The galvanizing must admit of this being performed four times without there being any sign of a reddish deposit of metallic copper on the wire, which would be the case if the coating of zinc were too thin.

The diameter of the wire to be 171 mils, and no greater difference than 5 (five) mils under or above will be accepted.

To prove its ductility, the wire must be capable of bearing 21 twists in six inches without breaking or showing any sign of splitting.

The weight of wire per mile to be 400 lbs., with a maximum resistance of 13½ ohms.

The wire must bear a weight of not less than 1,300 lbs. without breaking.

If, after the examination of any particular parcel of wire, 10 per cent. of such wire fails, in the opinion of the Telegraph Superintendent, to meet the requirements of the foregoing stipulations, the whole of such parcel shall be rejected, and no such parcel, or any part thereof, shall on any account be again presented for examination and testing, and this stipulation shall be deemed to be, and shall be treated as, an essential condition of the contract.

LADDERS.—The Ladders are to be of Red or Yellow Baltic Fir, free from large or loose knots, and perfectly straight in grain, sound and free from heart and sap. The rounds are to be cleft, of young and fresh Hickory, English Ash, or English Oak, straight in grain, and turned to 14" diameter in centre, and for 4" holes at ends. The sides of the Ladders are to be bored to receive the rounds, and the holes are to be tapered outwards, so as to admit of the round being opened and wedged.
