WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.

BRITISH PROTECTORATE OVER CHOISEUL, YSABEL, SHORTLAND ISLAND, FAURO, TASMAN GROUP, LORD HOWE'S GROUP, AND GOWER ISLAND.

It is hereby notified that the Jurisdiction of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner's Court for the Western Pacific, and the provisions of Her Britannic Majesty's Order in Council, 1893, and of such of the "Queen's Regulations" made in accordance therewith as apply to the Protectorate of the British Solomon Islands, are extended to all persons residing or being within the limits of the islands to the east and south-east of the Island of Bougainville, and formerly included in the Protectorate of the German Solomon Islands, which were transferred to Great Britain by the Convention between Great Britain and Germany signed at London, on the 14th November, 1899, that is to say:—

Choiseul, and the small islands depending thereon;

Ysabel, and the small islands depending thereon, including Ramos and St. George;

Shortland Island, and the small islands adjacent and depending thereon, viz., Morgusaia, Alu, Porporang, Faise, Onua, and Ballale;

Fauro Island, and the small islands adjacent and depending thereon, viz., Oema Island and Atoll, Ovau, Asie, Illina, Nusave, Niellei, Nusakoa, Benana, Nufahana, Munia, Piedu, Masamasa, and Cyprian Bridge;

The Tasman Group, or Niupano Atoll, comprising the islands of Niupano, Loto, and thirty-seven others;

The Leueneuwa Islands, otherwise known as Ontong Java or Lord Howe's Group, and comprising the islands of Palav, Oikuo, Uailoko, Ouku, Leueneuwa, Engaulii, Lehuauu, Nee, Akoo, Ekolo, Makamea, Toukoua, Kalau, and all other islands situated upon or within the aforesaid reef, and also the reef known as El Roncador, or Candelaria Reef; and

Gower, otherwise known as Inattendue Island;

And that henceforth these islands will form part of the Protectorate of the British Solomon Islands.

Whereof let all men take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

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TREATY BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF HONDURAS.

THE following Despatch (with its enclosure), received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Honduras, signed at Guatemala on 21st January, 1887, and ratified on 3rd February, 1900, together with an explanatory Protocol signed at Guatemala on the 3rd February, 1900.

The effect of this explanatory Protocol is to override the provisions of Article XIV. of the Treaty, and to give to Colonial Governments in all cases a period of one year, and one year only, from the date of the exchange of ratifications to come within the operation of the Treaty, while it also reserves to Her Majesty's Government the right to terminate the Treaty on behalf of any Colony by giving twelve months' notice.

I shall be glad to be informed as soon as possible whether your Government desires to adhere to the Treaty.

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF HONDURAS.

*Signed at Guatemala, 21st January, 1887.*

[Ratifications exchanged at Guatemala, 3rd February, 1900.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, being desirous of maintaining and strengthening friendly relations, and of promoting commercial intercourse between the dominions of Her Britannic Majesty and the territories of the Republic, have resolved to conclude a Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, James Plaister Harriss-Gastrell, Esq., Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Resident and Consul-General to the Republic of Honduras;

And His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, His Excellency Dr. Don Jerónimo Zelaya, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

*Article I.*

The High Contracting Parties agree that, in all matters relating to commerce and navigation, any privilege, favour, or immunity whatever which either Contracting Party has actually granted or may hereafter grant to the subjects or citizens of any other State shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the subjects or citizens of the other Contracting Party; it being their intention that the trade and navigation of each country shall be placed in all respects by the other on the footing of the most favoured nation.

*Article II.*

The produce and manufacture of, as well as all goods coming from, the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, which are imported into Honduras, and the produce and manufactures of, as well as all goods coming from Honduras, which are imported into the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, whether intended for consumption, warehousing, re-exportation, or transit, shall be treated in the same manner as, and, in particular, shall be subjected to no higher or other duties, whether general, municipal, or local, than the produce, manufactures, and goods of any third country the most favoured in this respect. No other or higher duties shall be levied in Honduras on the exportation of any goods to the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, or in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty on the exportation of any goods to Honduras, than may be levied on the exportation of the like goods to any third country the most favoured in this respect.

