I have the honour to forward herewith ten copies of a Proclamation incorporating certain Islands in the British Solomons Protectorate, and extending to those Islands the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, and the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council 1893, and of certain of the "Queen's Regulations," made in accordance therewith, which Proclamation has been issued by me in place of those of which copies were forwarded to you with my Despatches of the 1st September<sup>1</sup> and 6th October<sup>2</sup> last, and which have been cancelled.

## WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE THOMAS MICHAEL O'BRIEN,  
Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Proclamations issued under the hand of the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific and the Seal of the Western Pacific High Commission, and bearing date the 18th day of August, 1898, and the 1st day of October, 1898, respectively.

Now, therefore, I, George Thomas Michael O'Brien, in pursuance of authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby cancel the aforesaid Proclamations, and in their stead proclaim that the Jurisdiction of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner's Court for the Western Pacific, and the provisions of Her Britannic Majesty's Order in Council, 1893, and of such of

the "Queen's Regulations" made in accordance therewith as apply to the Protectorate of the British Solomon Islands, are extended to all persons residing, or being, within the limits of the Protectorate established by Her Majesty over the following Islands, that is to say:—

Bellona Island; Rennell Island; Stewart Island; the Reef Islands, Swallow Group, including Matema, Lomlom, Nifiloli, Fenuloa, Banganeda or Nibanga, Banganatepa or Banepi, Pileni, and Nukapu; the Swallow Group, including Nakogo or Nalogo, Nupani, and Tamami or Tinakula; the Santa Cruz Group, including Trevanion, or Temotu, Santa Cruz, Utupua, Vanikoro, and Tucopia; the Duff, or Wilson, Group; Anuda, or Cherry, Island; and Fataka, or Mitre, Island; and that henceforth these Islands will form part of the Protectorate of the British Solomon Islands.

Whereof let all men take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. ## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1897*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. W. MONCKTON, CLOTHING MANUFACTURER, 310 FLINDERS-STREET, MELBOURNE.

for a period of three weeks from the 9th March, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## Marriage Act 1898.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALL PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1893.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Marriage Act 1898*, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained.

## Marriage Act 1898.—No. 1582.

## Section 31—

- (1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1893, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.
- (2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.
- (3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions: and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40—20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

*Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.*

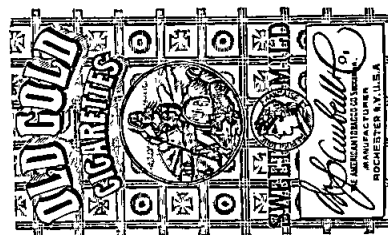

The births of 922 children, viz., 462 boys and 460 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. The number was, it will be observed, 54 fewer than in February, 1898, and also slightly fewer than in February of the years 1895 to 1897, but much fewer than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 232 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 254 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in February numbered 606, viz., 304 of males and 302 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 316, or by 52 per cent., as against only 25 per cent. in 1898, and 66 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 175 fewer than in February, 1898, and also much fewer than that recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years except 1894, 1895, and 1897; it was also 89 less than the average of February during the last ten years, or 102 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.59 and of deaths registered to 16.82 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 28.20 and 22.34 per annum respectively, and in the last ten years of 32.62 and 19.76 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.58.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 101.8° on the 14th, and the lowest was 48.2° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (69.5°) was 4.3° lower than in February, 1898, and slightly lower than in both 1890 and 1895, but much higher than in the corresponding month of any other of the previous ten years, and was 2.2° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (42.1°) took place on the 12th, and the least was 6.2° on the 4th. The mean daily range was 24.1°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.281 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.466 inches on the 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.918 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on two days, the amount being 1.44 inches, which was higher than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1889, 1896, and 1897, and .29 of an inch above the average during the period.

