Merri and Hopkins rivers, prohibiting the use of nets and fixed engines, and prescribing close seasons, as indicated hereunder, viz.:

MERRI RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Merri River to be a line bearing north $\frac{1}{2}$ east from the easternmost point of Middle Island to a post fixed on the timber viaduct.

Prescribing a close season for all species of fish in the Merri River from the 1st July to the 31st October (both dates inclusive), in every year.

LADY BAY.

Prohibiting the use of nets and fixed engines from the 1st July to the 16th December (both dates inclusive) in every year within a line bearing east by north from the seaward end of the Warrnambool breakwater to a post fixed on the shore a quarter of a mile westward of the western bank of the mouth of the Hopkins River.

HOPKINS RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Hopkins River to be a line extending from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such river enter the ocean; and fixing the distance from the mouth of the said river within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be a radius of one-quarter of a mile from any portion or point of the aforesaid line defining the mouth of the said river.

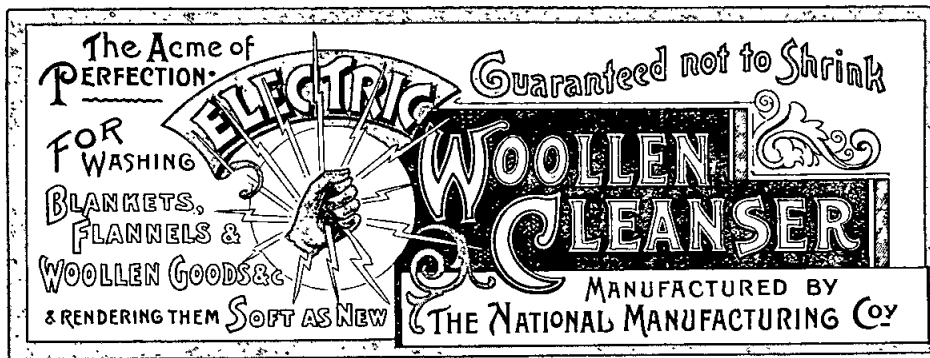

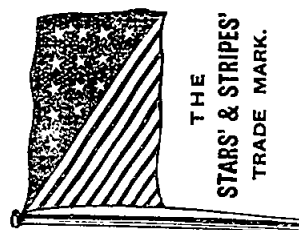

The births of 1,045 children, viz., 520 boys and 525 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. The number was, it will be observed, 55 fewer than in September, 1897, and also fewer than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 288 below the average of the previous ten years, or 295 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 548, viz., 309 of males and 239 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 497, or by 91 per cent., as against 101 per cent. in 1897 and 120 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, numerically the same as those in the corresponding month of the preceding year; but 58 below the average of September during the last ten years, or 61 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.72 and of deaths registered to 14.54 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 29.69 and 14.78 respectively, and during the last ten years of 35.54 and 16.16 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 72.8° on the 25th, and the lowest was 40.0° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (53.3°), was slightly below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.9°) took place on the 25th, and the least range (7.9°) on the 1st. The mean daily range was 15.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.268 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29.397 inches on the 22nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.885 inches) was a twenty-fifth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on thirteen days, the amount being 2.30 inches, which was higher than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, except September, 1893; nearly an inch above the average during that period.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 25 per cent. to that mortality, as against 21 per cent. in September, 1897; 20 per cent. in September, 1896; 22 per cent. in September, 1895; 30 per cent. in September, 1894; 29 per cent. in September, 1893; and 29 per cent. in September, 1892.

Fifty-seven persons—as against fifty-five in September, 1897—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a carpenter, aged 75, died of cancer; a bottle merchant, aged 75, of heart disease; a baker, aged 75, of pneumonia; a bricklayer, an engine-driver, a tailor, and a female, each aged 75, of Bright's disease; two females, each aged 76, of influenza and cancer respectively; a bricklayer, aged 76, of heart disease; a painter, aged 77, of apoplexy; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 77, of senile gangrene; a cook, aged 77, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 77,

of gastritis; a sailor, aged 78, of cancer; two females, each aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart and syncope respectively; a draper, aged 78, of embolism; four females, each aged 79, of dilatation of the heart, syncope, heart disease, and pneumonia respectively; a waiter, aged 79, of kidney disease; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of syncope; a quarryman and a female, each aged 80, of bronchitis; a pensioner, aged 80, of nephritis; a female, aged 80, of Bright's disease; two females, each aged 81, of influenza and pneumonia respectively; a carpenter, aged 82, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a bootmaker, aged 82, of paralysis and heart disease respectively; two females, each aged 84, of diabetes and syncope respectively; a hawker, aged 84, and a female, aged 87, of pneumonia; a female, aged 88, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 93, of cancer; a pensioner, aged 75, a female, aged 83 and 88 respectively, a gardener, aged 89, a carpenter, aged 93, and a female, aged 98, of old age.

