By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

Marriage Act 1898.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALL PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18th DAY OF JANUARY, 1893.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Marriage Act 1898*, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained.

Marriage Act 1898.—No. 1582.

Section 31—

- (1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1893, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.
- (2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.
- (3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. SNIDERS AND ABRAHAM S. CIGARETTE MANUFACTURERS, DREWERY-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 15th February, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-five hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

8. WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST RATING REGULATION FOR 1899.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1899—commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1899, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st day of January, and the other moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

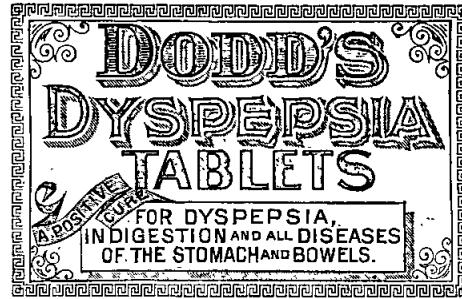

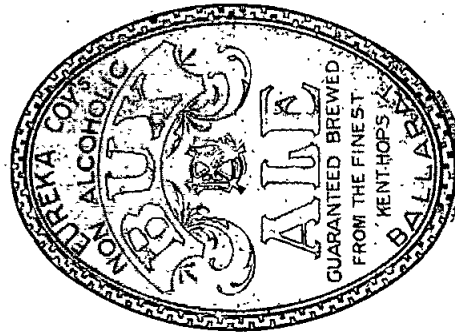

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1899.

THE births of 44 boys and 40 girls, or in all of 84 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of January. Of these, 38 occurred in Ballarat East, 38 in Ballarat West, 5 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 3 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 98, viz., 55 of boys and 43 of girls.

The deaths registered in January numbered 92, viz., 45 of males and 47 of females. The deaths thus exceeded the births by 8. In December, the recorded deaths numbered 96; in January, 1898, they numbered 111; in January, 1897, they numbered 86; in January, 1896, they numbered 90; in January, 1895, they numbered 107; in January, 1894, they

numbered 101; in January, 1893, they numbered 69; in January, 1892, they numbered 69; in January, 1891, they numbered 71; in January, 1890, they numbered 104; and in January, 1889, they numbered 104.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

It should be mentioned, however, that the mortality in January, 1898, was exceptionally high.

The births of 943 children, viz., 500 boys and 443 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. The number was, it will be observed, only 12 fewer than in January, 1898, and 39 fewer than in January, 1897, although much fewer than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 251 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 257 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 600, viz., 323 of males and 277 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 343, or by 57 per cent., as against only 11 per cent. in 1898, but 49 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 260 fewer than in January, 1898, and also much fewer than that recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years except 1895 and 1897—the number in the former being somewhat above and in the latter somewhat below that in the month under notice; it was also 203 less than the average of January during the last ten years, or 207 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.21 and of deaths registered to 15.40 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 24.93 and 22.45 per annum respectively, and in the last ten years of 30.61 and 20.71 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 102.3° on the 9th, and the lowest was 46.0° on the 25th. The mean temperature of the month (60.6°) was 6.5° below the average; and was the lowest recorded for the month in the last 40 years, the next lowest being 62.8° in January, 1884. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (44.2°) took place on the 9th, and the least range (5.8°) on the 16th. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.210 inches on the 31st, and the lowest was 29.139 inches on the 19th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.706 inches) was one-eighth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on fourteen days, the amount being 3.91 inches, which was higher than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years except 1889 and 1897, and 2.06 inches above the average during that period.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 39 per cent. to that mortality, as against a similar proportion in January, 1898; 30 per cent. in January, 1897; 43 per cent. in January, 1896; 43 per cent. in January, 1895; 42 per cent. in January, 1894; and 50 per cent. in January, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 173, as compared with 237 in January, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality (i.e., deaths of infants per 1,070 births, registered in the same month) was 183 in the month under review, as compared with 248 in January, 1898, 143 in January, 1897, 224 in January, 1896, 178 in January, 1895, 224 in January, 1894, 222 in January, 1893, 225 in January, 1892, 274 in January, 1891, 285 in January, 1890, and 384 in January, 1889.

Forty-four persons—as against 82 (an exceptional number) in January, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of diarrhoea; an agent, aged 75, of cancer; two females, each aged 75, of insanity and gastritis respectively; a bootmaker, aged 75, of nephritis; two females, each aged 76, of cerebral hæmorrhage and melæna respectively; a labourer, aged 77, of phthisis; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of disease of the liver; a lighterman, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of cancer; another, aged 79, of influenza; a soldier, aged 79, of phthisis; a gentleman, aged 79, of apoplexy; a male, of no occupation, aged 79, of indigestion; a slaughterman, aged 79, of cystitis; a gardener, aged 80, of dysentery; a labourer, aged 80, of cancer; a female, aged 80, of dilatation of the heart; an ex-teacher, aged 81, of cancer; a pensioner, aged 81, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a female, aged 81, of hemiplegia; two females, each aged 82, of diabetes and apoplexy respectively; a saddler, aged 82, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 84, and a female, aged 85, of heart disease; a tailor, aged 86, and a male, of no occupation, aged 87, of bronchitis; a female, aged 89, of fracture of femur, the result of a fall; a female, aged 90, of diarrhoea; a station hand, aged 98, of heart disease; five females, aged 76, 77, 78, 79, and 79 respectively, a hawker, aged 80, a miner, a dressmaker, and a female, each aged 81, a cabinet-maker, aged 84, and a female, aged 85, of old age.