Males and females contributed equally to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 37 per cent. to that mortality, as against 44 per cent. in February, 1898; 34 per cent. in February, 1897; 42 per cent. in February, 1896; 40 per cent. in February, 1895; 40 per cent. in February, 1894; and 49 per cent. in February, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 162, as compared with 232 in February, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality (i.e., the proportion of deaths of infants per 1,000 births, registered in the same month) was 176 in the month under review, as compared with 238 in February, 1898, 134 in February, 1897, 203 in February, 1896, 171 in February, 1895, 156 in February, 1894, 220 in February, 1893, 184 in February, 1892, 227 in February, 1891, 210 in February, 1890, and 275 in February, 1889.

Fifty-two persons—as against 55 in February, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 75, died of cancer; a female, aged 75, of cerebral effusion; a shoeblick, aged 75, of hemiplegia; a gentleman, aged 75, of pericarditis; an ex-civil servant, aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a male of no stated occupation, aged 75, of gangrene of leg; two females, each aged 76, of heart disease; two females, each aged 77, of pericarditis; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 77, of liver disease; two females, each aged 78, of cholera and cancer respectively; a journalist, aged 78, of paralysis; two females, each aged 78, of spinal disease and bronchitis respectively; a female, aged 79, of dysentery; a gentleman, aged 79, of heart disease; a female and a pensioner, each aged 79, of bronchitis and pneumonia respectively; a female, aged 79, of enteritis; a carpenter and a female, each aged 80, of valvular disease of the heart and syncope respectively; a seaman, aged 81, of pneumonia; a female, aged 82, of obstruction of the intestines; a housekeeper, aged 82, of gangrene of leg; a stonemason, aged 83, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 83, of valvular disease of the heart; a clergyman, aged 83, of cystitis; a pensioner, aged 84, of apoplexy; a pensioner, aged 85, of hemiplegia; a waterman, aged 87, of heat apoplexy; a labourer, aged 94, of syncope; a labourer, aged 95, of enteritis; a barrister and a labourer, each aged 76, a carpenter, aged 77, a chemist, a gentleman, and a female, each aged 80, a female, aged 82, a labourer, aged 83, a female, aged 84, a gentleman, a manufacturer, and two females, each aged 85, and four females, aged 87, 89, 97, and 100 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-one of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 44 in February, 1898—were from external causes, of which 17 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 2, was passed over by a railway train; a vigneron, aged 68, by a cart; a boy, aged 9, by a fireman's cart; a female, aged 35, died of fracture of the skull, caused by the kick of a horse; a female, aged 60, of burns; a male child, aged 2, of scalds; a labourer, aged 74, and a waterman, aged 87, of heat apoplexy; a female, aged 33, of arsenical poisoning; a boy, aged 8, was drowned by falling into the River Yarra; a watchmaker, aged 19, a dyer, aged 59, and an engineer, aged 74, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two female children, aged 6 and 9 weeks respectively, were accidentally suffocated in bed; a new-born female and a male infant, aged 9 days, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a female, aged 17, who was suffocated during an attempt to procure abortion, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 34, who shot himself; a female, aged 23, who cut her throat; and a carpenter, aged 54, who hanged himself.

One hundred and twenty-eight deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 58 in the Melbourne, 15 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 3 in the Women's, 9 in the Children's, 4 in the Homeopathic, and 6 in the Austin Hospitals; 5 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 3 in the Immigrants' Home; 8 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylum; 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 2 in the Protestant Refuge; and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 223, of which 122, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 101, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 162 were under one year of age, 45 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five. As compared with February, 1898, there was a decrease of 70 in the deaths of infants under one year, and of 47 in those of children between the ages of one and five years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 383. Of these, 182, or 48 per cent., were males, and 201, or 52 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 32 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 29 were between sixty-five and seventy, 33 were between seventy and seventy-five, 25 were between seventy-five and eighty, 15 were between eighty and eighty-five, 8 were between eighty-five and ninety, 1 at the age of ninety-four, 2 were between ninety-five and one hundred, and 1 at the age of one hundred.

