ENGINEER SURVEYOR, ETC., MARINE BOARD.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Monday, the 10th April next, from Officers of the Public Service, for the position of Engineer Surveyor, &c., Marine Board, Professional Division, Department of Trade and Customs.

Yearly salary—minimum £350, maximum £500, less a reduction of 7 per cent., as fixed by law, up to the 30th June next. Regular increments are not provided.

The duties of the office are as follow:—

1. As Engineer Surveyor—

To perform periodical surveys of machinery, boilers, hulls, electric installations, and mechanical equipments of steam-ships coming under the provisions of the *Marine Act 1890* or any Act amending the same, and to issue declarations of such surveys as required by section 141 of the Act first mentioned.

To keep a general supervision, under the provisions of the 139th section of the *Marine Act 1890*, over such steam-ships in regard to the matters above mentioned during the intervals between the periodical surveys of such steam-ships.

To examine and report, when requested, upon the condition of any vessel which may have met with any accident, or which may be "unsafe" within the meaning of section 104 of the said Act.

To hold preliminary inquiries, under section 175 of the said Act, into any matter involving incompetency or misconduct on the part of any engineer.

To inquire into and report to the Marine Board on any matter pertaining to the duties of Engineer Surveyor which the Board may direct from time to time under the provisions of section 100 of the said Act.

2. As Examiner of Engineers—

To examine marine engineers applying for certificates of competency as first, second, and third class engineers, and to report result thereof under the provisions of section 64 of the said Act.

3. As Load-line Officer—

To approve and certify on behalf of the Marine Board of Victoria from time to time the position of any disc or any alteration thereof in respect of any vessel to which a load line is to be affixed under the *Marine Act 1892*.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. BRIGHT AND HITCHCOCKS, COSTUME AND MANTLE MANUFACTURERS, MOORADOO-STREET, GEELONG,

for a period of four weeks from the 28th March, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

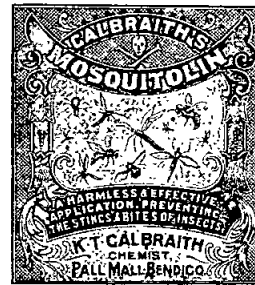

CARRIAGE OF SULPHURIC ACID UNDER DECK AND STOWAGE OF DANGEROUS GOODS.

THE following Instructions to Surveyors, which have been received from the Board of Trade, are published for general information, and, in connexion therewith, attention is directed to sections 157-161 of the *Marine Act 1890* (Victoria).

HALF-YEARLY INSTRUCTIONS TO SURVEYORS.

Carriage of Sulphuric Acid under Deck.

THE Board of Trade have recently had under consideration the conditions under which strong sulphuric acid contained in electrically welded steel drums—holding about half-a-ton each—can, with proper regard to safety, be carried on board ship and stowed under deck.

Two steel drums of the following dimensions were tested to destruction:—

The ends were flat and flanged at the periphery and electrically welded to the body. The results showed that they are strong enough to withstand rough usage when filled with sulphuric acid.

As regards stowage, the Board of Trade are advised that the acid can be carried with safety under deck if the drums are embedded in coal to a depth of not less than three-fourths the diameter of the drum, it being of course understood that the quantity of coal must be sufficient to absorb any leakage from the drums, and for this purpose a depth of one foot of coal for every hundredweight of acid contained in the largest drum in the shipment, but with a minimum depth of six feet, may be deemed sufficient.

In the event of leakage, the Board of Trade are advised that coal, even in a powdered state, will not evolve heat by reason of the presence of sulphuric acid, and that the marketable condition of only so much of the coal as is wetted by the sulphuric acid is affected.

In issuing this notice the Board of Trade think it desirable to indicate the possible results that may be anticipated as regards spontaneous combustion in a cargo of coal on the surface of which drums of sulphuric acid have been embedded.

- (1) If the sulphuric acid escapes into the coal spontaneous combustion will not take place within the region of the leakage.
- (2) If the spontaneous combustion takes place first, then the rupture of the drums, and consequent escape of the sulphuric acid, will retard or extinguish the fire by the production of sulphurous acid vapour, in which combustion cannot be sustained. This gas has a pungent odour and a strongly suffocating effect, so that great care should be taken to keep away from it.

Any coal that has been wetted with sulphuric acid should not afterwards be used.

