**KEEPING OF EXPLOSIVES.—ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of June, 1899.*

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Explosives Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1090) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations and rescind the same providing for the storage of Explosives, and, notwithstanding anything in the said Part of the said Act, may from time to time by Order prohibit, either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions, the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of Victoria, conveyance and sale, or any of them, of any explosive when in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order rescind clauses 20, 21, and 22, being Part III. (Keeping of Explosives) of the Regulations intituled "Prohibiting the Importation, Keeping, Conveyance, and Sale of Explosives, except under certain Conditions or Restrictions," made by Order in Council No. 6, dated the 13th day of December, 1897, and doth substitute the following clauses in lieu thereof, viz.:—

**PART III.**

*Keeping of Explosives.*

20. No person shall keep any explosive unless he shall previously have obtained a licence to do so, issued under the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1890*, and on the conditions referred to or set out in or on such licence. Provided that an offence shall not be deemed to be committed under this Regulation in the following cases (that is to say):—

- (1) Where gunpowder is kept for private use only and not for sale, to an amount not exceeding 30 lbs.
- (2) Where any explosive other than gunpowder is kept for private use only and not for sale, to an amount not exceeding 5 lbs., provided that in such amount of 5 lbs. not more than 100 detonators shall be included.
- (3) Where any explosive is kept by a carrier for the purpose of conveyance, in accordance with the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1890* relating to the conveyance of explosives.

21. Every person keeping for private use only the quantity of explosives allowed under the last foregoing Regulation shall take all due precaution in the storage of the same and for the prevention of any accident by fire or explosion.

No. 1082) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind such Regulations as may be necessary or expedient for the carrying out of the provisions of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations relating to the sale of tobacco, cigars, and snuff which were made by Orders in Council dated respectively the 30th day of June, 1896, and the 6th day of July, 1897, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof (that is to say):—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The registration fee for a licence to sell tobacco, cigars, and snuff shall be five shillings per annum.
2. The term for an annual licence shall be from 1st July to the 30th June following.
3. Such annual licences may be issued by the authorized issuers during the months of June and July in each year, and shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto.
4. On and after the 1st August in any year licences for the unexpired portion of the year ending 30th June following may be issued. Such licences shall commence from the day of issue, and shall terminate on the 30th June following, and shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereto. The fee therefor shall be at the rate of five pence per month, and a portion of a month shall be charged as a whole month.
5. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st July, 1899.

**W**HEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to and alterations in the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART VII.—STORES.

*Section I.—General Regulations—Ordnance Stores.*

Paragraph 160.—In sub-clause commencing "Expense Stores are not to be entered," after the words "expense stores" the following words are inserted:—"(except in the case of the V.P.A., the expense stores for which corps are specially provided for under paragraphs 186 to 198)."

*Section II.—Supply and Maintenance of Stores at Forts.*

Paragraphs 186 to 199 (inclusive) are cancelled, and the following paragraphs are substituted therefor:—

186. Each requisition will be stamped with a rubber stamp with the name of the Fort to which it refers.

186A. All requisitions for stores must show the quantity on hand at the date of requisitioning.

187. The Commanding Officer, Victorian Permanent Artillery, will requisition for all expendible stores for all forts at Port Phillip Heads, and will issue such stores to Officers in charge of forts as may be required.

188. Requisitions for stores within the establishment will be sent direct by the Commanding Officer, V.P.A., to the Controller, who will issue the same after having satisfied himself that the demand is in accordance with the Regulations.

189. Requisitions for stores outside the authorized establishment will be marked Special, and forwarded by the C.O., V.P.A., to the Military Commandant, who will forward the same to the Secretary for Defence for the approval of the Minister.

190. The stores will be delivered direct to the C.O., V.P.A., at the Central Depot, Queenscliff Fort, and the papers relating thereto will also be sent to him.

191. Stores may be sent to Queenscliff either by rail or water, and the Commanding Officer, V.P.A., will take delivery at railway station or wharf.

