It having been reported that an uncharted rock existed between Hawes Rock, in Queen Charlotte Sound, and the nearest point on Arapawa Island in an easterly direction, Captain Bollons, of the Government steam-ship *Hinemoa*, states that he searched for the rock without success, but found that between Hawes Rock and the south end of Blumine Island there are several patches of rock with one, two, and three fathoms of water on them; one patch, one third of the distance from the point to the buoy, has not more than 4 feet at low water, spring tides. The channel between Hawes Rock buoy and the south end of Blumine Island should therefore be avoided.

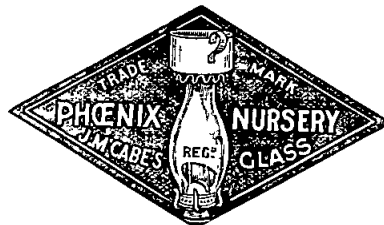

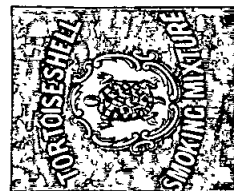

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1899.

BY VIRTUE OF THE WATER ACT 1890.

REGULATION for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1899, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Eighteen pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Eighteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of ninespence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Boort Waterworks Trust on the first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and the seal was affixed hereto in the presence of—

KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION NO. 24.

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the year 1900 of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1900, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and

the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1900, and the second instalment upon the 1st day of July in the same year. Such person as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and recover the said rate.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steamship or vessel *Afric* arrived in Victorian waters having had on board in the course of her voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williams-town, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steamship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steamship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steamship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steamship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steamship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

INTRODUCTION OF SHEEP, CATTLE, ETC., INTO VICTORIA FROM AFRICA PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS by section 267, *Health Act 1890*, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas it is also enacted that all orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act; and that all persons offending against any order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such order direct; and that such sum shall go to and form part of the Consolidated Revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, prohibit the introduction of sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or of hay, straw, or fodder into Victoria from Africa, and the restriction, so far as live stock is concerned, on vessels calling at the ports of South Africa, viz., Table Bay and Port Natal, from English or foreign ports is hereby removed.

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Health Act 1890 and Stock Diseases Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF SHEEP INTO VICTORIA FROM NEW SOUTH WALES, IN WHICH COLONY THE DISEASE OF ANTHRAX IS KNOWN TO EXIST, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH DISEASE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth
day of October, 1899.

WHEREAS the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers conferred upon him by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* and section 4 of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, and of all other powers him enabling in that behalf, has deemed it necessary to regulate the introduction by land into Victoria of sheep from the colony of New South Wales, the same being a colony in which the disease of anthrax is known to exist, and has deemed it necessary to make the order and regulations following for the purpose of coping with the said disease: Now therefore be it ordained as follows (that is to say):—

1. No sheep shall be introduced into Victoria by land from the colony of New South Wales unless and until the owner or person having the charge of the same shall make and shall have lodged with the Victorian Inspector of Stock at the place where it is proposed to introduce such sheep a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of that contained in the schedule hereto that such sheep are free from anthrax and from all other infectious or contagious disease, and that they have not within the three months next preceding the date of such declaration been in direct or indirect contact with stock infected with any such disease, and as regards the disease known as anthrax either that none of such sheep have during any part of such period been in country or travelling on routes where anthrax was present, or that such of them as have been in such country or over such routes within such time have been successfully vaccinated and rendered immune from anthrax, in which latter case full particulars of the time, place, and person, when, where, and by whom the operation was performed shall be set out in such declaration, with a certificate thereof from an Inspector of Stock of New South Wales that he has examined the sheep referred to in the declaration, and has no reason to doubt its correctness in any particular. Provided further that no sheep which within the period of three months preceding the application for permission to introduce the same into Victoria have been in country or travelling on routes affected or suspected to be affected with anthrax shall be so introduced unless the declaration be accompanied by a certificate of a competent vaccinator that they have been successfully vaccinated for and rendered immune from anthrax.

2. Upon any stock of any kind in Victoria exhibiting symptoms of anthrax, or symptoms such as might reasonably suggest that such stock was so affected, the owner of such stock, or the occupier of the land upon which the same then is shall forthwith carry out and observe the following directions:—

- (a) Give notice, with all practicable speed, to the nearest inspector of stock or police constable of the fact that such stock are diseased, or that such symptoms have appeared, as the case may be, stating where such stock then are.
- (b) Forthwith isolate any diseased or suspected animals from other animals showing no symptoms of disease.
- (c) Forthwith plug, so as to prevent the oozing of blood therefrom, the nostrils and other natural openings of the carcasses of any animals diseased or suspected so to have died, and the carcasses of any animals that may have died under suspicious circumstances with tow, wool, hay, or other suitable material in any case saturated with a strong solution of carbolic acid or other effective disinfectant.

3. No stock, whether diseased, or suspected so to be, or not departing or being on land upon which any stock suffering from anthrax, or suspected so to be, have been, or on land worked in conjunction therewith, shall be removed or permitted to escape therefrom; and no stock from outside shall be permitted to come upon any such land, in either case, until such land has been declared clean by an inspector of stock, without the written authority of an inspector of stock first had and obtained.

