PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN AVOCA AND TULLAROOP SHIRES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF JULY INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Avoca and Tullaroop.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.
