Alteration of "Course Recommended."

THE new survey of the inner route by H.M.S. *Dart* being now completed as far south as Aye (1) Reef, it is found that the safest course to be followed to clear the North and South Khandala Shoals lies to the westward of Heath Reef, and in order to facilitate navigation on the course now recommended the Claremont Island Light-ship will, on the 1st November, 1899, be removed to a position south 85 degrees west, distant 8 cables from the western extreme of Heath Reef.

After that date, the "Course Recommended" from Fife Island will be as follows:—

When Fife Island tree bears north 85 degrees east, distant 6½ cables, steer north 19 degrees west for a distance of 11¼ miles, passing to the eastward of the light-ship at a distance of about 2 cables. When the west extreme of Heath Reef bears north 85 degrees east, the course is again changed to north 8 degrees west. Continue this course 8½ miles, when it will intersect the "Course Recommended" before laid down.

PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA.—LENDING LIBRARY—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE majority of the Trustees for the time being of the body politic and corporate, named the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria, do hereby repeal the rules in connexion with the Lending Library made on the 5th December, 1898, by the majority for the time being of the above-named Trustees, and in lieu thereof make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

THE LENDING LIBRARY.

1. The Lending Library shall be open from Twelve noon to Eight p.m. every day except Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, and such other days as the Trustees may by special order direct.
2. Any person satisfying the librarian that he is a ratepayer of any municipality within the Colony of Victoria may borrow books from the Lending Library.
3. Any other person having reached the age of fifteen years, who shall deliver to the librarian a guaranty signed by two such ratepayers, may borrow books from the Lending Library.
4. Every application for the loan of books, and the guaranty required by the next preceding regulation, shall be in the form provided from time to time by the Trustees.
5. The librarian may issue to any person entitled to borrow, on his or her personal application, a borrower's ticket, the production of which shall authorize its holder for twelve months to borrow books subject to the regulations of the Lending Library.
6. A borrower's ticket may be issued to any person who is physically incapable of applying personally, or to any person who resides more than ten miles from Melbourne, without personal application, on receipt of the necessary forms duly filled in and signed, provided that a statement in writing of the reason for not attending in person be given to the librarian and a reference given to some local magistrate, clergyman, or ratepayer.
7. Borrowers must return books personally or by messenger. The Trustees will neither undertake to receive nor issue books by post.
8. All books borrowed must be returned to the librarian within a fortnight, and for every failure to comply with this condition the borrower shall incur a fine, to be paid to the librarian, of Threepence for each day, or portion of a day.
9. No book can be obtained from the Lending Library by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred, and made full compensation for any loss, damage, or cost of repair.
10. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.

11. Borrowers must see that books are in good order before taking them from the library. If any book be found to be written on, or otherwise injured, borrowers are required to report the fact to the librarian.

12. Any borrower returning a book which has been written upon, marked, or otherwise injured, shall, within one week of the date upon which the injury has been notified to him, replace such book, or pay to the librarian the value of any book, set, or series injured, or shall pay such sum for the cost of repair as may be assessed by the librarian. The borrower shall be entitled to the injured book, set, or series on depositing with the librarian its full value, or a new and satisfactory copy.

13. Borrowers ceasing to use the library are required to return their tickets to the librarian in order to have them cancelled, as, until the tickets are returned, borrowers and their guarantors remain responsible for any book taken out in their names.

14. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify, on forms supplied for the purpose, the change to the librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited for failure to comply with this condition.

15. Borrowers losing their tickets are required to give immediate notice in writing to the librarian, and until they have done so shall be liable for any books taken out in their names.

16. If a borrower's ticket be lost, a second ticket may be issued, after two days from the date on which the loss is notified, in the manner provided in the case of the issue of the ticket in the first instance. If the second ticket be lost, one month must elapse from the time of the notification of the fact to the librarian before a third ticket shall be issued.

17. Borrowers must under no circumstances transfer their tickets for use to any other person.

18. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the library, nor exchange them with each other.

19. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time. When, however, the connexion of two or more volumes of one work makes the use of the whole work necessary, several volumes may be issued together, the number of volumes to be plainly written on the application card in such cases.

20. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower.

21. The librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the Lending Library, or who is, in his opinion, for other reasons not to be intrusted with books.

22. Every book must, under a penalty of five shillings, be returned to the librarian at such times as shall be publicly announced.

