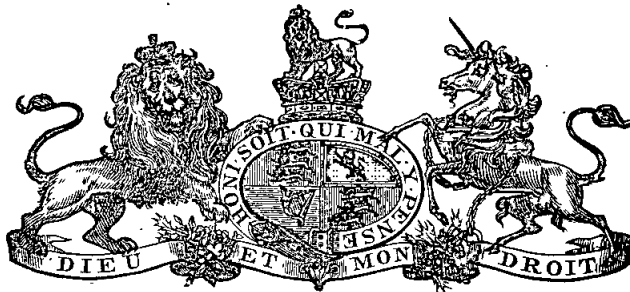

## PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAY.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the day and date hereunder mentioned to be observed as a Public Holiday or Bank Holiday (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF JUNE NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Avoca and Lexton and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Avoca.

- (1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1853, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.
- (2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.
- (3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

*Vine Disease Act 1890.***REGULATIONS FOR DESTRUCTION OF VINES IN PARISHES OF TOOLAMBA AND ARDMONA.****REGULATIONS.**

1. All vines ordered to be destroyed under the provisions of the *Vine Disease Act 1890* in the parishes of Toolamba and Ardmona shall be destroyed in the manner herein indicated, under the supervision of the Inspecting Officer.

2. All stakes in the vineyards shall be removed and disinfected as directed.

3. All vines, their tap roots, and small roots shall be uprooted and burned.

4. The infested vineyards shall be ploughed to a depth of 12 inches, which may be accomplished by two ploughings, the first 7 inches deep, and the second 5 inches further into the subsoil, and the land harrowed with a heavy pair of harrows.

5. The soil shall be treated with bi-sulphide of carbon, and salt and kerosene, in such quantities as the Inspecting Officer may direct.

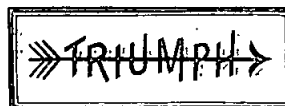

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

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**BY-LAW No. 151.**

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**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONER, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed :—

That general By-law No. 20 be repealed :—

20. "Any person riding or driving or attempting to ride or drive any animal or animals, with or without any vehicle, across any line of railway, at any place when a train is in sight and in motion coming towards such place, and when warned not to do so by any railway gate-keeper or crossing-keeper, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds."

And the following By-laws substituted, viz. :—

20. "Any person riding or driving or attempting to ride or drive any animal or animals, with or without any vehicle, across any line of railway on the level thereof when a train is in sight and in motion coming towards such place, or when a train has given warning of its approach by a whistle, or when warned not to do so by a railway employé, or when crossing fails to use all convenient despatch to cross such line, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds."
- 20A. "No person shall take or attempt to take across any railway line on the level thereof any traction engine, road engine, or any vehicle of whatsoever description, the weight of which on any wheel exceeds 3 tons, or 6 tons on any axle, unless and until such person or persons shall have given 48 hours' previous notice, in writing, of his intention to so cross, particularizing the place and stating the time when he intends to cross, with the name and address of the owner of such engine or vehicle to the station-master or officer in charge of any railway station, which is also a telegraph station, or the railway station next adjacent to the point on either side at which such person proposes to cross such railway line with such engine or vehicle, provided a man be in charge of such station, and unless and until such person has made such provision as may be required by the Commissioner to prevent any injury being done to the rails and other materials forming such railway line by reason of the crossing of such engine or vehicle, and any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds."
- 20B. "No person with any load resting on more than four wheels or exceeding 14 feet in height or 12 feet in width, or with any load that is exceptional and will cause, or will be likely to cause, an obstruction, shall cross or attempt to cross any railway line on the level thereof until such person or persons shall have given 48 hours' previous notice, in writing, of his intention to so cross, particularizing the place and stating the time when he intends to cross, with the name and address of the owner of such load to the station-master or officer in charge of any railway station, which is also a telegraph station, or the railway station next adjacent to the point at which such person proposes to cross such railway line with such load, provided a man be in charge of such station, and unless and until such person has made such provision as may be required by the Commissioner to prevent any injury being done to railway property or such railway line by reason of the crossing of such load, and any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds."

## THE FERNTREE GULLY AND GEMBROOK RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST CONSTITUTION.

The Board of Selectors will be appointed within seven days before the time so named.

The Board of Selectors will not be informed of nor acquaint themselves with the names of the candidates or any of them.

Every person who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself or in favour of or against any other person will for ever be disqualified for employment in the railway service.

