TREATY WITH ECUADOR.

THE following Despatch, received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

Sir,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 13th April, 1898, respecting the termination of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation, between Her Majesty and the Republic of Ecuador, signed at Quito on the 18th October, 1880, I have the honour to inform you that the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a telegram, dated the 23rd April, 1899, from Her Majesty's Minister, at Lima, reporting that the expiration of the Treaty on April 1st has been notified by the Minister for Foreign Affairs to the Ecuadorean Government, who trusts that a new treaty may shortly be made.

Public Service Reclassification Act 1897.

THE PUBLIC SERVICE RECLASSIFICATION BOARD. —ADDITIONAL MATTERS TO BE DETERMINED.

Marriage Act 1853.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALL PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18th DAY OF JANUARY, 1853.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Marriage Act 1853*, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained.

Marriage Act 1853.—No. 1582.

Section 31—

(1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1853, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.

(2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.

(3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 444 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it is provided that where the Legislature of any British possession by any enactment provides for the fixing, marking, and certifying of load-lines on ships registered in that possession, and it appears to Her Majesty the Queen that that enactment is based on the same principles as the provisions of the said *Merchant Shipping Act* relating to load-lines, and is equally effective for ascertaining and determining the maximum load-line to which these ships can be safely loaded in salt water and for giving notice of the load-line to persons interested, Her Majesty in Council may declare that any load-line fixed and marked, and any certificate given in pursuance of that enactment shall, with respect to ships so registered, have the same effect as if it had been fixed, marked, or given in pursuance of the Fifth Part of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*.

And whereas the Legislature of Victoria, by certain enactments, namely, the *Marine Act 1890*, 54 Vict. No. 1163, the *Marine Act 1892*, 56 Vict. No. 1357, and the *Marine Act 1897*, 61 Vict. No. 1537, has provided for the fixing, marking, and certifying of load-lines on ships registered in that possession.

And whereas it appears to Her Majesty that the said marine enactments are based on the same principles as the provisions of the Fifth Part of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, relating to load-lines, and are equally effective for ascertaining and determining the maximum load-lines to which ships registered in that possession can be safely loaded in salt water, and for giving notice of the load-line to persons interested.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by section 444 of the said *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, is pleased to declare that any load-line, fixed and marked, and any certificate given in pursuance of the provisions of the Marine Acts hereinbefore referred to, shall, with respect to ships registered in Victoria, have the same effect as if it had been fixed, marked, or given in pursuance of the Fifth Part of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*.

CLOUDY BAY, COOK STRAIT.

Marine Department,

THE following letter, received from Captain Manning and others, with reference to the advantages of Cloudy Bay as a safe anchorage during heavy gales in Cook Strait, is published for the information of mariners.

Wellington, N.Z., 29th May, 1899.

Sir,—With a view of giving information of considerable value to shipmasters who may be navigating the eastern portion of Cook Strait, and with the hope of possibly preventing casualties in the future, we suggest that the following facts, drawn from the long experiences of the undersigned, should be published by the Marine Department, and circulated amongst shipmasters and ship-owners throughout the colony.

We are of the opinion that during the last few years many disasters might have been avoided, and much risk and anxiety not been incurred, had there been a more widely diffused knowledge amongst shipmasters of the easy access to, and the complete shelter and safety afforded by, Cloudy Bay. To quote the *New Zealand Pilot*, "Cloudy Bay is a part of the coast between the White Bluff and Port Underwood, a distance of 12 miles; it is a deep indentation, and has a convenient depth of water for anchorage, 12 fathoms across the entrance, and 9 fathoms a mile and a half off the beach, decreasing gradually to the shore. There is good shelter at its head, with off-shore winds from north round to south-east, and out of the strength of the tide, with the advantage of Port Underwood being open in case of the wind drawing more to the eastward. The coast-line is a deep shingle beach."