23. Books will not be issued to any person suffering from an infectious disease, nor to any person living in the same house as one suffering from an infectious disease. Borrowers are required to report at once to the librarian in the event of the outbreak of any such disease in the house in which he or she may be dwelling.

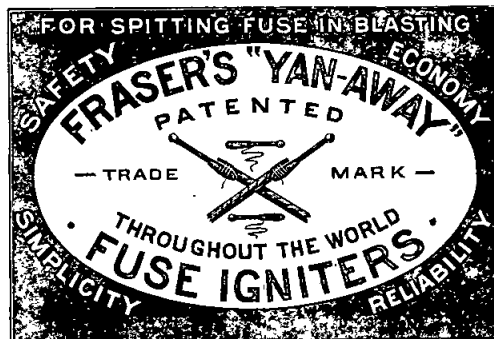

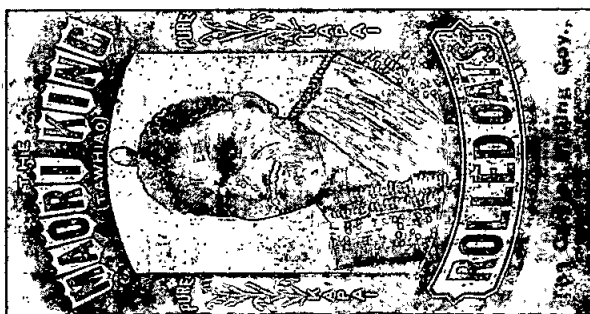

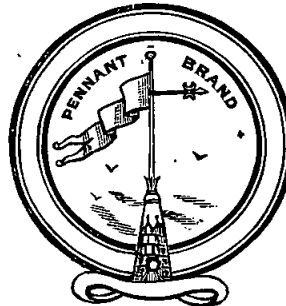

Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law, the rate to be charged for water supplied during the period when the surface of the water in the Malmsbury reservoir is above the level of the permanent sills of the flood escapes under and in terms of this by-law shall be One farthing (4d.) per 1,000 gallons from the 17th day of July, 1899.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF ROMSEY.—PUBLIC HEALTH.

BY-LAW No. 4.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Romsey, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law or Regulation No. 4 of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. This By-law or Regulation shall apply to and have operation within the area comprising the Romsey Waterworks Supply District hereinafter described, and shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*. The limits of the land within which the area comprising the Romsey Waterworks Supply District are as follows, viz:—

Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 6, section A, parish of Lancefield; thence east by the northern boundary of said allotment to a point on the main road from Romsey to Lancefield; thence east by a line crossing the said road and by the northern boundary of allotment 16 of said section A to the north-east angle of said allotment; thence south by the eastern boundary of said allotment 16 to the 5-Mile Creek: thence easterly by the said creek forming the northern boundary of allotment 19 of said section A to north-east angle of same allotment; thence south by the eastern boundary of said allotment 19 and a line in the same direction to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 36, section B, parish of Monegeetta; thence west by the southern boundary of the last-named allotment and a line in the same direction crossing the Main-road from Romsey to Lancefield to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 40, section A, in the last-named parish; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of said allotment 40 to the south-east angle of same; thence west by the southern boundary of said allotment 40 to a point south of the south-west angle of allotment 9, section A, parish of Lancefield; thence north by a line and the western boundaries of allotments 9 and 6, parish of Lancefield, to the north-west angle of the latter, the commencing point aforesaid.

2. By-law No. 3 under the *Health Act 1890*, passed by the Council of the Shire of Romsey, on the 6th day of January, 1893, is hereby repealed.

3. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be provided with a suitable pan. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

4. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of some material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan in such earth-closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

5. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited in any pan in such earth-closet any garbage, rubbish, or any other material other than night-soil.

6. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any closet-pan except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., unless otherwise permitted in writing by the council.

7. The occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every fourteen days empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied and cleansed every closet-pan, earth-closet, and privy on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any closet-pan, earth-closet or privy or remove the said pan or the contents thereof or the contents of the said earth-closet or privy from their premises except by means of a cart, carriage, or other means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering; and such cart, carriage, or other means of conveyance shall be constructed in such a manner as to prevent the escape of the contents of the said pan or of such cart, carriage, or other means of conveyance or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia or offensive odour.

9. No person shall bury night-soil within the area described in clause No. 1 of this By-law or Regulation.

10. That individual householders shall not contract for the removal of either night-soil or any other refuse except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the Council of the Shire of Romsey and of the *Health Act 1890*.

