INTERNATIONAL COPYRIGHT CONVENTION.— WITHDRAWAL OF THE PRINCIPALITY OF MONTENEGRO FROM THE CONVENTION.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosure, are published for general information.

SIR,

With reference to my Circular Despatch of 31st May last, informing you that the Principality of Montenegro had given notice of withdrawal from the International Copyright Convention of the 9th September, 1886, as from the 1st April, 1900, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the colony under your Government, copies of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 8th August, 1899, revoking as from 1st April, 1900, the Order in Council of 16th May, 1893, which extended to the Principality of Montenegro the provisions of the Order in Council of the 28th November, 1887, giving effect to the terms of the Berne Convention and providing that the latter Order and the Order in Council of the 7th March, 1898, giving effect to the Additional Act of Paris modifying that convention, shall cease to apply to that Principality from the same date.

WHEREAS on the 9th day of September, 1886, a Convention (hereinafter called the Berne Convention) with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works was concluded between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and certain foreign countries therein named, and on the 5th day of September, 1887, the ratifications of the said Convention were duly exchanged between Her Majesty and the said countries:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 28th day of November, 1887, and made under the authority committed to Her Majesty by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, Her Majesty was pleased to make provision for giving rights of copyright throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the authors of literary and artistic works first produced in any of the said foreign countries, and otherwise giving effect throughout Her

Majesty's dominions to the terms of the said Berne Convention, and an English translation of the said Convention was set out in the First Schedule to the Order in Council now in recital:

And whereas since the date of the said Order in Council hereinbefore recited, the Principality of Montenegro acceded to the said Berne Convention, and by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of May, 1893, the provisions of the said Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, were extended to the said Principality:

And whereas an Additional Act to the said Berne Convention was agreed upon between Her Majesty and certain foreign countries (including Montenegro) for the purposes of varying the provisions of the said Berne Convention, and the ratifications of the said Additional Act were on the 9th day of September, 1897, exchanged between Her Majesty and the said foreign countries parties thereto:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 7th day of March, 1898, and made under the authority aforesaid, Her Majesty was pleased to make provision for varying the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, and otherwise giving effect to the said Additional Act throughout Her Majesty's dominions so far as regards the foreign countries parties thereto (including Montenegro), and an English translation of the said Additional Act is set forth in the Schedule to the Order in Council now in recital:

And whereas by the said Berne Convention and the said Additional Act it is provided that the said Convention shall remain in effect until the termination of a year from the day on which it may have been denounced, and that such denunciation shall be made to the Government of the Swiss Confederation, and shall only be effective as regards the country making it, the said Convention remaining in full force and effect for the other countries parties thereto:

And whereas Her Majesty's Government have been informed that the Government of Montenegro did, on the 1st day of April, 1899, denounce the said Berne Convention to the Government of the Swiss Confederation in accordance with the terms of the said Convention and Additional Act:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, doth order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 16th day of May, 1893, is hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order, and the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Orders in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, and the 7th day of March, 1898, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to apply to the Principality of Montenegro.
2. Nothing contained in this Order shall prejudicially affect any right acquired or accrued before the commencement of this Order by virtue of the said Orders in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, the 16th day of May, 1893, and the 7th day of March, 1898, or otherwise, and any person entitled to such right shall continue entitled thereto, and to the remedies for the same in like manner as if this Order had not been made.
3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1900, which date is hereinbefore referred to as the commencement of this Order.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

With reference to Lord Knutsford's Circular Despatch of the 29th February, 1888, enclosing copies of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated 28th November, 1887, for giving effect to the International Copyright Convention of the 9th September, 1886, and to my Circular Despatch of the 15th March, 1898, enclosing copies of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 7th March, 1898, for giving effect to the Additional Act of Paris modifying that Convention, and also to my Circular Despatch of the 10th June, 1898, enclosing an Order of Her Majesty in Council of the 19th May, 1898,

