THE BUKAWERT REFORMATORY SCHOOL FOR PROTESTANT BOYS.—CHANGE OF SITE.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. S. A. PALMER, PATENT MEDICINE VENDOR, 43 BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of three weeks from the 6th February, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifteen females or more than one boy under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifteen females and one boy under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings and Twelve shillings respectively per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Stamps Act 1890.

COMMISSION ALLOWABLE ON THE PURCHASE OF STAMPS.

THE Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 6th day of February, 1899, rescinded all previous Orders in Council relating to commissions allowed on the purchase of Stamps by Licensed Vendors of Stamps, or Managers of Banking Companies or Corporations duly appointed to sell and distribute Stamps, and has ordered as follows:—

On and after the 16th January, 1899, any licensed vendor of stamps or manager of a banking company or corporation duly appointed to sell and distribute stamps, who may obtain upon requisition from the General Post-office, or any Post and Telegraph Office, at any one time, stamps, post cards, envelopes or wrappers to the value of Three pounds (£3) will be allowed commission thereon (to be paid in stamps only) as follows:—

Adhesive stamps from One halfpenny to Two pence halfpenny	4d. in the pound
Adhesive stamps from Three pence to One shilling	3d. in the pound
Adhesive stamps over One shilling to One pound	2d. in the pound
Adhesive stamps over One pound	1d. in the pound

That commission be not allowed on fractional parts of a pound, either in the amount of stamps of any one denomination or in the total value of stamps purchased.

SHIRE OF COLAC.

BY-LAW No. 53.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 53 of the said shire:—

1. This by-law may be cited as a by-law for regulating earth-closets, and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans, and for fixing a charge for the same.

2. By-laws 49 and 51 of the Shire of Colac are hereby repealed, except that all charges which under By-law No. 51 hereby repealed are at the commencement of the operation of this by-law due or payable to the Council of the said shire shall be recoverable as if this by-law had not been made.

3. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

4. This by-law shall apply to, and have operation within, the following area in the township of Colac, namely:—Bounded on the west by Armstrong-street, on the south by Wilson and Tulloch streets, on the east by Church-street, and on the north by Lake Colac.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service to be provided by the Council.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the rise of seat towards the back of building of half-an-inch to the foot, and from the rise of seat towards the door of at least half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, saw-dust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the Council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every earth-closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time to such place as the said Council may have appointed. No one except the persons authorized by the said Council shall be employed to remove the same.

10. The charge for emptying and cleansing of cesspans to be paid by the occupier of any tenement under the provisions of section 259 of the *Health Act 1890* shall be as follows:—

Once a week for each pan, per annum	£1 0 0
Twice a week for each pan, per annum	2 0 0
Thrice a week for each pan, per annum	3 0 0

Such charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance.

Failure to pay the said annual charge shall be a breach of this by-law.

11. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

During the year 1898, the registered births numbered 30,170, and the registered deaths 18,666, which resulted in a natural increase of 11,504 as shown in the table. This was lower than the natural increase in 1897 by 4,680, and than that according to the average of the preceding four years by about 5,900; in consequence of the births having fallen off in comparison with the same periods by 1,140 and about 2,700 respectively, and the deaths having increased by 3,540 and about 3,200 respectively.

The recorded gross arrivals by sea having numbered 94,436, and the recorded gross departures 98,223, the apparent net loss by emigration was thus 3,787—consisting of 441 males and 3,346 females—which was considerably less than in the previous five years, when it varied from about 5,900 in 1894 to about 7,700 in 1895, with the exception of one year (1896) when it rose to over 14,500. The falling-off was most marked in regard to the net recorded emigration of males, which fell from between 3,200 and 4,600 in the years 1893 to 1895, nearly 10,000 in 1896, and nearly 1,600 in 1897, to less than 500 in the year under review. Whereas the net recorded emigration of females in 1898, although lower than in 1896 or 1897 was somewhat larger than in the years 1893 to 1895. Adding to the apparent loss by emigration the usual allowance for unrecorded departures, the actual net loss by emigration during the year is estimated to have been 12,262, viz., 6,888 males and 5,374 females—as shown in the table.