11. Every person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing By-law or Regulation was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Romsey this fifth day of May, A.D. 1899.

BOROUGH OF CLUNES.

BY-LAW No. 3 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Borough of Clunes made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 3, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet pans, house and yard refuse, and other matters named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Clunes make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Clunes.

3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the Borough of Clunes from the operation of this By-law.

4. The occupier, and every person having the management or control of any house or premises, shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.

5. As frequently as the Borough Council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles shall be removed, and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor.

6. Every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in any street or lane, and shall cause them to be removed or replaced from time to time as often as occasion shall require, and shall be responsible for the emptying and the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

7. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

8. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the Borough Council with a double-pan service, and the pans of such service shall be and remain the property of the Borough Council.

9. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Borough Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct in a suitable cart, and the Council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for such service, and for the said pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

10. And a pan cleansed by superheated steam, or some other equally efficient means approved by the Borough Council, shall be left in place of the one removed.

11. Every closet within the borough shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings or flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than three (3) inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth or some deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

12. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Borough Council, or be trenched or ploughed into land, in such locality as may be provided by the Borough Council.

13. The occupier of any land in the Borough of Clunes on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yards, cattle shed, or pig-stye shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect to cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor of Victoria and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the 7th day of July, 1879, made in pursuance of the provisions of *The Land Act 1869*, certain Crown lands therein described, situate in the parish of Banyena, were proclaimed a Village: And whereas by another Proclamation made as aforesaid and bearing date the 20th day of October, 1879, such Village was distinguished by the name of Karmbool: And whereas by another Proclamation made as aforesaid and bearing date the 23rd day of December, 1879, the name of such Village was altered to Avon Plains: And whereas it is expedient now to rescind in part such Proclamations: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby rescind the Proclamations aforesaid bearing dates respectively the 7th day of July, 1879, the 20th day of October, 1879, and the 23rd day of December, 1879, so far only as the same relate to the land hereunder described, that is to say:—

14. No such occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pans and lids in any manner whatsoever.

15. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, cinders, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

16. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Borough Council over all premises which may be inspected by the Borough Council or its officers from time to time, or by any person duly authorized by the Council.

17. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding £10 for every breach thereof, or not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than 5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

18. Sections 3, 4, 5, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16 of By-law No. 1 are hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.

BY-LAW No. 11.

IN pursuance of powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, No. 1098, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Seymour make the following By-law No. 11, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, that is to say:—

1st. The By-law shall apply to the territory within the Seymour Waterworks Trust area.

2nd. Once in each week the person contracted with by the Council shall remove the pans in use, empty them into a vehicle provided for the purpose, and replace them in their position.

3rd. No owner or occupier of premises shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of pans or their contents or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons appointed in that behalf by the Council, and such pans and their contents shall be removed by the said contractor at such times and in such manner as the Council shall from time to time direct.

4th. Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be, immediately on deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

5th. For the removal and disposal of the pan contents each occupier shall pay to the Council quarterly, and in advance, a sum equal to fifteen (15) shillings per pan per year for one pan, and Ten (10) shillings per annum for each additional pan on private premises.

6th. If any person commit a breach of this By-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten (10) pounds and not less than Five (5) shillings, or a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds and not less than Five (5) shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

7th. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

8th. The foregoing By-law was adopted by the Seymour Shire Council on the 8th day of November, 1892, and was confirmed on the 6th day of December, 1892.

PART IV.—SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES, STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

Chapter XIII.—*Felling and removal of redgum timber, and payment for the same by measurement.*

Regulation 15 is hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation is made in lieu thereof, as from the 1st day of August, 1899, namely:—

No redgum tree shall be felled for saw-mill purposes which at a height of five (5) feet from the ground has a girth of less than seven (7) feet three (3) inches.—(Corr. F. 18201.)

A By-law of the Borough of Rutherglen, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 3/99, for regulating bicycle and other cycle traffic.

1. Throughout this by-law the word "machine" shall mean bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
2. A person shall not ride, drive, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers, provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.
3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.
4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever any such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, such person shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, and shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle or horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.
5. In every case where a person riding or driving a machine meets or approaches any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall on such approach become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such horse or other beast of burden, the person driving or riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.
6. No person shall drive or ride a machine along or across any street or other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven or ridden.
7. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any machine along any street or any other public thoroughfare in such a manner or in such order that more than two machines shall be travelling side by side in the same direction, except when such machines shall form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.
8. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings.
