## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), 1, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 31ST DAY OF MAY INSTANT, throughout the Town of Brunswick;

THURSDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF JUNE NEXT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Bendigo;\*

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF JUNE NEXT, throughout the Borough of Maryborough and the Shire of Lillydale.

## Factories and Shop Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF GEORGE & GEORGE LTD., DRESS AND MANTLE MAKERS, COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of six weeks from the 23rd May, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than sixty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said sixty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

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2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## SHIRE OF KARKAROO SUBDIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of May, 1899.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Peacock | Mr. Foster.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Acts, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Karkaroo has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th day of April, 1899, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order subdivide the said Shire of Karkaroo into four separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of twelve members be elected accordingly.

## North Riding.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of mallee allotment 653; thence following the shire boundary northerly, easterly, southerly, easterly,

southerly, and westerly to the north-east angle of mallee allotment 447; thence westerly by the southern boundary of mallee allotments 665, 667, 669, 672, and 673 to the south-west angle of last-named allotment; thence northerly by the western boundary of mallee allotments 673 and 653 to the point of commencement.

*West Riding.*

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary on the 36th parallel of south latitude where it is intersected by the 142nd meridian line; thence following the shire boundary northerly and easterly to the north-east angle of mallee block 46A; thence south by the west boundaries of mallee allotments 653 and 673 to the south-west angle of allotment last named; thence easterly by a road to the north-east corner of mallee allotment 212; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of mallee allotment 60, being the south boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary westerly to the point of commencement.

*Central Riding.*

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the shire at the south-east angle of mallee allotment 371; thence westerly by a road to the north-east angle of mallee allotment 140; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of mallee allotment 212; thence easterly along the south boundary of mallee allotments 672, 669, 667, and 665 to the north-east angle of mallee allotment 447; thence south by a road being the eastern boundary of the shire to the commencing point.

*South Riding.*

Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire at the south-east angle of mallee allotment 60; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of mallee allotment 140; thence east by a road to the eastern boundary of the shire at the south-east angle of mallee allotment 371; thence following the shire boundary southerly and westerly to the point of commencement.

The shire boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th March, 1898.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SHIRE OF YEA.—BOUNDARIES OF RIDINGS  
ADJUSTED AND RE-DEFINED.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of May, 1899.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Peacock | Mr. Foster.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of continuous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, for the purpose of adjusting the continuous boundaries of the subdivisions of the Shire of Yea, doth hereby cancel all previously defined boundaries of subdivisions of the said shire, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof respectively in the manner following, that is to say:—

*North Riding.*

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the shire where it is intersected by the River Goulburn; thence westerly by said river to the western boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary northerly, easterly, northerly, north-easterly, and southerly to the point of commencement.

*Central Riding.*

Commencing at a point on the Goulburn River to the north-west angle of allotment 47, parish of Whanregarwen; thence westerly by said river to its junction with the Yea River; thence south-easterly by the river last named to the western boundary of the township of Yea; thence following the township boundary southerly, easterly, and north-easterly to the Yea River; thence following the said river southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 34, parish of Yea; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 25, parish of Murrindindi; thence northerly by a road to the north-east angle of said allotment; thence north-easterly by a road to the northern angle of allotment 18, parish of Whanregarwen; thence northerly by a road to the northern angle of allotment 22c; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments 40, 39, 38, 36, and the State School site to the north-east angle of said site; thence north-easterly by a road to the point of commencement.

*West Riding.*

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire where it is intersected by the Goulburn River; thence south-easterly by said river to its junction with the Yea River; thence south-easterly by the river last named to the western boundary of the township of Yea; thence following said township boundary southerly, easterly, and north-easterly to the Yea River; thence following said river southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 25, parish of Murrindindi; thence westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 35, parish of Yea; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 63A; thence easterly by a road to the Yea River; thence following that river to the north-east angle of allotment 75, parish of Yea; thence westerly, north-westerly, and westerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 71; thence south-westerly by a

road to the south-west angle of allotment 212; thence south-westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 215c; thence north-westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 216A; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the parish of Flowerdale to its south-east angle; thence east along the north boundary of the parish of Kinglake to its north-east angle; thence south by the eastern boundary of said parish and a line in continuation thereof to the shire boundary; thence following the shire boundary westerly, northerly, westerly, and northerly to the point of commencement.

