BANK HALF-HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each such day, at each of the places specified, that is to say:—

THURSDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at Rosedale;
FRIDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at Talbot;
FRIDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at Port Fairy;
TUESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at Gisborne;
WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at Portarlington;
FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at Learmonth;
WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at Kingston and Smeaton.