Twenty-seven of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 47 in January, 1898—were from external causes, of which 22 were set down to accident and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 9, died of injuries, the result of being thrown out of a vehicle; a student, aged 16, of injuries to abdomen, through colliding with a cart; a miner, aged 59, of injury to spine, consequent on a fall down a winze; a leather-cutter, aged 23, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from the Merri Creek bridge; a miner, aged 58, of fracture of the thigh; an engineer, aged 44, of fracture of the spine, and a female, aged 89, of fracture of femur, caused in each case by a fall; a clerk, aged 41, of a wound on the wrist, the result of a fall on broken glass; three female children, aged 1, 2, and 10 respectively, a boy, aged 5, and a lighterman, aged 54, of burns; two female children, aged 3 and 6 months respectively, of heat apoplexy; a male child, aged 3 months, of toxic absorption, followed by convulsions; two persons were drowned whilst bathing, viz., a boy, aged 7, in the River Yarra, and a driver, aged 34, in the Saltwater River; three persons were "found drowned," two females, aged 27 and 59 respectively, in the River Yarra, and a dealer, aged 66, in the Saltwater River; and a female child, aged 4 weeks, was suffocated by regurgitation of vomited matter into the air passages. The suicidal deaths were those of a bookkeeper, aged 59, who shot himself; a carpenter, aged 55, and a female, aged 39, who cut their throats; a female, aged 49, who poisoned herself; and a gardener, aged 70, who hanged himself.

One hundred and twenty-three deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 49 in the Melbourne, 18 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 4 in the Women's, 9 in the Children's, 7 in the Homeopathic, and 6 in the Austin Hospitals; 7 in the Metropolitan and 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 7 in the Immigrants' Home; 7 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylum; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 234, of which 130, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 104, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 173 were under one year of age, 44 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five. In the corresponding month of 1898, the deaths of children of these ages numbered as many as 337.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 366. Of these, 193, or 53 per cent., were males, and 173, or 47 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 33 were between sixty-five and seventy, 32 were between seventy and seventy-five, 22 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were between eighty and eighty-five, 6 were between eighty-five and ninety, 1 at the age of ninety, and 1 at the age of 98. There was a decrease as compared with January, 1898, in the deaths of persons over five years of age of 157, of which 59 was in the number of those under 40, and 86 in those over 55 years.

By far the largest proportion—162 out of a total decrease of 260—of the reduced mortality in the month under notice as compared with the corresponding month last year will be found under local diseases: deaths from diseases of the digestive system (confined to enteritis alone) having fallen off by 49, from those of diseases of the respiratory system by 45, of the nervous system by 39, of the circulatory system by 16, and of the urinary system by 13. There was also a falling off under each of the other classes of diseases, except the parasitic class, viz., 24 under zymotic, 9 under dietic, 15 under constitutional, 12 under developmental diseases, 20 under the head of violence, and 18 under ill-defined causes (chiefly atrophy and debility). The diminution under the zymotic class would have been more pronounced but for the prevalence of an epidemic of whooping-cough, which caused 30 deaths in the month under review as compared with 28 in December, 14 in November, but only 4 in October last, and as against nil in January, 1898; since the mortality from measles fell from 23 to 3, that from typhoid fever from 38 to 22, from diarrheal diseases from 42 to 31, and diphtheria from 5 to 1. In the dietic class, the chief falling off was from 17 to 3 in the deaths from want of breast-milk, &c.; in the constitutional class, from 68 to 54 in those from phthisis; and in the developmental class, from 29 to 19 in those from old age.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first month of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

Between November and April diarrheal diseases and enteritis cause great havoc and carry off their most numerous victims; and in this respect the past year has been much more conspicuous than the years immediately preceding, for 964 deaths from these diseases have been recorded in 1898 as compared with 840 in 1896, when they were much above the average. It is satisfactory however, that a marked reduction in such deaths took place in the last two months. As four-sevenths of the deaths from diarrheal diseases, and eight-ninths of those from enteritis are of infants under two years, whose staple article of diet—when not breast-fed—is cow's milk, there is every reason to suspect a close connexion between the deterioration of the milk consumed during the summer months, and the great fatality from the causes named. Assuming this to be so, the introduction of some general and effective means of preventing such deterioration would probably result in the saving of nearly 500 or 600 lives annually in Melbourne and suburbs alone. The following are the deaths from these causes in each month from January, 1894, onwards:—

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.