*South Riding.*

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the shire where it is intersected by the Goulburn River; thence following said river westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 47, parish of Whanregarwen; thence westerly by a road and the northern boundaries of the State School site, allotments 36, 38, 39, and 40 to the north-west angle of the allotment last named; thence southerly by a road to the northern angle of allotment 18; thence south-westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 25, parish of Murrindindi; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of the allotment last named; thence westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 35, parish of Yea; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 63A; thence easterly by a road to the Yea River; thence southerly by that river to the north-east angle of allotment 75, parish of Yea; thence westerly, north-westerly, and westerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 71; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 212; thence south-westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 215c; thence north-westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 216A; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the parish of Flowerdale to its south-east angle; thence east along the north boundary of the parish of Kinglake to its north-east angle; thence south by the eastern boundary of said parish and a line in continuation thereof to the shire boundary; thence following said shire boundary easterly and northerly to the point of commencement.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

The shire boundary above described is that referred to in the *Government Gazette* of 17th March, 1893.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SHIRE OF BRIGHT RE-SUBDIVIDED.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of May, 1899.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Acts* it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Acts, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Bright has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th day of April, 1899, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Bright aforesaid, and, in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into three separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of nine members be elected accordingly.

*North Riding.*

Commencing at the source of the northern branch of the Two-mile Creek; thence by a direct line northerly to the Owens River bridge; thence westerly by the Owens River to a point opposite the lane running through or dividing allotments 7 and 8, section F2, parish of Porepunkah; thence by that lane north-easterly to the main Buckland road; thence by the centre of that road to the north-west angle of Trapp's special allotment; thence by a line bearing north to the Running Creek road; thence by the centre of that road easterly as far as the junction of the two roads at the south-east angle of 5D, section A, parish of Barwidgee; thence by the centre of the road forming the southern boundaries of allotments 5D and 2c, sections A and 8, 3A, 3 of section XIX., to the Barwidgee parish boundary; thence by that boundary northerly to the northern boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary northerly, easterly, southerly and westerly to Mount Hotham; thence northerly by a range forming the western watershed of the Kiewa River to a point due east of the German Creek; thence by a line and German Creek to its junction with the Owens River; thence by a line bearing westerly to Dogherly's Crossing, being a fording place so named on the Bright and Morse's Creek road; thence by a direct line bearing westerly to the point of commencement.

*West Riding.*

Commencing at the source of the northern branch of the Two-mile Creek; thence by a direct line northerly to the Owens River bridge; thence westerly by the Owens River to a point opposite the lane dividing allotments 7 and 8, section F<sup>2</sup>, parish of Porepunkah; thence by that lane north-easterly to the main Buckland road; thence by the centre of that road to the north-west angle of Trapp's special allotment; thence by a line bearing north to the Running Creek road; thence by the centre of that road easterly so far as the junction of the two roads at the south-east angle of allotment 5D, section A, parish of Barwidgee; thence by the centre of the road forming the southern boundaries of allotments 5D<sup>1</sup> and 2G, section A, and 8, 3A, 3 of section XIX. to the Barwidgee parish boundary; thence by that boundary northerly to the northern boundary of the shire; thence by the shire boundary westerly, south-westerly, and southerly to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range to the head of the Buckland River in the Great Dividing Range; thence by the watershed between the Owens River and Morse's Creek on the one hand and the Buckland River on the other hand to the commencing point.

*South Riding.*

Commencing at the source of the northern branch of the Two-mile Creek; thence by the watershed on the eastern side of the Buckland River to the Great Dividing Range; thence westerly by that range to the shire boundary; thence southerly, easterly, and northerly by the boundary of the shire to Mount Hotham; thence northerly by a range forming the western watershed of the Kiewa River to a point due east of the German Creek; thence by a line and German Creek to its junction with the Owens River; thence by a line bearing westerly to Dogherty's crossing, being a fording place so named on the Bright and Morse's Creek road; thence by a direct line bearing westerly to the point of commencement.

The shire boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th May, 1896.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
