SIR,

With reference to my *Circular Despatch of the 6th February, 1897, I have the honour to acquaint you, for the information of your Government, that a letter has been received from the Foreign Office reporting that the Union of Nicaragua, Honduras, and Salvador has been dissolved; and that a decree has been issued by the Government of Honduras to the effect that, pending the definitive organization of the Consular body of the Republic, all Consular Officers appointed by the Diet of the Greater Republic of Central America were confirmed in their posts as representatives of Honduras only as from 29th November, 1898.

COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY.

REGULATIONS.

THE subjoined Regulations (War Office, 1899), under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by Officers of Colonial Local Military Forces and Students from the Colonial Universities, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES AND STUDENTS FROM THE COLONIAL UNIVERSITIES, 1899.

[N.B.—Officers appointed to Commissions in the Army may, in case of voluntary retirement from the Army, be called upon, as a condition of receiving the full rates of retired pay, to serve for a time in the Militia.]

1. *To whom granted.*—Commissions in the cavalry and infantry of the line will be granted to Officers (who are *bona fide* colonists) of the Local Military Forces of certain colonies, and to students from Colonial Universities, under the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES.

2. *Allotment of commissions.*—Until further notice, two Army commissions will be allotted to each of the undermentioned colonies annually:—

New South Wales.
South Australia.
Victoria.
Queensland.
New Zealand.
Cape of Good Hope.

Six will be allotted annually to Canada, one biennially to Natal, one annually to Tasmania, and two every three years to the Royal Malta Regiment of Militia.

In the event of the number of candidates nominated by the Governor in a colony at any time exceeding the allotted number of commissions, the selection will be decided by competition in the military portion of the prescribed examination.

3. *Qualification of candidates.*—An officer of the Colonial Military Forces, who is a candidate for a commission in the British Army, will be required—

- To be unmarried, and to be between the ages of 18 and 22 on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination in military subjects.
- To have served as an officer in the Local Military Force of the colony from which he is nominated, and to have attended two annual trainings, each training to be in a distinct year, or have seen active service in the field.

LITERARY EXAMINATION.*

4. *Subjects of literary examination.*—Subject to the exceptions stated in paragraph 5, a candidate will be required, before being permitted to present himself for examination in military subjects, to undergo a qualifying literary examination by the Civil Service Commissioners in the following subjects:—

All the subjects of Class I. may be taken up. Only two of the subjects of Class II. may be taken up, and if one of these subjects be a modern language, it must be different from the modern language selected in Class I.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examinations as a whole as may indicate, in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners, a competent amount of general proficiency.

5. *Exemption for graduates, &c.*—The candidate will be exempted from the literary examination, except in geometrical drawing, if he can produce a certificate from the proper University authority that he has (a) taken his degree in arts or science, or (b) has passed the examination for the degree of B.A. or M.A., at one of the following universities:—

The Royal University, Ireland	...	"The second University Examination in Arts, or the second Professional Examination in Engineering."
Victoria University, Manchester	...	The Intermediate Examination.

Or if he has passed some other test which is accepted by the University as exempting from the above examinations. A certificate that the examination is accepted by the authorities concerned must be produced.

An equivalent examination at the University of Malta, or one of the chartered colonial universities, will likewise be accepted as a sufficient ground for exemption.

6. *Literary examination held twice a year.*—The literary examination will take place in June and in November in each year.

7. *Mode of application.*—A candidate who is desirous of attending one of these examinations must apply to his commanding officer, at such date as will allow of the Governor forwarding the application so as to reach the War Office not later than the 1st of April or 1st September, for the June and November examinations respectively. The Governor in forwarding the application will certify that the candidate is, having regard to the maximum limit laid down in paragraph 3 (a), eligible in point of age, and that he will be prepared, when necessary, to recommend him in the manner prescribed in paragraph 8. Not more than three trials at these examinations will be allowed.

8. *Notification by Colonial Governor.*—The Governor of the colony will notify to the War Office, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, each year, the names of any duly qualified candidates he is desirous of nominating for examination in military subjects.

