COMMERCIAL RELATIONS OF GERMANY WITH
THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosures, are published for general information.

Sir.

With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 5th July, 1898, forwarding papers respecting the commercial relations of Germany with the British Empire after the expiration of the Treaty of 1865. I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, a translation of a further law on the subject passed in Germany on the 1st ultimo, together with a translation of the Notification based on that law, which has been published in the Imperial Gazette.

### (Translation.)

(No. 2592.) Law regarding Commercial Relations with the British Empire, 1st July, 1899.

We, William, by the Grace of God, German Emperor, King of

Prussia, &c.,

Order as follows, in the name of the Empire, with the consent of the Federal Council and the Imperial Diet, for the time subsequent to the 30th of July, 1899.

The Federal Council is authorized to extend to the subjects and products of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and to persons belonging to British colonies and foreign possessions and the products of British colonies and foreign possessions, until the 30th of July, 1900, such advantages as are granted by the Empire to the subjects and products of the most favoured nation.

On the basis of the law of 1st July, 1899, the Bundesrath have resolved that the decree published in the notification of 11th June, 1899, by which those advantages are granted to the subjects and products of Great Britain and Ireland, as well as to those of the British colonies and foreign possessions, with the exception of Canada, which are accorded by the Empire to the subjects and products of the most favoured nation, shall remain in force beyond 30th July, 1899, until further notice.

WEATHER-FORECAST SIGNALS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following weather-forecast signals will be exhibited on and after the 18th day of October, 1899, from the following light-houses, viz.:—

North Island.—Cape Maria van Diemen and Tiri Tiri Light-bouses

Nouses. South Island.—Cape Campbell, Cape Foulwind, and Farewell Spit Light-houses.

The weather signals consist of two symbols, a black cone and a black drum. The cone is 3 feet high and 3 feet wide at tither end.

These symbols will be used either with or without a red pennant; they will be shown to all vessels passing within signal distance, and between the hours of Eight a.m. and Six p.m., unless the wind at the station is too strong. You are to bear in mind that symbols can be always seen further than flags.

Mariners are cautioned that weather-forecast signals for the day are not to be considered as covering a distance greater than a radius of 200 miles from the place at which they are

hoisted, and those made with the red pennant under as covering only a radius of 50 miles from the place at which they are hoisted.

If the symbols are not displayed, mariners desirous of obtaining information as to probable changes of weather are requested to use the International Code signal for that purpose.

The weather-forecast for the day will be forwarded from Wellington as soon as possible after Ten a.m., except on the following days:—All Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New. Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and the Sovereign's and Prince of Wales' Birthdays. Such messages ought to reach their destination, at latest, about Noon on the day they are issued.

The red pennant hoisted below any weather signal made be-tween the hours of Eight a.m. and Noon will always indicate that such signal belongs to the forecast of the previous day.

Weather signals without the red pennant will always indicate that the forecast belongs to the day upon which they are hoisted

The red pennant, when hoisted alone, will indicate that the forecast for the day has not been received from Wellington.

Whenever the wind at any of the signal-stations has changed in such manner that the forecast for the previous day will not apply, no symbol will be displayed until the forecast for the day has been received at the station.

### EXPLANATION OF SIGNALS.

Moderate Weather.—This will be indicated by the International Code signal.

Cautionary Signals.

Northerly Gales .—The cone hoisted point upwards will denote that strong winds or gales are probable from the northward—that is, from about north east, changing by the north towards

N.B.—This change of wind is usually followed by strong winds or gales from the southward.

. Westerly Galex.—The cone hoisted point downwards will denote that strong winds or gales are probable from the westward—that is, from about west, changing by the south-west towards south.

N.B.—After these gales have moderated the wind generally backs to the north-west or to the north; but should the southerly gale continue for a longer time than usual the wind may be expected to work round as far as south-cast.

Easterly Gales.—The cone hoisted point upwards with the from below will denote that strong winds or gales are probable from the eastward—that is, from about north, changing towards the east and south-east.

N.B.—This change of wind denotes a black north-easter and an approaching cyclone.

Southerly Gales.—The cone hoisted point downward with the drum below will indicate that strong winds or gales are probable from east, changing by the south towards south-west.

Unusual Gales.—The drum only will indicate that strong winds or gales are probable from about south, changing by the east towards north.

Masters of vessels calling at Bluff will in future be able to obtain information at the telegraph-office of the date on which the next barometric depression from the westward is expected.

# REMUNERATION TO GOVERNMENT AUDITORS OF MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTS TO 30th SEPT., 1899.

MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTS TO 30TH SEPT., 1899.

In exercise of the power conferred by the Local Government Act 1891 (55 Vict. No. 1243, section 42), the Governor in Council has, by Order made on the 2nd day of October, 1899, appointed that the remuneration to be paid out of the respective municipal funds to the Auditors appointed by the Governor in Council, for cities, towns, boroughs, and shires, with the exception of the Shires of Mildura, Omeo, and Orbost, for their services in auditing the municipal accounts for the year ended on the 30th September, 1899, shall be at the rate of Four shillings and sixpence (48. 6d.) per hour, and that the remuneration to be paid to the Government Auditors for the Shires of Mildura, Omeo, and Orbost, before mentioned, be Six shillings (6s.) per hour when actually engaged in auditing (exclusive of time taken for meals); and that, in addition to the above fees, there be paid, in cases where travelling expenses are incurred, the actual cost of transit, and also a commuted allowance of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) per day for personal expenses when the auditor is necessarily prevented by the discharge of his duties from returning daily to his place of residence.