We wish to add that the width of the mouth of this bay makes it so easy of access that it may practically be considered as a roadstead and a harbor of refuge on the safe side of Cook Strait. The configuration of the land and the adjacent mountain ranges give such protection from the wind and sea that the mariner approaching the locality from the northward or eastward finds himself running into light winds, smooth seas, and clearer weather when within 12 or 14 miles from the anchorage, and will generally find himself in a calm and in smooth water when within 5 miles. This applies to north-west, south, and south-west winds, when even heavy gales of wind are raging in the centre of the Strait and on the Wellington side. Innumerable instances have occurred where heavy southerly gales have been blowing through the Strait and into Wellington, stopping all traffic, and in Cloudy Bay and Port Underwood the weather has been so fine that small craft which had previously taken refuge there were getting under way, with light winds from the north-west.

As Cloudy Bay is of greatest benefit to vessels when southerly gales are blowing, when, through the thick weather which often accompanies these gales, they are unable to pick up Pencarrow Head, or when, through being light and in ballast, they do not care to run down on a lee shore, we enclose a chart marked with lines indicating the locality of the various strength of the wind and state of the sea during such gales. To the westward of a line drawn on the chart from Cape Campbell to Tory Channel the wind and sea will be moderate as compared with what it is to the eastward of that line; to the westward of a line drawn from Cape Campbell to Ranunder Point the wind will be much less and the sea much smoother; to the south-west of a line drawn from Cape Campbell to Port Underwood the wind will be very light, perhaps calm, and the sea quite smooth; and from 2 miles off the White Bluff to Port Underwood the weather, though it may be thick and dirty outside, is generally perfectly clear.

In making for Cloudy Bay at night the ship-master has many things to guide him. As he steers his course for it he finds himself getting into better weather every mile he goes, though he may be 12 or 14 miles from the anchorage. If he can use the sounding machine he will find the soundings gradually decreasing, and will get between 20 and 16 fathoms when 8 miles off Cape Campbell light, which is rarely obscured by mists or squalls, when on a south and easterly bearing, will be a good guide; and the White Bluff, 890 feet high, is nearly always visible some miles off, even on the dirtiest of nights. It can be approached without apprehension, there being 17 fathoms within a mile and a quarter of it. The light at the Wairau Bar is generally visible 10 miles off, and can therefore be seen long before the vessel is in proximity to the White Bluff.

A good mark for anchoring in about 10 or 12 fathoms is to get the Wairau Bar light bearing about south-west, and to have Cape Campbell light slightly open of the White Bluff. Large vessels are advised not to shut Cape Campbell light in with the White Bluff. The bottom is good holding ground, and a vessel with ordinary ground-tackle might lay at anchor in Cloudy Bay with perfect safety all the year round.

There is a signal and telephone station opposite the anchorage (the Wairau Bar), from which telegraphic messages can be sent and received by the ordinary flag signals. As Cape Campbell and Wairau Bar are both telephone stations, vessels bound south, if anchored in Cloudy Bay through stress of weather, could obtain prompt information from the signalman as to the state of the weather at Cape Campbell. Sailing vessels, when unable to

beat up or be towed into Wellington through strong north and north-west gales, are advised to stand across the strait and anchor in Cloudy Bay, where they can be reported, and advised by telegram when the weather has moderated. Ship-owners should instruct the masters of their vessels that when delayed by bad weather, they should report themselves at Cloudy Bay in preference to Cape Campbell. In fact, every encouragement should be given to bring this important haven of refuge into more general use.

In concluding, we trust you will see the necessity for the circulation of this information amongst shipping circles; for, though it is known and used by a few local men, the great majority of shipmasters trading on our coast (including, of course, those in English and foreign-going vessels) are not aware of the existence of such a splendid harbor of refuge in such close proximity to the most tempestuous and dangerous vicinity of Cook Strait.

