PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath ; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF AUGUST NEXT,  
as a Bank Holiday at Apsley ;

WEDNESDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF AUGUST NEXT,  
as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Rutherglen, and, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Geelong ;\*

THURSDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF AUGUST NEXT,  
throughout the Shire of Bairnsdale ;\*

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH, AND WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH, DAYS OF SEPTEMBER NEXT,  
throughout the Shire of Castle Donnington ;

THURSDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT,  
throughout the Boroughs of Rutherglen and Wangaratta and the Shires of Chiltern and Glenelg ;

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT,  
throughout the Shire of Stawell.
