SHIRE OF TOWONG.

By-law 6 under the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Towong, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 4 of the Shire of Towong, made under the *Health Act 1890*, shall be and hereby is repealed.

2. The ordinary system of open pans for night-soil shall be abolished.

3. *Double-pan service*.—In lieu of such ordinary system of pans every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be fitted with air-tight lids and the pans removed for cleansing at least once a week.

4. *Removal of night-soil.*—No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the council of the said shire; and any such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied alternately as the council of the said shire shall direct.

5. *Use of Deodorant.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

6. *Power of council to make a charge.*—The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

7. *Extent of application of by-law.*—This By-law 6 shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of an area (including the Town of Corryong) described as follows:—

Commencing at the western angle of the Government Town Reserve; thence N. 37° 24' E. to the southern boundary of allotment 1a, section O, parish of Towong; thence S. 52° 30' E. along the boundary of the said allotment to the south-east angle thereof; thence N. 37° 30' E. to the north-west angle of allotment 1a, section D; thence S. 52° 30' E. to the north-east angle of allotment 1a, section T; thence S. 37° 30' W. to the northern boundary of allotment 1, section U; thence N. 52° 30' W. to the north-east angle of the Government Town Reserve; thence S. 55° W. to the south-east angle of the reserve; thence N. 52° 30' W. to the starting point.

8. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for every day such offence is continued after any conviction.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Council of the Shire of Lillydale made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 14.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, sections 31, 32, 35, and Division 3 of Part 11, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Lillydale in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire doth hereby make the By-law following (that is to say):—

1. By-law No. 2 made by the Council of the Shire of Lillydale acting as the Local Board of Health in and for the said shire, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th June, 1884, page 1940, and By-law No. 7 made by the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Lillydale, being the municipal council thereof, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd October, 1886, page 3016, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law, after confirmation by the Board of Public Health, shall come into full force and operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Every occupier of any house or premises within the shire of Lillydale shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from the yard or ground belonging to or occupied in connexion with such house or premises, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the Council of the said Shire may cause the same to be removed at the expense of the occupier.

4. Every occupier of any land in the said Shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow yard, cattle shed, or pigsty in or to which any animals are kept or have access shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be removed from such premises once at least in every week, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the Council of the said Shire may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises in the township of Lillydale situated within the boundaries following, that is to say:—Commencing at a point at the intersection of the main Melbourne and Victoria

Roads, running north along the said Victoria-road to Nelson-road, thence east along Nelson-road to its eastern termination, then south along the western boundary of Crown portion 6, parish of Yering, to the main Healesville-road, thence through the Mount Olinda estate *via* Queen's-road and Albert-road to the Three-Chain-road, and thence two hundred feet south of that road, thence west in a straight line parallel to that road to the main Melbourne road and along that road to the commencing point, shall once at least in every week cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth-closet, privy, and place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises in the township of Lillydale, situated within the boundaries mentioned in clause 5 hereof, shall employ the contractor authorized by the Council of the Shire of Lillydale to empty and cleanse every earth-closet, privy, and place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises; and no person other than the said contractor and his assistants shall empty or deposit the contents of any earth-closet, privy, or place for the reception of night-soil in the portion of the said township, situated within the boundaries aforesaid; and no person whatsoever shall convey or cause to be conveyed through any public street or road the contents of any earth-closet, privy, or cesspool, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance approved of by the Council of the Shire of Lillydale as being so constructed as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

7. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land within the said shire, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or other place for the deposit thereof, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness.

8. No nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter shall be placed, deposited, or spread in the said shire within 20 chains of the Olinda creek or any tributary thereof.

9. The occupier of any premises in that portion of the township situated within the boundaries mentioned in clause 5 hereof used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be removed therefrom once in every 48 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia, and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have any offensive matter removed therefrom as aforesaid the Council of the Shire of Lillydale may cause it to be removed at the expense of the occupier.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises in the township of Lillydale situated within the boundaries mentioned in clause 5 hereof shall cause such premises to be provided with a closet-pan which shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

11. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 20 feet in width.

12. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises in that portion of the township situated within the boundaries mentioned in clause 5 hereof shall from time to time use such disinfectants as shall keep every closet-pan, earth-closet, privy, and place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises free from offensive odours to the satisfaction of the council's sanitary inspector.