192. Orders for the Heads will be sent to the contractors by the Controller, and the contractor will send supplies under such orders to the C.O., V.P.A. Goods that require examination and inspection are to be first delivered at the Ordnance Branch.

193. The C.O., V.P.A., will frequently inspect the Central Depot for expendible stores, and will see that stores are not allowed to accumulate.

194. Two ledgers are to be kept, one for the armament, the other for barrack stores, for each fort, and in addition a separate ledger will be kept by C.O., V.P.A., at Queenscliff, for expense stores, and in this latter ledger all receipts and issues will be duly entered, vouchers being obtained and filed in support of all entries. This ledger will be audited as often as is considered necessary by the Controller on application to the Military Commandant.

195. The expenditure of all expendible stores is to be shown in expense books at all forts.

196. The Officer in charge of each fort will be responsible for the stores in the fort, also that the records are correct, and that the ledgers are properly kept.

197. Requisition for transfer of stores (expendible stores excepted) between forts at the Heads will be signed by the C.O., V.P.A., and forwarded direct to Controller.

198. Paragraph 160 of Financial and Store Regulations will apply to V.P.A. stores, except where it conflicts with paragraphs 186 to 198.

*Section III.—Allowance of Ammunition and Stores for Instructional Purposes.*

In paragraph 202, under the heading "Small Arms Ammunition," the following is added:—"*Francotte, ball, 10,000 rounds per annum.*"

**QUARANTINE OF CATTLE AND SHEEP FROM  
 PLACES OUTSIDE THE AUSTRALASIAN COLONIES  
 OR NEW ZEALAND.**

**W**HEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1141) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations under the said Part of the said Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the 4th section of the said Act, and may rescind the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order order as follows (that is to say):—

(1) The Order bearing date 19th day of December, 1898, relating to the quarantine of cattle and sheep from places outside the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, shall be and the same is hereby revoked, except so far as the said Order relates to pigs.

(2) Cattle, sheep, or pigs intended to be introduced into Victoria from any place other than one of the Australasian colonies—the introduction of pigs from New Zealand having been prohibited—shall remain in quarantine in the case of cattle not less than 40 days, and in the case of sheep and pigs not less than 30 days, and in the case of sheep from Germany and the United States of America not less than 60 days, during which times, in the case of sheep, they shall be washed, dressed, and disinfected as the Chief Inspector of Stock may direct, and in the case of cattle any animal suspected to be affected with tuberculosis may be subjected to the tuberculin test, and the owner if required by the inspector shall render all necessary assistance to facilitate the operation, and until after the expiration of the said periods of 40 days, 30 days, or 60 days, as the case may be, they have been examined by a veterinary surgeon approved by the Governor in Council in that behalf and an inspector of stock, and by them declared by writing under their hands to be free from infection; and no person shall, whether before or after the expiration of the said periods of 40 days, 30 days, or 60 days, as the case may be, remove or drive any such cattle, sheep, or pigs, or suffer any such cattle, sheep, or pigs to escape from the quarantine ground until an inspector of stock by writing under his hand may authorize their removal.

A By-law of the Shire of Yarrawonga, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 23, for preventing the deposit of offensive substances upon the streets or lanes of the township of Yarrawonga.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrawonga order as follows:—

1. No foul or offensive-smelling water or other fluid, and no garbage, house or other sweepings or other refuse, matter, or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged into or upon the water channel, footway, roadway, or any part whatever of any street or lane, whether public or private, within the limits of the township of Yarrawonga.

2. For every offence against any provision of this By-law the offender shall, upon conviction before any one or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing By-law, being By-law No. 23 of the Shire of Yarrawonga, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga on the 16th day of May, 1899, and confirmed by the said Council by Special Order this 19th day of June, 1899.

## SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

BY-LAW No. 24.

A By-law of the Shire of Yarrawonga, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 24, for the regulation and government of drivers of bicycles and other velocipedes.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrawonga order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted, and kept lighted, as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and, whenever he shall overtake with such machine any



waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, or carriage, horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person riding, driving, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person riding, driving, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse, or other beast of burden, may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