As 117 fewer deaths—out of a total falling off of 175 in the month under review as compared with the corresponding one of 1898—occurred amongst children under 5 years (70 being amongst infants under 12 months), it is not surprising to find a corresponding reduction in the mortality from infantile and children's complaints. Thus, deaths from the zymotic class of diseases fell off by 48, from diphtheria (chiefly want of breast milk), by 20, from local diseases by 69, from violence by 23, and from ill-defined causes (chiefly atrophy of children), by 10. All the principal zymotic diseases show a marked falling off, except whooping-cough, a severe epidemic of which caused 21 deaths in the month under review as against nil twelve months previously; thus, deaths from measles fell from 31 to nil, those from diphtheria diminished by 13, those from diarrhoeal diseases also by 13, and those from typhoid fever by 9; under the local class the chief reductions were 13 in the deaths from nervous diseases, and 53 in those from diseases of the digestive system, chiefly enteritis. Amongst other causes, it will be noticed that only two deaths were caused by sunstroke (or heat apoplexy) during the month, whereas as many as 15 occurred in the corresponding month of last year. Deaths from phthisis also fell off from 64 to 51.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first two months of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the last two months was below the average.

Between November and April diarrhoeal diseases and enteritis cause great havoc and carry off their most numerous victims, and in this respect the past year has been much more conspicuous than usual, for 964 deaths from those diseases were recorded in 1898 as compared with 810 in 1896, when they were much above the average. It is satisfactory to find, however, that a marked reduction in such deaths took place in the last three months ended with February, 1899. As four-sevenths of the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, and eight-ninths of those from enteritis, are of infants under two years, whose staple article of diet—when not breast-fed—is cow's milk, there is every reason to suspect a close connexion between the deterioration of the milk consumed during the summer months, and the great fatality from the causes named. Assuming this to be so, the introduction of some general and effective means of preventing such deterioration would probably result in the saving of nearly 500 or 600 lives annually in Melbourne and suburbs alone. The following are the deaths from those causes in each month from January, 1894, onwards:—

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE DOMAIN.

WHEREAS by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the regulations made by the said Board on 9th June, 1893, in respect of the Government House Domain, and doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. Unless otherwise directed by the Minister of Lands, the double gates of the domain shall be open to visitors to the Botanic Gardens, the Observatory, and any portion of the domain, on week days from seven a.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and half-past seven a.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, until sunset.
2. Contractors and other business or tradesmen's vehicles to Government House, the Observatory, Botanic Gardens, and any portion of the domain shall enter and leave the domain by the tradesmen's gate, Domain-road.
3. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, fish, or birds in the domain, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange peel, paper, or litter of any kind, or light fires anywhere in the domain, or engage therein in any sport or game.

4. No bicycle or tricycle, other than children's bicycles or tricycles, shall be ridden in or through the domain, except on the roads or drives provided therein for vehicular traffic.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the domain who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct; and any person found in a state of intoxication or creating or taking part in any disturbance in the domain shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable, and to prosecution.

6. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place in the domain without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands first obtained.

7. No person shall offer for sale any article in the domain without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the seats, gates, or fences in the domain, or stick bills thereon, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, post, or fences, or write thereon, or otherwise deface the same.

9. Cattle, sheep, horses, or other animals shall not be depastured in the domain without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands, and then only in such portions thereof as may be specified in such permission. All goats and poultry found in the domain shall be liable to be destroyed.

10. No person, except workmen employed in the domain, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs or for other purposes without the consent of the curator.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender: all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as

an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. 7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Parcels up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

15. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any extra payment on account of the establishment of any new Post Office, or the removal of any existing Post Office, during the term of his contract, unless such establishment or removal shall increase the distance to be travelled by such contractor on any one day to the extent of one mile.

16. No application for the transfer of a contract will be entertained until a fee has been paid of Ten shillings on a contract not exceeding £50 per annum, and Twenty shillings on a contract above £50 per annum.