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 28th day of November, 1887, and made under the authority committed to Her Majesty by the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1888, Her Majesty was pleased to make provision for giving rights of copyright throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the authors of literary and artistic works first produced in any of the said foreign countries (therein referred to as the foreign countries of the Copyright Union), and otherwise giving effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the terms of the said Berne Convention, and an English translation of the said Convention was set out in the First Schedule to the Order in Council now in recital:

And whereas since the date of the said Order in Council hereinbefore recited, the foreign countries following, namely, Luxembourg, Monaco, Montenegro, and Norway, have acceded to the said Berne Convention, and by Orders in Council, dated respectively the 10th day of August, 1888, the 15th day of October, 1889, the 16th day of May, 1893, and the 1st day of August, 1896, and made under the authority aforesaid, the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, have been extended to the last-mentioned foreign countries respectively, and the last-mentioned foreign countries, together with the foreign countries comprised in the said Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1877, now constitute the foreign countries of the Copyright Union within the meaning of the said Order in Council:

And whereas an Additional Act to the said Berne Convention was agreed upon between Her Majesty and the following foreign countries for the purpose of varying the provisions of the said Berne Convention, namely:—Germany, Italy, Switzerland, Belgium, Luxembourg, and Spain, Monaco, Tunis, France, Montenegro, and the ratifications of the said Additional Act were, on the 9th day of September, 1897, exchanged between Her Majesty and the said foreign countries:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 7th day of March, 1898, and made under the authority aforesaid, Her Majesty was pleased to make provision for varying the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, and otherwise giving effect to the said Additional Act throughout Her Majesty's dominions so far as regards the foreign countries hereinbefore named as parties to the said Additional Act, and an English translation of the said Additional Act is set forth in the Schedule to the Order in Council now in recital:

And whereas the Republic of Hayti having duly acceded to the said Additional Act, the said Order in Council of the 7th day of March, 1898, was, by Order in Council of the 19th day of May, 1898, extended to the said republic:

And whereas it has been intimated to Her Majesty's Government that the Government of the Empire of Japan have notified the accession of that country to the said Berne Convention and Additional Act, to take effect from the 15th day of July, 1899:

And whereas Her Majesty in Council is satisfied that the said Empire of Japan has made such provisions as it appears to Her Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors of works first produced in Her Majesty's dominions:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. From and after the commencement of this Order, the hereinbefore recited Orders in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, and the 7th day of March, 1898, shall extend to the said Empire of Japan.
2. This Order shall come into operation on the 15th day of July, 1899, which date is hereinbefore referred to as the commencement of this Order.
3. And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

BEACON ERECTED, ENTRANCE TO THAMES RIVER.

THE Thames Harbor Board have notified that a beacon has been erected at low-water mark, ordinary spring tides, inside the mouth of the Thames River, on the eastern or Thames side of the channel, and abreast of the first red buoy inside Opani Point. The beacon, which is in place of the black buoy formerly in about the same position, is diamond-shaped, and measures 7 feet from angle to angle, surmounted by an iron wicker ball 18 inches in diameter. The beacon stands 10 feet above high-water mark, ordinary spring tides, and is facing N.W. and S.E. It is painted all white on the seaward or N.W. face, so as to show against the dark background, and the inside or S.E. face is white with a black disc in centre 3 feet in diameter. This beacon is not a leading-mark inwards, but it can be used as such if care is taken to keep it about one point open on the port bow after passing the Spit black buoy. When approaching the beacon the channel is fair in the centre between the beacon on port hand and the red buoy on starboard. Bearings are unnecessary, as the buoy and beacon are so close that it is impossible to miss them.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date earlier than the 2nd December, 1898, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the 1st November and for the Legislative Council on the 1st December next.