Neither of the Contracting Parties shall establish a prohibition of importation, exportation, or transit against the other which shall not, under like circumstances, be applicable to any third country the most favoured in this respect.

In like manner, in all that relates to local dues, Customs formalities, brokerage, patterns or samples introduced by commercial travellers, and all other matters connected with trade, British subjects in Honduras, and Honduranian citizens in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy most-favoured-nation treatment.

In the event of any changes being made in Honduranian Laws, Customs Tariff, or Regulations, sufficient notice shall be given in order to enable British subjects to make the necessary arrangements for meeting them.

*Article III.*

British ships and their cargoes shall, in Honduras, and Honduranian vessels and their cargoes shall, in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, from whatever place arriving and whatever may be the place of origin or destination of their cargoes, be treated in every respect as national ships and their cargoes.

The preceding stipulation applies to local treatment, dues, and charges in the ports, basins, docks, roadsteads, harbors, and rivers of the two countries, pilotage, and generally to all matters connected with navigation.

Every favour or exemption in these respects, or any other privilege in matters of navigation which either of the Contracting Parties shall grant to a third Power shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the other Party.

All vessels which, according to British law, are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which, according to the law of Honduras, are to be deemed Honduranian vessels, shall, for the purpose of this Treaty, be respectively deemed British or Honduranian vessels.

*Article IV.*

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall be permitted to reside permanently or temporarily in the dominions or possessions of the other, and to occupy and hire houses and warehouses for purposes of commerce, whether wholesale or retail. They shall also be at full liberty to exercise civil rights, and therefore to acquire, possess, and dispose of every description of property movable and immovable. They may acquire and transmit the same to others, whether by purchase, sale, donation, exchange, marriage, testament, succession *ab intestato*, and in any other manner under the same conditions as natives of the country. Their heirs and legal representatives may succeed to and take possession of it, either in person or by procurators, in the same manner and in the same legal forms as natives of the country.

In none of these respects shall they pay upon the value of such property any other or higher impost, duty, or charge than is payable by natives of the country. In every case the subjects or citizens of the Contracting Parties shall be permitted to export their property, or the proceeds thereof if sold, freely and without being subjected on such exportation to pay any duty different from that to which natives of the country are liable under similar circumstances.

*Article V.*

The dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, and shops of the subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, and all premises appertaining thereto destined for purposes of residence or commerce, shall be respected. Except under the conditions and with the forms prescribed by the laws for natives of the country, such dwellings and premises shall be exempt from search or domiciliary visit, and books, papers, or accounts shall be exempt from examination or inspection.

The subjects or citizens of each of the two Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall have free access to the Courts of Justice for the prosecution and defence of their rights, without other conditions, restrictions, or taxes beyond those imposed on natives of the country, and shall, like them, be at liberty to employ, in all causes, their advocates, attorneys, or agents from among the persons admitted to the exercise of those professions according to the laws of the country.

*Article VI.*

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall be exempted from billeting and from all compulsory military service whatever, whether in the army, navy, or national guard or militia. They shall likewise be exempted from all contributions, whether pecuniary or in kind, imposed as a compensation for billeting and for personal service, and, finally, from forced loans and military exactions or requisitions of any kind.

*Article VII.*

The subjects or citizens of either of the two Contracting Parties residing in the dominions and possessions of the other shall enjoy, in regard to their houses, persons, and properties, the protection of the Government in as full and ample a manner as native subjects or citizens.

In like manner the subjects or citizens of each Contracting Party shall enjoy in the dominions and possessions of the other full liberty of conscience, and shall not be molested on account of their religious belief; and such of those subjects or citizens as may die in the territories of the other Party shall be buried in the public cemeteries, or in places appointed for the purpose, with suitable decorum and respect.