4. No occupier of land upon which any stock suffering, or suspected to be suffering, from anthrax are, or have been, shall, until such land has been declared clean by an inspector of stock, remove, or permit to be removed therefrom, without the written authority of an inspector of stock first had and obtained, the carcass of any diseased or suspected animal, or any dung from any animal affected with anthrax, or suspected so to be, or any dung, litter, fodder, or other material with which any such animal or its carcass may have come in contact, or being in or about any place in which any such animal has been kept.

5. When any animal has died, or is suspected to have died, suffering from anthrax, no person, not being an inspector of stock, shall cut or otherwise interfere with the skin of such animal so as to permit of the escape of fluids, except for the purpose of microscopical examination or other test, and then only with the authority of an inspector of stock, who shall forthwith report the circumstances to the chief inspector of stock.

6. Every occupier of land upon which any animal affected, or suspected of being affected, with anthrax is or has been shall forthwith, after any symptoms of anthrax have appeared, and from time to time, if considered necessary by an inspector of stock, until all risk of the disease spreading is at an end, and to the satisfaction of an inspector of stock, thoroughly disinfect, or cause to be disinfected, all places, buildings, fixtures, fittings, dung, litter, fodder, and other material used for or being about any diseased animal, or animal suspected of so being, or with which any such animal may have come in contact, with freshly burnt lime or other approved disinfectant. Provided that in the event of its being made to appear to an inspector of stock that any place or thing is incapable of being disinfected, or that it would be unreasonable to insist on the requirements of this regulation being observed in any particular instance, he may sanction the place or thing being treated in such other manner, for the purpose of preventing contagion or infection, as he may think reasonably sufficient under the circumstances.

7. No inspector of stock shall declare any land or place to be clean until a reasonable time has expired from the last appearance of any symptoms of anthrax in any animal, nor until the occupier thereof has complied with the requirements of these regulations as to disinfecting or treating such land or place to prevent contagion or infection as hereinbefore provided.

8. No inspector of stock shall permit the removal from off any land or place of the carcass of any animal which has, or is suspected to have, died infected with anthrax, or of any dung, litter, fodder, or other material that has been in contact with or used about any animal having or suspected to have had anthrax, until the same has been thoroughly disinfected with fresh burnt lime or other sufficient disinfectant.

9. No inspector of stock shall, except for the purpose of immediate slaughter, permit to be removed from off any land or from off any land worked in connexion with any land upon which any case or suspected case of anthrax has occurred, any stock that has not been vaccinated and rendered immune from anthrax, and in respect to which a certificate of such vaccination by a competent vaccinator has not been lodged with him, unless the occupier of such land or the owner of such stock has kept the same for a period of not less than seven days immediately preceding the date of their removal in some part of the land isolated from any place where any diseased animal or animal suspected so to be is or has been kept, or over which any such animal has or may have passed.

10. Such of the regulations for the time being in force under the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* as are not inconsistent herewith shall be read and construed as incorporated in these regulations.

(a) The words in italics may be omitted in the case of sheep being vaccinated, and in which case the owner to state place, date, and by whom the vaccination was performed, and that the certificate produced is the certificate of the person performing the operation.

All pawnbrokers' shops within the municipal districts of Collingwood and Fitzroy shall be closed on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that, if requested thereunto by petition signed by not less than twenty-five ratepayers resident in any portion not exceeding three square miles in extent of any shire and distant more than ten miles from the boundaries of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council, with the consent of the municipal council, may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim such portion a township by any name and with any boundaries, whether those respectively indicated by the petition or not, mentioned in such Order, and may from time to time in like manner and at the like request alter the name and boundaries thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and acting on a petition signed by not less than twenty-five ratepayers resident within a certain portion (as described in the said petition) of the Shire of Bairnsdale, do hereby, with the consent of the municipal council of the said shire, proclaim as a township, under the name and title of the Township of Lindenow, the portion of the Shire of Bairnsdale comprised within the boundaries herein set forth and described, viz.:—

TOWNSHIP OF LINDENOW.—Commencing at a point on the bank of the River Mitchell bearing N. 0° 40' W. one hundred and fifty links from the north-east corner of allotment 20B in the parish of Coongulmerang, county of Tanjil; thence by a line bearing S. 0° 40' E. one hundred and fifty links to the north-east corner of allotment 20B aforesaid; thence by the east boundary of allotment 20B S. 0° 40' E. fifty-seven chains thirty links to the south-east corner of allotment 20B; thence by a line bearing S. 0° 40' E. two hundred links to the north-east corner of allotment 21A, parish of Coongulmerang; thence along the east boundary of allotment 21A bearing S. 0° 40' E. twenty chains; thence by a line bearing W. 0° 40' S. a distance of one hundred and eighty-two chains to the south east corner of allotment 48B, parish of Coongulmerang; thence along east boundary of allotment 48B N. 0° 40' W. twenty chains to the north-east corner of allotment 48B; thence by a line bearing N. 0° 40' W. a distance of two hundred links to the south-west corner of allotment 44A, parish of Coongulmerang; thence along the west boundary of allotment 44A bearing N. 0° 40' W. a distance of ninety-four chains to the north-west corner of allotment 44A; thence by a line bearing N. 0° 40' W. a distance of one hundred and fifty links to the bank of the Mitchell River; thence by that river easterly to the point of commencement, and containing one thousand nine hundred and eighteen acres one rood twenty-five perches or thereabout.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 3, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