Notwithstanding that Assembly rights bear on their faces a notice that they hold good until the 1st December, 1899, they must, under a recent alteration in the law, be renewed before or on the 1st November.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for an election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1900.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post-offices, and Police Stations.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

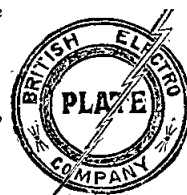

TWELVE MILE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.

THE Commissioners of the Twelve Mile Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. The form of measurement shall be determined by the Trust.

2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be:—For all kinds of crops, Eightpence per inch per acre; for grass lands, Threepence per inch per acre; for gardens, Twelve shillings and sixpence per acre per annum for the first acre or fractional part of an acre, and Five shillings per acre for each additional acre or fractional part of an acre; for filling tanks, Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each tank. The minimum quantity of water to be supplied at each watering shall be two inches per acre.

3. Payment for water delivered from the works of the Trust must be made in all cases on delivery of such water, except for the right to water a garden or fill a tank, at per annum, as stated in clause No. 2, payment for which must be made at the time application is made for the right.

4. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct, and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays, as well as on ordinary working days.

5. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding, for any offence, the sum of Ten pounds.

6. That the Regulation providing for the sale of water made by the Trust on the 21st day of May, 1898, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 19th December, 1898, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

For Travelling.

1. To every witness or interpreter (not being a member of the Police Force) the sum actually paid, but not exceeding One shilling for every mile he may reside from the court at which he may be required to attend.
2. To every witness or interpreter who may travel by ship, coach, railway, or train, the sum actually and properly paid for fares both in going to and returning from the court at which he may be required to attend.
3. No allowance under clause 1 will be made to any witness or interpreter residing within one mile of the court which he may be required to attend.
4. In all cases where practicable witnesses or interpreters must travel by ship, coach, railway, or tram, and in such part of the vessel, vehicle, or train as may be suitable to their station in life.

9. The abstract of payments to witnesses and interpreters must be certified by the magistrate sitting as Judge of the Revision Court or as Chairman of the Court of Petty Sessions.

10. "Accountant" shall mean and include a member or associate of any recognised society or association of accountants or actuaries in Great Britain or Ireland, a member of the "Incorporated Institute of Accountants, Victoria," of the "Australian Institute of Incorporated Accountants," a public accountant or actuary actually practising as such, or a Government auditor of municipal accounts.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased : And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto : Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 6, 7, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

Every conditional purchase lease will be dated the 1st day of January, 1900, and may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof.

7. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister; and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

9. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

10. Thering-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

11. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

12. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

Special Conditions.

1. The period of occupation will be for eight months—from 1st November, 1899, to 30th June, 1900.

2. The fee for the period from 1st November, 1899, to 30th June, 1900—for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.

SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

A By-law of the Shire of Bellarine made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, as amended by section 46 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 21, for fixing the hours during which and the conditions on which certain Traction and Locomotive Engines and Rollers impelled by steam or electricity may proceed over any road within the shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1891*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bellarine order as follows:—

1. A traction or locomotive engine within the meaning of this by-law shall be limited to engines used for agricultural purposes, or in connexion with agricultural implements and machinery.

2. Every engine proceeding on any street, road, or highway shall have the name and address of the owner in legible letters, not less than one inch and a half in length, either painted thereon or on a plate attached thereto in a conspicuous place so that it may be readily seen and read.

3. Every person for the time being having the possession or charge or use of any engine shall for all the purposes of this by-law be deemed to be the owner.

4. Every engine proceeding on any street, road, or highway between the time of sunset on any day and the time of sunrise on the following day shall be preceded by a man at least 100 yards in advance, who shall give all persons whom he may overtake or meet notice that such engine is proceeding along the road.

5. The stuffing on every engine must be well and properly packed, and there shall be no boxes or leaky safety-valves, and steam shall not be allowed to escape or be blown off while proceeding on any street, road, or highway, and if any such escape shall happen from unavoidable accident the engine shall forthwith be stopped and not allowed to proceed further until such accident shall have been efficiently repaired.