This notification must reach the War Office by the 1st July, and should be accompanied by—

- An extract from the register of the candidate's birth; or, in default, a certificate of his baptism or other documentary evidence accompanied by a declaration made by one of his parents or guardians before a magistrate, giving his exact age.
- A certificate of having served the required number of annual trainings (each training in a distinct year).
- A certificate from the Governor that he is satisfied that the candidate is actually a colonist, that he is of good moral character, and, in all other respects, a fit and proper person to hold a commission in Her Majesty's army.
- A certificate that the candidate has passed the examination described in paragraph 4, or a university certificate as prescribed in paragraph 5.

STUDENTS OF COLONIAL UNIVERSITIES.

9. *Commissions for colonial university students.*—A commission will be granted under these regulations to one student annually of the University of Malta, and of each of the chartered universities in colonies not having a military college through which commissions in the army may be obtained.

10. *Age.*—The candidate must be unmarried, and must be within the ages of 18 and 22 on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination in military subjects.

11. *Literary examination.*—The literary examination of students of the chartered colonial universities will be conducted entirely by those universities. Geometrical drawing will be an obligatory subject of such examination.

* This examination will also exempt from geometrical drawing.

12. *Name of candidate to be notified to War Office, with documents prescribed.*—The name of the candidate selected for nomination must be forwarded so as to reach the War Office on the 1st July, and should be accompanied by—

- A certificate that the candidate is a British born or naturalized British subject.
- An extract from the register of the candidate's birth; or, in default, a certificate of his baptism or other documentary evidence accompanied by a declaration made by one of his parents or guardians before a magistrate, giving his exact age.
- A certificate of good moral character, for the four years immediately preceding the date of application, from the heads of all schools, colleges, or other educational establishments at which the candidate has been educated during the period; or, if such a certificate cannot be produced, a statement showing the reason for the omission, together with some other satisfactory proof of good moral conduct.
- A certificate from the head of the college that the candidate has passed the required University examination, including geometrical drawing.

EXAMINATION IN MILITARY SUBJECTS.*

13. *Examination in military subjects.*—An examination in military subjects of candidates nominated under paragraphs 8 and 12, who have previously passed the literary examination, will be held in September in each year. The subjects and the maximum marks obtainable in each subject will be as follows:—

	Marks.
1. Military Engineering	2,000

In order to qualify for a commission, a candidate will be required to obtain one-third of the marks in each subject, and half of the aggregate. Not more than three trials will be allowed at these examinations.

14. *Inspection by medical board.*—A candidate will be required to undergo an inspection by a medical board, to be convened by the Governor of the colony, or other proper authority, and will not be allowed to proceed with his examination unless recommended by this board to be physically fit for Her Majesty's Service.

The general conditions as to height, weight, chest measurement, eyesight, &c., required, are given in Appendix I. The board have, however, discretionary power to recommend a candidate slightly below one or other of these conditions in a case in which they are satisfied that he will fulfil them within six months. No relaxation, however, of the eyesight qualification will ever be allowed.

The recommendations of the board will in all cases be absolutely final.

15. It is suggested that a candidate before commencing his course of study should undergo a thorough medical examination. By such an examination any serious physical disqualification would be revealed, and the candidate probably spared expense and the mortification of rejection.

16. Candidates may undergo a preliminary examination by a military medical board, not more than two years before they compete, under the following conditions:—

- Applications must be addressed to the Governor of the colony, accompanied by a fee of two guineas.
- Instructions will be issued for the examination to take place at the military station where a medical board can be held, nearest the candidate's residence. The result will be notified to candidates by the board.
- Candidates must pay their travelling expenses.
- Candidates found unfit by the preliminary board are not bound to accept its finding, but may, at their own risk, continue their studies, and if successful at the competitive examination may then submit themselves for medical examination by the final medical board.
- It must be distinctly understood that passing such preliminary medical board is solely for the candidate's information, and would give him no sort of claim to be accepted as physically fit when he presents himself as a candidate. His acceptance will depend entirely upon the report of the final medical board. Candidates may be fit for the service at the preliminary examination, but may become disqualified by some subsequent physical deterioration.

APPENDIX I.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY.

I.—A candidate for a Commission in Her Majesty's Army must be in good mental and bodily health, and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of military duty, and it should be stated whether he is of pure European descent.

II.—The examination will be conducted by a board of medical officers.