Twenty-five of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 34 in September, 1897—were from external causes, of which 20 were set down to accident and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A presser, aged 37 was passed over by a railway train; a jockey, aged 14, died of injuries to the head, caused by a fall from a horse, whilst riding in a race; a driver, aged 17, of injuries, resulting from the kick of a horse; a boy, aged 7, of injuries, consequent on falling from a height; a plasterer, aged 18, was killed by falling from a ladder; a driver, aged 27, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a loft; a machinist, aged 44, of fracture of the skull the result of a fall in the street; a plasterer, aged 38, of injuries caused by a bucket falling on him; a labourer, aged 23, of accidental injuries to the head; a boy, aged 8, of gunshot wounds; two females, aged 1 year and 9 respectively, of burns; a male child, aged 2, of scalds; a gardener, aged 37, of arsenic poisoning; a female, aged 55, was drowned in a bath; three persons were found drowned, viz., two labourers, aged 45 and 50 respectively, in the River Yarra, and a female, aged 28, in Hobson's Bay; a new-born male infant was suffocated in bed; and a new-born female infant was suffocated, not sufficient evidence to show how caused. The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 34, and a mining manager, aged 45, who drowned themselves; a nightman, aged 56, and a chimney-sweep, aged 66, who hanged themselves; and an umbrella-maker, aged 45, who threw himself out of a window.

One hundred and sixty deaths, or 29 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 59 in the Melbourne, 11 in the Alfred, 1 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 13 in the Children's, 5 in the Homoeopathic, and 16 in the Austin [Hospitals]; 20 in the Metropolitan and 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 138, of which 86, or 63 per cent., were of males, and 52, or 37 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 85 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 410. Of these, 223, or 54 per cent., were males, and 187, or 46 per cent., were females; 25 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 35 were between thirty-five and forty, 13 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 39 were between sixty and sixty-five, 41 were between sixty-five and seventy, 36 were between seventy and seventy-five, 29 were between seventy-five and eighty, 21 were between eighty and eighty-five, 4 were between eighty-five and ninety, 1 was ninety-three, and 2 were aged ninety-eight.

Whilst the total mortality during the month was the same as in the corresponding month of the previous year, there was but little variation in the fatality of the various classes of diseases as a whole; thus there was an increase of 5 deaths under zymotic diseases, of 10 under constitutional diseases, and of 3 under local diseases, which were exactly counterbalanced by decreases of 4 each under dietetic (chiefly want of breast milk) and developmental diseases, 9 under violence, and 1 under ill-defined causes. There were, however, greater variations in the individual causes, as, under the zymotic class, deaths from measles increased from nil to 15; but, on the other hand, those from diphtheria decreased from 14 to 7, and those from septic diseases from 7 to 4. Under the constitutional class, deaths from hydrocephalus rose from 4 to 10, those from scrofula from 4 to 9, and those from diabetes from nil to 4, whereas those from rheumatism and gout fell off from 8 to 4. The decrease of 4 under developmental diseases resulted from a decrease of 8 under premature births, less an increase of 4 under congenital malformations. Under local diseases there was a falling off in the deaths from diseases of the nervous system from 68 to 37, and in those from parturition from 8 (in addition to 2 from puerperal fever) to 4; but an increase from 58 to 66 in those from diseases of the circulatory system, and from 89 to 118 in those from diseases of the respiratory system, chiefly pneumonia.

The present epidemic of measles, which culminated in April with 99 deaths, is gradually abating—the deaths having since gradually fallen to 15 in September. Since its first outbreak, in December last, this epidemic has carried off 394 persons—principally children. During the last 25 years there have been six conspicuous epidemics of measles, of which the most fatal was the epidemic of 1874-5, which caused 733 deaths; the next that now prevalent; and the next that of 1893, which caused 386 deaths. Such epidemics have recurred at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 25 years:—

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1897, and the first nine months of 1898, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever has been very low during the past four months.

VITAL STATISTICS

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1898.

THE births of 51 boys and 50 girls, or in all of 101 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of September. Of these, 32 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, 10 in Sebastopol, and 4 in the outlying districts; included were 6 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 125, viz., 61 of boys and 64 of girls.

