PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :-

- WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday at Camberwell;
- WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH AND THURSDAY, THE 30TH DAYS OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as Public Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, throughout the City of Bendigo*;
- THURSDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Koroit; and as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Bairnsdale;
- WEDNESDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Alberton; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yarram;
- THURSDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Warrnambool* ; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Warrnambool;
- FRIDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Sunbury;
- TUESDAY, THE 12TH DAY DECEMBER NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Lancefield;
- THURSDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the West Riding of the Shire of Dimboola;
- SATURDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, AND TUESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF JANUARY NEXT, as Public Holidays throughout Victoria;
- WEDNESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF JANUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai.
