PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.  
**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

- MONDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT,  
as a Bank Holiday, at Cheltenham, and a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Foster;
- WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT,  
as a Bank Holiday at Newstead;
- THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale\*;
- TUESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Lancefield;
- WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of EchUCA,\* Majorca,\* Maryborough,\* and Talbot,\* and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Korumburra;
- THURSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bairnsdale,\* and as a Bank Holiday at Newmarket;
- SATURDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT,  
as a Bank Holiday at Werribee;
- THURSDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MARCH NEXT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Maffra;
- WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Kerang\*;
- THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Flinders and Kangerong, Frankston and Hastings, and Mornington;
- FRIDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Dundas, the East Riding of the Shire of Gordon, and the South-east Riding of the Shire of Kerang, and as a Public Half-Holiday throughout the Borough of Hamilton.

FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HITHERAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Wednesday, the 15th day of February, 1899, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Wednesday, the 15th day of February, 1899, until Wednesday, the 15th day of March, 1899.
