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COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES LONG SERVICE DECORATION AND MEDAL WARRANTS.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State to His Excellency the Governor, with its Enclosures, is published for general information.

SIR,

It is probable that your attention has been directed to two Royal Warrants, dated the 18th of May, instituting a new 2 Warrants. Decoration and Medal for Colonial Forces, which were published in the *London Gazette* of the 2nd of June, and copies of which I have the honour to enclose.

2. Various representations have been made during recent years, both to my predecessor and myself, as to the exclusion of a large section of the Colonial Forces from the long service Decoration and Medal which has been granted to Volunteers; and it is impossible to doubt that the feeling on the subject has been very strong.

3. You are probably aware that the reason assigned by the War Department for this limitation of the Decoration and Medal has been that a large proportion of the Colonial Forces are described as "Militia"; and it has been held that a force raised on a "militia" or even a "partially-paid" organization could not properly be regarded as coming under the designation of a Volunteer Force.

4. In view, however, of the feeling to which I have referred, and which under the circumstances it is not difficult to understand, I have for some time past been in consultation with the Secretary of State for War as to whether some modification of the existing regulations might not be arrived at that would include those Colonial Forces which have hitherto been regarded as disqualified for the Decoration and Medal; and with this object in view I suggested to the Marquess of Lansdowne the appointment of an inter-Departmental Committee to consider the question in all its bearings.

5. The appointment of this Committee was agreed to by the Marquess of Lansdowne; and their recommendations have been practically embodied in the Royal Warrants which I now have the pleasure to enclose.

6. With the exception, therefore, of the Permanent Forces, which are already eligible under other regulations for medals for long and meritorious service and for distinguished service, the whole of the organized Military Forces of Her Majesty's Colonies, whether designated as Militia or Volunteers, will now become eligible for a long service Decoration and Medal. I venture to think that this concession on the part of Her Majesty's Government will be appreciated throughout the Empire.

7. It will be observed that the regulations as to the issue, surrender, forfeiture, and restoration of Decorations or Medals are to correspond as far as possible with those laid down for "The Volunteer Officers' Decoration" and "The Volunteer Long Service Medal"; and I need only therefore refer you for your guidance to my predecessor's Circular despatch of the 18th June, 1894, and my own Circular despatch of the 23rd September, 1896. A copy of the latter is enclosed.

8. The question of the designs for the new Decoration and Medal is at present under consideration; and a further communication will be addressed to you on this subject. The cost of the supply of the Decoration and Medal will, as on previous similar occasions, be borne by Colonial Revenues.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, copies of a Royal Warrant extending to Indian, Colonial, and other Volunteer Forces raised for service in countries under Her Majesty's protection the grant of the "Volunteer Long Service Medal."

It is intended that the medal for Colonial Volunteers should be of the same design as that awarded to Volunteers in this country, except that the words "et Imperatrix" will be added to the inscription "Victoria Regina" on the obverse of the latter.

The medal is manufactured for the War Office by Messrs. Jenkins and Sons, Unity Works, Vittoria-street, Birmingham; and it is a matter for consideration whether it may not be convenient that all the Colonial Governments in which there are Volunteer Forces, should decide to obtain the medal from that firm.

It will be observed that under the terms of the Royal Warrant, the medal is to be issued to Colonial Volunteers under regulations recommended by the Governors of Colonies and approved by a Secretary of State. These regulations should, as far as circumstances permit, be similar to those now existing for the Volunteer Forces in Great Britain, and I enclose for your information copies of the paragraphs of the current Volunteer Regulations dealing with the issue of the medal in this country.

THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES OFFICERS' DECORATION WARRANT.

VICTORIA R.I.

Whereas it is Our desire to recognise the long and meritorious services of Commissioned Officers of our Colonial Auxiliary Forces, and of others who shall be eligible under the conditions herein laid down. We do hereby constitute and create, as a reward for these services, a new Decoration, which shall be designated "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration."

It is Our Will and Pleasure that this Decoration shall be conferred on the Commissioned Officers of all organized Military Forces, except the Permanent Forces, serving in Our Colonies and Dependencies, or raised for Our Service in countries under Our protection, whether designated as Militia or Volunteers, or otherwise, subject to the following rules:—

The period of service requisite to qualify for this Decoration shall be twenty years' commissioned service. Half the time

served in the ranks of any such forces shall be reckoned as qualifying service. Service on the West Coast of Africa shall reckon double as qualifying service.

Service rendered partly in the Local Forces of one Colony or Protectorate, and partly in the Local Forces of another Colony or Protectorate, or partly in the Local Forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, and partly in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain, shall be reckoned as qualifying service for the Decoration, provided that no Officer shall be eligible unless at least half of his qualifying service has been rendered in the Militia or Volunteer Forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, service on the West Coast of Africa counting double.

Service on the Permanent Staff shall not reckon as qualifying service for this Decoration.

Service qualifying for this Decoration shall also count towards the qualifying service necessary for "The Volunteer Officers' Decoration," provided that no Officer shall be eligible for such decoration unless ten years' commissioned service, or the equivalent thereof, has been spent in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain.

It is Our further Will and Pleasure that this Decoration shall be conferred under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, and restoration, as may from time to time be submitted by the Governor-General of Our Dominion of Canada, or by the Governors of Our Colonies and Dependencies, or by Our representatives in countries under Our protection, and as may be approved by Our Principal Secretary of State for War upon the recommendation of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies. The regulations aforesaid shall as far as possible correspond with those laid down for "The Volunteer Officers' Decoration."

Our Warrant of the 24th May, 1894, save and except so much of it as relates to Our Indian Empire, is hereby cancelled.

THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES LONG SERVICE MEDAL WARRANT.

VICTORIA R.I.

Whereas it is Our desire to recognise the long and meritorious services of members of Our Colonial Auxiliary Forces, and of others who shall be eligible under the conditions herein laid down, We do hereby constitute and create, as a reward for these services, a new Medal, which shall be designated "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal."

It is Our Will and Pleasure that this Medal shall be awarded to the members of all organized Military Forces, except the Permanent Forces serving in Our Colonies and Dependencies, or raised for Our Service in countries under Our protection, whether designated as Militia or Volunteers, or otherwise, subject to the following rules:—

The period of service requisite to qualify for this Medal shall be twenty years. Service on the West Coast of Africa shall reckon double as qualifying service.

Service rendered partly in the Local Forces of one Colony or Protectorate, and partly in the Local Forces of another Colony or Protectorate, or partly in the Local Forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, and partly in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain, shall be reckoned as qualifying service for the Medal, provided that no Officer or man shall be eligible, unless at least half his service has been rendered in the Militia or Volunteer Forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, service on the West coast of Africa counting double.

Service on the Permanent Staff shall not reckon as qualifying service for this Medal.

Service qualifying for this Medal shall also count towards the necessary qualifying service for "The Volunteer Long Service Medal," provided that no Officer or man shall be eligible for such medal, unless ten years' service has been spent in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain.

An Officer who has served in the ranks of a Volunteer corps in Great Britain, or of the Militia or Volunteers of a Colony or Protectorate, but who is not qualified for the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration, shall, on completing twenty years' service in all, be eligible to receive the Long Service Medal, but shall surrender it if subsequently the aforesaid Decoration shall be conferred upon him.

It is Our further Will and Pleasure that this Medal shall be awarded under such regulations as to issue, surrender, forfeiture, and restoration as may from time to time be submitted by the Governor-General of Our Dominion of Canada, or by the Governors of Our Colonies and Dependencies, or by Our representatives in countries under Our protection, and as may be approved by Our Principal Secretary of State for War upon the recommendation of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies. The regulations aforesaid shall as far as possible correspond with those laid down for "The Volunteer Long Service Medal."

Volunteer Long Service Medals already issued to Colonial Forces under the authority of Our Warrant of the 13th June, 1896, shall be considered equivalent to "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal."

Our Warrant of the 13th June, 1896, save and except so much of it as relates to Our Indian Empire, is hereby cancelled.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. 

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 28,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes, or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under, a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

CAMPERDOWN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Camperdown Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the *Government Gazette*, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Before any interment shall take place in the said cemetery, application for permission shall be made at the office of the trustees a reasonable time previously, when an order, on the form or to the effect set out in the schedule hereto annexed, marked B, will be given to the applicant on payment of the charges hereto annexed, marked A.

2. All such charges must be paid when the order for interment is given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other sufficient evidence to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4. If an interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the proprietor must be left with the orders.

5. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the orders.

6. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

7. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under direction of the trustees, or whom they may appoint, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

8. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other months.

9. The funeral must take place punctually at the appointed hour.

10. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for approval.

11. All vaults, graves, monuments, and fences must be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owner, who must, within three days, remove the refuse of all materials used in their construction and repair.

12. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less

than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery, nor shall any material be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft with rain or otherwise.

13. No catacomb shall be allowed.

14. No wooden erection shall be allowed.

15. The trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other cemetery.

16. Before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the trustees a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and, in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890*, or any amendment or substitution thereof, in addition to the permission of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

17. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. No bath, caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once, by and at the expense of the person causing the same. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.

18. No child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

19. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.

20. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

21. No person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

22. Any person employed under the trustees accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

23. Any person committing any breach of any of these rules or regulations, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such persons may be subject.

24. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office.

25. The ground shall be open to the public from Seven in the morning to sunset.

26. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in the regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

BOROUGH OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BY-LAW No. 4.

A By-law of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell made under the provisions of section No. 191 of the *Local Government Act 1899*, and numbered 4, for the regulation and government of drivers of machines for locomotion, or carriage, other than perambulators and vehicles drawn by animals.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the provisions and powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1899*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean any vehicle used for locomotion or carriage, whether driven by manual or pedal power, or by any mechanical means, but shall not include perambulators. The expression "driver" shall mean every person in charge of or propelling a machine.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers; provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person riding, driving, or impelling a machine between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every driver of a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way (except as provided hereunder), and whenever he shall overtake or pass with such machine any vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or

any foot passenger proceeding along or across the carriage-way he shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every driver of a machine who overtakes and passes any other machine or vehicle or any horse or any other beast of burden proceeding in the same direction as himself shall keep the machine in his or her charge to the right or off side of the machine, vehicle, or animal being passed.

6. Every driver of a machine who meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by an animal, or who meets any horse or other beast of burden (and the animal drawing such vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden on such meeting or overtaking becomes restive or alarmed, or ceases to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof), shall immediately dismount and cease propelling such machine, and shall so continue so long as may be necessary to allow such animal to be removed or quietened.

7. No person riding, driving, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than 8 miles per hour upon or along any street or public place, nor shall proceed at a greater speed than 5 miles per hour upon, over, or along any crossing.

8. No person whilst riding, driving, or impelling a machine through any street shall ride with his feet off the pedals or with his hands off the handle-bars, or otherwise ride the machine carelessly or negligently, or adopt the practice generally known as "coasting," but shall so ride, drive, or impel the machine in such a manner that he shall at all times retain full control thereof.

9. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