The subjects of Her Britannic Majesty residing within the territories of the Republic of Honduras shall be at liberty to exercise in private and in their own dwellings, or within the dwellings or offices of Her Britannic Majesty's Minister, Consuls, or Vice-Consuls, or in any public edifice set apart for the purpose, their religious rites, services, and worship, and to assemble therein for that purpose without hindrance or molestation. The same stipulations shall be observed in regard to the citizens of the Republic of Honduras within the territories of Her Britannic Majesty.

*Article VIII.*

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as natives, or as subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation, in regard to patents for inventions, trade-marks, and designs, and the protection of industrial property, upon fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law.

*Article IX.*

Each of the Contracting Parties may appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, Pro-Consuls, and Consular Agents to reside respectively in towns or ports in the dominions and possessions of the other Power. Such Consular officers, however, shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted in the usual form by the Government to which they are sent. They shall exercise whatever functions, and enjoy whatever privileges, exemptions, and immunities are, or may hereafter be, granted there to Consular officers of the most favoured nation.

*Article X.*

In the event of any subject or citizen of either of the two Contracting Parties dying without will or testament, in the dominions and possessions of the other Contracting Party, the Consul-General, Consul, or Vice-Consul of the nation to which the deceased may belong, or, in his absence, the representative of such Consular officer may, so far as the laws of each country will permit, take charge of the property which the deceased shall have left, for the benefit of his legal representatives, until an executor or administrator be named.

*Article XI.*

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents of each of the Contracting Parties residing in the dominions and possessions of the other shall receive from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

*Article XII.*

Any ship of war or merchant vessel of either of the Contracting Parties which may be compelled by stress of weather, or by accident, to take shelter in a port of the other, shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all necessary stores, and to continue their voyage, without paying any dues other than such as would be payable in a similar case by a national vessel. In case, however, the master of a merchant vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandise in order to defray his expenses, he shall be bound to conform to the Regulations and Tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any ship of war or merchant vessel of one of the Contracting Parties should run against or be wrecked within the territory of the other, such ship or vessel, and all parts thereof, and all furniture and appurtenances belonging thereunto, and all goods and merchandise saved therefrom, including any which may have been cast out of the ship, or the proceeds thereof if sold, as well as all papers found on board such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, shall be given up to the owners or their agents when claimed by them. If there are no such owners or agents on the spot, then the same shall be delivered to the British or Honduranian Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent in whose district the wreck or stranding may have taken place, upon being claimed by him within the period fixed by the laws of the country; and such Consuls, owners, or agents shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the like case of a wreck of a national vessel.

The goods and merchandise saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all duties of Customs, unless cleared for consumption, in which case they shall pay the same rate of duty as if they had been imported in a national vessel.

In the case either of a vessel being driven in by stress of weather, run aground, or wrecked, the respective Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents shall, if the owner or master or other agent of the owner is not present, or is present and requires it, be authorized to interpose in order to afford the necessary assistance to their fellow-countrymen.

*Article XIII.*

For the better security of commerce between the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty and the citizens of the Republic of Honduras, it is agreed that if at any time any interruption of friendly intercourse, or any rupture, should unfortunately take place between the two Contracting Parties, the subjects or citizens of either of the said Contracting Parties who may be residing in the dominions or territories of the other, or who may be established there, in the exercise of any trade or special employment, shall have the privilege of remaining, and continuing such trade or employment, without any manner of interruption, in full enjoyment of their liberty and property, so long as they behave peacefully and commit no offence against the laws; and their goods, property, and effects, of whatever description they may be, whether in their own custody or intrusted to individuals or to the State, shall not be liable to seizure or sequestration, or to any other charges or demands than those which may be made upon the like goods, property, and effects belonging to native subjects or citizens. Should they, however, prefer to leave the country, they shall be allowed to make arrangements for the safe keeping of their goods, property, and effects, or to dispose of them, and to liquidate their accounts; and a safe conduct shall be given them to embark at the ports which they shall themselves select.

*Article XIV.*

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws permit, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India.	Western Australia.
The Dominion of Canada.	Queensland.
Newfoundland.	Tasmania.
New South Wales.	New Zealand.
Victoria.	The Cape.
South Australia.	Natal.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Treaty shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative in the Republic of Honduras to the Honduranian Minister for Foreign Affairs within two years, from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Treaty.