III.—The attention of the board will be directed to the following points:—

(a) That the correlation of age, height, weight, and chest girth is equal or superior to that which is given in the following table:—

(a) Measurement of height.

The candidate will be placed against the standard with his feet together, and the weight thrown on the heels and not on the toes or outside of the feet. He will stand erect without rigidity, and with the heels, calves, buttocks, and shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vertex of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be noted in parts of an inch to eighths.

(b) Measurement of chest.

The candidate will be made to stand erect with his feet together, and to raise his hands above his head. The tape will be carefully adjusted round the chest, with its posterior upper edge touching the inferior angles of the shoulder blades, and its anterior lower edge the upper part of the nipples. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side, and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to empty his chest of air as much as is possible. This is best done by continuous whistling with the lips as long as sound can be produced. The tape is carefully gathered in during the process, and when the minimum measurement is reached, it is recorded.

He will then be directed to inflate his chest to its utmost capacity. This maximum measurement will likewise be recorded. The mean of the two measurements will be considered as the true chest measurement.

(d) Eyesight.

The regulations regarding the examination of eyesight are as follows:—

1. If a candidate can read D = 6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) and D = 0·6 at any distance selected by himself, with each eye without glasses, he will be considered fit.
2. If a candidate can only read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, his visual deficiency being due to faulty refraction which can be corrected by glasses which enable him to read D = 6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, and D = 12 at the same distance with the other eye, and can also read D = 0·8 with each eye without glasses, at any distance selected by himself, he will be considered fit.
3. If a candidate cannot read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, notwithstanding he can read D = 0·6, he will be considered unfit.

(N.B.—Snellen's test types will be used for determining the acuteness of vision.)

Squint, inability to distinguish the principal colours, or any morbid conditions, subject to the risk of aggravation or recurrence in either eye, will cause the rejection of a candidate.

IV.—The following additional points will then be observed:—

- (a) That his hearing is good.
- (b) That his speech is without impediment.
- (c) That his teeth are in good order. Loss or decay of ten teeth will be considered a disqualification. Decayed teeth, if well filled, will be considered as sound.
- (d) That his chest is well formed, and that his lungs and heart are sound.
- (e) That he is not ruptured.
- (f) That he does not suffer from hydrocele, varicocele, varicose veins in a severe degree, or other disease likely to cause inefficiency. A slight defect, if successfully cured by operation, is not a disqualification.
- (g) That his limbs are well formed and developed.
- (h) That there is free and perfect motion of all the joints.
- (i) That his feet and toes are well formed.
- (j) That he does not suffer from any inveterate skin disease.
- (k) That he has no congenital malformation or defect.
- (l) That he does not bear traces of previous acute or chronic disease pointing to an impaired constitution.

APPENDIX II.

SYLLABUS OF SUBJECTS FOR THE LITERARY EXAMINATIONS.

Mathematics I.—Arithmetics; algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem; the theory and use of logarithms; Euclid, Books I. to IV., and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including solution of triangles; mensuration.

Mathematics II.—Further questions on the syllabus of Mathematics I.; elementary solid geometry, including Euclid, Book XI., Propositions 1 to 21, and Book XII., Propositions 1 and 2; geometrical conic sections, the elementary properties common to the ellipse, parabola and hyperbola; dynamics and

statics, uniform and uniformly accelerated rectilinear motion, uniform circular motion, motion of projectiles (not requiring a knowledge of the parabola), equilibrium of forces in one plane and of parallel forces, the centre of mass, and the construction and use of the simpler machines.

Mathematics III.—Geometrical conic sections; analytical geometry, the straight line, circle and conic sections, referred to Cartesian co-ordinates; dynamics and statics, so far as they may be studied without the aid of the differential calculus.

Latin.—Passages selected from the authors usually read in schools will be set for translation in English. Passages from English authors will be given for translation into Latin prose and verse, but candidates will be allowed, in the place of verse composition, to answer questions of a simple character, which will test whether they possess a fundamental knowledge of the grammar of the language, and such an elementary acquaintance with Roman History as is required for the intelligent study of the books they have read.

Greek.—Passages will be set for translation into English from the authors usually read in schools, and in other respects the examination will proceed on the same lines as in Latin.