From the date of the census (5th April, 1891) to the end of 1898, the allowance made for unrecorded departures has been 57,491, viz., 44,626 for males and 12,865 for females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of 1898 would have been 1,232,981, viz., 638,072 males and 594,909 females. In the absence of any reliable information as to over-land migration, it is assumed that the immigration and emigration across the border balance each other.

The records of migration by sea for the year—taking them for what they are worth—show a balance in favour of immigration from South Australia of 1,261, and from foreign ports of 2,359; but a balance in favour of emigration to New South Wales of 2,607, to Queensland of 1,166, to Western Australia of 817, to Tasmania of 316, to New Zealand and South Seas of 1,424, to United Kingdom of 949, and to South Africa of 130. So long as it is the practice to include persons merely passing through Victorian ports *en route* both as immigrants and emigrants, no correct indication can be obtained of the migration as between Victoria and other countries individually.

The recorded net emigration to Western Australia—not only from Victoria, but practically from the whole of Eastern Australasia—during the last nine years was as follows:—736 in 1890, 1,960 in 1891, 1,714 in 1892, 2,255 in 1893, 10,145 in 1894, 11,127 in 1895, 21,497 in 1896, 11,195 in 1897, and 817 in 1898; and that to South Africa in the last four years as follows:—1,488 in 1895, 2,881 in 1896, 746 in 1897, and 130 in 1898. Thus the net emigration to Western Australia which had been so heavy in the years 1893-7 has almost ceased, having been less in 1898 than in any year since 1890; whilst that to South Africa in 1898 was also inconsiderable.

The figures of births and deaths, and consequently those of population, may be slightly altered when the returns are finally examined.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST RATING REGULATION FOR 1899.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulations. The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust (that is to say):—

In regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes.

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds (£10) annual value or under, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the value of Ten pounds (£10), the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property, provided that no rate be less than One pound.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and when such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1899—commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1899, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st day of January, and the other moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

**SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1899 FOR THE
PURPOSE OF LEVYING RATES WITHIN THE
RURAL PORTION OF THE DISTRICT OF THE
TRUST.**

REGULATION No. 29.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 14th day of December, 1896, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust District, exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of December, 1895, into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—No. 1 Division and No. 2 Division, and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such divisions, and has by a further Order made the 19th day of December, 1898, determined the proportion in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another for the year 1899.

The Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following rates to be levied within the aforesaid divisions of the district of the Trust, the boundaries of which divisions are fully set forth in the Order in Council of the 14th December, 1896, hereinbefore mentioned:—

1. In No. 1 Division, Fivepence in the pound sterling; in No. 2 Division, Threepence in the pound sterling. The respective rates to be levied on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above, described according to the valuation for the time being for the municipal rates of the Shire of Numurkah.

The rates hereby made shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1899.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due on the 1st day of February, 1899.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

**KERANG EAST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY
TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE DISTRIBUTION
OF WATER.**

FOR the purpose of distributing water, the district of the Trust shall be divided into six sections, as follow:—

Section 1 shall include all land watered by the No. 1 branch channel, together with the land watered by the main channel, commencing at the top end, and terminating at the Calivil flume, about 2,376 acres, to receive one-eighth of the whole of the supply available at any time.

Section 2 shall include all land watered by the No. 2 distributary from the offtake down to the Kerang East State School, about 3,762 acres, to receive one-fourth of the supply available.

Section 3 shall include all land watered by the No. 2 distributary, commencing at the Kerang East State School, and terminating at Garlicks, about 4,332 acres, to receive one-fourth of the whole of the supply available.

