**CHIEF PORT OFFICER, PROFESSIONAL DIVISION
TRADE AND CUSTOMS DEPARTMENT.**

APPPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Monday, the 30th January instant, from Officers of the Public Service, and from persons outside the service who are qualified, for the position of Chief Port Officer, Professional Division, Trade and Customs Department.
Yearly salary—£520 minimum, £600 maximum, less a temporary reduction of 9 per cent. as fixed by law. Regular increments are not provided.

The following are the duties to be carried out, under the direction of the Permanent Head of the Trade and Customs Department:—

To supervise the staff and service of light-houses—of the Government steamer *Lady Loch*; of the Alfred Graving Dock; of the Slip; of the 50-ton Crane and appliances connected therewith. (In connexion with matters relating to surveying machinery and light-house apparatus, the advice of professional officers in the Department will be available.)

To act as principal emigration officer and as immigration agent, and to carry out the provisions of Part III. of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* and of Part VIII. of the *Marine Act 1890*.

To act as Superintendent of the Mercantile Marine Office, Melbourne, and to carry out the provisions of Part II. of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*.

To act as Inspector of Fisheries, and to carry out the provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1890*.

To have general charge of matters relating to the surveying, buoyage, marking of channels, condition of piers, wharfs, &c., and foreshore of all ports and places in Victoria.

Any further information desired will be furnished by the Secretary for Trade and Customs.

QUALIFICATIONS.

Must hold a certificate of competency as master mariner, and have been in command of steam vessels, and have had experience in sailing vessels for a considerable period, and have a competent knowledge of the ports of Victoria and navigation of the same.

The successful applicant will be required to furnish security for £2,000 in a guarantee society on his appointment.

The person selected, if from outside the Public Service, must be not more than 45 years of age, and may be required to insure his life for the maximum salary of the position.

Marriage Act 1898.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALL PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1893.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Marriage Act 1898*, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained.

Marriage Act 1898.—No. 1582.

Section 31—

- (1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1893, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.
- (2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.
- (3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN PREPARING ACCOUNTS FOR EXPENDITURE IN CONNEXION WITH COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS OF INQUIRY.

THE President or Chairman will submit an application for a special advance to defray necessary expenses, and if further funds are necessary application will be made as often as may be necessary (provided the total amount mentioned in the order appointing the Commission has not been spent) for a reimbursement of the amount paid out of such advance, full particulars of such amount, supported by vouchers, being furnished. In preparing accounts for expenditure the secretary shall be careful to see—

That they set forth the exact dates or periods and rates of service or supply, and the names of the places in respect of which the expenditure was incurred.

That the particulars of the claims are stated in such a manner as will admit of the calculations being readily checked.

That they are signed opposite the total amount by the proper claimant, or by an agent acting under power of attorney on his behalf, or in the case of a registered company under the *Companies Act 1892* by a duly accredited person on behalf of the company.

That the mark of any claimant unable to write is properly vouched for.

That they are made out in the name of the claimant legibly written in the proper place.

That the amount of the claim is written in words at length opposite to the total.

That blank spaces between the words expressing the total amount of the claim are filled up by drawing a line across them; and, finally,

That they are duly certified by the President (or Chairman).

In stating periods in connexion with salaries or wages, the first and last days shall invariably be included in the calculation. Where a salary at a monthly rate is paid, salary or wages for a portion of a month is to be computed by multiplying the amount of the salary or wages for the month by the number of days comprised in the broken period for which payment is to be made and dividing by the number of days in the month. Where a weekly wage is paid, the wage for a portion of a week is to be computed by multiplying the weekly wage by the number of days comprised in the broken period and dividing by seven.

Petty expenditure not requiring minute description, such as cab hire, railway or train fare, and such like, should, as far as practicable, be included in one account, but full particulars should be given, and an acquittance should be forwarded with the account for any expenditure of five shillings or over in one payment.

No forms of account except those printed at the Government Printing Office shall be used for claims in connexion with any Commission or Board.

The actual payment of an account and the signature to the acquittance shall be verified whenever practicable by the signature of a witness other than the payer; the "mark" of a person unable to write shall invariably be so verified, such verification not to be by the certifying officer.

Every cheque on the official account of the Board or Commission must be signed by the Chairman or President, and countersigned by the secretary, and any moneys received by the Board or Commission from fees, sale of goods or stores, &c., must be forthwith paid into its official account. The secretary shall keep books giving full particulars with dates of all receipts and expenditure of the Board or Commission, such books shall contain reference to the authority in the minute book for expenditure.

The minute book and account books shall be open to inspection of the Under Secretary and Audit Commissioners. No contract shall be entered into except with the authority of the Governor in Council for works or goods the estimated cost of which shall exceed £100, except tenders shall have been first publicly invited.

All stores under contract required shall be obtained at contract rates from the contractors to the Government for the particular articles needed.

No bonus or gratuity shall be paid without the special sanction of the Chief Secretary having first been obtained.