13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and the justices before whom such penalty or penalties is, or are sought to be recovered, may order the whole, or any portion thereof, not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Council of the Shire of Lillydale may be empowered by the by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether it has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

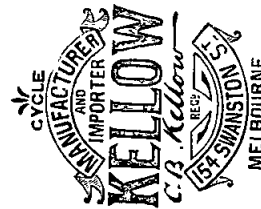

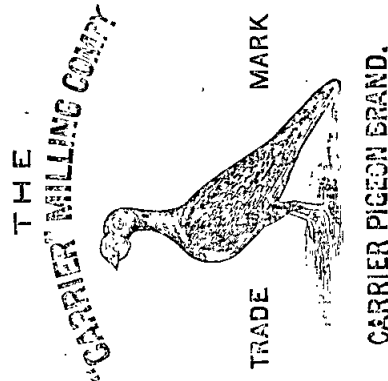

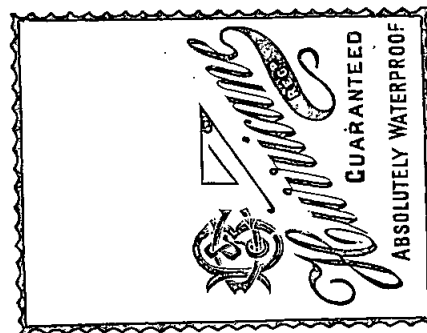

THE BORUNG SHIRE COUNCIL AND THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 373 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of its municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Borung is desirous of applying from the municipal fund of the said shire a sum of Two hundred and twenty-three pounds nineteen shillings sterling (£223 19s.) for the purpose of paying interest on moneys borrowed by and liabilities transferred to the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust: The Governor in Council has therefore, by Order made on the 23rd day of January, 1899, consented to the said sum of £223 19s. being applied by the Municipal Council of the said shire from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

FIRST MILDURA IRRIGATION TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1896*, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. Any person who shall commit any of the following offences shall be liable, on conviction, in a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50 for each offence, viz.:—

- (a) Any person who shall take, or use, or cause to be taken or used any water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust (other than within the town reticulated area) without authority.
 - (b) Any person who shall raise or lower any sluice gate or weir, or in any manner interfere with any appurtenance of any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust without authority.
 - (c) Any owner or occupier of land through or near to which there is a channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust who shall, without authority, obstruct or in any manner whatever interfere with the flow of water in the said channel, conduit, or pipe, or alter in any manner whatever any such channel, conduit, or pipe.
 - (d) The owner or person having the control of any animal shall drive or allow the same to stray upon the banks of the channels or fills belonging to or under the control of the Trust.
 - (e) Any person who shall throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing into any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any clothes, cloth, or other thing.
 - (f) The owner or person having the control of ducks or other fowls who shall allow the same to enter or swim in the channels belonging to or under the control of the Trust.
 - (g) Any person who shall bathe in any reservoir, channel, or conduit belonging to or under the control of the Trust, or cause to enter, or having charge of allow to enter therein any horse, dog, or other animal.
 - (h) Any person who shall maliciously or negligently destroy or damage any reservoir, dam, weir, tank, channel, conduit, pipe, bridge, culvert, box, or other part whatever of the works belonging to or under the control of the Trust.
 - (i) Any owner or occupier who shall allow any waste water from his land to enter any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust.
 - (j) Any owner or occupier who shall by negligence allow the water supplied to him to run to waste or on to public roads or private or public lands to their detriment.
2. If any person cause the water of any sink, sewer, or drain, or other filthy water belonging to him or under his control to run or be brought into any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust, or do any other act whereby the water of the Trust shall be fouled, he shall for each such offence be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50.
3. If any owner or occupier of a block of land using water for irrigating the same shall not have a person in attendance on the water, or if due care in irrigating be not observed by such person and water shall thereby be wasted, the Trust shall have power to shut off the water during the remainder of the pumping in which the waste occurs, and if, notwithstanding such action on the part of the Trust, water shall be taken for irrigating the said block of land the owner or occupier shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.
4. The Trust shall have the right to specify what shall be the capacity of any head ditch within the lands supplied by it with water, and failing compliance on the part of any owner or occupier of the said lands with such specification, or failing head ditch being kept in such condition that its capacity is not diminished, the Trust shall have the right to refuse to supply water till the head ditch is made of the required capacity or put in proper condition; and if the owner or occupier of such lands shall, notwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to the Trust he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50 for each offence.
5. The Trust shall have the right to refuse to supply water to land on which water rates are more than three months in arrear; and if the owner or occupier of such land shall, notwithstanding such refusal, take or cause to be taken water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to the Trust he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50 for each offence.
6. The Trust shall have the right to impose a time limit for the irrigation of each particular block, and to shut off the water when such limit shall be exceeded.
7. If water shall be used for the irrigation of any land without the authority of the Trust the owner or occupier of such land shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding £50.