Each candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, will be furnished by the officer in charge with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he will be known to the Board of Selectors.

The candidates selected by the Board of Selectors must present themselves for examination by the examiners appointed in that behalf at such time and place as may be thereafter notified to them by the officer in charge.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active, and must produce to the examiners satisfactory written testimony that they are of respectable character, and must furnish names of any persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years, together with certified extracts from the register of their birth, or, in default, statutory declarations as to their age last birthday, giving the date thereof.

The age of all candidates shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioner for opening applications, except in the case of the applicants already temporarily employed in the Department, whose age may be reckoned to the date of their first employment as supernumeraries.

Any candidate who was at any time employed in the Railway or Public Service must furnish particulars as to the period of his service and the cause of his leaving. No person who has been previously dismissed from such service shall be eligible for employment under these Regulations.

Before being finally approved they must pass an examination by the medical officer as being free from bodily ailments, defects, colour blindness, or defective sight of any kind. For such examination they are to pay 5s. each into the hands of the officer in charge.

After examination the successful candidates in each grade will be called together, and determine by ballot, in accordance with the Regulations, the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed.

Any successful candidates in excess of the number required by the Commissioner shall be eligible for appointment in the order so decided for a period of twelve months then next ensuing from the date of such determination without further examination.

All appointments will be made to the lowest grade in each of the various branches of the railway service, and on probation only, for a period of six months. After such probation, and upon production of a certificate of fitness from the head of the branch in which the probationer was employed, and of evidence that his life is insured in Victoria, as prescribed by Regulations, such appointment may be confirmed.

## REGULATIONS FOR ERECTION OF PRIVATE TELEPHONE LINES.

THE Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 22nd day of May, 1899, cancelled the Regulations for the Erection of Private Telephone Lines made on the 26th day of September, 1893, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, viz.:

## REGULATIONS FOR THE ERECTION OF PRIVATE TELEPHONE LINES.

1. In country districts a private person may be allowed to erect poles and wires for a telephone line mainly upon his own land, provided such line be used exclusively for his own private purposes, and be not run from a point in the vicinity of a telegraph office to another point in a like vicinity, upon payment in advance of a licence-fee to the Postmaster-General per annum.

2. The fee payable for a licence to use a private line is £1 per annum, and in the case of a line joining two pastoral holdings, a separate licence-fee will be charged for each holding occupied by a different lessee, irrespective of the length of the line, and such fee must be paid in advance. No licence is required where the line does not go beyond the boundary of the land occupied by such owner.

3. Where the line may cross or run along public roads or tracks the height of the wire above the highest portion of the road or track shall not be less than 18 feet, and the poles carrying the wire at such places shall be of a substantial character, and be strutted or stayed, if necessary, to stand the strain of the wire.

All fittings upon such poles, such as brackets, pins, insulators, wire, &c., shall be of approved material and make.

4. The person wishing to erect the line must submit a plan and specification showing the route to be followed, especially marking where a road or railway is to be crossed or entered upon, and describing the nature and dimensions of the materials to be used in the construction of the line, and any other particulars which may be required, upon receipt of which the Postmaster-General may direct an officer of the Post Office and Telegraph Department to examine such plan and specification, and, if necessary, make an inspection of the route, the cost of such examination and inspection to be borne by the person wishing to erect the line, and should the report of such officer disclose that the line will not, in any way, interfere with or endanger any other line of telegraph, whether belonging to the Postmaster-General, the Victorian Railways Commissioner, or any private person, and that the material and method of erection described in the specification are satisfactory, the Postmaster-General may, upon payment of the necessary fees, grant permission to erect. Provided, however, that such permission shall in no case be granted in the event of the route of such proposed line being along any public road, railway, or track, or over or across any private land, other than land belonging to the person desirous of erecting such private line, unless and until the necessary authority of the local municipal council or the owners of such private land (as the case may be) shall have been obtained, and satisfactory evidence to that effect shall have been forwarded to the Postmaster-General.

5. The person to whom such permission has been granted shall, upon the completion of the line, report the fact to the Postmaster-General, when an officer of the Post Office and Telegraph Department may be sent to inspect the line, and report whether the work has been satisfactorily carried out. The cost of such inspection to be borne by the person who erected the line. If the work be not to the satisfaction of the inspecting officer, he shall issue instructions as to what is required, and on the defects being made good a licence to use the line may be issued.

