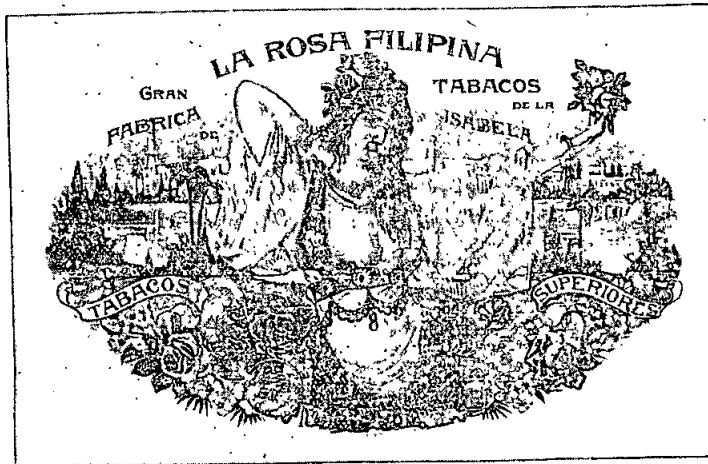

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 1.

ANY person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

2. Every house, tenement, factory, or steam boiler receiving water from the Trust shall have a separate and independent service-pipe connexion with the pipes of the Trust for every such house, tenement, factory, or steam boiler.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust, appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. The service-pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises of less annual value than Twenty pounds, one-half inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises of the annual value of Twenty pounds and over, three-quarters of an inch diameter, except where special agreement is made; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

6. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

7. No person supplied by the Trust with water shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for any such breach.

8. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

10. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed, in writing, by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

11. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

12. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which,

under any of these Regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

14. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise.

15. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings, connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to relay or refix the same, must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner; and shall pay a license-fee of One pound per annum, notwithstanding which the Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

17. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All end of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded; and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved patterns, to screw into elbows, bends, &c.; all cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- (6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than 10 inches.

18. If any person throw, or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks, belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds.

19. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct, which by notice in the *Government Gazette* has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash, or throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds.

20. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to supply such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

21. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

22. The officers of the Trust shall have power, between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, to enter any house, building, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust, by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. In the construction of these Regulations the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word officer shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word Trust shall be deemed to mean the Yea Waterworks Trust.

KYABRAM URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

The following rates and charges are those which the officers and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds annual value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that no rate shall be less than One pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Five shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Ten shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half-an-acre, Fifteen shillings if more than half-an-acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre, with a maximum charge of One pound sterling for any parcel of land within the boundary of the Urban Trust.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st of July, 1900.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 3.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation respecting Fishing, &c., in the Caledonia and Hanging Rock Reservoirs, Heathcote:—

1. No person shall use in the Caledonia and Hanging Rock Reservoirs, Heathcote, any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil, or made stationary, or partly stationary, in any way or manner, for the purpose of taking fish.

2. No person shall angle for or remove, or take from the said reservoirs, any fish which may be therein during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in each and every year.

3. No person shall angle with or use more than one line of any kind whatsoever upon or in either of the said reservoirs at one and the same time. That no person shall angle in the said reservoirs with more than two hooks covered with bait at one and the same time.

4. No person or persons shall be allowed to catch fish in the reservoirs between the hours of Eight p.m. and Five a.m.

5. No person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever in the said reservoirs for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot, or for any other purpose whatsoever.

6. All persons catching any fish in the said reservoirs under 4 ozs. in weight shall forthwith return the same to the reservoirs.

7. No person shall remove or take away, or cause or procure to be removed or taken away, from the said reservoirs any ova or spawn without the consent of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust being first obtained.

8. Any person detected in leaving any weight, stone, tin, or other obstacle, at the bottom of the reservoirs shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

9. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to catch fish in the said reservoirs unless previously licensed so to do. Such licences shall be issued to applicants at the discretion of the Engineer of the Trust, at the following rate:—

For each licence, Two shillings and sixpence per annum.

10. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law, where not otherwise provided, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 7.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust (a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District, being an area comprised within lines parallel to and 40 chains distant from the boundaries of the Township of Korumburra, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 19th December, 1887, page 3804), for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, and pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 7.

For fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and a minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied, and for regulating the construction, disposition, custody, and inspection of meters, and for other purposes.