French.—Translation of unseen passages from French into English, and from English into French. The passages for translation will be taken mainly from standard authors, and a few simple questions may be asked on the passages set, as to the structure and character of the language, and allusions of obvious and general interest. The *third voce* examination will include dictation. Three hundred marks will be allotted to colloquial knowledge of the language.

German.—The passages for translation will be taken mainly from standard authors, and in other respects the examination will proceed on the same lines as in French.

English Composition.—Candidates will be tested by *précis* writing as well as by an essay. The standard of positive merit will be looked for in logical arrangement of thought, and in accuracy and propriety of expression, but large deductions of marks will be made for faults of writing and spelling. (Candidates are also warned that, for similar faults in the use of the English language, similar deductions will be made from the marks obtained in other subjects.)

Geometrical Drawing.—Practical plane geometry; the construction of scales; and the elements of solid geometry, and of simple orthographic projection. Great importance will be attached to neatness and exactness of drawing.

Geography.—Simple questions in descriptive and general geography.

English History.—The general paper in this subject will be confined to events subsequent to the Norman Conquest. It will test whether the candidates are accurately acquainted with the facts of English History, and also possess an intelligent knowledge of the meaning of the facts.

The paper on the special period will be confined to distinctly modern history. It will require from the candidates more minute knowledge than the general paper.

Natural Science Subjects.—The standard of examination in these subjects will be such as may reasonably be expected from the education given at schools possessing appliances for practical instruction, such as a laboratory, &c. A considerable portion of the marks will be given for proficiency shown in the practical parts of the examination. A knowledge of the metric system will be expected.

Chemistry.—The laws of chemical combination and decomposition, and the preparation, classification, and properties of the principal metallic and non-metallic elements, and of such of their compounds as are treated of in inorganic chemistry. In the practical part of the examination only the more ordinary apparatus and the less dangerous re-agents will be supplied, and no candidate will be allowed to bring his own apparatus or re-agents.

Heat.—The elementary portion of the subject.

Physics.—The elementary properties of electricity, magnetism, light, and sound.

Physiology, *i.e.*, Physical Geography.

Geology.—Chiefly economic, including the recognition of the more familiar minerals and rocks, and their properties and uses.

SYLLABUS OF SUBJECTS FOR THE MILITARY EXAMINATION.

Military Engineering.—Chapters I. to VIII., inclusive of Philips' Text Book on Fortification.

Military History.—Parts I., II., and III. of Hamley's Operations of War.

Military Topography.—Chapters I. to XIV., inclusive of Part I., Text Book of Military Topography.

APPENDIX III.

FIRST APPOINTMENTS TO LINE REGIMENTS.

The appointment of qualified candidates to particular regiments of the line will be made on the following principles:—

1. A candidate having a special family or territorial connexion with a regiment, may, when fully qualified for a commission, apply to the Military Secretary to be appointed to that regiment, and such consideration as can be afforded will be given to his application. If approved, and if the interests of the service admit of it, he will be permitted to wait six months for an opportunity of being appointed to the regiment he applies for, but must understand that by so doing he loses Army seniority.

2. If desirous of thus waiting, he must state this when making application for a regiment. After a candidate has once been gazetted on first appointment, no application for a transfer will be entertained, save under the most exceptional circumstances.

3. Candidates without special claims are at liberty to apply for particular regiments (not exceeding two in all), but will in no case be allowed to wait.

4. Where the claims of different candidates for the same regiment are evenly balanced, the first consideration will be given to those highest on the list in their final examination.

5. All candidates must clearly understand that, while their wishes will be met as far as possible, they will be posted to vacancies as demanded by the interests of the service.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steamship *Nineveh* has arrived in Victorian waters, and had on board during the voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steamship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steamship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steamship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his

directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steamship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steamship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steamship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

I further hereby order that this Order shall take effect from the time of arrival of the s.s. *Nineveh* in Hobson's Bay.

SHOAL PATCHES SOUTH OF AYE REEF AND ALSO BETWEEN EAD AND JEE REEFS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Commander Parry, of H. M. surveying vessel *Dart*, reports that, when making a further examination of the Shoal Patches referred to in Notice No. 17, issued from this office on the 25th October last, he found another coral head, about two yards in diameter, with only 18 feet over it at low water. The minimum depth given in Notice No. 17 should therefore be 18 feet instead of 4½ fathoms.