The deaths registered in September numbered 60, viz., 33 of males and 27 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 41. In August the recorded deaths numbered 87; in September, 1897, they numbered 57; in September, 1896, they numbered 52; in September, 1895, they numbered 57; in September, 1894, they numbered 77; in September, 1893, they numbered 69; in September, 1892, they numbered 48; in September, 1891, they numbered 63; in September, 1890, they numbered 64; in September, 1889, they numbered 63; and in September, 1888, they numbered 47.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 55 per cent.; females, 45 per cent.; under five years, 32 per cent.; over five years, 68 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 54 and 46 per cent.; under and over five years, 20 and 80 per cent. respectively.

Sixteen deaths, or 27 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 12; Benevolent Asylum, 2; Lunatic Asylum, 2.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of September, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers substantially interested and affected thereby: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All shops in the municipal district of the Borough of Koroit (other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*) shall be closed for the afternoon of Friday in each week.

ENLARGEMENT OF THE METROPOLITAN FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1200) it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district, or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation declare that those portions of allotments 23 and 24, in the parish of Moorabbin, in the shire of Moorabbin, not hitherto included in the Metropolitan Fire District, and also the whole of allotment 25, in the said parish of Moorabbin, in the said shire of Moorabbin, shall be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District.

VIOLET TOWN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1899.

THE Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following Rating Regulations:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be made and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust supplied otherwise than by meter (the minimum rate of each house or tenement supplied with water to be One pound sterling), according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated, for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1899. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments; and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1899, and the second instalment on the 1st day of July, 1899.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover said rate.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1899.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1899.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1899, in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten pounds (£10) annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made.

9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings for each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1899, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

**BY-LAWS OF THE BAIRNSDALE DISTRICT
HOSPITAL.**

(Incorporated 1888.)

1. **Objects.**—The hospital will afford surgical and medical aid to poor persons, and will accommodate a limited number of paying patients if space is available; but no person able to pay therefor shall receive such aid gratuitously.
2. **Life Governor.**—Every donor of not less than £20 in one sum shall be entitled to be a life governor. Every person, institution, society, or corporate body who shall raise and contribute to the funds of the hospital an amount of not less than £25 in any one year shall be entitled to nominate a life governor.
3. **Contributors.**—A contributor for the purpose of and within the meaning of these by-laws shall be a person who has paid £1 per annum by way of subscription or contribution to the funds of the hospital.
4. **Privileges of Life Governors and Contributors' Patients' Tickets.**—Every life governor shall be entitled to two patients' tickets annually, and to exercise the privileges of a contributor. Every contributor shall be entitled to two patients' tickets, together with an additional ticket for every pound more than one contributed by him; all such tickets to be available for one year only from date of issue. Every member of the committee of management shall, during his term of office, be entitled to receive as many patients' tickets as he may require.
5. **Corporations.**—Any friendly society, church congregation, public or corporate body, or committee, which shall pay to the funds of the hospital an amount of not less than £1 in any one year shall be entitled to nominate some person who shall be entitled to the privileges of a contributor for the year subsequent to such payment.
6. **Firms.**—Any firm or partnership which shall pay to the funds of the hospital an amount of not less than £1 in any one year shall be entitled to the privileges of a contributor for the year subsequent to such payment, and may exercise those privileges through some one member of such firm.
7. **Executors.**—One executor in any will under which an amount of not less than £10 has been paid to the funds of the hospital shall be entitled to the privileges of a contributor for the year subsequent to such payment.
8. **Voters.**—Contributors shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of contributors held during the year subsequent to the payment of the contribution; and no person shall be entitled to more than one vote.
9. **Annual meeting.**—The annual meeting of contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in each year for the following purposes:—
 - To confirm the minutes of the previous annual meeting.
 - To deal with the annual report and statement of accounts.
 - To fill vacancies in the committee of management.
 - To fill vacancies in the honorary medical staff.
 - To elect two auditors and to fix their remuneration.
 - To transact any other business of which notice has been given to the secretary not less than ten days prior to the date of such meeting.
 Such meeting shall be convened by the president or secretary, at such time and place as may be fixed by the committee of management, by advertisement in some newspaper published in Bairnsdale, not less than seven days previous to the meeting.
10. **Committee of Management.**—The hospital shall be governed by a committee of management consisting of twelve members, one-third of whom shall retire annually but may nevertheless be re-elected, as provided by section 14 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*. All candidates for election to the office of member of such committee shall be nominated in writing by two contributors: such nomination, together with the nominee's written consent to act if elected, to be delivered to the secretary not less than seven days before the date of the annual meeting of contributors. Life governors and contributors only shall be eligible for election to such committee. The committee shall meet every month, on such days as it shall appoint, four members to form a quorum. In the event of a quorum not being present within half-an-hour of the appointed time of such meeting, it shall be in the power of the members present or, if there be no members present, of the secretary to adjourn such meeting to any day not exceeding seven days from the date of such adjournment.
11. **Who shall preside.**—The president or, in his absence, one of the vice-presidents shall preside at all meetings of contributors and of the committee of management. In the absence of these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman. In the event of an equality of votes the president or chairman for the time being shall have an additional or casting vote.
12. **Contracts for Supplies or Works.**—No member of the committee of management or official of the hospital shall be a contractor for any supplies or works to or for the hospital, or become security for any such contractor, directly or indirectly.
13. **Power and Duties of Committee of Management.**—The committee of management shall, at its first meeting after the annual meeting of contributors, elect from their number a president, two vice-presidents, an honorary treasurer, and a finance committee of three members, who shall hold office for one year, but may be re-elected; shall present a report to the annual meeting of contributors; shall direct the business of the hospital; shall frame regulations for its control and for the direction of the officers of the hospital (the same not being repugnant to these by-laws); shall have power to enter into all necessary contracts on its behalf, to direct payment to be made therefor, and to appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants.
14. **Visiting Committee.**—The committee of management shall elect from their number a visiting committee, who shall meet at the hospital on such days as they may appoint in each week, for the purpose of confirming or otherwise the admission of any cases received into the hospital during the interval between their meetings. They shall report to each monthly meeting of the committee of management on the general condition of