1. For water for domestic and other than domestic purposes supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be paid.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be as follows:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes solely; 50,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

For gardens and lawns—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Above $\frac{1}{16}$ but not more than $\frac{1}{8}$ of an acre, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Above $\frac{1}{8}$ but not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Above $\frac{1}{4}$ but not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre, 28,000 gallons per annum.

Above $\frac{1}{2}$ but not more than 1 acre, 40,000 gallons per annum.

Livery and carriers' stables; for each stall or space of 5 feet 3,000 gallons per annum.

Stand-pipe or hydrant water for each load of 100 gallons or under One shilling shall be charged, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first 100 in any one load Sixpence shall be charged. Payments for such water to be made at the time of taking delivery.

All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

The water supplied in the Urban District of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and the *Water Act 1890* or any Act amending the same.

The Regulation No. 1 of the Trust is hereby repealed, and the following provisions substituted therefor:—

(1) Meters, how placed.—Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and, as far as practicable, where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto. A meter shall not be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe or other pipe of the Trust, unless permitted in writing under the hand of the duly authorized officer of the Trust. A meter shall not be continued to be used if it is found on being tested by the Trust's officer to be inaccurate, and no meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons. The keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust.

(2) Use of hose prohibited.—No cock or tap, with any connection for attaching hose, shall be affixed to any service-pipe, connection, or fitting, and no hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing houses, walls, or vehicles, or animals, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter, without the written authority of the Trust, under a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

(3) Penalty for illegally using water.—Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, drinking-tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipes shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(4) Licence to lay service-pipes.—Penalty for breach of this clause.—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(5) Licence-fee.—Licences to affix and lay or alter or repair service-pipes, to tap mains and sub-mains, and to do and execute generally the plumbing and other work necessary for laying on and maintaining water services may be granted to persons who shall satisfy the Trust of their competency to perform such plumbing and other work, upon payment of an annual fee of One pound.

(6) It shall not be compulsory on the Trust to grant a licence to every or any applicant who shall prove his competency.

(7) Deposit as security for good faith.—Every person previous to being licensed to lay services shall deposit with the Trust Secretary the sum of Two pounds sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the regulations and conditions contained in this regulation, and, in the case of the non-observance or non-performance of any of such stipulations and conditions at any time by such licensed person, the Trust shall be entitled to declare his deposit absolutely forfeited, and the same shall be forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person shall at once be struck off the roll of licensed plumbers. On surrender of the licence to the Trust the deposit, if not forfeited, shall be refunded.

(8) Responsibility of licensee.—In every case a licensee shall be responsible for the acts, errors, and omissions of his employes; and the Trust shall have power to cancel the licence at any time.

(9) Service-pipes at cost of consumers.—All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer as the Trust may appoint. All service-pipes shall have a stop cock at the main with brass ferrule.

(10) No pipe to be fixed, nor afterwards removed, without permission of the Trust.—It shall be unlawful for any person, whether licensed or not, to open any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, or a communication or service-pipe belonging to or used by the owner, occupier, or consumer, or any other person, or to make any alteration in any such communication or service-pipe, or in any apparatus connected therewith, or remove such service-pipe or apparatus, without the consent in every such case of the Trust; and if any person act in any respect in contravention of the provisions of this clause he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, without prejudice to the right of the Trust to recover damages from him in respect of any injury done to its property, and without prejudice to its right to recover from him the value of any water wasted, misused, or unduly consumed.

(11) Defective service-pipes, penalty for neglect to repair.—If any person shall neglect to have repaired any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from an officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires to be repaired, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, after notice, to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after such offence is continued after notice thereof from the Trust.

(12) Water-troughs and cisterns.—To prevent overflow, all water-troughs and cisterns must be fitted with approved self-acting taps which shall at all times be maintained in good working order.

(13) Boilers, steam-pipes, &c.—No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

(14) All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed direct from the pipes of the Trust.

(15) Baths.—In every bath the inlet must be distinct and unconnected with the outlet. The inlet pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly water-tight ground outlet, plug, or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessels will not be permitted, except where the supply is taken by measure.

(16) Water-closets.—Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

(17) Entry of Trust's officers for purposes of inspection.—The officers of the Trust may at all reasonable times, between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890*, enter any house, tenement, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the instruments, pipes, and apparatus for conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water.