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY
TRUST.

REGULATION providing for the sale of water for the year 1899.

REGULATION No. 18.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The forms of measure shall be and are hereunder determined by the Trust.

Gravitation Water.

2. The price or rate to be paid for water delivered from the River Murray, Gunbower Creek, or the Barr Creek through the Trust Channels or otherwise shall be, for indigenous grasses or pasturage, Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre.

3. For irrigation of lucerne or fodder crops, the charge shall be Ninopence (9d.) per inch per acre.

4. For the irrigation of cereals, wheat, oats, barley, &c., the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and One shilling per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

Filling Tanks.

5. Filling tanks outside of Trust area, a charge of Two pounds (£2) for each tank shall be made, but when the parties are irrigating land in the immediate neighbourhood of such tanks, a demand of One pound (£1) only for each tank shall be made.

Fallow Land.

6. For fallow land a charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made.

Irrigation by Pumping.

7. For all kinds of crops or land, all the year round, the charge shall be Tenpence (10d.) per inch per acre, 3 inches to be considered a watering. Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) to be the minimum charge for each acre.

Filling Tanks.

8. Filling tanks inside of Trust area, a charge of One pound (£1) for each tank shall be made. Filling tanks outside of Trust area, a charge of Two pounds (£2) shall be made.

Garden Rights.

9. The rate or price for the right to irrigate gardens or orchards shall be at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per acre, or part of an acre, for the year round, but in all cases the minimum charge shall be One pound (£1).

10. A garden shall be taken to mean an area not exceeding 20 acres.

11. Such person or persons as the aforesaid Trust shall appoint from time to time for the purpose of collecting water rates shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates and charges.

HALF-HOLIDAY IN THE TOWNSHIP OF
HEALESVILLE.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district, or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, closing all shops or all shops of any particular class within such district, other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, on one specified day in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers, or of all the shopkeepers other than those mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule, or of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected (as the case may be): And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the Township of Healesville within the municipal district of the Shire of Healesville all shops, other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid, shall be closed on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers within such part of such district other than those mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All shops in the Township of Healesville within the municipal district of the Shire of Healesville (other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*) shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

of inquiry to hear, receive, and examine evidence relating to and to report on any matter connected with the government or discipline of the volunteer force, or of any corps thereof, or on any charge brought against a member of any such corps, the maintenance of discipline, the power of arrest, the payment and recovery of subscriptions, fines, and penalties, and the general government, discipline, and management of the volunteer force and the several corps thereof, and the persons appointed to the paid staff of or serving for pay in the said force, and may from time to time alter or repeal any such regulations and orders, and may call for such returns as may from time to time seem requisite: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for Volunteer Cadet Corps, and in accordance with the provisions of section 81 of the above in part recited Act, doth direct that the same shall apply to all Volunteer Cadet Corps enrolled within Victoria, that is to say:—

In paragraph 25, the amount "£3" is substituted for the amount "£2."

In paragraph 30, after "Adjutant £5," the word "Quartermaster" and the amount "£3" are inserted.

LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM
MADRAS IN BRITISH INDIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And whereas it is enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this proclamation notify that

MADRAS IN BRITISH INDIA

is infected with Oriental Plague, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, 4, and 8 of the classes mentioned in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

14. The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

15. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any extra payment on account of the establishment of any new Post Office, or the removal of any existing Post Office, during the term of his contract, unless such establishment or removal shall increase the distance to be travelled by such contractor on any one day to the extent of one mile.

16. No application for the transfer of a contract will be entertained until a fee has been paid of Ten shillings on a contract not exceeding £50 per annum, and Twenty shillings on a contract above £50 per annum.

17. The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any post office in the colony.

18. The Postmaster-General will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.
