Marriage Act 1898.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALL PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1893.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Marriage Act 1898*, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained.

Marriage Act 1898.—No. 1582.

Section 31—

(1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1893, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.

(2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.

(3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

Factories and Shop Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. T. CRAWFORD, DRESSMAKER,
CLARENDON-STREET, SOUTH MELBOURNE,

for a period of three weeks from the 10th May, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

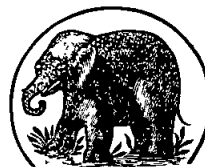

OTAGO HARBOR ENTRANCE.—EXHIBITION OF LIGHTS ON MAIN CHANNEL BEACONS, AND DISCONTINUANCE OF LIGHTS ON ORIGINAL BEACONS ON SANDSPIT.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 40 of 1898, issued by this Department on the 6th December, 1898, the Otago Harbor Board notify that on and after Thursday, the 15th June, 1899, two fixed white lights, visible seaward 5 to 6 miles distant, will be shown from sunset to sunrise from the Main Channel leading-beacons. The front beacon is 20 feet high, and stands on Harrington Point; the back beacon is 30 feet high, and stands on a site east of the Maori Kaik Jetty, the front beacon-light being 30 feet and the back beacon-light 60 feet above sea-level at low tide. The beacons are 6,600 feet apart, and bear from each other S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. respectively, and are painted white. The Harbor-master has supplied the following information for the guidance of mariners:—

1. The depth of water at low tide on this line of beacons is 32 feet.

2. Directions for entering Otago Harbor on this line: When 2 miles off the entrance bring the beacons in line on a S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. bearing; then steer in on this course, keeping the beacons in line until the outer end of the mole or training-wall is brought abeam; then steer for Harrington Point, which may be safely passed half a cable distant, continuing a mid-channel course between the buoys, leaving the red buoys on the starboard side and the black buoys on the port side.

On and after the above date of Thursday, the 15th June, 1899, the lights on the original beacons on Sandspit marking the old channel will be discontinued. These beacons will, however, remain, and mark the old channel by daylight. Mariners are, however, warned that this old channel has a depth of 21ft. 6in. only, and is only considered safe when the bar is smooth for vessels drawing 19 feet, and when the bar is rough for vessels drawing 16 feet.

All bearings are correct magnetic, and the soundings are calculated for low water, spring tides.

TORRES STRAIT.—TELEGRAPH CABLES—ELLIS CHANNEL AND APLIN PASS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the prohibited anchorages in Ellis Channel and Aplin Pass, across which the telegraph cables are laid, are now marked by buoys painted green with the word "Telegraph" on them, two of which mark the line of cable across Ellis Channel and one the line of cable across Aplin Pass. The prohibited area extends for one and a half cables on each side of the line indicated by the buoys.

The buoys are laid approximately on the lines of cables as denoted by test-houses; that in Aplin Pass being about 1 cable distant from the Thursday Island fringing reef, and those in Ellis Channel being 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cables and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cables distant respectively from the fringing reefs of Thursday Island and Horn Island.

KYABRAM URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1899.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1899 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds annual value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that no rate shall be less than One pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Five shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Ten shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half-an-acre, Fifteen shillings if more than half-an-acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre, with a maximum charge of One pound sterling for any parcel of land within the boundary of the Urban Trust.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st of July, 1899.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1899.

THE births of 57 boys and 63 girls, or in all of 120 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of April. Of these, 49 occurred in Ballarat East, 57 in Ballarat West, 13 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 102, viz., 46 of boys and 56 of girls.

The deaths registered in April numbered 67, viz., 39 of males and 28 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 53. In March, the recorded deaths numbered 67; in April, 1898, they numbered 96; in April, 1897, they numbered 56; in April, 1896, they numbered 71; in April, 1895, they numbered 62; in April, 1894, they numbered 76; in April, 1893, they numbered 81; in April, 1892, they numbered 82; in April, 1891, they numbered 74; in April, 1890, they numbered 99; and in April, 1889, they numbered 68.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 58 per cent.; females, 42 per cent.; under five years, 27 per cent.; over five years, 73 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 52 and 48 per cent.; under and over five years, 27 and 73 per cent. respectively.

Twenty deaths, or 30 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 16; Benevolent Asylum, 3; Lunatic Asylum, 1.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of April, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART VII.—STORES.

Land Act 1890, Part I.
ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106), section 142, power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS DATED 3RD JULY, 1893.

Chapter XI.—Licences, State Forests and Timber Reserves.—
Splitter's Licences.

In Regulation 6, after the words "Two pounds per annum," the following words are added, namely:—"except within the Beechworth Survey District, when the fee shall be One pound per annum in lieu of Two pounds per annum."—(Corr. F.15520.)