The births of 1,098 children, viz., 552 boys and 546 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. Although the number was, as will be observed, 41 fewer than in May, 1898, it was slightly above the average of May during the last four years, but considerably below that recorded for the month during any other of the previous six years prior to 1895. The number was, moreover, 241 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 267 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in May numbered 540, viz., 296 of males and 244 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 558, or by 103 per cent., as against 63 per cent. in May, 1898, and 112 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 158 fewer than in May, 1898—when the mortality was exceptionally high—but slightly larger than in the years 1893 to 1896, but fewer than that recorded during any other of the previous ten years; it was also 91 lower than the average of May during the decade referred to, or 103 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

For every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.51 and of deaths registered to 13.53 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 29.24 and 17.95 respectively, and during the last ten years of 31.23 and 16.19 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.55.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 70.0° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 35.9° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (52.3°) was with one exception (May, 1898) the lowest recorded for the month in the last ten years, and one and a half degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.9°) took place on the 13th, and the least range (3.9°) on the 16th. The mean daily range was 13.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.467 inches on the 9th, and the lowest was 29.457 inches on the 2nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.022 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on thirteen days, the amount being 3.54 inches, which was much higher than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years, except 1893, and 1½ inches above the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was 801.

Fog occurred on seven days during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 22 per cent. to that mortality, as against 34 per cent. in May, 1898; 25 per cent. in May, 1897; 30 per cent. in May, 1896; 25 per cent. in May, 1895; 28 per cent. in May, 1894; and 33 per cent. in May, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 93, as compared with 123 in May, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality was 85 per 1,000 births, registered in the month under review, as compared with 108 in May, 1898; 84 in May, 1897; 106 in May, 1896; 88 in May, 1895; 79 in May, 1894; 91 in May, 1893; 76 in May, 1892; 87 in May, 1891; 99 in May, 1890; and 106 in May, 1889.

Fifty-eight persons—as against 50 in May, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a farmer, aged 75, died of cancer; a publican, aged 75, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a gentleman, aged 75, of locomotor ataxy; an agent, aged 75, of syncope; a pensioner, a labourer, and a female, each aged 75, of pneumonia; a gentleman, a farmer, and a modeller, each aged 75, of disease of the kidneys; a miner and a weaver, each aged 76, of cancer; a gardener, aged 76, of insanity; a female, aged 76, of hernia; a salesman, aged 76, of nephritis; a blacksmith, aged 76, of calculus; four females, each aged 77, of cancer, apoplexy, disease of brain, and valvular disease of the heart respectively; a gentleman, aged 77, of asthma; a presser and a female, each aged 77, of bronchitis; a farmer, aged 77, of Bright's disease; a professor, aged 77, of disease of the bladder; a female, aged 78, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 78, of hypertrophy of the heart; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a miner, aged 79, of apoplexy; two females, each aged 79, of hemiplegia and syncope respectively; a brickmaker, aged 79, of heart disease; a poulterer, aged 79, of enteritis; a school-mistress, aged 80, of heart disease; a clerk, aged 80, of pneumonia; a farmer, aged 80, of Bright's disease; three females, each aged 81, of diarrhoea, heart disease, and tumour in the abdomen respectively; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 82, of pneumonia; an orchardist, aged 83, of apoplexy; a contractor, aged 83, of injuries caused by being knocked down by a tram-car; a dentist, aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 86, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 87, of heart disease; a shoemaker, aged 90, of suppression of urine; a gentleman, aged 91, of nephritis; a labourer, aged 76, two females, each aged 78, a bricklayer and a carpenter, each aged 80, a bootmaker, aged 83, a labourer, aged 86, a stonemason, aged 87, a gentleman, aged 89, and a clergyman, aged 90, of old age.

Twenty of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 23 in May, 1898—were from external causes, of which 17 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway guard, aged 35, and a labourer, aged 59, were passed over by railway trains; a boy, aged 10, died of fracture of thigh, and a contractor, aged 83, of injuries, caused in each case by being knocked down by tram-cars; a greengrocer, aged 37, of injuries to the head, through falling from a cart; a fireman, aged 35, of injuries, caused by falling down the hold of a steamer; a student, aged 15, of extravasation of blood on the brain, consequent on a fall, whilst playing football; a bank clerk, aged 26, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall down steps; a labourer, aged 41, of concussion of the brain, and two females, aged 61 and 69 respectively, of lacerated wound of the head and fracture of the thigh respectively, caused in each case by falls; five persons were found drowned, viz., a lighterman and a female, each aged 35, and a coachman, aged 40, in the River Yarra, and a chemist, aged 44, and a female, aged 39, in Hobson's Bay; and a female infant, aged 13 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a boy, aged 10, who was suffocated by charcoal fumes, a verdict of wilful murder being returned against the mother, who was found to be insane. The suicidal deaths were those of a solicitor, aged 34, who shot himself; and a railway employé, aged 68, who cut his throat.