The Treaty shall apply in the case of such Colonies or foreign possessions from the date when this notice is given to the Honduranian Minister for Foreign Affairs.

*Article XV.*

Any controversies which may arise respecting the interpretation or the execution of the present Treaty, or the consequences of any violation thereof, shall be submitted, when the means of settling them directly by amicable agreement are exhausted, to the decision of Commissions of Arbitration, and the result of such arbitration shall be binding upon both Governments.

The members of such Commissions shall be selected by the two Governments by common consent; failing which each of the Parties shall nominate an Arbitrator, or an equal number of Arbitrators, and the Arbitrators thus appointed shall select an Umpire.

The procedure of the arbitration shall in each case be determined by the Contracting Parties; failing which the Commission of Arbitration shall be itself entitled to determine it beforehand.

*Article XVI.*

The present Treaty shall continue in force during ten years, counted from the day of the exchange of the ratifications; and in case neither of the two Contracting Parties shall have given notice twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of their intention of terminating the present Treaty, it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

## Article XVII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified by Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and by His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Tegucigalpa or Guatemala as soon as possible. In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms. Done at Guatemala, the twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

## PROTOCOL.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries of the High Contracting Parties, in proceeding to the signature this day of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Republic of Honduras, do hereby declare that by the words "a port" in Article XII (first paragraph), as regards vessels in distress, is intended "a port or roadstead of any kind, whether or not it be a port of entry." It is likewise understood between the undersigned Plenipotentiaries that British subjects, in like manner as Honduran citizens, shall pay the same municipal taxes, such as the tax on places of business in Honduras.

Done in duplicate at Guatemala, this twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Su Excelencia el Presidente de la República de Honduras, y Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña e Irlanda, Emperatriz de la India, deseando mantener y estrechar las relaciones amistosas que existen al presente entre ellos, y de promover el trato comercial entre los territorios de la República y los dominios de Su Majestad Británica, han resuelto concluir un Tratado de Amistad, Comercio, y Navegación, y han nombrado por sus Plenipotenciarios, á saber:—

Su Excelencia el Señor Presidente de la República de Honduras á su Excelencia Señor Dr. Don Jerónimo Zelaya, Enviado Extraordinario y Ministro Plenipotenciario;

I Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña e Irlanda, á James Plaister Harris Gastrell, Esquire, Ministro Residente de Su Majestad Británica y Cónsul-General en la República de Honduras;

Quienes, después de haberse comunicado mutuamente sus respectivos plenos poderes, y encontrándolos en buena y debida forma, han aceptado y admitido los Artículos siguientes:—

## Artículo I.

Las Altas Partes Contratantes convienen en que en todas las materias relativas al comercio y la navegación, cualquier privilegio, favor ó inmunidad que una de las Partes Contratantes haya concedido ó conceda en adelante á los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cualquiera otro Estado, se hará inmediatamente é incondicionalmente extensivo á los súbditos ó ciudadanos de la otra Parte Contratante; pues es su intención que el tráfico y navegación de cada uno de los dos países sean puestos, en todos respectos, por el otro, bajo el pie de la nación más favorecida.

## Artículo II.

Los productos y manufacturas y los géneros procedentes de los dominios y posesiones de Su Majestad Británica importados en Honduras, y los productos y manufacturas y géneros procedentes de Honduras importados en los dominios y posesiones de Su Majestad Británica, bien se destinen al consumo, al depósito, á la re-exportación ó al tránsito, serán tratados de la misma manera y sobre todo no serán sujetos á otros ó más elevados derechos, bien sean éstos generales, municipales ó locales, que los productos, manufacturas, y géneros de cualquier tercer país más favorecido en este respecto. Ningún otro ni más altos derechos se impondrán en Honduras á la exportación de cualesquiera géneros á los dominios y posesiones de Su Majestad Británica, ó en los dominios y posesiones de Su Majestad Británica á la exportación de cualesquiera géneros á Honduras, que los que se impongan á la exportación de los mismos géneros á cualquier tercer país más favorecido en este respecto.