Chapter XI.—Licences, State Forests and Timber Reserves.

Chapter XIII.—Timber Licences.—Licences on Crown Lands
(not being State Forests or Timber Reserves).

HEATHCOTE AND RUSHWORTH FOREST DISTRICTS.

Timber, other than redgum, in the undermentioned Crown lands, Timber reserves, and State forests, shall, from the date hereof, be sold under special permit and royalty only, at the prices hereafter stated, and subject to the conditions mentioned; but licences then current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation.

Conditions.

1. Applications shall be made to the Conservator of Forests through the officer in charge of the district, who will arrange for the work to proceed without delay immediately upon issue of permit.
2. The officer in charge will locate the permit holder in any particular portion of Crown lands, Timber reserve, or State forest under his supervision which is, in his opinion, most suitable, and when necessary mark the trees which may be felled with the broad arrow, thus, \wedge . He will also give the permit holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work.
3. All forest produce cut under this regulation must be branded with the Crown brand by the officer in charge, and paid for before removal from the place where felled, but the forest officer may, in his discretion, arrange for branding at any depot or railway station.
4. A sum of not less than £2 must be deposited by permit holders who obtain prop and other mining timber, as a guarantee of strict obedience to the conditions of the permit.
5. Permit holders must stack and burn all debris when directed so to do by the officer in charge, and to his satisfaction or that of the supervising officer. In the event of any wilful breach of these conditions the Hon. the Minister may cancel the permit, forfeit the deposit, and seize the timber already cut as the property of the Crown.
6. If the permit holder removes, or allows to be removed, unbranded timber cut under his permit, without special authority in writing from the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken against him under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* or *Crimes Act 1890*, and any person having unbranded timber in his possession, cut under a permit, and without having written authority from the forest officer for the possession of same, will also be prosecuted under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* or *Crimes Act 1890*.
7. All permits are personal, and must be produced, on demand, to any forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.
8. This regulation shall apply to the following areas, including State forests, Timber reserves, and Crown lands in the Heathcote and Rushworth forest districts.
9. The forest officer may instantly suspend any permit pending the decision of the Hon. the Minister, and during such suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.

WHEREAS by section 142 of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I.) it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in Part I. of the said Act, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part: And whereas by section 9 of the *Mines Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1514) it is enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 5 of the *Mines Act 1890*, every holder of a miner's right, and every person on whose behalf any consolidated miner's right is held, shall, for the purposes of exercising the privileges granted to them respectively by the said section 5, be entitled to cut any live or dead timber, except blackwood, and to remove the same from any portion of Crown land being or included in any land proclaimed as a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, but that the privilege conferred by the said section 9 of the said *Mines Act 1897* shall not be exercisable except in such Crown land reserves as the Governor in Council, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, may specially proclaim for the purpose, nor shall such privilege be exercisable except in such manner and at such times as may be directed by regulations made for the purpose under the provisions of the *Land Acts*: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid (that is to say):—

CHAPTER XI.—LICENCES.—STATE FORESTS AND TIMBER RESERVES.

General Provisions.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, holders of miners' rights, and all persons on whose behalf a consolidated miner's right is held, are hereby empowered to cut any live or dead wood save and except as hereinafter mentioned, and to remove the same from any Crown land reserves for the growth and preservation of timber, provided such land be within a radius of ten miles of the Post Office at Beechworth, and be referred to in Proclamation dated the 24th day of April, 1899.

Blackwood of every kind, and ironbark timber which at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground is of less diameter than eighteen inches, and timber of any kind whatsoever for the purposes of sale, cannot be felled or removed, and are expressly exempted from the provisions of this regulation.—(Corr. F.15520.)

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 954 children, viz., 475 boys and 479 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. The number was, it will be observed, 11 more than in April, 1898, but slightly fewer than in April, 1897, and much fewer than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 271 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 295 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in April numbered 557, viz., 315 of males and 242 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 397, or by 71 per cent., as against only 15 per cent. in April, 1898, but 77 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 264 fewer than in April, 1898 (when, however, the death rate was exceptionally high), but only 30 more than the average recorded for the month during the four years, 1894-7, when the mortality was very uniform, although considerably lower than that recorded during the first five years of the last decade; it was also 134 lower than the average of April during the decade referred to, or 148 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.70 and of deaths registered to 14.42 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 25.02 and 21.78 per annum respectively, and in the last ten years of 31.68 and 18.31 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.58.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 84.1° on the 1st, and the lowest was 40.0° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (58.9°) was the same as the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.5°) took place on the 21st, and the least range (4.1°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 18.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.261 inches on the 14th, and the lowest was 29.637 inches on the 2nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.981 inches) was about a thirtieth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on nine days, the amount being 2.52 inches, which was, with one exception—viz., April, 1896—by far the highest recorded for the month since April, 1894; but was only slightly above the average of the last ten years.

