W HEREAS by Part II. of the Marine Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the Governorae Gazette, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following Additional Regulations for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

29A. No person forming any portion of the crew of any foreign

29a. No person forming any portion of the crew of any foreign ship of war shall land in any Port of Victoria without authority from the Governor of Victoria. Such authority is to be obtained through the Consular representative at Melbourne of the nation to which such foreign ship of war may belong. Pending the issue of such authority any individual officer or man may land from any such vessel with the consent of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

29b. The use of any search light attached to any foreign vessel of war, or the survey of the shore line by any boats belonging to any such ship or employed in connexion therewith, without the authority of the Governor first obtained, is hereby prohibited.