6. No engine shall proceed on any street, road, or highway unless in charge of two men at the least, one of whom shall drive the engine and be held to be the person in charge thereof, and the other shall steer the engine and render any help or assistance that may be necessary to any vehicles or persons that may be on the road.

7. The person in charge of any engine shall whenever called upon to do so by any person in charge of any vehicle on the road, and also whenever any horse or horses are becoming restive or frightened, stop the engine after, if practicable, removing the same to one side of the road, unless when crossing a bridge or when ascending a hill the engine if stopped could not easily be started again, or when on any occasion the front wheels of an engine are so much lower than the hind ones that stopping the engine would endanger the boiler. In all the above exceptions the man steering the engine shall render all necessary assistance to any such vehicles or horses.

8. If any engine while proceeding on any street, road, or highway shall break the decking or in any other way damage or injure any bridge or culvert, the man in charge of such engine shall forthwith, and before proceeding further on any street, road, or highway, place a sufficient and conspicuous guard or protection over the part of the said bridge or culvert so broken or damaged, so that persons proceeding along the said road may have notice and warning of such damage. And further, that such man so in charge shall, within twenty-four hours, send or give notice to the engineer of the shire that such breakage or damage has happened, and define accurately the situation of such bridge or culvert, and the time when such breakage or damage occurred.

9. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Lillydale, made under Sections 207, 484, and 510 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 15, for regulating and fixing the tolls and dues to be levied in the Shire Market at Lillydale and for the better regulation and government of the said market, also for repealing By-law No. 9 and Regulation No. 11. of the Shire of Lillydale.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, Sections 207, 484, and 510, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale by this By-law order as follows, that is to say:—

I. That By-law No. 9, published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th October, 1889, page 3497, and Regulation No. 11., published in the *Government Gazette* of 3rd August, 1894, page 3277, are hereby repealed.

II. That the tolls and dues to be levied and paid in the Shire Market at Lillydale after the publication of this By-law in the *Government Gazette* shall be as follows:—

IV. Rules for the better regulation and government of the market:—

That the market shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday in each week, from Ten o'clock in the forenoon to Seven o'clock p.m. of the same day. Should any of the days hereby fixed for the sale of stock or produce fall on Christmas Day or New Year's Day, the market shall be open for the sale of stock and produce on the day preceding.

V. There shall be appointed by the Council, if necessary, an Inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

1st. To see that the market regulations are duly observed.

2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the market.

3rd. To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as are deemed unfit for use to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

VI. All tolls and dues chargeable under the said schedule, except those chargeable in respect of live stock, shall be payable and collected on the entrance of the articles into the market, or prior to their being sold and leaving the market, in the discretion of the Inspector.

VII. Tolls and dues chargeable in respect of live stock sold by auction shall be paid to the Inspector by the persons selling at the close of the day's sale; but those chargeable on any live stock sold otherwise than by auction must be paid to the Inspector prior to said stock leaving the market.

VIII. Any person who shall place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the said market, and shall refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the Inspector to do so, or who shall place any cart, carriage, or wheelbarrow in any part of said market, contrary to the direction of the Inspector thereof, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

IX. No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, peg, or other instrument into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall without the consent of the Inspector in writing.

X. Any person resisting or obstructing or interfering with the Inspector in the discharge of his duty shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

XI. No person shall offer for public or private sale in any part of the said market any produce, goods, horses, or cattle before the hour of opening or after the hour of closing said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the Council as a day which the market will be open, without the sanction of the Council in writing. All produce or implements of every description must be removed out of the market yards before Twelve o'clock noon on the day following that upon which they are sold or offered for sale,

otherwise a charge of (5s.) Five shillings per week will be made for a space not exceeding 200 superficial feet. All horses or cattle must be removed out of the market before Twelve o'clock noon on the day following the day of sale.

XII. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach or default of this By-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
