## BANK HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

TUESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Wycheproof;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, at Dunolly, and from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon at Torang;

TUESDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kaniva;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Allendale, Creswick, and Smeaton;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bacchus Marsh;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Heathcote;

FRIDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Creswick and Smeaton.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1899.

THE births of 66 boys and 62 girls, or in all of 128 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of September. Of these, 46 occurred in Ballarat East, 71 in Ballarat West, 9 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 14 illegitimate births and 5 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 155, viz., 76 of boys and 79 of girls.

The deaths registered in September numbered 67, viz., 37 of males and 30 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 61. In August, the recorded deaths numbered 66; in September, 1898, they numbered 60; in September, 1897, they numbered 57; in September, 1896, they numbered 52; in September, 1895, they numbered 57; in September, 1894, they numbered 77; in September, 1893, they numbered 69; in September, 1892, they numbered 48; in September, 1891, they numbered 63; in September, 1890, they numbered 64; and in September, 1889, they numbered 63.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 55 per cent.; females, 45 per cent.; under five years, 21 per cent.; over five years, 79 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 64 and 36 per cent.; under and over five years, 30 and 70 per cent. respectively.

# TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

## SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date earlier than the 2nd December, 1898, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the 1st November and for the Legislative Council on the 1st December next.

Notwithstanding that Assembly rights bear on their faces a notice that they hold good until the 1st December, 1899, they must, under a recent alteration in the law, be renewed before or on the 1st November.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1900.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post-offices, and Police Stations.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.