Ninguna de las Partes Contratantes establecerá prohibición de importaciones, exportación ó tránsito contra la otra, que no sea aplicable, bajo las mismas circunstancias, á cualquier tercer país más favorecido en este respecto.

De la misma manera, en todo lo relativo á derechos locales, formalidades de Aduanas, corretaje, muestras introducidas por los viajeros comerciales, y todas las otras materias concernientes al tráfico, los súbditos Británicos en Honduras, y los ciudadanos Hondureños en los dominios y posesiones de Su Majestad Británica, disfrutarán el trato de la nación más favorecida.

En el caso de que se verifiquen algunos cambios en las leyes, tarifas ó reglamentos de Aduanas de Honduras, se dará noticia suficiente para que los súbditos Británicos puedan tomar las medidas necesarias para hacer frente á ellas.

## Artículo III.

Los buques Británicos y sus cargamentos en Honduras, y los buques Hondureños y sus cargamentos en los dominios y posesiones de Su Majestad Británica, cualquiera que sea su procedencia, y cualquiera que sea el lugar de su origen ó el destino de sus cargamentos, serán tratados en todos respectos como buques nacionales y sus cargamentos.

La precedente estipulación es aplicable al trato local, derechos, impuestos de puerto, fondeadero, dársenas, radas, puertos y ríos de los dos países, pilotaje, y en general á todas las materias concernientes á la navegación.

Cada favor ó exención en estos respectos, ó cualquier otro privilegio en materia de navegación, que cualquiera de las Partes Contratantes conceda á una tercera Potencia, se hará inmediata é incondicionalmente extensivo á la otra parte.

Todos los buques que según la ley Británica son tenidos por buques Británicos, y todos los buques que según la ley de Honduras son tenidos por buques Hondureños, serán para los efectos de este Tratado considerados respectivamente buques Británicos ó Hondureños.

## Artículo IV.

Les será permitido á los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cada una de las Partes Contratantes á residir permanente ó temporalmente en los dominios ó posesiones de la otra, y á ocupar y alquilar casas y almacenes destinados al comercio, bien sea por mayor ó por menor. Estarán en plena libertad de ejercer derechos civiles, y por consiguiente de adquirir, gozar y disponer de todo género de propiedad mueble é inmueble. Podrán adquirir y transmitir los mismos á otros, por compra, venta, donación, cambio, casamiento, testamento, sucesión *ab intestato*, y de cualquier otro modo, bajo las mismas condiciones que los naturales del país. Sus herederos y representantes legales podrán sucederlos y tomar posesión de ellos, bien en persona ó por procuración, de la misma manera y con las mismas formas legales que los naturales del país.

En ninguno de estos respectos pagarán sobre el valor de la propiedad ningún otro ni más altos impuestos, derechos ó recargo que los pagables por los naturales del país. En cada caso á los súbditos ó ciudadanos de las Partes Contratantes les será permitido exportar sus bienes, ó sus productos si son vendidos, libremente y sin que sean sujetos á pagar derechos de exportación diferentes de los que bajo iguales circunstancias estén sujetos á pagar los naturales del país.

## Artículo V.

Las habitaciones, fábricas, depósitos y almacenes de los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cada una de las Partes Contratantes en los dominios y posesiones de la otra, y todos los edificios y sitios pertenecientes á ellos destinados á residencia ó comercio, serán respetados. Excepto bajo las condiciones y con las formas prescritas por las leyes para los naturales del país, no será permitido proceder á hacer registros ó visitas domiciliarias en tales habitaciones, edificios ó sitios, ni examinar ó inspeccionar libros, papeles, ó cuentas.

Los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cada una de las dos Partes Contratantes en los dominios y posesiones de la otra tendrán libre acceso á los Tribunales de Justicia para la prosecución y defensa de sus derechos, sin más condiciones, restricciones ó contribuciones que las impuestas á los súbditos ó ciudadanos naturales, y como ellos tendrán libertad de emplear, en todos los casos, abogados, procuradores, ó agentes de entre las personas admitidas, según las leyes del país, á ejercer estas profesiones.