One hundred and forty-two deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—66 in the Melbourne, 19 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 4 in the Homœopathic, and 5 in the Austin Hospitals; 8 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 3 in the Immigrants' Home; 7 in the Benevolent Asylum; 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 1 in the Protestant Refuge; 1 in the Blind Asylum; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 1 in the Pentridge Strata.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 120, of which 73, or 61 per cent., were of males, and 47, or 39 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 93 were under one year of age, 10 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five. Only half as many deaths took place at these ages as in the corresponding month of 1898.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 420, or 41 fewer than in May, 1898. Of these 223, or 53 per cent., were males, and 197, or 47 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 45 were between sixty and sixty-five, 46 were between sixty-five and seventy, 26 were between seventy and seventy-five, 36 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five.

Owing chiefly to the disappearance of the epidemic of measles, which prevailed in May, 1898, the mortality from zymotic diseases, as compared with that period, fell off in the month under review by 103; whilst deaths from constitutional diseases diminished by 16, those from developmental diseases by 9, those from local diseases by 13, those from violence by 3, and those from ill-defined causes (chiefly the juvenile one of debility) by 14. In the zymotic class, no death was set down to measles in the month under notice as against 80 in May, 1898, whilst there was a reduction of 19 in the deaths from typhoid fever, and 5 in those from diphtheria. The decrease under constitutional causes was chiefly distributed over the diseases rheumatism, cancer, phthisis, and scrofula; and of that under developmental causes, 5 occurred under the sub-causes of premature birth and congenital malformations, and 4 under old age. Under the local class there was an increase of 11 and 7 deaths respectively from diseases of the respiratory and urinary systems, but a decrease of 15 in those of the digestive system, and of 16 distributed over other causes. During the month under notice there were 10 deaths from childbirth (including puerperal fever), being equivalent to 1 death of a mother to every 110 births registered, as against 1 in every 127 births in May, 1898.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first five months of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from diphtheria during the last five months was below the average.

Owing, it is suspected, to a deterioration of the milk supply during hot weather, diarrhoeal diseases and enteritis are responsible for the deaths of from 600 to nearly 1,000 persons annually—between three-fourths and eight-ninths of whom are mere infants under the age of two years—which take place for the most part in the six months November to April, which, of course, include the hottest period of the year. During the first five months of the current year 432 such deaths have been recorded, which, although nearly 200 fewer than in the corresponding period of 1898, are still up to the average. The following are the deaths from those causes in each month from January, 1894, onwards:—

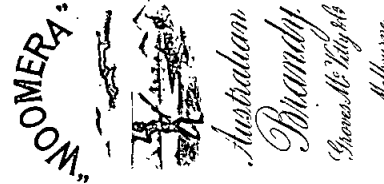

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Jeparit Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. The hours for burial shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be

allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

- Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing, with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
- Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
- No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM EGYPT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or have been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of departure of such vessel from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And whereas it is enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be brought on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation notify that

EGYPT

is infected with Oriental Plague, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Richmond do hereby make the Regulation following in respect of the said Richmond Park:—

REGULATION.

The undermentioned gentleman shall be a member of the Committee of Management to exercise control over the said Richmond Park:—

Samuel James Willis,

in the room of John Hott, who has ceased to hold office as a Councillor of the said City of Richmond.

Provided nevertheless that the said Samuel James Willis shall hold office as a member of the Committee of Management of the said Richmond Park for so long only as he may continue a Councillor of the said City of Richmond.
