ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three hundred and seventy-eight thousand one hundred and fifty-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine and One thousand nine hundred."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

THURSDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Port Fairy*;

MONDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF FRERUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Alberton,* and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yarram;

Weinesdat, the 7th day of February Next, as a Public Holiday throughout the Township of Melton, the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, the Devenish and Mokoan Ridings of the Shire of Benalla, the East and Centre Ridings of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Borough of Ararat,* and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Donald, Pitfield, and Rokewood;

THURSDAY, THE STH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Wyndham, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Borough of Ararat*, and as a Bank Holiday at Clunes;

Monday, the 12th day of February Next, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Moorabbin, and as a Bank Holiday at Cheltenham;

Tuesday, the 13th day of February next, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Lancofield; No. 11.—February 1, 1900.—1.

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Stawell and Violet Town;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale*, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Sale;

FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Creswick;

WEDNESDAY, THE 21st DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Echuca,* as a Bank Holiday at Penshurst, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Tarnagulla;

MONDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Walhalla;

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Richmond;

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Towong;

SATURDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Town of Warrnambool* and the Borough of Port Fairy.*