## Artículo VI.

Los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cada una de las Partes Contratantes en los dominios y posesiones de la otra estarán exentos de alojamiento y de todo servicio militar forzoso, bien sea en el ejército, bien en la marina, ó en la guardia ó milicia nacional. De la misma manera estarán exentos de toda contribución pecuniaria, ó en especie, impuesta como compensación por alojamiento ó servicio personal, y finalmente de empréstitos forzosos y exacciones y requisiciones militares de cualquier género que sean.

*Artículo VII.*

Los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cualquiera de las Partes Contratantes, residentes en los dominios y posesiones de la otra, disfrutarán, respecto de sus casas, personas y bienes, la protección del Gobierno en la misma plena y amplia manera que los súbditos ó ciudadanos naturales.

Del mismo modo, los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cada Parte Contratante gozarán en los dominios y posesiones de la otra libertad plena de conciencia, y no serán molestados por sus creencias religiosas; y aquellos de estos súbditos ó ciudadanos que mueran en los territorios de la otra Parte serán enterrados en los cementerios públicos, ó en lugares destinados á este objeto, con el decoro y respeto debidos.

Los súbditos de Su Majestad Británica residentes en los territorios de la República de Honduras tendrán libertad para ejercer en privado y en sus propias moradas, ó en las habitaciones y oficinas del Ministro, ó de los Cónsules ó Vice-Cónsules de Su Majestad Británica, ó en cualquier edificio público destinado á este objeto, sus ritos religiosos, servicios y culto, y para reunirse en ellos con este propósito sin molestia ó impedimento. Las mismas estipulaciones serán cumplidas con respecto á los ciudadanos de la República de Honduras en los territorios de Su Majestad Británica.

*Artículo VIII.*

Los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cada una de las Partes Contratantes tendrán en los dominios y posesiones de la otra los mismos derechos que los naturales, ó que los súbditos ó ciudadanos de la nación más favorecida, en lo referente á patentes para invenciones, márcas de fábrica, y diseños, así como para la protección de la propiedad industrial, por tanto que las formalidades prescritas por las leyes sean cumplidas.

*Artículo IX.*

Cada una de las Partes Contratantes podrá nombrar Cónsules-Generales, Cónsules, Vice-Cónsules, Pro-Cónsules, y Agentes Consulares que residan respectivamente en las ciudades ó puertos de los dominios y posesiones de la otra Potencia. Pero estos funcionarios Consulares no empezarán á ejercer sus funciones hasta después de haber sido aprobados y admitidos en la forma usual por el Gobierno cerca del cual han sido enviados. Dichos funcionarios ejercerán todas las funciones y disfrutará todos los privilegios, exenciones é inmunidades concedidas ó que se concedieren en lo futuro á los funcionarios Consulares de la nación más favorecida.

*Artículo X.*

En la eventualidad de que muera algún súbdito ó ciudadano de cualquiera de las dos Partes Contratantes, sin última voluntad ó testamento, en los dominios y posesiones de la otra Parte Contratante, el Cónsul-General, Cónsul, ó Vice-Cónsul de la nación á que pertenezca el finado, ó en su ausencia el representante del funcionario Consular, puede hacerse cargo, hasta donde las leyes de cada país permitan, de los bienes que haya dejado el finado para beneficio de sus representantes legales hasta que sea nombrado ejecutor ó administrador.

*Artículo XI.*

Los Cónsules-Generales, Cónsules, Vice-Cónsules, y Agentes Consulares de cada una de las Partes Contratantes residentes en los dominios y posesiones de la otra recibirán de las autoridades locales la ayuda que permita la ley para recobrar los despojos de los buques de sus respectivos países.