(18) Regulations for laying service.—The following regulations shall be observed by all persons in connexion with the laying of services, &c.:

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., shall be sound and free from defects, and all ends of pipes, bends, &c., shall be properly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c. All delivery cocks shall be high pressure and the best quality in workmanship, and in all exposed places to be opened and shut by movable key or handle. All jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks shall be made with red lead and flax.
 - (2) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of less than 10 inches. After service-pipes have been laid, the trench or trenches shall be properly filled and thoroughly rammed, and any subsidence therein which may appear within three months shall be immediately made good by the owner or occupier of the premises supplied by such service-pipe. No trench made for the purpose of receiving, removing, altering, or repairing, or extending a service-pipe shall be left open after sunset.
 - (3) No private service whatsoever shall be laid or removed, or extensions made by any licensed person unless he has ascertained at the Trust's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the proper officer of the Trust to have such work executed.
 - (4) Within 24 hours after the completion of each service the licensed person by whom such service shall have been laid shall report at the office of the Trust the completion thereof.
 - (5) If at any time such licensed person shall wilfully act contrary to any of the provisions of this regulation either by himself or his workmen his name may be erased from the Trust's list of licensed plumbers.
 - (6) Each licensed person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him or his workmen in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and maintained in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three months after such service-pipe has been completed.
- (19) In the construction of this regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Korumburra Waterworks Trust.
- (20) Any person who shall commit a breach of these regulations shall, in addition to the penalty that may be imposed for such breach, be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

**ROMSEY WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
No. 20.**

A REGULATION of the Romsey Waterworks Trust, made under the powers conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

In pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Romsey Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Romsey Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Romsey in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1900, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions of Ninepence each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1900, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of July, 1900.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Romsey Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special agreement.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900, and shall be due and payable in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

**BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST
—RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following:—

REGULATION NUMBERED 19.

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 1s. per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, 10s. per annum for the first horse kept, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. each per annum.
Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be 2s. per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be 20s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at 2s. per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

For the annual supply of water to gardens and special blocks of land on or near any of the Trust's channels, either within or without the Trust's District (in the Shires of Tungamah and Benalla) there shall be charged such sum as the Trust Commissioners, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall from time to time by resolution of the Trust determine.
3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1899, and shall be payable on the 1st day of November, 1899.
4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half-a-mile, distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.
5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.
6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1900.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every unoccupied allotment or vacant lot the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings (10s.) be charged.

(3) For every occupied allotment a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings (10s.) each be charged.

(4) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile, from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1900, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900.

4. Such person as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

The minimum rate payable in respect of any property liable to be rated shall be One pound sterling for lands or tenements supplied with water from the pipes of the Trust, and Ten shillings for every piece of vacant or unoccupied land not so supplied, as fixed by the Governor in Council.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

TOWN OF GEELONG.—REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE GEELONG TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of July, 1893, the Council of the Town of Geelong, having drafted the following regulations for the management of the Geelong Town Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the and occupied by him may depasture on the common one

additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. Each person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any stock on the common, give to the herdsman a true and correct description of such stock and their brands and other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate of having done so, and shall at the same time obtain a badge and chain from the herdsman (both of which shall be the absolute property of the managers) for any number of stock he wishes to depasture; he shall then be responsible and liable to be charged for that number from the time the herdsman delivers the badge or badges to him to the date of delivery of same back to the herdsman. No person shall use other than registered badges in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the common; should the badge or badges aforesaid be from any cause removed from the stock, they must be at once replaced at the expense of the person depasturing (and shall be supplied by the herdsman at a cost of One shilling each), and any person who shall place, or allow to be placed, a chain and badge on any stock without the authority of the herdsman shall be liable to be prosecuted.

4. All fees as hereinafter set forth shall be payable in advance on the first day of each month, and no stock shall be permitted to depasture on the common unless the fees and dues thereon are regularly paid.

5. The managers of the common, or the herdsman thereof, shall not under any circumstances whatever be responsible or chargeable for the loss or damage of or to any stock depasturing on the common.

6. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule	... 3s. per month
For every head of other large cattle	... 1s. 6d. "
For every sheep or goat	... 1s. 6d. "

7. No bulls or entire horses shall be allowed to depasture on the common without special permission in writing from the managers of the common, and all geese and swine found thereon shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.

8. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

9. All stock found on the common without being duly registered, licensed, and badged shall be liable to be forthwith impounded, or their owners to be prosecuted.

10. The licence to use the common and the badges and chains shall not be transferable.

11. The herdsman shall muster the stock on the common on the first Monday in the months of January and July, in each and every year; or such other day or time as the managers may appoint, and shall see that all brands are legible, and the chains and badges in proper order. The licensees shall be required to assist at the mustering.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall on conviction before any justice of the peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
