Marriage Act 1898.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALE PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18th DAY OF JANUARY, 1853.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Marriage Act 1898, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained

Marriage Act 1898,-No. 1582.

Section 31—

- (1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1853, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the suid date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be prima face evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.

 (2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on convictors.

 (2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and overy month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.
- (3) A copy of this section shall be published in the Gorcra-ment Gazette at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of

Factories and Shops Acts.

In compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1890, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. SNIDERS AND ABRAHAM S CIGARETTE MANUFACTURERS, DREWERY-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 15th February, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

- 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-five hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
- 2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
- That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence teamoney each evening she works overtime.
- That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their



VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURES DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1899.

THE births of 44 boys and 40 girls, or in all of 84 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of January. Of these, 38 occurred in Ballarat fast, 38 in Ballarat West, 5 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 3 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 98, viz., 55 of boys and 43 of girls.

The deaths registered in January numbered 92, viz., 45 of males and 47 of females. The deaths thus exceeded the births by 8. In December, the recorded deaths numbered 96; in January, 1898, they numbered 111; in January, 1897, they numbered 86; in January, 1896, they numbered 90; in January, 1895, they numbered 107; in January, 1894, they

numbered 101; in January, 1893, they numbered 69; in January, 1892, they numbered 69; in January, 1891, they numbered 71; in January, 1890, they numbered 104; and in January, 1889, they numbered 104.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballanat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The births of 943 children, viz., 500 boys and 443 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. By far the largest proportion—162 out of a total decrease of 260—of the reduced mortality in the month under notice as compared with the corresponding month last year will be found under local diseases; deaths from diseases of the digestive system (confined to enteritis alone) having fallen off by 49, from those of diseases of the respiratory system by 45, of the nervous system by 39, of the circulatory system by 16, and of the urinary system by 13. There was also a falling off under each of the other classes of diseases, except the parasitic class, via., 24 under zymotic, 9 under dietic, I under constitutional, 12 under developmental diseases, 20 under the head of violence, and 18 under ill-defined causes (chiefly atrophy and debility). The diminution under the zymotic class would have been more pronounced but for the prevalence of an epidemic of whoeping-cough, which caused 30 deaths in the month under review as compared with 28 in December, 14 in November, but only 4 in October last, and as against nil in January, 1808; since the mortality from measles fell from 23 to 3, that from typhoid fever from 35 to 22, from diarrheal diseases from 42 to 31, and diphtheria from 5 to 1. In the dictic class, the chief falling off was from 17 to 3 in the deaths from want of breast-milk, &c.; in the constitutional class, from 65 to 51 in those from pithisis; and in the developmental class, from 29 to 19 in those from old age.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first month of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. Between November and April diarrheal diseases and enteritis cause great havee and carry off their most numerous victims; and in this respect the past year has been much more conspicuous than the years immediately preceding, for 964 deaths from those diseases have been recorded in 1898 as compared with 840 in 1896, when they were much above the average. It is satisfactory diarrheal diseases, and eight-ninths of those from enteritis are of infants under two years, whose staple article of dist-when not breast-fod—is cow's milk, there is every reason to suspect a close connexion between the deterioration of the milk consumed during the summer months, and the great fatality from the causes named. Assuming this to be so, the introduction of some general and effective means of preventing such deterioration would probably result in the saving of nearly 500 or 600 lives annually in Melbourne and suburbs alone. The following are the deaths from those causes in each month from January, 1894, onwards:—