Section 4 shall include all land watered by the No. 2A distributary, commencing at the offtake, and terminating at the south boundary of J. W. Hall's selection, about 1,769 acres, to receive one-eighth of the supply available.

Section 5 shall include all land watered by the No. 2A distributary, commencing at the south boundary of J. W. Hall's, and terminating at Woolcock's, about 2,144 acres, to receive one-eighth of the supply available.

Section 6 shall include all land watered by the main channel, commencing at the Calivil flume, and terminating at W. Begg's selection, about 2,137 acres, to receive one-eighth of the supply available.

1. Applications for water must be made in writing. Applicants to be served according to priority.

2. If the demand for water be more than the channels can supply, the area to be watered shall be limited to 30 acres for crop, and 40 acres for grass per every 320-acre block.

3. Water will not be supplied to any applicant if proper provision be not made to secure it. All water used on the land to be paid for.

4. If an applicant be not ready to receive the water when his turn comes, or refuses to do so, his application shall be cancelled, but applicants can arrange for alterations amongst themselves.

5. All nets or traps for the destruction of fish found in the Trust channels will be destroyed, and persons found using the same will be prosecuted.

6. That the Regulation made by the Trust on the 9th day of January, 1894, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 3rd September, 1894, shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

GRANTED BY PARLIAMENT UNDER THE RAIL-

ACTS TO PROMOTE THE AGRICULTURAL,
DAIRY, FRUIT, AND WINE INDUSTRIES.**

WHEREAS by the Railway and Public Works Loan Application Acts it is among other things provided that the sum of One hundred thousand pounds, to be raised by the sale of Victorian Government Three per cent. Stock, under the authority of the said Act, may be applied for the purpose of District Co-operative Wineries and Viticulture Industry, Dairy Schools, Experimental Stations, Purchase of Live Stock, Machinery, Implements, and other Appliances, and Technical Agricultural Education, Development of the Export Trade, Bonuses for the encouragement of the Cultivation, Manufacture, and Export of Fruit, Tobacco, Flax, Hemp, Silk, and other Rural Industries, to be expended under Regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

TECHNICAL AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

1. The Governor in Council may, from time to time, engage persons temporarily and during his pleasure, upon such terms as he may think fit, to impart instruction in technical agricultural education—

- In the culture of grape vines.
- In wine-making.
- In the culture of fruit trees.
- In the drying, bottling, and canning of fruits.
- In the culture of plants producing hbro, paper, oil, tannin, drugs, dye, scents, or insecticide.
- In the preparation of any such articles for the manufacturer.
- In the cultivation and treatment of tobacco.
- In matters appertaining to dairying.
- In matters appertaining to sericulture.
- In the preparation of poultry, rabbits, &c., for export.

2. Such persons shall perform such duties as the Governor in Council or, failing the Governor in Council, the Minister may direct, and at such places as the Minister may direct.

3. The salaries or wages, travelling expenses, cost of and carriage of appliances, and the preparation of material for instruction purposes, shall be paid out of the sum of Thirty thousand pounds granted for dairy schools, experimental stations, purchase of live stock, machinery, implements, and other appliances, and technical agricultural education.

And the Honorable John William Taverner, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is provided among other things by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* (Act No. 1141) that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time make such regulations under the said Part of the said Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes in section 4 of the said Act mentioned, and may rescind the same: And whereas certain regulations were, on the 21st day of December, 1897, made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the hereinbefore recited powers which it is deemed expedient to amend: And whereas it is deemed expedient to make certain additional regulations for the purpose of subjecting stock (which term shall have the like meaning in this regulation as that given to it by the hereinbefore referred to regulation of the 21st December, 1897) intended to be introduced or when introduced into Victoria by sea from any place outside Victoria in any vessel which has called or been at any port or place in the colony of Queensland within a period of three calendar months from the date of the shipping of such stock on board such vessel to inspection and disinfection, and for the purpose of regulating the introduction into Victoria of certain fittings used or provided for or in connexion with the transport of stock by sea: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power him enabling in that behalf, make the regulations following (that is to say):—

1. The words "to the north of the boundary line" where they occur in the sixth clause and in schedule "C" and schedule "D" of the regulations of the 21st day of December, 1897, shall be and the same are hereby rescinded, and the said clause and schedules shall be read and construed accordingly.