6. Should the person to whom permission has been granted to erect the line fail to make good the defects pointed out, the

Postmaster-General may take such steps as he may deem necessary to remove the portions objected to, and the person seeking the licence to use the line shall be prohibited from so doing until the requirements of the Postmaster-General have been satisfactorily complied with.

7. The Postmaster-General may direct an official inspection of such lines to be made periodically, and the officer making such inspection may direct the licensee to make such alterations or repairs as may to him appear necessary, and the licensee shall immediately carry out the same; and in the event of his failing to do so within a reasonable time, the officer shall report to that effect, and the licence to use such line shall be cancelled.

8. The licensee shall be wholly responsible for the repairs and maintenance of the line, and he shall undertake to maintain the same in a thoroughly efficient manner at his own cost; and any alterations, repairs, or other works which the Postmaster-General may, in the interests of public safety or convenience, order to be done, shall be charged to the licensee, and may be recovered by the ordinary process of law.

9. The Postmaster-General may, at the request of the licensee, undertake the maintenance of any private line not exceeding 10 miles in length (which has been erected to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General), at the rate of £2 per annum per mile, or portion thereof, for the first 3 miles, and £1 10s. per annum for each additional mile, or portion thereof, in addition to the licence-fee provided under Rule 2.

10. The licensee may provide and maintain the instruments on private property, but if this service be performed by the Postmaster-General, a charge at the rate of £2 per annum will be made for each set of instruments.

11. The licensee shall undertake that the line shall be used for his own private purposes only, and in no case shall he charge or accept a fee for the use of the line, or for the transmission of any communication over the same; and in the event of it being proved that he has done so at any time, the licence may be cancelled, and he may be proceeded against for an infringement of the Post Office Acts.

12. In the event of the licensee's line being found to interfere in any way with the future erection of any lines by the Postmaster-General or the Victorian Railways Commissioner, the Postmaster-General may direct the licensee's line to be altered, removed, re-erected in another position, or otherwise dealt with as may be deemed necessary.

13. The licensee shall be solely responsible for any damage which may arise to life, limb, or property which may be caused by the poles, wire, or other portions of the line erected by the licensee.

14. Where the line is required to be erected partly on poles the property of the Postmaster-General and partly on poles the property of the licensee, the latter shall pay at the rate of £4 per annum per mile for the first 3 miles, and £2 per annum per mile over that distance for the portion erected on the Government poles; but the wire erected on such poles shall be erected and maintained by the Postmaster-General.

15. In cases where the licensee requires the line to be connected with a post and telegraph office for the purpose of transmitting and receiving telegrams, a fee of £5 5s. per annum will be charged in cities and large towns and £2 2s. in small towns, in addition to the rates herein quoted. It must be understood that the usual telegraphic rates will be charged in addition to the above on all telegrams transmitted over the lines beyond the office connected or for delivery from that office.

#### KYABRAM URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1899.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1899 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds annual value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that no rate shall be less than One pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Five shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Ten shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, Fifteen shillings if more than half an acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre, with a maximum charge of One pound sterling for any parcel of land within the boundary of the Urban Trust.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st of July, 1899.

#### RUTHERGLEN WATERWORKS TRUST. REGULATION No. 1.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Rutherglen Waterworks Trust, acting under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. The ordinary meetings of the Trust shall be held every second Tuesday, at half-past Seven p.m., at the Municipal Chambers, Rutherglen. The Chairman may convene special meetings, and shall do so if requested by two Commissioners, in writing, provided two (2) clear days' notice, in writing, thereof be given to each Commissioner.

2. The business of the Trust at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors.

3. The first business of the meetings of the Trust shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; after confirmation such minutes shall be signed by the Chairman.

4. At the ordinary meetings of the Trust, after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz.:—

- (a) Reading and ordering on correspondence.
- (b) Reading and considering petitions.
- (c) Reading and ordering on reports.
- (d) Orders of the day arising out of former minutes and any business the Chairman may bring before the meeting.
- (e) Motions of which notice shall have been given in writing.
- (f) Examination and passing of accounts.
- (g) General business.
- (h) Notices of motion.

5. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the Commissioner who gave notice thereof, or some other Commissioner duly authorized by him in writing, be present when called upon to proceed with the same. Notice of motion not so proceeded with shall be considered as having lapsed.

6. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall for that occasion be a member of such committee.

7. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any Commissioner to move another amendment thereon.

