VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1899.

THE births of 59 boys and 65 girls, or in all of 124 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of October. Of these, 50 occurred in Ballarat East, 63 in Ballarat West, 10 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 10 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 128, viz., 66 of boys and 62 of girls.

The deaths registered in October numbered 112, viz., 70 of males and 42 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 12. In September, the recorded deaths numbered 67; in October, 1898, they numbered 74; in October, 1897, they numbered 46; in October, 1896, they numbered 58; in October, 1895, they numbered 56; in October, 1894, they numbered 80; in October, 1893, they numbered 63; in October, 1892, they numbered 64; in October, 1891, they numbered 101; in October, 1890, they numbered 46; and in October, 1889, they numbered 61.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

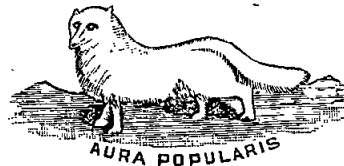

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 152.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONER, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

Fares for passengers and rates for live stock, goods, and merchandise carried from and to stations on the line of railway between Kilmore and Lancefield shall in all cases be calculated as though such line of railway were detached and separate from other lines of railway; and, so far as such line of railway is concerned, no reduction shall be made in the fares and rates chargeable in respect of passengers, live stock, goods, or merchandise carried over such railway by reason of their being carried over other railways vested in the Commissioner.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust.

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five (5) feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1900.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING AND GENERAL RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF EAST HEXHAM.

WE, Thomas Claridge, William George Forbes, Walter McLauchlan, and George Cook, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Racing and General Recreation purposes in the Parish of East Hexham, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—
 - (1) The stand enclosure.
 - (2) The remainder of the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, gates, seats, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the first and second divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for racing, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult to the first division such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Seven shillings and sixpence.

For admission of every adult to the second division such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

10. No person shall after the 31st day of December, 1899, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portion of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

(a) That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the Committee or Stewards of the Hexham Racing Club, or by those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards on payment of a fee not exceeding Two pounds two shillings.

(b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the Committee or Stewards of the Hexham Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF KYNETON.

BY-LAW No. XX. of the Shire of Kyneton, made under the provisions of Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, as amended by Section 46 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, for the purpose of regulating and defining the conditions upon which traction-engines impelled by steam or electricity may proceed along the roads or streets within the shire.

1. No traction-engine shall travel within the shire boundaries without having the true name and address of the owner painted on such engine in a conspicuous place, and so that the word "owner" shall appear between the name and address.

2. No traction-engine shall travel over any road within the shire after dark or before daylight unless such engine shall be preceded by some person by at least one-hundred yards, which person shall carry a lamp, and shall give notice that such engine is travelling on such road.

3. No traction shall travel on any road within the shire with badly packed stuffing-boxes or leaky valves, or otherwise in bad order, or without a spark-arrester attached to the funnel of such engine, and the driver shall not permit steam to be blown off, unless through accident to the engine or unavoidable circumstance which necessitates the stoppage of such engine.

4. No traction-engine shall travel on road within the shire with less than two men engaged thereon, one of whom shall be the driver and in charge of such engine, and the other of whom shall steer such engine and render assistance to horses and vehicles passing when necessary.

5. The width of tires of waggons which shall be drawn by traction engines within the shire shall be as follows:—

Waggons carrying 5 tons weight or under, three inches.

Waggons over 5 tons and less than 8, four inches.

Waggons carrying any weight exceeding 8 tons, five inches.

6. The person in charge of any traction-engine shall stop such engine, or, where practicable, take or move such engine to one side of the road upon which such engine shall be travelling when called upon to do so by persons travelling thereon on horseback,

or with vehicles, or otherwise where horses are frightened, except in the following places, namely:—(a) Where the engine at such time or times is in such a position as to have the front wheels much lower than the hind wheels. (b) Where the man in charge would be endangering the engine boiler by so doing. (c) When such engine shall be crossing a bridge. (d) Where such engine is proceeding up a steep hill. (e) Where the person in charge would not be able, if he then stopped, to start such engine again; and in all such places the person in charge shall send his assistant to, and such assistant shall render all such help as may then be required to persons, horses, and vehicles then passing and travelling.

7. The person in charge of any traction-engine shall forthwith fill up, or cause to be filled up, any hole caused by such engine or waggons, or vehicles drawn by it, on any road along which the same shall have travelled, or otherwise, where such road shall be damaged, shall repair such road in a proper manner, so as to render the same fit for vehicular traffic.

8. The owner of any traction-engine shall be liable to pay for any damage caused to any bridge or culvert by his engine.

9. No person shall permit a traction-engine whilst travelling to stop upon a bridge or culvert.

10. In the event of any traction-engine breaking the decking or otherwise damaging a bridge or culvert, the owner or person in charge thereof shall forthwith, before leaving the bridge or culvert, place an obstruction or notice in a conspicuous position on or near the damaged portion, and shall send notices within forty-eight hours to the president and secretary, or president and engineer of the shire—notice shall particularize the bridge or culvert so damaged, and the nature of such damage.

11. The owner of, or the persons travelling with or in charge of, any traction-engine within the shire shall do so at his or their own risk, and the owner shall be responsible for any damage done or caused through or by any traction-engine whilst travelling aforesaid.

12. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. The person in charge of any traction-engine, whether stationary or travelling, on any road within the shire shall, between sundown and sunrise, cause a lamp to be fixed thereon in a prominent position, and keep such lamp brightly burning between the periods aforesaid.