Fog occurred on one day during the month.

Males contributed 57 per cent. and females 43 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 40 per cent. in April, 1898; 31 per cent. in April, 1897; 32 per cent. in April, 1896; 31 per cent. in April, 1895; 34 per cent. in April, 1894; and 41 per cent. in April, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 125, as compared with 161 in April, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality (i.e., the proportion of deaths of infants per 1,000 births, registered in the same month) was 131 in the month under review, as compared with 171 in April, 1898, 107 in April, 1897, 108 in April, 1896, 107 in April, 1895, 120 in April, 1894, 145 in April, 1893, 140 in April, 1892, 154 in April, 1891, 155 in April, 1890, and 188 in April, 1889.

Forty-five persons—as against 65 in April, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a merchant, aged 75, died of cancer; a female, aged 75, of syncope; a teacher and a gardener, each aged 75, of nephritis; a gentleman, aged 76, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 76, of bronchitis; a male, of no occupation, aged 77, of disease of the brain; a female, aged 77, of cirrhosis of the liver; a pensioner, aged 77, of uræmia; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of injuries the result of being passed over by a railway train; a labourer, aged 78, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 78, of cirrhosis of the liver; a blind-maker, aged 78, of inflammation of the bladder; a female, aged 79, of disease of the brain; a grocer, aged 79, of heart disease; a sawyer, aged 79, of bronchitis; a coachbuilder, aged 80, of influenza; a labourer, aged 80, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 82, of apoplexy; a clergyman and a stonemason, each aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 83, of diarrhoea; a bootmaker and a storekeeper, each aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of syncope; a storeman, aged 85, of cystitis; a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 88, of influenza; a carpenter, aged 91, and a gentleman, aged 94, of dysentery; a plasterer, aged 94, of enteritis; a gentleman, aged 75, an engineer, aged 77, four females, aged 79, 83, 84, and 84 respectively, a farmer and a printer, each aged 85, a male of no occupation, aged 87, a gentleman and a hawker, each aged 89, a wheelwright, aged 90, a sawyer, aged 91, and a miner, aged 93, of old age.

Forty of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 25 in April, 1898—were from external causes, of which 25 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 12 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A. female, aged 5, a labourer, aged 53, and a male of no occupation, aged 77, were passed over by railway trains; a railway employé, aged 38, died of fracture of the spine, caused by falling off a guard's van; a female, aged 59, of injuries to the brain, consequent on a fall from a tram-car; a labourer, aged 41, of injuries to the head; and a dealer, aged 43, of fracture of the skull, the result in each case of being thrown from vehicles; a female, aged 45, of injuries to the lungs, caused by a fall from a cart; a cab-driver, aged 51, of injuries to the head, consequent on being thrown out of a buggy; a tailor, aged 34, of laceration of the brain; a tobacconist, aged 44, of fracture of the skull; and a female, aged 53, of extravasation of blood on the brain, resulting in each case from falls; a boy aged 5, of burns; a female child, aged 2, of phosphorus poisoning, through eating matches; a boy, aged 13, a fitter's apprentice, aged 15, a clerk, aged 18, a shipwright's apprentice, aged 24, a boatman, aged 31, and a shipwright, aged 58, were drowned through the foundering of the yacht *Queenie* in Fort Phillip Bay; a boy, aged 9, and a plasterer, aged 34, were "found drowned" in the River Yarra; a female, aged 50, was suffocated by falling down stairs; a female infant, aged 10 days, and a male infant, aged 3 weeks, were overtaken. The homicidal deaths were those of a boy, aged 7, who was drowned by his mother; and a clerk, aged 45, who was shot and stabbed, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case; also a newly-born male infant, who was found dead from suffocation in a canal (probably murdered). The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 18, a clerk, aged 20, a labourer, aged 45, and an ironmonger, aged 49, who shot themselves; a plasterer, aged 66, who cut his throat; a female, aged 24, a chimney sweep, aged 30, an accountant, aged 61, and a carpenter, aged 68, who poisoned themselves; a male, of no occupation, aged 21, and a labourer, aged 52, who hanged themselves; and a cab-driver, aged 53, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and forty-three deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 55 in the Melbourne, 17 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 3 in the Women's, 8 in the Children's, 9 in the Homœopathic, and 9 in the Austin Hospitals; 13 in the Metropolitan and 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 7 in the Immigrants' Home; 5 in the Benevolent and 4 in the Infant Asylums; 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 2 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 3 in Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 167, of which 86, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 81, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 125 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five. As compared with April, 1898 (when the mortality was exceptionally high), there was a falling-off of 36 in the deaths of children under twelve months, of 70 in those between one and two years, and 51 in those between two and five, or of 157 altogether.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 300. Of these, 229, or 59 per cent., were males, and 161, or 41 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 30 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 29 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 32 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 30 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, 12 were between eighty and eighty-five, 8 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 6 were between ninety and ninety-five. As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, when a high mortality prevailed, the deaths of persons over five years have fallen off by 107, which is accounted for by a decrease of 37 between the ages of five and fifteen, of 23 between the ages of twenty-five and forty, and of 41 between the ages of sixty and eighty.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