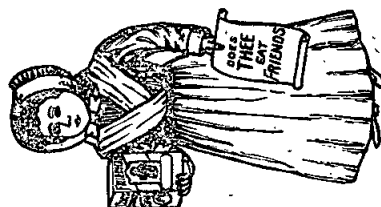

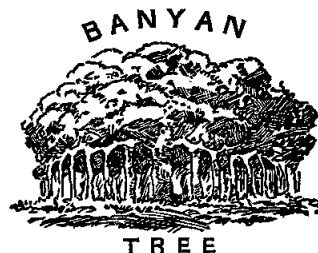

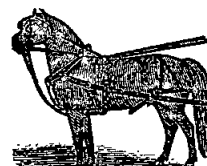

The births of 849 children, viz., 432 boys and 417 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, 73 fewer than in December, 1897, and much fewer than that recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years—in all but one of which the number exceeded 1,000. The number was, moreover, 340 below the average of the month of the previous ten years, or 346 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 774, viz., 419 of males and 355 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 75, or by only 10 per cent., as against 44 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 145 less than in December, 1897, but more than in the corresponding month in any other year since 1891; it was also 53 less than the average of December during the last ten years, or 57 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to only 21.80 and of deaths registered to 19.37 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 24.09 and 23.98 respectively, and in the last ten years of 31.24 and 20.90 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 109.4° on the 5th, and the lowest was 44.0° on the 1st. The former high temperature was exceeded on only seven previous occasions (but only twice in the month of December) since 1857—the maximum recorded having been 111.2° in January, 1861, and the next 111.0° in January, 1860. The mean temperature of the month (65.4°) was 1.1° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (50.4°) took place on the 2nd, and the least range (7°) on the 23rd. The mean daily range was 21.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.076 inches on the 3rd, and the lowest was 29.410 inches on the 5th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.841 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on five days, the amount being nearly one inch (.97), which was much lower than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, and over an inch below the average during that period.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 41 per cent. to that mortality, as against 43 per cent. in December, 1897; 43 per cent. in December, 1896; 42 per cent. in December, 1895; 39 per cent. in December, 1894; 45 per cent. in December, 1893; and 49 per cent. in December, 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 253, as compared with 316 in December, 1897. The rate of infantile mortality (i.e., deaths of infants per 1,000 births registered in the same month) was 301 in the month under review, as compared with 343 in December, 1897; 253 in December, 1896; 236 in December, 1895; 239 in December, 1894; 239 in December, 1893; 243 in December, 1892; 273 in December, 1891; 189 in December, 1890; 323 in December, 1889; and 417 in December, 1888.

Sixty persons—as against 74 in December, 1897—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a cabinetmaker, aged 75, died of phthisis; a labourer, aged 75, of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; a butcher and a female, each aged 75, of pericarditis; a gardener,

aged 75, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 75, of fracture of the leg, the result of a fall, whilst undressing; a police pensioner, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of peritonitis; another, aged 76, of burns; a labourer, aged 77, of dysentery; a police pensioner, aged 77, of heart disease; a pastoralist, aged 77, of hernia; a female, aged 78, of pericarditis; a male, of no occupation, aged 78, of syncope; a servant (female), aged 78, of fracture of the skull, the result of falling down stairs; four females, each aged 79, of diarrhoea, disease of spine, pneumonia, and ulcer of stomach respectively; two females, each aged 80, of hemiplegia and angina pectoris respectively; a miner and a female, each aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; two labourers, each aged 81, of gout and syncope respectively; a female, aged 82, of paralysis; a fisherman, aged 82, of insanity; a female, aged 82, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 82, and a female, aged 83, of gastro-enteritis; a gentleman and a female, each aged 84, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 84, of asthma; a labourer, aged 85, of cancer; two females, each aged 85, of heart disease and bed sores respectively; a farmer, aged 86, of heart disease; a bootmaker, aged 86, of pneumonia; a miner, aged 87, of rheumatism; a mariner, aged 87, of softening of the brain; a tailor, aged 88, of syncope; a female, aged 89, of influenza; a female, aged 76, a contractor, a farmer, and a female, each aged 78, a minor, aged 79, an ex-railway employee, aged 81, a barber, aged 83, a boot salesman and a cooper, each aged 83, a gentleman and a female, each aged 87, three females, aged 88, 90, and 92 respectively, and a gentleman, aged 95, of old age.