### Health Act 1890.

### SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

BT-LAW No. 25.

Br-LAW No. 25.

For keeping free from noxious matter yards, stables, places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, and other places of a like nature; for regulating the management of earth-closets and privies; for regulating the removal and final deposit of night-soil and offensive matter; for the registration of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk; for the inspection of the grazing ground of dairy cattle, and, if found to be likely to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, to prohibit the use of the same; for the inspection of cattle in dairies; for securing the cleanliness of milk stores, milk shops, and milk vessels used for containing milk for sale; for the prescribing of precautions to be taken for protecting milk against infection or contamination; and for securing the healthfulness of the shire and of its inhabitants.

THE Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga, in the Colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, hereby make the following by-law being By-law No. 25 of the said council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Guzette.

### PART I .-- YARDS, ETC.

- 3. This part of this by-law shall have operation in the township of Yarrawonga.
- 4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said township of Yarrawonga shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexi n therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, or refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any timo the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter removed as aforesaid, the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.
- such occupier.

  5. The occupier of any land situate in the said township of Yarrawonga on which there shall be erected any stable, cowhouse, cow-yard, or cattle-shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

  6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any
- at the expense of such occupier.

  6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and overy such building shall be properly and stificiently ventilated, and shall be constructed so as to admit of the pan being placed and fitted beneath the seat in such manner as may effectually prevent the deposit elsewhere than in such pan of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat; and such privy buildings shall be constructed and placed so as to afford proper means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and contents thereof. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-aninch to the foot.

  7. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane
- 7. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.
- 8. No person shall empty any closet, privy, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, and approved of by the said council; and when a nightman is appointed by the said council such nightman only shall be empowered to remove night-soil.

9. All night-soil or other offensive matter shall be removed to and deposited in such places only as may be appointed by the said council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and be trenched into friable earth in a layer not exceeding 6 inches thick, and be covered over with at least 1 foot thickness

inches thick, and be covered over with at least 1 foot thickness of clean earth.

10. The occupier of every house or premises shall provide a properly constructed galvanized iron closet-pan, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and shall keep the same in good and thorough repair.

11. Each occupier as aforesaid shall from time to time provide and keep in use in the closet or closets on his premises a suitable disinfectant or deoderant.

12. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil, each occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga the sum of Ten shillings annually per pan, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for removing night-soil.

13. Such annual charge shall be payable by each occupier in four equal instalments, due and payable on the 1st day of January, April, July, and October in each year, and shall be paid to the person appointed by the council to collect the same.

### PART II .- MILK SUPPLY.

1'ART II.—MILK SUPPLY.

14. Every person who is the owner or occupier of any dairy, farm, or milk store shall on or before the 1st day of January in every year register himself by signing and forwarding to the shire secretary an application in the form hereunder prescribed, and every such person shall with every such application pay the sum of Ten shillings, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.

15. Every person who, after the date of this by-law coming into operation, shall become the owner or occupier of any dairy farm or milk store shall register himself forthwith in the manner provided in the next preceding section.

16. Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee the shire secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the Schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

17. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or clerk of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of then, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing signed by the shire secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at some for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle and other animals in dairies may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspection or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council

19. Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop, and at such distance from the milking place, milk store, or milk shop, as may be directed by the council, and the closet pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily.

20. Where horses are kept on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such distance from the milking place or milk store or milk shop as the council may direct.

21. All houses, dairies, milking places, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a misance or injurious to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings and milking places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman.

22. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 21 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

23. All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily. And no cowkeeper, dairyman, or person employed in milking or dairy work shall use in counseion with milking, or for washing vessels used for holding milk, or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated, or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit, by order sorved as prescribed in clause 18 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well, o

and disinfected.

24. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

25. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

26. No person suffering from any dangerous infectious or con-tagious disease, or dangerous infectious disease, or who has been recently in contact with any person so suffering, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, municipal clerk, or health officer so

27. If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on or occupying or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cowheds, or as a milk shop or milk store, be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or, if he be the person attacked, his wife or other person in charge), shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force; and the council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises, by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

28. Every dairy, milk store, or milk shop shall be inspected once in each quarter of the year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say, condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds and buildings, disposal of manure, closet and stable accommodation, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with regulations.

### PART III .- GENERAL.

29. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion to be paid being not less than Five shillings, and any person committing any such breach as afore-action of the said penalties, and have been council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being by-law No. 25 of the Shire of Yarrawonga, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga on the 16th day of May, 1889, and confirmed by the said council by Special Order this 19th day of June, 1899.