*Artículo XII.*

Cualquier buque de guerra ó mercante de una de las Partes Contratantes que se vea obligado, á causa del mal tiempo ó por accidente, á guarecerse en un puerto de la otra, tendrá libertad para hacer reparaciones en él, procurarse las provisiones necesarias, y continuar su viaje, sin pagar más derechos que aquellos que serían pagables en caso semejante por un buque nacional. Pero en caso de que el capitán del buque mercante se vea en la necesidad de disponer de una parte de sus mercancías para pagar sus gastos, estará obligado á conformarse á los reglamentos y tarifas del lugar á que haya arribado.

Si cualquier buque de guerra ó mercante de una de las Partes Contratantes encallase ó naufragase en el territorio de la otra, tal buque y todas sus partes, y todos los muebles y aparejos á él pertenecientes, y todos los géneros y mercancías salvadas del mismo, incluso cualquiera que haya sido arrojado del buque, ó sus productos en caso de ser vendidos, así como los papeles hallados á bordo del buque encallado ó naufrago, serán entregados á los propietarios ó sus agentes, cuando sean reclamados por ellos. Si los propietarios ó agentes no se hallan sobre el terreno, serán entregados los mismos al Cónsul-General, Cónsul, Vice-Cónsul, ó Agente Consular Británico ú Hondureño en cuyo distrito haya tenido lugar el encallamiento ó naufragio, si son reclamados por él dentro del término fijado por las leyes del país; y tales Cónsules, propietarios, ó agentes pagarán solamente los gastos incurridos en la conservación de la propiedad, junto con el salvamento ú otros gastos que habrían sido pagables en el caso análogo del naufragio de un buque nacional.

Los géneros y las mercancías salvadas del naufragio estarán exentos de todos derechos de Aduanas, á menos que no sean despachados para el consumo, en cuyo caso pagarán la misma prorrata de derechos que si hubiesen sido importados en un buque nacional.

En el caso de que un buque bien se vea obligado á arribar á causa del mal tiempo, encalle, ó naufrague, los respectivos Cónsules-Generales, Cónsules, Vice-Cónsules, y Agentes Consulares estarán autorizados para intervenir, si el dueño ó capitán ú otro agente del dueño no se halla presente, ó si estando presente lo requiere, á fin de proporcionar los socorros necesarios á sus compatriotas.

*Artículo XIII.*

Para la mejor seguridad del comercio entre los súbditos de Su Majestad Británica y los ciudadanos de la República de Honduras, queda convenido que, si desgraciadamente tiene lugar en cualquier tiempo una interrupción de las amistosas relaciones, ó ruptura entre las dos Partes Contratantes, los súbditos ó ciudadanos de cualquiera de las dichas Partes Contratantes que se hallen establecidos en los dominios ó territorios de la otra, ejerciendo cualquier oficio ó empleo especial, tendrán el privilegio de permanecer y continuar tal oficio ó empleo en ellos, sin ningún género de interrupción, en el pleno goce de su libertad y sus bienes, mientras se conduzcan pacíficamente y no cometan delito alguno contra las leyes; y sus bienes, propiedades y efectos, de cualquiera clase que sean, bien estén en su custodia ó hayan sido confiados á individuos ó al Estado, no podrán ser confiscados ni secuestrados, ni estarán sujetos á otros gravámenes ó demandas más que á los impuestos ó los similares bienes, propiedades, y efectos pertenecientes á los súbditos ó ciudadanos naturales. Si no obstante prefieren abandonar el país, se les permitirá hacer arreglos para la segura custodia de sus bienes, propiedades y efectos, ó para disponer de ellos, y liquidar sus cuentas, dándoles también salvos conductos para que se embarquen en los puertos que ellos mismos elijan.

*Artículo XIV.*

Las estipulaciones del presente Tratado serán aplicables á todas las Colonias y posesiones extranjeras de Su Majestad Británica, hasta donde lo permitan las leyes, exceptuándose las nombradas á continuación, á saber, excepto á—

India.	Australia Occidental.
El Dominio de Canadá.	Tasmania.
Terranova.	Queensland.
Nueva Gales del Sud.	Nueva Zelandia.
Victoria.	El Cabo de Buena Esperanza.
Australia Meridional.	Natal.