2. When it is proposed to introduce by sea into Victoria any stock from any place outside Victoria (the introduction of any kind of stock from whence has not been prohibited) in any vessel which has called or been at any port or place in the colony of Queensland within a period of three calendar months from the date of the shipping of such stock on such vessel, such stock, together with all fixtures and fittings used or provided for or in connexion with the transport of such stock, shall before such stock or before any such fixtures or fittings from such vessel are permitted to land be thoroughly disinfected to the satisfaction of the Victorian Inspector of Stock, so as to effectually exterminate all ticks or tick, if any there be, about such stock, fixtures, or fittings.

And the Honorable John William Taverner, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary instructions herein accordingly.

Health Act 1890.

INTRODUCTION OF CATTLE, HORSES, SHEEP,
AND DOGS FROM QUEENSLAND REGULATED.

WHEREAS by section 207 of the *Health Act 1890* it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or among other things of articles likely to propagate among animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever; and further providing that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section should for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council might in any case by such Order direct: And whereas in the Colony of Queensland there is known to exist in cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs, a disease known as ticks, or tick, or Texas fever; And whereas by an Order made by the Governor in Council under the powers in that behalf conferred upon him by the hereinbefore recited section, on the 24th day of September, 1896, the introduction into Victoria of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs from that portion of the colony of Queensland north of the quarantine boundary line in the said Order more particularly described and referred to was absolutely prohibited: And whereas by a further Order made under the powers aforesaid by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of December, 1897 (repealing certain earlier Orders therein referred to), provision was made whereby the introduction into Victoria of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs from that part of the colony of Queensland not covered by the prohibition contained in the hereinbefore recited Order of the 24th day of September, 1896, was regulated: And whereas it has been determined to redefine the area of the part of the colony of Queensland the introduction from whence of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs is absolutely prohibited, and to modify the regulation with respect to the introduction into Victoria of all cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs from those parts of Queensland outside the area so defined, and with that object to repeal the aforesaid recited Order in Council, and to regulate the admission into Victoria of pens or fittings by vessels that have traded to or been in any part of Queensland within a period of three calendar months prior to the arrival of such vessels in Victoria used for or in connexion with the transport of cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the hereinbefore recited Act and of every other power him enabling in that behalf, doth by this present Order direct and ordain as follows (that is to say):—

- (1) That the hereinbefore recited Orders in Council made respectively on the 24th day of September, 1896, and on the 21st day of December, 1897, be and the same are hereby repealed.
- (2) The introduction into Victoria of any cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs from that part of the colony of Queensland included in the area described in the schedule lettered A hereunder is hereby absolutely prohibited.
- (3) The introduction by sea into Victoria of any cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs (other than horses or dogs in respect of which those conditions prescribed in clause 5 of this Order have been observed) from any part of Queensland is absolutely prohibited.
- (4) The introduction by land into Victoria of any cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs (other than horses or dogs in respect of which the conditions of clause 5 of this order have been observed) from any part of Queensland, the introduction into Victoria of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs from whence is not absolutely prohibited under the provisions hereinbefore contained, is prohibited, unless and except such cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs, as the case may be, have been previously detained in the colony of New South Wales for a period of not less than three calendar months immediately preceding the date of their proposed introduction into Victoria, and unless and except prior to their introduction into Victoria the terms of all regulations for the time being in force made under the provisions of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* applicable to their case have been complied with and observed.
- (5) Horses or dogs from any part of Queensland, the introduction into Victoria of cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs from whence is not absolutely prohibited under the provisions of clause 2 of this Order, which have not during the preceding six months from the date of their proposed introduction into Victoria been in direct contact with any cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs infected with tick or ticks or Texas fever, and which have been detained in New South Wales territory for a period of not less than one calendar month immediately preceding the date of their proposed introduction into Victoria, and which have during that month been constantly and habitually, in the case of horses, groomed and stabled, or, in the case of dogs, groomed,

may, subject to the due observance of and compliance with the terms of all regulations for the time being in force made under the provisions of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* applicable to their case, be introduced into Victoria by land or sea.