8. No person not being a Commissioner shall be permitted to address the Trust without the consent of the majority of the Trust then present.

9. Every Commissioner, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

10. The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

11. Any Commissioner may require the Secretary to take down the particular words used by a Commissioner on the same being uttered.

12. No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

13. Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner



(if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

14. Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

15. No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice, in writing, of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting; nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

16. It shall be competent for the majority of the Trust to suspend at any meeting one or more of the Regulations for the management and conduct of business, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted.

17. The Chairman and Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same, and impressions only to be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman and Secretary.

18. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given by advertisement in some newspaper or newspapers approved of by the Trust, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

19. Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

20. Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the notice shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with the truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

21. The salary or allowance attached to any office or place at the disposal of the Trust shall, unless otherwise ordered by resolution of the Trust, be fixed before the Trust proceeds to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

22. All payments by the Trust shall be made by cheque on the order of the Commissioners, and all such cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners and countersigned by the Secretary.

*Interpretation Clause.*—The word "Chairman" shall, in all cases, signify the permanent Chairman of the Trust, or, in his absence, any Commissioner appointed to preside at any meeting of the Trust; the term "Trust" shall, in all cases, signify a quorum of the Trust.

#### NORTH BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

**T**HE Commissioners of the North Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation—

##### No. 1.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as may be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust officers.

2. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land indorsed or approved by such owners.

3. All applications for the construction of irrigation outlets shall be dealt with by the duly appointed committee of the Trust to manage and regulate the distribution of the available water, and known as the water committee, except when otherwise directed by the Trust.

4. Only one outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to 320 acres, and one for every additional 320 acres or fraction thereof, except in such cases where the Trust may order otherwise, or the full cost of construction of the said outlet is paid by the applicant.

5. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant, subject to the approval of the engineer to the Trust.

6. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with, either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all lands (including gardens) from the 1st day of April to the 31st day of December in each year, and Ninepence per inch per acre from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of March in each year, except as hereinafter provided. The minimum amount of Twelve shillings and sixpence to accompany the application, and the balance to be paid on completion of the irrigation.

8. In no case shall the charge for supply of water be less than for 3 inches per acre for cultivation land for the first watering, and for 2 inches per acre for subsequent waterings.

9. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the water committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence (excepting in the case of gardens, applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of which may be

dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such agreement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient; and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

10. The water-bailiff shall receive all applications for water, and shall enter same in an order-book supplied to him for that purpose with the several particulars required therein, and all applicants for water may request, and shall be entitled to, the inspection of such order-book.

11. Each applicant for water will be supplied in the order in which his application appears in the order-book, except in the case of any subsequent applications being received on the channel then working, when all such applications shall be allowed one week on that channel before the water is transferred to another channel, and so on by rotation of channels for which applications for water have been made, and the water will be supplied to the applicant as near as possible to the time at which such water is required (if available), but the Trust will not be responsible for the non-supply of water applied for under any circumstances. No applicant shall be allowed to irrigate more than 50 acres at any one time.

12. No person shall receive water for the irrigation of land to a greater extent at each turn than is equal to 30 acres for each allotment on the channel then working when there are other applicants awaiting service, unless special instructions are given by the water committee or the Trust to do otherwise. Owners of more than one allotment to be restricted to water to irrigate not more than 30 acres in each 320 acres owned.

13. Any applicant refusing to take water in his turn, when asked to do so by the water-bailiff, shall forfeit to the Trust half of such application money on the date on which the water is refused.

14. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works on adjacent property or crops, or stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

15. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet or junction sluice, or interfere with any stop, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, excepting as herein-before provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

16. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or do any act which may cause such works to be injured or damaged or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

17. Garden irrigation rights must be paid for at the time the application is made for the said rights.

18. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1896*.

All hairdressers and barbers' shops in the municipal district of the Borough of Castlemaine shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

All tobacconists' shops within the municipal district of the Borough of Castlemaine shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

## BRIM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Brim Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

County of Bogong, parish of Carlyle: Commencing at the south angle of allotment 1 of section 44, parish of Carlyle (near Rutherglen); bounded thence by the road from Chiltern to Wahgunyah bearing N. 44° 15' W. twenty-five chains ninety-six links; thence by allotment 8c bearing N. 18° 35' E. twenty-one chains forty-seven links; thence by a road bearing east eleven chains sixteen links; and thence by a road bearing south thirty-eight chains ninety-six links to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.
