COMMERCIAL RELATIONS OF GERMANY WITH THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

SIR,

With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 5th July, 1898, forwarding papers respecting the commercial relations of Germany with the British Empire after the expiration of the Treaty of 1865, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, a translation of a further law on the subject passed in Germany on the 1st ultimo, together with a translation of the Notification based on that law, which has been published in the *Imperial Gazette*.

(No. 2592.) LAW REGARDING COMMERCIAL RELATIONS WITH
THE BRITISH EMPIRE, 1ST JULY, 1899.

We, William, by the Grace of God, German Emperor, King of Prussia, &c.,

Order as follows, in the name of the Empire, with the consent of the Federal Council and the Imperial Diet, for the time subsequent to the 30th of July, 1899.

The Federal Council is authorized to extend to the subjects and products of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and to persons belonging to British colonies and foreign possessions and the products of British colonies and foreign possessions, until the 30th of July, 1900, such advantages as are granted by the Empire to the subjects and products of the most favoured nation.

On the basis of the law of 1st July, 1899, the Bundesrath have resolved that the decree published in the notification of 11th June, 1899, by which those advantages are granted to the subjects and products of Great Britain and Ireland, as well as to those of the British colonies and foreign possessions, with the exception of Canada, which are accorded by the Empire to the subjects and products of the most favoured nation, shall remain in force beyond 30th July, 1899, until further notice.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following weather-forecast signals will be exhibited on and after the 18th day of October, 1899, from the following light-houses, viz. —

North Island.—Cape Maria van Diemen and Tiri Tiri Light-houses.

South Island.—Cape Campbell, Cape Foulwind, and Farewell Spit Light-houses.

The weather signals consist of two symbols, a black cone and a black drum. The cone is 3 feet high and 3 feet wide at the base, and the drum is 3 feet high and 3 feet wide at either end.

These symbols will be used either with or without a red pennant; they will be shown to all vessels passing within signal distance, and between the hours of Eight a.m. and Six p.m., unless the wind at the station is too strong. You are to bear in mind that symbols can be always seen further than flags.

Mariners are cautioned that weather-forecast signals for the day are not to be considered as covering a distance greater than a radius of 200 miles from the place at which they are

hoisted, and those made with the red pennant under as covering only a radius of 50 miles from the place at which they are hoisted.

If the symbols are not displayed, mariners desirous of obtaining information as to probable changes of weather are requested to use the International Code signal for that purpose.

The weather-forecast for the day will be forwarded from Wellington as soon as possible after Ten a.m., except on the following days:—All Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and the Sovereign's and Prince of Wales' Birthdays. Such messages ought to reach their destination, at latest, about Noon on the day they are issued.

The red pennant hoisted below any weather signal made between the hours of Eight a.m. and Noon will always indicate that such signal belongs to the forecast of the previous day.

Weather signals without the red pennant will always indicate that the forecast belongs to the day upon which they are hoisted.

The red pennant, when hoisted alone, will indicate that the forecast for the day has not been received from Wellington.

Whenever the wind at any of the signal-stations has changed in such manner that the forecast for the previous day will not apply, no symbol will be displayed until the forecast for the day has been received at the station.

EXPLANATION OF SIGNALS.

Moderate Weather.—This will be indicated by the International Code signal.

Cautionary Signals.

Northerly Gales.—The cone hoisted point upwards will denote that strong winds or gales are probable from the northward—that is, from about north east, changing by the north towards west.

N.B.—This change of wind is usually followed by strong winds or gales from the southward.

Westerly Gales.—The cone hoisted point downwards will denote that strong winds or gales are probable from the westward—that is, from about west, changing by the south-west towards south.

N.B.—After these gales have moderated the wind generally backs to the north-west or to the north; but should the southerly gale continue for a longer time than usual the wind may be expected to work round as far as south-east.

Easterly Gales.—The cone hoisted point upwards with the drum below will denote that strong winds or gales are probable from the eastward—that is, from about north, changing towards the east and south-east.

N.B.—This change of wind denotes a black north-easter and an approaching cyclone.

Southerly Gales.—The cone hoisted point downward with the drum below will indicate that strong winds or gales are probable from east, changing by the south towards south-west.

Unusual Gales.—The drum only will indicate that strong winds or gales are probable from about south, changing by the east towards north.

Masters of vessels calling at Bluff will in future be able to obtain information at the telegraph-office of the date on which the next barometric depression from the westward is expected.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

BY-LAW No. 25.