- (6) The introduction by sea into Victoria of any pens, boxes, cages, kennels, coops, or other appliances, fixtures, or fittings used or provided for or in connexion with the transport of cattle, horses, sheep, or dogs by any vessel which has called or been at any port or place in the colony of Queensland within a period of three calendar months from the date of the arrival in Victoria of such ship with such pens, boxes, cages, kennels, coops, or other appliances, fixtures, or fittings on board is prohibited, except on proof of the due observance of and compliance with the terms of all regulations for the time being in force made under the provisions of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* applicable to their case.

Commencing on the border between the colonies of New South Wales and Queensland, at a point due south of the south-east corner of portion 652 of 160 acres, parish of Rosenthal; and bounded thence by a line to that corner; thence by part of the east boundary of that portion to the railway line from Stanthorpe to Warwick; thence by that railway line westerly to Dalveen; thence by a line to the rabbit fence on the northern boundary of Folkestone Occupation Licence; thence by that fence in a general north-westerly direction along the north-eastern boundaries of Folkestone Occupation Licence, Fikedale, Glenelg, Bodumba, Stonehenge, Canning Creek, and Western Creek Consolidations, along the eastern and part of the northern boundaries of Dunmore Consolidation, through the Dandine Consolidation, and along the eastern boundaries of Kogan Consolidation; and thence by the eastern boundaries of Chinchilla Consolidation northerly, westerly, and northerly to the southern boundary of Auburn Consolidation; thence by part of the southern and the western boundaries of that consolidation and the western water-hed of the Burnet River and the tributaries northerly to the north-east corner of Walloon Lease; thence by the northern boundary of that lease, the eastern and northern boundaries of Kianga Consolidation, by parts of the south-east and south-west boundaries of Moura Resumption, portion B, by the south and west boundaries of Bathurst Occupation Licence; by part of the south boundary of Harcourt Resumption to the north-east corner of Denby No. 1 Occupation Licence; by the north boundary of that occupation licence; by parts of the north-east and north-west boundaries of Reeliffe; by the north-east and north-west boundaries of Goomally; by the eastern boundary of Shotover northerly; and by the western boundary of Shotover southerly to the north-east corner of Marshmead No. 4 Occupation Licence; by the north boundary of that occupation licence; by part of the east boundary of Humboldt North Occupation Licence; by the north-east boundary of Comet Downs Resumption; by the east boundaries of Killowen, Laleham, Kennmare, and Speculation Occupation Licences; JERICOHO PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1850*, the Trustees of the Jericho Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby repeal the Additional Regulation regarding Navigation in South Channel, Port Phillip, which was made under the provisions aforesaid by a Proclamation bearing date the 23rd day of December, 1898, and do by this my Proclamation make the following Additional Regulation for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

Navigation of South Channel, Port Phillip.

66A. Persons in charge of steam-ships navigating the waters in the dredged cutting, South Channel, shall cause the speed of such steam-ships to be so reduced that it shall not exceed the maximum rate of 7 nautical miles per hour.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction; And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, 4, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath: Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin Districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District shall be One shilling and ninepence per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermin District shall be Four shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District shall be Three shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District shall be Five shillings and sixpence per square mile.

- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

By-LAW No. 3.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 3, for the purpose of establishing Municipal Sale Yards at Poowong.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho do order as follow:—

That the following tolls and dues be levied in the Poowong Municipal Market, and that the following rules for the regulation and government of the said market be adopted:—

For every cart or dray loaded with vegetables, or in part, Threepence.

For every cart or dray loaded with fruit, or in part, Threepence.

For every wheelbarrow or basket loaded with vegetables, or in part, One penny.

For every wheelbarrow or basket loaded with fruit, or in part, Threepence.

For every cart or dray laden with straw, hay, flour, barley, oats, rye, maize, or other grain, Sixpence.

For every cart laden with green fodder, esculent roots, or other goods standing in the market 24 hours, or part of 24 hours, Sixpence.

For every dozen fruit trees, or less number, One penny.
Pork, bacon, cheese (per stone), One penny.

LIVE STOCK.

For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule sold, or exposed for sale, Sixpence.

For every calf sold, or exposed for sale, One penny.

For every head meat cattle sold, or exposed for sale, Threepence.

For every pig sold, or exposed for sale, One penny.

For every 50, and not more than 100, sheep or goats sold, or exposed for sale, One shilling.

For any number less than 50 sold, or exposed for sale, Threepence.

Articles not provided, per load or less quantity, Sixpence.
Bullock dray load, Ninepence.

Rules for the better Regulations and Government of the Market.

The market shall be open for the receipt or sale of the before-mentioned marketable commodities on such days during the year, and for such hours during each day, as the Council may from time to time determine, from sunrise to sunset, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, on which days no business shall be transacted therein.

That the market shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on the last Friday in each month from Ten o'clock in the forenoon to Seven o'clock p.m. of the same day. Should any of the days hereby fixed for the sale of stock or produce fall on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or New Year's Day, the market shall be open for the sale of stock or produce on the day preceding.

That all cattle yarded in the Poowong Market Yards for sale by public auction shall be divided into three classes, as follows:—

No. 1 shall consist of dairy cows; that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot, and springers.

No. 2 shall consist of stores or other cattle, not exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.

No. 3 shall consist of stores or other cattle, exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.

That all cattle shall be sold in classes. Class 1 shall be sold first, Class 2 second, Class 3 third. All the cattle in each class shall be sold or offered for sale before the sale of another class is commenced.

That all the cattle in Classes Nos. 1 and 2 shall be sold in the selling yard, and the cattle in No. 3 class may be sold in the pens or selling yard, at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of cattle shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class in the presence of the Market Inspector or other officer of the Council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced, and any person interfering with or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle in the market yard.

That all disputes as to the classification of cattle under the provisions of this By-law shall be referred to the Market Inspector, and his decision shall be final.

There shall be appointed by the Council, if necessary, an Inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

1st. To see that the market regulations are duly observed.

2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the market.

3rd. To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as may be deemed

unfit for use to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

All tolls and dues chargeable under the said schedule shall be payable and collected on the entrance of the articles into the market, or prior to their being sold and leaving the market, in the discretion of the Inspector.

Any person who shall place anything or any matter so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the market, and shall refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the Inspector to do so, or who shall place any cart, or carriage, or wheelbarrow in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Inspector thereof, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, or peg, or other instrument into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall, without the consent of the Council in writing.

Any person resisting, or obstructing, or interfering with the Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the market any produce, goods, horses, or cattle, &c., before the hour of opening or after the hours of closing said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the Council as a day upon which the market will be open, without the sanction of the Council in writing.

All produce or implements must be removed out of the yards before Twelve o'clock noon on the following day, otherwise a rent of One shilling (1s.) per week must be paid to the Council for a space not exceeding 200 superficial feet.

All horses or cattle must be removed out of the market before Twelve o'clock noon on the day following the day of sale, provided that all horses or cattle sold or offered for sale at the monthly sales on Fridays shall be removed from the market yards before Eight o'clock p.m. on the day of sale.

Any person or persons guilty of any breach or neglect of this By-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
