By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Allendale, Creswick, and Smeaton;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bacchus Marsh;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Heathcote;

FRIDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Creswick and Smeaton.

# VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1899.

THE births of 66 boys and 62 girls, or in all of 128 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of September. Of these, 46 occurred in Ballarat East, 71 in Ballarat West, 9 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 14 illegitimate births and 5 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 155, viz., 76 of boys and 79 of viris.

The deaths registered in September numbered 67, viz., 37 of males and 30 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 61. In August, the recorded deaths numbered 65; in September, 1895, they numbered 60; in September, 1895, they numbered 67; in September, 1896, they numbered 57; in September, 1896, they numbered 57; in September, 1894, they numbered 77; in September, 1895, they numbered 69; in September, 1892, they numbered 48; in September, 1891, they numbered 63; in September, 1890, they numbered 63.

#### SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

TT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date earlier than the 2nd December, 1898, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the 1st November and for the Legislative Council on the 1st December next.

Notwithstanding that Assembly rights bear on their faces a notice that they hold good until the 1st December, 1899, they must, under a recent alteration in the law, be renewed before or on the 1st Navember.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post-offices, and Police Stations.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.