For keeping free from noxious matter yards, stables, places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, and other places of a like nature; for regulating the management of earth-closets and privies; for regulating the removal and final deposit of night-soil and offensive matter; for the registration of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk; for the inspection of the grazing ground of dairy cattle, and, if found to be likely to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, to prohibit the use of the same; for the inspection of cattle in dairies; for securing the cleanliness of milk stores, milk shops, and milk vessels used for containing milk for sale; for the prescribing of precautions to be taken for protecting milk against infection or contamination; and for securing the healthfulness of the shire and of its inhabitants.

THE Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga, in the Colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, hereby make the following by-law being By-law No. 25 of the said council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.
2. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

PART I.—YARDS, ETC.

3. This part of this by-law shall have operation in the township of Yarrawonga.
4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said township of Yarrawonga shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, or refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter removed as aforesaid, the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.
5. The occupier of any land situate in the said township of Yarrawonga on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-house, cow-yard, or cattle-shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be properly and sufficiently ventilated, and shall be constructed so as to admit of the pan being placed and fitted beneath the seat in such manner as may effectually prevent the deposit elsewhere than in such pan of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat; and such privy buildings shall be constructed and placed so as to afford proper means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and contents thereof. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

7. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

8. No person shall empty any closet, privy, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, and approved of by the said council; and when a nightman is appointed by the said council such nightman only shall be empowered to remove night-soil.

9. All night-soil or other offensive matter shall be removed to and deposited in such places only as may be appointed by the said council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and be trenced into friable earth in a layer not exceeding 6 inches thick, and be covered over with at least 1 foot thickness of clean earth.

10. The occupier of every house or premises shall provide a properly constructed galvanized iron closet-pan, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and shall keep the same in good and thorough repair.

11. Each occupier as aforesaid shall from time to time provide and keep in use in the closet or closets on his premises a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

12. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil, each occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga the sum of Ten shillings annually per pan, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for removing night-soil.

13. Such annual charge shall be payable by each occupier in four equal instalments, due and payable on the 1st day of January, April, July, and October in each year, and shall be paid to the person appointed by the council to collect the same.

PART II.—MILK SUPPLY.

14. Every person who is the owner or occupier of any dairy, farm, or milk store shall on or before the 1st day of January in every year register himself by signing and forwarding to the shire secretary an application in the form hereunder prescribed, and every such person shall with every such application pay the sum of Ten shillings, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.

15. Every person who, after the date of this by-law coming into operation, shall become the owner or occupier of any dairy farm or milk store shall register himself forthwith in the manner provided in the next preceding section.

16. Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee the shire secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the Schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

17. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or clerk of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing signed by the shire secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle and other animals in dairies may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke; but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

18. The council on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking place, cowshed, milk store, milk shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply, in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order the cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk to make alterations in any such buildings or structures to remedy any such defects within a time specified in such order.

19. Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop, and at such distance from the milking place, milk store, or milk shop, as may be directed by the council, and the closet pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily.

20. Where horses are kept on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such distance from the milking place or milk store or milk shop as the council may direct.

21. All houses, dairies, milking places, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings and milking places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman.

22. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

23. All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily. And no cowkeeper, dairyman, or person employed in milking or dairy work shall use in connexion with milking, or for washing vessels used for holding milk, or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated, or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit, by order served as prescribed in clause 18 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well, or tank, or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

24. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

25. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

26. No person suffering from any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, or dangerous infectious disease, or who has been recently in contact with any person so suffering, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, municipal clerk, or health officer so to do.

27. If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on or occupying or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cowsheds, or as a milk shop or milk store, be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or, if he be the person attacked, his wife or other person in charge), shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force; and the council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises, by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

28. Every dairy, milk store, or milk shop shall be inspected once in each quarter of the year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say, condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds and buildings, disposal of manure, closet and stable accommodation, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with regulations.

PART III.—GENERAL.

29. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion to be paid being not less than Five shillings, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being by-law No. 25 of the Shire of Yarrowonga, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga on the 16th day of May, 1899, and confirmed by the said council by Special Order this 19th day of June, 1899.

