PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :-

WEDNESDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Wodonga; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Maryborough, Talbot, Wodonga, Wunghnu, and Yea;

THURSDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bacchus Marsh;

FRIDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, AND WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,* as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Seymour;

WEDNESDAY, THE 31ST DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Euroa, Lancefield, and Violet Town;

THURSDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale and the Shire of Rosedale;

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the East Riding of the Shire of Portland;

FRIDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Belfast, Creswick, and Rutherglen;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bairnsdale;

FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Ballaarat, the Town of Ballaarat East, and the Shire of Ballaarat;

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Rosedale and Springfield;

THURSDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Portland.

That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings and Twelve shillings respectively, per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continuously posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

**BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1901.**

No. 18.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation, viz.:-

1. That the rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1901. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance, in four equal instalments, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under, a sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property.

4. On every shop or place of business, not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

5. On every cordial or aerated-water factory, or other factory, or saw-mill, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings; on every flour-mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds; and on every livery-stable, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings.

6. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill named in clause 5), a sum of Twenty shillings.

7. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

8. The area of land allowed for every house or tenement shall be one-quarter of an acre. Should any larger quantity of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land and Three shillings for uncultivated land shall be paid for every quarter of an acre, or part of a quarter of an acre.

9. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of, or amount charged, or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where water is not laid on.

10. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

11. On each quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.

12. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided for in clause 10, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the quarter then current. No allowance will be made unless the water is turned for a full quarter, nor in any case where water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water supplied by measure.

13. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold, shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons; such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same and charge a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a one-inch service-pipe may be allowed.

14. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 13 shall apply.

15. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under clauses 13 and 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for each two hundred (200) gallons.

17. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

19. In the construction of this Regulation the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1901, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined.

1. Every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 26 was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the Water Acts, this third day of September, 1900.

TWELVE MILE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.

THE Commissioners of the Twelve Mile Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following Regulation:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. The form of measurement shall be determined by the Trust.

2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be:—For all lands, except gardens, Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre; for gardens, Twelve shillings and sixpence per acre per annum for the first acre or fractional part of an acre, and Five shillings per acre for each additional acre or fractional part of an acre; for filling tanks, Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each tank. The minimum quantity of water to be supplied at each watering shall be 2 inches per acre, except at such time as the water is not required for crops, when the minimum quantity of water to be supplied at each watering shall be 1 inch per acre.

3. Payment for water delivered from the works of the Trust must be made in all cases on delivery of such water, except for the right to water a garden or fill a tank, at per annum, as stated in clause No. 2, payment for which must be made at the time application is made for the right.

4. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct, and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

5. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding for any offence the sum of Ten pounds.

6. That the Regulation providing for the sale of water made by the Trust on the 15th day of April, 1899, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

REGULATIONS TO FURTHER REGULATE THE INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA FROM THE COLONY OF NEW SOUTH WALES OF SHEEP, AND TO EXTEND AND APPLY THE PROVISIONS TO THE CASE OF CATTLE AND HORSES IN CONNEXION WITH THE DISEASE KNOWN AS ANTHRAX.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers conferred upon him by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* and section 4 of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, has deemed it necessary and expedient to further regulate the introduction into Victoria from the colony of New South Wales, where the disease of anthrax (being a disease in sheep, cattle, horses, and other animals) is known to exist, of sheep, and to extend and apply the provisions to the case of cattle and horses (which said sheep, cattle, and horses are hereinafter in the Order and Regulations included under the term stock): Now, therefore, it is ordained as follows (that is to say):—

1. In the preamble to the Regulations made by the Governor in Council under the *Health Act 1890* and the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, made on the thirtieth day of October, 1890, the word "sheep" is hereby repealed, and the word "stock" shall be read in lieu thereof.

2. Clause 1 of the said Regulations shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be read and construed as Clause 1:—No stock shall be introduced into Victoria by land from the colony of New South Wales unless and until the owner or person having the charge of the same shall make and shall have lodged with the Victorian Inspector of Stock, at the place where it is proposed to introduce such stock, a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of that contained in the schedule hereto that such stock are free from anthrax, and that they have not within the three months next preceding the date of such declaration been in direct or indirect contact with stock infected with any such disease, and that none of such stock have during any part of such period been in country or travelling on routes where anthrax was present, or that such of them as have been in such country or over such routes within such time have been successfully vaccinated and rendered immune from anthrax, in which latter case full particulars of the time, place, and person, when, where, and by whom the operation was performed shall be set out in such declaration, with a certificate thereof from an Inspector of Stock of New South Wales that he has examined the stock referred to in the declaration, and has no reason to doubt its correctness in any particular. Provided that no stock which within the period of three months preceding the application for permission to introduce the same into Victoria have been in country or travelling on routes affected or suspected to be affected with anthrax shall be so introduced unless the declaration be accompanied by a certificate of a competent vaccinator that they have been successfully vaccinated for and rendered immune from anthrax. Provided further that fat stock under bond intended for export shall not be subjected to vaccination if, in the opinion of an Inspector of Stock, vaccination is not necessary.

3. For the declaration in the said Regulations contained there shall be substituted the following declaration, namely:—

DECLARATION BY OWNER, AND CERTIFICATE OF HEALTH BY INSPECTOR.

I [name and full address], do solemnly and sincerely declare that the undermentioned stock are, to the best of my knowledge and belief, free from anthrax; that such stock have not, within the next preceding three months, been in direct or indirect contact with stock infected with anthrax, (a) nor has such stock during that period been on runs or routes known to be infected, nor to have travelled over routes known to be so affected with that disease.*

(a) The words in italics may be omitted in the case of sheep being vaccinated, and in which case the owner to state place, date, and by whom the vaccination was performed, and that the certificate produced is the certificate of the person performing the operation.