Commander Parry also reports the existence of a shoal patch in the following position, viz. :—

Ead Reef Beacon—S. 36° 45' W., distant 1 mile 5½ cables.
Eff Reef Beacon—S. 80° 25' W., distant 4 miles 4 cables.
Sea Reef Beacon—S. 80° 10' W., distant 4 miles 4½ cables.

Latitude 14° 3' 15" S.; Longitude 143° 55' 42" E., approx.
This shoal has 4 fathoms over it at low water, except at its southern end, where there is a minimum depth of only 16 feet. It is 1½ cables long (north and south) and ¾ cable wide (east and west). Soundings of from 8 to 10 fathoms were found round the patch, which lies on the same bearing from Ead Beacon as the Taiwan Shoal, but is 4½ cables to the northward of it. An even bottom of 10 fathoms (mud) exists between the two shoals.

Also a shoal between Ead and Jee Reefs, in the following position, viz. :—

Ead Reef Beacon—S. 30° 55' W., distant 1 mile 9½ cables.
Eff Reef Beacon—S. 75° 30' W., distant 4 miles 5½ cables.
Sea Reef Beacon—S. 80° 50' E., distant 4 miles 4½ cables.

Latitude 14° 2' 50" S.; Longitude, 143° 55' 51" E., approx.
This is a small coral head, less than 50 yards in extent, with 24 feet over it.



The minimum weight to be charged for consignments in the Special Wheat Rate will, except where otherwise specified in the Merchandise Rate Book, be 3 tons, or actual weight at "A" class with "Smalls Minimums."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, from the date hereof, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

RE-DEFINED.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide Victoria into districts and assign Victoria and the said districts to the Government Statist and Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he may think fit, and may define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, pursuant to the provisions of the Acts aforesaid, and bearing date the 16th day of August, 1899, the limits and boundaries of (amongst others) the Bendigo Registration District were defined: And whereas it is expedient to re-define the limits and boundaries of the said registration district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, so far only as the same relates to the definition of the limits and boundaries of the Bendigo Registration District aforesaid, and do hereby re-define the limits and boundaries of the said registration district to be those hereunder set forth and described, that is to say:—

BENDIGO REGISTRATION DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point in the centre of the Marong-road where it is intersected by the north-west boundary of the city of Bendigo; thence easterly by the said road and Alley-street to McIntyre-street; thence north-westerly along McIntyre-street

to Ironbark Gully; thence along the east side of Ironbark Gully to the north side of the Inglewood railway; thence south-easterly by the said side of that railway to the White Hills-road; thence north-easterly by that road to McCrae-street; thence south-westerly by that street to Nolan-street; thence south-easterly by that street to Charleston-road; thence south-westerly by that road to Lansell-street; thence easterly by that street to the city boundary; thence south-westerly by that boundary to McIvor-street; thence easterly by the Axedale-road to the north-east angle of allotment 167 at Grassy Flat, parish of Sandhurst; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 83; thence south-westerly by the south boundary of that allotment and a line in continuation thereof, and further south-westerly by a road to a point on the Spring Gully aqueduct near the south-east angle of allotment 261c; thence southerly by the said aqueduct to the road from Mandurang to Bendigo, *via* Woodward-road; thence north-westerly by that road to the city boundary; thence westerly by that boundary and a road to the south-west angle of allotment 42a of section L; thence north-westerly by a line to the east boundary of A. AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath ; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

5. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

6. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

7. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from the stand-pipe, one quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

8. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. PURPOSES.

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 23,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes, or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under, a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

A Regulation of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, made under the *Water Act 1890*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Trust district shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1900:—

1. For every house or tenement of under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence (£1 12s. 6d.) per annum.

3. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.) per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per annum.

5. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over, annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.

6. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per one thousand (1,000) gallons, or at a price as shall be specially agreed on.

7. For water supplied to Government departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, suire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged Two pounds (£2) each per annum.

8. For every public water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

9. All public water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow, such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

10. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.

11. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who are in arrears with the payment of their water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes or by any other means that are available by or through which the water is supplied, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

13. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence on that behalf to execute such works.

14. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust; and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

15. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officer of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

16. For any breach of any of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

17. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1900, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1900, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1900.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

SMALL-POX ON THE STEAM-SHIP "NINEVEH."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel *Nineveh* has arrived in Victorian waters and had on board during the voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williams-town, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

INTRODUCTION OF SWINE INTO VICTORIA FROM QUEENSLAND PROHIBITED.

colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine, in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act; and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct: and such sum shall go to and form part of the Consolidated Revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. The introduction of swine into Victoria from Queensland is hereby prohibited.

2. No person shall do or attempt to do, cause to be done or to be attempted to be done, or assist in doing or attempting to do any act forbidden by this Order, or obtain, or endeavour to obtain, or assist any one in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any authority under this Order, or forge any such authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently obtained authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of this Order.

3. All persons offending against this Order shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

And whereas application has been made by the minister of a religious denomination styled the "Services for the People" to be registered as a minister entitled to celebrate marriages under the said Act: And whereas it appears after due inquiry to be expedient that such religious denomination should be declared to be a religious denomination for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order declare the

to be a religious denomination for the purposes of the *Marriage Act 1898* aforesaid.

REGULATION OF PAWNBROKERS' SHOPS WITHIN
THE TOWN OF GEELONG.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district, or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, on obtaining a licence to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, and during such hours as shall be specified in such licence, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within such district: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the Town of Geelong all pawnbrokers' shops (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid) may be permitted, on obtaining a licence, to keep open until Nine o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, and until Eleven o'clock on the evening of Saturday in each week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for any pawnbroker's shop within the municipal district of the Town of Geelong to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Nine o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each

week from Ten o'clock until Eleven o'clock on obtaining a licence to keep open during such hours from the Chief Inspector of Factories.

Printed forms of tender, giving estimates of the probable requirements, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne, from the Receivers and Paymasters at the respective places, and from Queenscliff from the Officer Commanding Victorian Artillery, Queenscliff, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering. Security will be required in cash, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank deposit receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or Government debentures.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit above mentioned in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for Victorian House and Smiths' Coal, Victorian Brown Coal or Coke, or Steam Coal at _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of coal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The coal supplied must have been screened at the pit's mouth, and must be the best of its kind. The house coal must be free from shale, small coal, dust, ashes, or other impurities, and the smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. No other coal will be received. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the coal so rejected or returned.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the coal.

4. Coal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. At the time of delivering the coal the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the coal accepted and shall return the order to the contractor.

6. If after the delivery of the coal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such coal may be returned to the contractor.

7. The contractor must produce the pit certificate if requested to do so by the officer receiving the coal.

8. The contractor will be bound to weigh the house coal and coke on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

9. The contractor will be bound to deliver coal for vessels, except in the case of dredges, into the vessels' bunkers.

10. When baskets are used in the delivery of coal they are all to be of one size, and the contractor will be bound to tare the baskets when so required by the officer taking delivery. In other cases the contractor will be bound to satisfy the officer receiving that the weight or quantity is correct.

11. Coal must be put on board at a rate of not less than ten (10) tons per hour.

12. In the event of the officer ordering the coal not requiring the same to be put into the vessel's bunkers, as required by condition No. 8, a rebate of 1s. per ton to be made by the contractor.

13. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price may be deducted from the contractor's account or the security money, but coal for steam vessels must be supplied on demand. No more delay will be allowed than is sufficient to give the necessary orders and get the hulk or vessel alongside. Bad weather to be the only excuse.

14. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

15. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the coal as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

16. If the board shall decide that the coal or coke is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 13.

17. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such coal or coke as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected coal or coke and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition No. 13.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the coal, &c., or delay in delivering or replacing the coal when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct: and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 13. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

20. In the event of a general strike occurring at the collieries, any contract entered into under these conditions after the expiry of one calendar month from notice being given may be suspended, such contract to come into full force and effect again ten (10) days after such cause of suspension shall be discontinued.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of any other coal by the Defence Department for the use of torpedo boats and the *Cerberus*.

22. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged therein are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and at a minimum wage of 7s. 6d. (clear of all deductions) per day of eight hours for miners, and 6s. per day for labourers; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the colliery. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such penalty, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

Unless otherwise specified in the schedule the firewood tendered for must consist of either box, red, or white gum, or peppermint, or proportions of each. Tenderers to specify in their tenders the kind or kinds of these woods, and the proportions of each kind tendered for.