the hospital, and on such other matters as they think of importance. They shall have power to examine and check the hospital books and records, to engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the hospital, under the direction of the committee of management, and shall in cases of emergency have power to order in writing any requisite work or materials—two members certifying to the same.

15. **Treasurer.**—All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the honorary treasurer thereof, and shall be appropriated by him to the purposes of the hospital, under the direction of the committee of management. He shall deposit all moneys received by him, whenever the same shall amount to £5, in such bank as the said committee shall direct, and place the same to the account of the Bairnsdale District Hospital. Payments shall be made by the honorary treasurer only upon the orders of the committee of management, under the hand of the chairman of the meeting at which such orders shall have been made; such payments to be made by cheque upon the banking account, signed by the honorary treasurer and any one member of the committee who, shall have been present at the meeting at which such payments shall have been authorized and countersigned by the secretary. The honorary treasurer shall cause a statement of accounts, duly audited, to be presented at the annual meeting of contributors.

16. **Special meeting.**—It shall be competent at any time for the committee of management by resolution, or for twelve or more life governors or annual contributors by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special general meeting of the contributors, of which meeting seven days' notice shall be given by advertisement in some newspaper published in Bairnsdale; the occasion of calling such meeting to be stated in the requisition and in such notice. And no business shall be transacted at such special meeting other than that so stated.

17. **Honorary medical officers.**—The honorary medical officer shall be limited to three, and shall be registered medical practitioners of the colony of Victoria, resident in Bairnsdale. They shall have admittance to the hospital at all times, and shall attend there when required, the rotation of their duty to be regulated by themselves collectively. They shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors, and shall hold office for the term of one year. All candidates for election to the honorary medical staff shall be nominated, in writing, by two contributors, such nomination, together with the nominee's written consent to act if elected, to be delivered to the secretary not less than seven days before the date of such meeting.

18. **Neglect or misconduct of honorary medical officers.**—Any honorary medical officer who, in the opinion of the visiting committee, has neglected his duty, or has been guilty of conduct detrimental to the interests of the hospital, shall be reported to a meeting of the committee of management, who shall have power to remove the name of such practitioner from the list of honorary medical officers.

19. **Casual vacancies.**—Casual vacancies in the committee of management and in the staff of honorary medical officers shall be filled up by such committee, and casual vacancies in the staff of auditors shall be filled up by the contributors at a special meeting called for the purpose. Every person so elected shall hold office until the next annual meeting, but may nevertheless be re-elected.

20. **Quorum.**—At all meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the appointed time of meeting the contributors present may adjourn the meeting to any day not exceeding seven days from the date of such adjournment.