- THE Commissioners of the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the Water Act 1890, do make the following Regulation:—
- No. 1.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS OF THE GUNBOWER WEST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

- GUNDOWER WEST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUES.

  1. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

  2. Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the proceedings and the said minutes of the proceedings at the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required.

  3. Order of business at meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
  - (I.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust. (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering
  - thereon.
    (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
    (IV.) Presentation of reports of committees.

(v.) Payments.

(iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.

(v.) Ordinary business.
(vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
(viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
(iv.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
(x.) Notices of motion.
(xi.) Reading of rough minutes (if required).
And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
4. Addresses to Governor.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.
5. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he received them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.
6. Notice of motion to be given.—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
7. Petitions.—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next

  8. Motions to be moved in order in motion book.—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

  9. Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

  10. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for an address or potition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

  11. Order, &c., of debate.—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

  12. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any commissioner desirated and the context of the same.
- 12. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust
- 13. Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

  14. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

  15. Mover of motion.—A commissioner moving a motion
- 15. Mover of motion.—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken
- upon it.

  16. Designation of commissioners.—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official title, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case
- may require.

  17. Priority of commissioners.—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18. Chairman to rise in addressing Trust.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

19. Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

20. Points of order.—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus:—

"Shall the decision of the chair be maintained?"

21. Commissioners not to digress, &c.—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

22. Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

23. Commissioner called to order to sit down.—A commissioner called to order that it down, unless permitted to explain.

24. Commissioner cannot not order to sit down.—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

24. Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.

25. Strangers.—Any person, not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.

26. Committees of the whole.—Whenever a majority of the

Committees of the whole.—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine, any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves itself into a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.

27. Commissioner not attending order for call.—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the whole Trust without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.

28. Commissioners may demand documents.—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may at any time during business hours require the officers of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may at any time during business hours require the officers of the Trust produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust; but such books or documents shall not be removed from the offices without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.

29. Voting.—The Trust shall vote by show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting and not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it, before the next business has been proceeded with. When a division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in

sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. Motions, &c., to be in writing.—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. Amendments.—(1) No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of. (2) An amendment destroying or altering the intention of a motion shall be in order; but an amendment relating to a different subject shall not be in order. (3) On an amendment or strike out and insert, "the paragraph to be amended should first be read as it stands, then the words proposed to be struck out and inserted, and, finally, the paragraph as it would stand if so amended.

33. Fiffect of rejection of original motion.—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.—

34. If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.—If an amendment be negatived then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

35. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. Adjournment.—(1) No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made. (2) A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except:—1st. When a commissioner is in possession of the floor; 2nd. When the commissioners are voting; 3rd. When adjournment was the last preceding motion; 4th. When it has been decided that the previous question shall be taken. (3) A motion simply to adjourn cannot be amended.

37. Protests.—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall; in overy case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes, if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. Explanations.—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order, or asking of the chairman leave to explain, or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain, or to call the previous question as present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business such d

strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

Al. Privileged questions.—(1) When a question is before the Trust the only motions in order shall be:—Ist. To adjourn; 2nd. The previous question; 3rd. To lay on the table; 4th. To postpone indefinitely; 5th. To postpone to a definite period; 6th. To refer; 7th. To divide, if the sense will permit of it; 8th. To amend; to take precedence as heroin arranged, and the first three to be decided without debate. (2) When the previous question is moved and seconded, it shall be put in this form—

"Shall the main question now be put?" If this is carried all further amendments and debates shall be excluded, and the question be put without delay. If the question has been amended, the question shall be taken on the amendment first. It shall not be in order to re-consider the agreement to take the previous question. (3) When a motion and amendent are under discussion, it will be in order for any member to give notice of another amendment which he intends to move in the event of the amendment being lost. Upon such notice no debate will be allowed at that stage. (4) When a motion is postponed indefinitely, it shall not come up again during that meeting.

41. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution at

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 31st day of the 1st day of September last, and in the Melbourne Argus and Age newspapers or the 5th day of September aforesaid (the same being newspapers circulating in the municipalities of the City of Collingwood and the Shire of Heidelberg respectively), I, the undersigned, The Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, announced my intention of authorizing the municipalities respectively of the City of Collingwood and the Shire of Heidelberg to act on the part of their several municipal districts, under the provisions of Part II. of the Raiway Lands Acquisition Act 1893 with respect to the Melbourne and Collingwood railway line authorized by the Melbourne to Collingwood Railway Construction Act 1893, to be constructed subject to such Part. And whereas one month has expired from the date of, the publication of such recited Order in the Government Gazette. And whereas the giving of the guarantee in the said Order in Council referred to by the municipalities respectively of the City of Collingwood and the Shire of Heidelberg has not been forbidden by the ratepayers of either of such municipalities. Now therefore I, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of Victoria, in accordance with my intention amounced in the hereinbefore recited Order, do hereby authorize the municipalities of the City of Collingwood and of the Shire of Heidelberg respectively to act under the provisions of Part II. of the Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893, with respect to the Melbourne and Collingwood railway line, and sulficient guarantee to the Victorian Railways Commissioner, to assure the payment annually, for a period of twenty years from the date of the opening of the said line of railway for traffic
