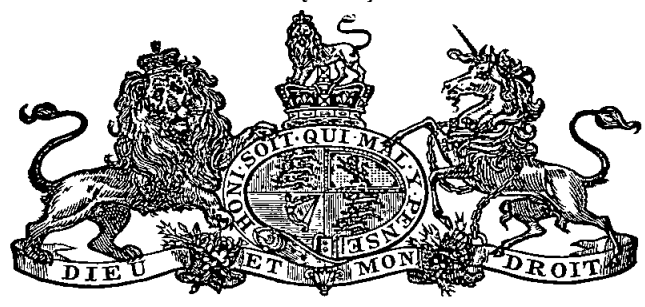

Fire Brigades Act 1890.

ELECTION OF METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890*, and the Regulations made thereunder, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, by Order made on the 22nd day of October, 1900, has made the following arrangements for the election of representatives of the Municipal Councils on the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board, namely:—

- Issue of Notices—Wednesday, 24th October, 1900;
- Date of Nomination—Wednesday, 21st November, 1900;
- Date of Election—Wednesday, 19th December, 1900;

and has appointed

Wednesday, 19th December, 1900,

as the date on or before which the Fire Insurance Companies carrying on business in Victoria may elect persons to be representative members of the said Board;
and, further, has been pleased to appoint

WILLIAM ALFRED CALLAWAY, Acting Chief Clerk, Chief Secretary's Office,

to be the Returning Officer in connexion with the election of the representatives of the Municipal Councils on the said Board.

Factories and Shops Acts.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE ELECTION OF THE WOODWORKERS BOARD.

UNDER the Regulations made pursuant to the Factories and Shops Acts, the Under-Secretary is the returning officer at elections of Special Boards; and "every candidate as a representative of employers on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by ten electors, and every candidate as a representative of employes on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by twenty-five electors; and every nomination shall contain the written consent of the candidate to his nomination, and shall be delivered or posted to the returning officer so as to reach him before Four o'clock on the day of nomination."

In the event of the number of persons nominated either as representatives of employers or as representatives of employes on the Woodworkers Board exceeding five (the number to be elected), the day for taking the poll (by voting-papers) will be Friday, the 16th day of November, 1900.

Forms for nomination may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Melbourne.

The envelope containing the nomination should be marked "Nomination Paper, Special Board," and be addressed to—

and must be delivered or posted so as to reach me before Four o'clock on Friday, the 2nd day of November, 1900.

Factories and Shops Acts.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE ELECTION OF THE PASTRYCOOKS BOARD.

UNDER the Regulations made pursuant to the Factories and Shops Acts, the Under-Secretary is the returning officer at elections of Special Boards; and "every candidate as a representative of employers on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by ten electors, and every candidate as a representative of employes on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by twenty-five electors; and every nomination shall contain the written consent of the candidate to his nomination, and shall be delivered or posted to the returning officer so as to reach him before Four o'clock on the day of nomination."

In the event of the number of persons nominated either as representatives of employers or as representatives of employes on the Pastrycooks Board exceeding five (the number to be elected), the day for taking the poll (by voting-papers) will be Wednesday, the 21st day of November, 1900.

Forms for nomination may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Melbourne.

The envelope containing the nomination should be marked "Nomination Paper, Special Board," and be addressed to—