CHAPTER V.—AGRICULTURAL AND GRAZING ALLOTMENTS.

NON-RESIDENCE LICENCES.

Payment by Half-yearly instalments for improvements of a permanent character.

In every case where, pursuant to section 71 of the *Land Act 1898*, payment for improvements of a permanent character is to be made by half-yearly instalments, the following additional condition shall be included in the conditions prescribed in Schedule H:—

To pay the sum of being the amount determined by the Board as the value of the improvements of a permanent character on the land hereby licensed by half-yearly instalments of each together with interest on the amount so determined as aforesaid at the rate of Three pounds per centum per annum from the date hereof until payment of the last half-yearly instalment of such amount. The first of such instalments together with interest to be paid on the day of now next and a further instalment together with interest on each of the days herebefore appointed for the payment of rent until the whole amount be paid. Provided always that any default in the payment of any half-yearly instalment of such amount or of any interest shall have the like consequence as a default in the payment of rent and may be levied or recovered by or under the authority of the Board of Land and Works in the like manner as rent is leviable or recoverable by law and that in case the same be levied by distress an order under the seal of the Board shall be a sufficient warrant and authority to distrain.

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Woorayl has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Koorooman in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 3, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 3 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

The births of 951 children, viz., 505 boys and 446 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. The number was by far the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years; and was, moreover, 320 below the average of the month during that period, or 353 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in September numbered 602, viz., 330 of males and 272 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 349, or 58 per cent., as against 120 per cent. in September, 1899, and 116 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 71 more than in September, 1899, and the highest recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years except 1890, 1891, and 1893; it was also 13 above the average of September during the last ten years, or 5 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.22, and of deaths registered to 15.33 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 30.14 and 13.72 respectively, and during the last ten years of 33.37 and 15.46 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 75.0° on the 20th, and the lowest was 35.3° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (50.6°) was with one exception, 50.5° in September, 1874, the lowest recorded for the month during the last 40 years, and was 2.9° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (29.8°) took place on the 17th, and the least range (2.6°) on the 26th. The mean daily range was 13.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.289 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.615 inches on the 12th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.009 inches) was one-eleventh of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 17 days, the amount being 2.91 inches, which was higher than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1893.

The mean humidity of the month was 81.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 20 per cent. to that mortality, as against 18 per cent. in September, 1899; 25 per cent. in September, 1898; 21 per cent. in September, 1897; 20 per cent. in September, 1896; 22 per cent. in September, 1895; and 30 per cent. in September, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 72, as compared with 71 in September, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality was only 76 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 61 in September, 1899; 81 in September, 1898; 75 in September, 1897; 59 in September, 1896; 88 in September, 1895; 89 in September, 1894; 91 in September, 1893; 72 in September, 1892; 123 in September, 1891; and 89 in September, 1890.

Seventy-three persons—as against 60 in September, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of rheumatism; a gardener, aged 75, of cancer; a female, aged 75, of pulmonary tuberculosis; a gentleman, aged 75, of disease of the brain; two females, each aged 75, of aneurism and heart disease.

Twenty-six of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 24 in September, 1899—were from external causes, of which 20 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A gentleman, aged 55, was passed over by a railway train; another, of the same age, was thrown from a tramcar; a bootmaker, aged 66, was knocked down by a cab; an engineer, aged 19, died of injuries, the result of a fall down a lift well; an engineer, aged 41, of injuries to bowel, accidentally received; a female, aged 31, of hæmorrhage from a wound in the neck, caused by a fall on a broken vessel; a bricklayer, aged 40, and two females, aged 64 and 68 respectively, of burns; a glass beveller, aged 17, of ptomaine poisoning; a watchman, aged 67, was drowned by falling into the River Yarra; a boy, aged 7, a ship's apprentice, aged 19, a miner, aged 42, and a female, aged 23, were "found drowned" in the River Yarra; a male of no occupation, aged 35, and a female, aged 57, in Hobson's Bay; two females, aged 3 and 70 respectively, were suffocated by vomited matter getting into air passages; and a female child, aged 12 months, in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 44, who was shot by her husband, a verdict of wilful murder being returned; a new-born male and a female infant, and a female child, aged 6 weeks, who were found dead, the cause being ascertained to be suffocation in each case (probably murder). The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 18, who shot himself; and a female, aged 60, who drowned herself.

One hundred and sixty-eight deaths, or 28 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne, 18 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 3 in the Women's, 8 in the Children's, 9 in the Homœopathic, and 15 in the Austin Hospitals; 15 in the Metropolitan and 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 13 in the Benevolent, and 2 in the Infant Asylum; 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 5 in the Protestant Refuge; and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 121, of which 70, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 51, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 72 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 481. Of these 260, or 54 per cent., were males, and 221, or 46 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 42 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 49 were between sixty and sixty-five, 55 were between sixty-five and seventy, 53 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 32 were between eighty and eighty-five, 8 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 1 at the age of ninety-one.

As compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 9, those from parasitic diseases by 1, those from constitutional diseases by 20, those from developmental diseases by 2, those from local diseases by 30, those due to violence by 2, and those from ill-defined causes by 8, whilst the only decrease in the total of any class was 1 in those from dietic diseases. Under the zymotic class, deaths from measles rose from nil to 18, and those from diphtheria from 3 to 10, whilst those from influenza fell from 10 to 4, and those from septic diseases from 7 to 1. Under the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis rose from 45 to 58, and those from other forms of tuberculosis, &c., from 9 to 16. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the respiratory system increased by 13, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 11. The epidemic of measles now prevalent caused 18 deaths in the month, as compared with 20 in the preceding one—making a total of 42 since the 1st January.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first nine months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.