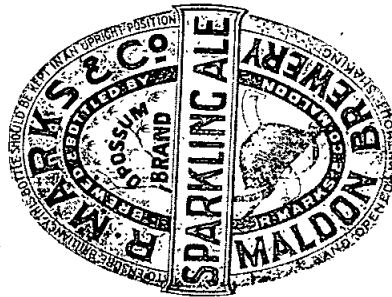

GUNBOWER WEST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 1.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS OF THE GUNBOWER WEST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

1. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required.

3. Order of business at meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.
- (xi.) Reading of rough minutes (if required).

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Addresses to Governor.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

5. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he receive them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6. Notice of motion to be given.—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. Petitions.—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

8. Motions to be moved in order in motion book.—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

9. Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

11. Order, &c., of debate.—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

12. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

13. Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

14. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

15. Mover of motion.—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. Designation of commissioners.—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official title, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

17. Priority of commissioners.—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18. Chairman to rise in addressing Trust.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

19. Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

20. Points of order.—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus:—“Shall the decision of the chair be maintained?”

21. Commissioners not to digress, &c.—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

22. Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

23. Commissioner called to order to sit down.—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

24. Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.

25. Strangers.—Any person, not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.

26. Committees of the whole.—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves itself into a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.

27. Commissioner not attending order for call.—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the whole Trust without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.

28. Commissioners may demand documents.—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may at any time during business hours require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust; but such books or documents shall not be removed from the offices without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.

29. Voting.—The Trust shall vote by show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting and not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it, before the next business has been proceeded with. When a division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in his minute book how each vote, whether affirmatively or negatively, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

30. Question, how declared.—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. Motions, &c., to be in writing.—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. Amendments.—(1) No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of. (2) An amendment destroying or altering the intention of a motion shall be in order; but an amendment relating to a different subject shall not be in order. (3) On an amendment to “strike out and insert,” the paragraph to be amended should first be read as it stands, then the words proposed to be struck out and inserted, and, finally, the paragraph as it would stand if so amended.

33. Effect of rejection of original motion.—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.—If an amendment be negatived then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

35. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. Adjournment.—(1) No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made. (2) A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except:—1st. When a commissioner is in possession of the floor; 2nd. When the commissioners are voting; 3rd. When adjournment was the last preceding motion; 4th. When it has been decided that the previous question shall be taken. (3) A motion simply to adjourn cannot be amended.

37. Protests.—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes, if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. Explanations.—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order, or asking of the chairman leave to explain, or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain shall only have the right to explain an actual misunderstanding of language, and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

40. Privileged questions.—(1) When a question is before the Trust the only motions in order shall be:—1st. To adjourn; 2nd. The previous question; 3rd. To lay on the table; 4th. To postpone indefinitely; 5th. To postpone to a definite period; 6th. To refer; 7th. To divide, if the sensus will permit of it; 8th. To amend; to take precedence as herein arranged, and the first three to be decided without debate. (2) When the previous question is moved and seconded, it shall be put in this form:—“Shall the main question now be put?” If this is carried all further amendments and debates shall be excluded, and the question be put without delay. If the question has been amended, the question shall be taken on the amendment first. It shall not be in order to re-consider the agreement to take the previous question. (3) When a motion and amendment are under discussion, it will be in order for any member to give notice of another amendment which he intends to move in the event of the amendment being lost. Upon such notice no debate will be allowed at that stage. (4) When a motion is postponed indefinitely, it shall not come up again during that meeting.

41. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such resolution or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, or unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

42. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

43. Notices of meetings.—All notices of any meeting or adjourned meeting of the Trust shall be in writing, and shall be delivered or sent by post or otherwise to the place of abode or place of business of each of the commissioners two clear days at least previous to such meeting; and every such notice shall specify the time of meeting; and in case of a special meeting shall specify the object thereof; and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

44. Power to suspend officers.—The Trust may, at any ordinary or special meeting, resolve that a special meeting be called to consider the removal from his office of any officer appointed by the Trust, and may direct that notice of such special meeting be given, and thereupon may suspend such officer from his office pending the holding of such meeting, and may appoint some other person to perform the duties of such office in the meanwhile.

45. Committees of Trust, and quorum.—The Trust may from time to time, as they may see fit, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee; and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman, and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex officio* member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present.

46. Meetings, chairman, &c., of committee.—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and may adjourn from place to place as they may think proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust—and, if no quorum be fixed, three members—be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the commissioners present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the

commissioners present, and, in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

47. Seal.—The seal of the Trust shall be in the custody of the secretary, and shall not be impressed except by direction of the Trust, and in the presence of at least three commissioners.

48. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

49. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust, and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committee.

50. Meetings of committee.—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

51. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

52. Petitions to be respectful.—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

53. Commissioners to affix their names.—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

54. Petition to be in writing.—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof; and the petition shall be prepared in a way similar to that adopted with regard to petitions presented to Parliament.

55. To be signed by the petitioners.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

56. No letters, &c., to be attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

57. No letters or memorials to be dealt with.—No letters or memorials shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust, or the office of the chairman, not later than the day preceding the day of meeting.

58. Deputations to signify intention.—Deputations can only be received by the Trust when they have signified their intention of waiting upon the Trust, and stated their object at least one day beforehand.

59. Letters or memorials returned for amendments.—When letters or memorials do not accurately indicate the localities by giving the number of the allotment, and section, and name of the parish, or other technical description, it shall be in order to return the documents for amendment.

60. Commissioners confined to statements of certain facts.—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

61. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the irrigation district, and such other newspapers, if any, as the Trust may determine, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

62. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same by advertisement, inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement, except when the Trust by special resolution, which may be moved without notice, orders otherwise.

63. No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Trust or for any work to be done for the Trust.

64. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

65. Suspension of rules.—Any one or more of the rules and regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

66. Penalty.—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation, he or she shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered one, was made by the Commissioners of the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the provisions of Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, this 19th day of September, 1899.

Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893.

MELBOURNE TO COLLINGWOOD RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION ACT 1898.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 31st day of August, 1899, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of September last, and in the *Melbourne Argus* and *Age* newspapers on the 5th day of September aforesaid (the same being newspapers circulating in the municipalities of the City of Collingwood and the Shire of Heidelberg respectively), I, the undersigned, The Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, announced my intention of authorizing the municipalities respectively of the City of Collingwood and the Shire of Heidelberg to act on the part of their several municipal districts, under the provisions of Part II. of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* with respect to the Melbourne and Collingwood railway line authorized by the *Melbourne to Collingwood Railway Construction Act 1898*, to be constructed subject to such Part. And whereas one month has expired from the date of the publication of such recited Order in the *Government Gazette*. And whereas the giving of the guarantee in the said Order in Council referred to by the municipalities respectively of the City of Collingwood and the Shire of Heidelberg has not been forbidden by the ratepayers of either of such municipalities. Now therefore I, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of Victoria, in accordance with my intention announced in the hereinbefore recited Order, do hereby authorize the municipalities of the City of Collingwood and of the Shire of Heidelberg respectively to act under the provisions of Part II. of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, with respect to the Melbourne and Collingwood railway line, and subject to the said Act to give a full and sufficient guarantee to the Victorian Railways Commissioner, to assure the payment annually, for a period of twenty years from the date of the opening of the said line of railway for traffic, and within six months after demand of any sum which may be required and demanded by the Commissioner to make up interest in full, calculated at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum upon the money expended or to be expended in purchasing the land required for such line of railway, or expended or to be expended in compensating persons interested in land used in connexion with or likely to be injured in or prejudicially affected by the construction of such line. And further to do all things necessary to fulfil and carry out such guarantee.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the *Width of Tires Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1431) it is enacted that at the request of the council of any municipal district, including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall apply to and be of full force and effect in such district from and after a date to be specified in such Proclamation, not being within six months from the date of such Proclamation; and that, except in pursuance of a Proclamation under the said section, the said Act shall not have any force or effect in any municipal district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts of the Shire of Eltham and the Shire of Kara Kara have requested that the provisions of the said Act may be declared to apply to and be of full force and effect in such districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that the provisions of the *Width of Tires Act 1896* aforesaid shall apply to and be of full force and effect in the municipal district of

from and after the 1st day of April, 1900, and in the municipal district of

THE SHIRE OF KARA KARA

from and after the 1st day of March, 1900.

WHEREAS by the *Police Offences Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1126) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Act to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and that upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation extend the provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1890* aforesaid to the whole of the Shire of Morwell.

Land Act 1898.

SWAMP LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE OR PERPETUAL LEASE.

KOO-WEE-RUP SWAMP.

THE allotments mentioned in the schedule hereunder will be available for application on or before Friday, 27th October, 1899.

Applications, accompanied by the registration fee of £1, must be made on usual form, and lodged at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

All applications so lodged on or before the above-mentioned date will be deemed to have been simultaneously made.