The Board are aware that it is the practice at some ports to stow sulphuric acid in a compartment by itself on a layer of

chalk, but the leakage of sulphuric acid on to the chalk would produce carbonic acid gas, a heavy odourless gas which it is dangerous to inhale, and which gives no warning of its presence. For these reasons, the ventilation of a space where this practice is followed should be carefully attended to before any person is allowed to enter the compartment, the down cast being carried as low as possible.

It is recommended that wherever sulphuric acid is carried under deck, the precautions indicated above should be observed; but it is, of course, to be understood that drums of sulphuric acid should not be stowed on coal known to be specially liable to spontaneous combustion.

Stowage of Dangerous Goods.

The attention of the surveyors is drawn to the case of the s.s. *Legislator* of Liverpool, on board which vessel a serious fire recently occurred, resulting in the loss of the vessel with several lives, owing to the indiscriminate stowage together on deck of "dangerous goods" and chemicals.

With a view to the prevention of similar casualties in future, the surveyors are instructed, when on their rounds of inspection of vessels loading, to use all due diligence in keeping themselves informed as to what vessels are likely to ship "dangerous goods," and, when inspecting the stowage of such goods, to see that any one description of "dangerous goods" shall be securely stowed apart from all other goods, whether dangerous or not, except in the case of certain combinations, which may be approved by the Board of Trade.

This precaution is so obviously in the interest of ship-owners that, if properly explained, it is not anticipated any difficulty will be experienced; but if the surveyor be unable to get this instruction carried out, the case should be treated as one of "improper loading" within the meaning of the 459th section of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Bairnsdale which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Bairnsdale and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Mitchell."

Area described in Petition.

Commencing on Lake Victoria at the embouchure of Tom's Creek; thence north-westerly by that creek and westerly by the north boundaries of the parishes of Meerlieu, Yeerung, and Stratford, to the road from Stratford to Grant; thence northerly by that road to the north boundary of allotment B, parish of Bow-Worrung; thence east by that boundary and a line to the east boundary of the last-named parish; thence north by that boundary and the west boundary of pastoral allotment Z to the road to Grant; thence northerly by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 25, parish of Cobannah; thence east by the south boundary and north by the east boundaries of allotments 25, 26, and part of 27, to Bulgaback Creek; thence easterly by that creek to the south-east-angle of allotment 32; thence north by the east boundary of that allotment and allotment 36 to the Wonnangatta River; thence easterly by that river and northerly by the Dargo River to a point due west of Mount Birregun; thence east by a line to that point and north-easterly by a range to the Great Dividing Range; thence south-easterly by that range to a point where it is intersected by a direct line from Mount Phipps to Mount Bald Head; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the latter point; thence southerly by a direct line to the source of the Nicholson River and south-easterly by that river to Lake King; and thence westerly by the

northern shores of that lake and Lake Victoria to the commencing point. Excluding the area within the line described as follows:— Commencing at the point where the main road from Bairnsdale to Stratford crosses the eastern boundary of the parish of Moormung; thence north along the said boundary to the Mitchell River; thence along the course of the said river northerly, easterly, and southerly to the south-eastern corner of allotment 6 of section H, parish of Bairnsdale; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said allotment to its south-western corner; thence due west to the eastern boundary of allotment 20A; thence north, north-westerly, and westerly along the boundary of the said allotment to its north-east angle; thence in a direct line to the northernmost point of allotment 199A; thence in a direct line to the northern boundary of allotment 184A; thence due west along that boundary to a one-chain road; thence west by that road to a two-chain road; and thence west by the latter road to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the interests of the area proposed to be severed conflict in administration with the remainder of the shire, which consists practically of the township of Bairnsdale forming the Centre Riding, whose requirements vary from those of the other ridings. And that while the rates hitherto made in the shire are sufficient for the purposes of the latter they are inadequate for the Centre Riding. And that the Centre Riding has encroached on the funds of the other subdivisions to such an extent that two of the latter, which have credit balances, are unable to expend the same, although the money is urgently needed for public works.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the shire of Bairnsdale, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Mitchell," such municipality to be subdivided into four (4) ridings, to be called the South Riding, the West Riding, the North Riding, and the East Riding.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the West Riding of the Shire of Woorayl with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been published in the manner prescribed in the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the West Riding of the Shire of Woorayl the portion described in such petition, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the Korumburra Riding of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho: and with the advice aforesaid doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Woorayl and of the several Ridings thereof, including the West Riding as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, and of the several Ridings thereof, including the Korumburra Riding as hereby enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

8. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be

shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.) within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Controller of Stores, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6 or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised.

13. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