The mortality of the month, although little above the average of recent years (excepting 1898), was considerably lower than in the corresponding month of 1898, when an epidemic of measles prevailed, and the fatality of other zymotic diseases was excessive. On comparing the two periods it will be found that the deaths from zymotic diseases fell off by 126, from constitutional diseases by 37, from developmental diseases by 14, from local diseases by 91, and those from ill-defined causes (chiefly atrophy and debility) by 11; whereas there was an increase of 15 under violence. In the zymotic class deaths from measles fell from 99 in April, 1898, to nil in April, 1899, those from diphtheria from 13 to 2, those from typhoid fever from 36 to 29, and those from diarrheal diseases from 28 to 10, but those from whooping-cough rose from nil to 12. In the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis diminished from 76 to 51, those from scrofula, &c., from 11 to 4, and those from cancer from 36 to 32. In the developmental class, 10 fewer deaths were ascribed to premature birth, and 3 fewer to old age. In the local class there was a decrease of 28 under diseases of the nervous, 15 under those of the circulatory, 22 under those of the respiratory, 29 under those of the digestive, and 4 under those of the generative system; but an increase of 9 under the urinary system. Under the head of violence, deaths from accidents increased from 19 to 25, and those from suicide from 5 to 12.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first four months of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from diphtheria during the last four months was below the average.

Owing, it is suspected, to a deterioration of the milk supply during hot weather, diarrheal diseases and enteritis are responsible for the deaths of from 500 to nearly 1,000 persons annually—between three-fourths and eight-ninths of whom are mere infants under the age of two years—which take place for the most part in the six months November to April, which, of course, include the hottest period of the year. During the first four months of the current year nearly 400 such deaths have been already recorded, which, although 200 fewer than in the corresponding period of 1898, are still up to the average. The following are the deaths from those causes in each month from January, 1894, onwards:—

NOTE.—During the quarter, 7,072 births, and 4,142 deaths were registered; the former having exceeded the latter by 2,930, as shown in the table, or by 71 per cent.—a proportion which,

although below the average, was considerably higher than in the March quarter of 1898, viz., 41 per cent. As compared with the same quarter, the births fell off by 626, and the deaths, owing to the exceptionally high mortality prevailing twelve months previously, by 1,302.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 28,373, and the departures by sea, with which is included the usual proportion for unrecorded departures (2,517), numbered 31,732, resulting in a loss by emigration, as shown in the table of 3,359 persons, viz., 2,634 males, and 725 females. This loss was by far the lowest recorded for the quarter in the last seven years, being less than in the March quarter of 1898 by 4,247; or than in that of 1897 (when it was at a maximum) by 5,700, or than in that of 1893 (when it was exceeded only in the quarter under review) by 619.

If from the natural increase the loss by emigration be deducted, the result is a net decrease of population during the quarter of 429, arising from a decrease in the males of 1,242, less an increase in the females of 813, as set forth in the table. This is the ninth quarter within the last six years in which an actual decrease of population occurred, but in only two of these was such decrease less than in the quarter under review; and it is worthy of note that, with only three exceptions, the decreases all took place in the first quarter.

From the date of the census (5th April, 1891) to the 31st March, 1899, the allowance made for unrecorded departures has been 60,009, viz., 46,536 for males and 13,473 for females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of March last would have been 1,235,043, viz., 638,717 males and 596,326 females. In the absence of any reliable information as to overland migration, it has been assumed that the arrivals and departures across the border balance one another.

The returns of the Immigration Agent for the quarter—taking them for what they are worth—show a balance in favour of immigration of 104 from South Australia, 777 from Western Australia, 333 from Tasmania, 44 from South Africa, 79 from other British Dominions, and 287 from foreign ports; but a balance in favour of emigration of 727 to New South Wales, 485 to Queensland, 345 to New Zealand, 235 to the South Seas, and 674 to the United Kingdom. The net emigration to Western Australia, which had been so heavy during the years 1893-7, has not only ceased, but those who left are rapidly returning to this colony, there having been during the last twelve months a net immigration of 4,868, as against a net emigration in the previous six months—December quarter 1897 and March quarter 1898—of 2,444.

These figures do not show the actual movements of population as between Victoria and the other countries named, since persons merely passing through Victorian ports *en route* are included in the returns.