Thirty of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 37 in December, 1897—were from external causes, of which 25 were set down to accident, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 9, and a gentleman, aged 70, were passed over by railway trains; a jockey, aged 16, and a labourer, aged 33, died of injuries to the brain, the result in each case of a fall from a horse; a butcher, aged 32, and a female, aged 50, of fracture of the skull, and a carpenter, aged 59, of injuries, caused by being knocked down by carts; a carter, aged 40, of injuries, resulting from a fall from a dray; a gentleman, aged 75, of fracture of the leg, consequent on a fall whilst undressing; a female, aged 78, of fracture of the skull, caused by falling down stairs; a farmer, aged 56, of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 73, of fracture of the thigh, both caused by a fall; a boy, aged 10, of traumatic tetanus; a female, aged 76, of burns; a female infant, aged 4 months, and a seaman, aged 70, of heat apoplexy; a female, aged 28, of poison; a labourer, aged 20, was drowned in the River Yarra, whilst bathing, and a fireman, aged 35, by falling off the Port Melbourne pier; an agent, aged 31, was "found drowned" in the River Yarra; a storeman, aged 37, was suffocated by food; two male infants, one just born and the other aged 2 months, were suffocated, there being insufficient evidence to show how caused; and two new-born male infants died of injuries at birth. The suicidal deaths were those of a miner, aged 40, who shot himself; an assayer, aged 34, who poisoned himself; an ironmonger, aged 58, and two females, aged 30 and 64 respectively, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and sixty-five deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 61 in the Melbourne, 23 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 2 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 4 in the Homoeopathic, and 3 in the Austin Hospitals; 14 in the Metropolitan and 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 14 in the Immigrants' Home; 11 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 3 in the Protestant Refuge; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 317, of which 174, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 143, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 258 were under one year of age, 39 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five. Deaths of children under five years were 81 fewer, and those under one year 42 fewer than in the corresponding month of the previous year.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 457. Of these, 245, or 54 per cent., were males, and 212, or 46 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 28 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty-five and sixty, 41 were between sixty and sixty-five, 43 were between sixty-five and seventy, 57 were between seventy and seventy-five, 26 were between seventy-five and eighty, 17 were between eighty and eighty-five, 14 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at 95. The deaths of persons over five years were 64 fewer than in the corresponding month of the previous year, this reduction being mainly confined to persons between 35 and 70.

Nearly the whole of the reduced mortality from all causes as compared with December, 1897—or 117 out of a total of 145—will be found under the head of local diseases; whilst the balance was distributed over the other classes, except constitutional diseases, under which there was a slight increase. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system fell off by 24, from those of the circulatory system by 17, from those of the respiratory system by 19, from those of the digestive system—chiefly enteritis—by 51, and from those of the urinary system by 10. Under the head of zymotic diseases, the deaths from whooping-cough rose from nil to 28; but this was counterbalanced by a falling off of 11 in those from diarrhoeal diseases, of 6 from diphtheria, and of 8 from septic diseases.

The year just closed was marked by the prevalence of an epidemic of measles, which, during the twelve months, caused 402 deaths—the monthly number having varied from a maximum of 99 in April to 3 each in October and December. The fatality of this epidemic was only exceeded by that of 1875, when 503 deaths occurred, but was greater by 16 deaths than that of 1893. Further particulars will be found in the report for October last.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality during the past twelve months from typhoid fever was the highest since 1890, and that from diphtheria—with one exception—the highest since 1891.

The season—November to April—has already commenced when diarrhoeal diseases and enteritis cause great havoc and carry off their most numerous victims; and in this respect the past year has been much more conspicuous than the years immediately preceding, for 964 deaths from those diseases have been recorded in 1898 as compared with 840 in 1896, when they were much above the average. It is satisfactory to find, however, that a marked reduction in such deaths took place in the last month of the year. As four-sevenths of the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, and eight-ninths of those from enteritis are of infants under two years, whose staple article of diet—when not breast-fed—is cow's milk, there is every reason to suspect a close connexion between the deterioration of the milk consumed during the summer months, and the great fatality of the causes named. Assuming this to be so, the introduction of some general and effective means of preventing such deterioration would probably result in the saving of nearly 500 or 600 lives annually in Melbourne and suburbs alone. The following are the deaths from those causes in each month during the last five years:—

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt, from the date hereof, the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

BOROUGH OF CLUNES.

By-Law No. 17.

A By-law of the Borough of Clunes, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 17, for the regulation and government of drivers of bicycles, tricycles, and other velocipedes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Clunes order as follows:—

1. Through this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers; provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted, and kept lighted, as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever any such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep such machine at a distance of not less than 6 feet on the right or off side of such vehicle, or horse, or other beast of burden, and any person overtaking with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding a machine meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall, on such meeting, become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such horse or other beast of burden, the person driving or riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine along or across any street or any other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven, ridden, or impelled.

7. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any machine along any street or any other public thoroughfare in such manner in such order that more than two machines shall be travelling side by side in the same direction, except when such machines shall form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

8. No person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than 10 miles per hour upon or along any street or public place, nor shall proceed at a greater speed than 5 miles per hour upon, over, or along any crossing.

9. No person whilst riding, driving, or impelling a machine through any street, shall ride with his feet off the pedals, or with his hands off the handle-bars, or otherwise ride the machine carelessly or negligently, or adopt the practice generally known as "coasting," but shall so ride, drive, or impel the machine in such a manner that he shall at all times retain full control thereof.

10. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding £5.