The firewood for Yarra Bend is to be tendered for at per ton weight of 2,240 lbs.

Printed forms of tender, giving estimates of the probable requirements, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne, the Receivers and Paymasters at Ararat,

Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Geelong, and Maryborough, and the Medical Superintendent, Sunbury Asylum, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Bank Deposit Receipt, or Savings Bank Deposit Book, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit above mentioned in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for Firewood at ..." (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark, or pieces of wood with bark adhering will be received. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular area concerned.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account from the security money.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., cross-ways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as

closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

5. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any firewood, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the wood so rejected or returned.

6. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

8. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition No. 3.

9. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

13. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged therein are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. per day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted as in condition 3, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

By-Law No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Yarrawonga, made under section 510 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 26, for regulating the market place and the buildings and pens therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto, for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held; for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences; and for regulating the use of the weighing machine provided by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrawonga order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Yarrawonga Corporation Sale-yards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market, situated in the township of Yarrawonga, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle.

2. The said market shall be open daily for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle on every lawful day from sunrise to sunset. A "fortnightly market" shall be held on Thursday, the 11th day of January, 1900, and subsequently on every alternate Thursday, provided that, in the event of any "fortnightly market" day falling on Christmas day or a public holiday, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable, the Council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said "fortnightly market."

3. The sales of cattle shall be commenced not earlier than Nine o'clock a.m., and shall be conducted in the order following:—

1st	Sheep
2nd	Pigs
3rd	Fat cattle
4th	Store cattle
5th	Horses.

4. The Council shall appoint a market inspector, whose duties will be as follows:—

(1) To see that this By-law, and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* relating to markets, are duly observed.

(2) To demand and collect all market tolls and dues.

(3) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of persons bringing cattle to the market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market yards before Five o'clock p.m. on the day, except with the consent of such inspector.

5. No persons shall obstruct the market inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, or remove any cattle from one part of the said market to any other part of the said market, without the consent of the market inspector, nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, nor cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

6. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls or dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied; and if any cattle be not removed within 48 hours after the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

7. The fat and store cattle shall be offered by the auctioneers in numerical order, beginning at the lowest number; and no auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than six minutes in offering any one pen of cattle for sale, or occupy more than one hour in disposing of all similar stock in his hands for sale. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle in his hands within the specified time, the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered by auction until all similar stock that day in the market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale.

8. All auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than ten minutes in offering any horse or horses by auction while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction are present, except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers; and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time.

9. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction, the market inspector's decision shall be final.

10. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.

11. The Council may licence any yards or premises for the sale of cattle outside a radius of seven miles from the Yarrawonga Corporation Sale-yards; and the annual licence fee shall be Two shillings and sixpence for each yard or premises so licensed.

12. The weigh-bridge, situate in Belmore-street, in the township of Yarrawonga, shall be the market weigh-bridge, and be subject to such tolls and dues as the Council may from time to time appoint.

13. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach or default of this By-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing By-law, being By-law No. 26 of the Shire of Yarrawonga, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga on the 16th day of October, 1899, and confirmed by the said Council by special Order this 21st day of November, 1899.

The Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga shall demand, receive, and have of and from every person exposing or offering for sale, or selling any cattle in the Yarrowonga Corporation Sale-yards, and from every person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle any licensed yards or premises within the municipal district and outside the said Yarrowonga Corporation Sale-yards, and also from every person who shall use the weighing machine provided by such Council for the weighing of carts, the several sums of money as for tolls or dues hereinafter appointed in that behalf, that is to say:—

BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Yarrowonga, made under sub-section 7 of section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 27, for authorizing the issue of Licences to Auctioneers empowering them to sell in the Yarrowonga Corporation Sale-yards and immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the amount of annual licence-fee to be paid for such licence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrowonga order as follows:—

1. Every auctioneer desirous of exercising his vocation within the Yarrowonga Corporation Sale-yards and its immediate approaches shall, on obtaining the consent in writing of the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, be authorized to sell in the said market and approaches thereto, subject to the provisions of any by-law now or hereafter to be in force in the said shire for the regulation and government of the said market.

2.