Siempre en la inteligencia de que las estipulaciones del presente Tratado se harán aplicables á cualquiera de las expresadas Colonias ó posesiones extranjeras, en cuyo favor se haya al efecto notificado por el Representante de Su Majestad Británica en Honduras al Ministro de Relaciones Exteriores Hondureño, dentro de dos años desde la fecha del cambio de ratificaciones del presente Tratado.

El Tratado se aplicará en tales Colonias ó posesiones extranjeras, á partir de la fecha en que esta noticia estará dada al Ministro de Relaciones Exteriores de Honduras.

*Artículo XV.*

Cualesquiera controversias que puedan ocurrir respecto á la interpretación ó la ejecución del presente Tratado, así como las consecuencias de cualquiera violación del mismo, serán referidas, cuando los medios de un arreglo directo por convenio amigable se habrán agotado, á la decisión de Comisiones de Arbitramento; y el resultado de tal arbitramento será obligatorio para ambos Gobiernos.

Los miembros de tales Comisiones serán nombrados por los dos Gobiernos de mutuo convenio; de lo contrario, cada una de las Partes nombrará un perito, ó igual número de peritos, y los peritos así nombrados escogerán un árbitro.

El procedimiento de la arbitración será determinado en cada caso por las Partes Contratantes; de lo contrario, la Comisión de Arbitramento estará calificada para determinarlo ella misma de antemano.

*Artículo XVI.*

El presente Tratado continuará en fuerza durante diez años á contar desde el día del cambio de las ratificaciones; y en el caso de que ninguna de las Partes Contratantes diese noticia, doce meses antes de la expiración del dicho período de diez años, de su intención de terminar el presente Tratado, seguirá en vigor hasta la expiración de un año desde el día en que una de las Partes Contratantes diere semejante noticia.

Artículo XVII.

El presente Tratado será ratificado por Su Majestad la Reina de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda y por Su Excelencia el Presidente de la República de Honduras, y las ratificaciones cambiadas en Tegucigalpa ó Guatemala tan pronto como sea posible.

En testimonio de lo cual los respectivos Plenipotenciarios han firmado el mismo y puesto en él los sellos de sus armas.

PROTOCOL.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries of the High Contracting Parties to the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation signed between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Republic of Honduras on the twenty-first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, being duly authorized thereto, have agreed as follows:—

1st. The stipulations of the said Treaty shall not be applicable to any of the Colonies or foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty unless notice to that effect shall have been given on behalf of any such colony or foreign possession by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative accredited to the Republic of Honduras to the Honduranian Minister for Foreign Affairs within one year from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the said Treaty.

2nd. Her Majesty's Government may in the same manner give notice of accession on behalf of any British Protectorate or sphere of influence, or on behalf of the Island of Cyprus, in virtue of the Convention of the fourth of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, between Great Britain and Turkey.

3rd. Her Majesty's Government shall also have the right to separately terminate the Treaty at any time on giving twelve months' notice to that effect on behalf of any British Colony, foreign possession, or dependency which may have acceded thereto.

4th. It is understood that in all cases in which the provisions of the said Treaty accord the treatment of the most favoured nation, that term shall not be held to include the Central American Republics.

5th. The stipulations of the said Treaty will be applicable to India, including the territories of any native Prince or Chief in India under the suzerainty of the British Government, subject to the following reservations:—

1. The Government of India reserve the discretionary power to prevent any foreigner from residing or sojourning in, or travelling through, India, as above defined, without their consent.

2. In regard to the native States of India, the rights of citizens of the Republic of Honduras, under Articles I and IV of the said Treaty are subject to the same limitations as those which are, or may be, in force as regards the European British subjects.

3. The right to appoint Consuls under Article IX of the said Treaty shall, in India, be restricted to the seaport towns of the provinces under the direct administration of the Government of India.

Done in duplicate, at Guatemala, this third day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred.

2º. El Gobierno de Su Majestad Británica podra de la misma manera dar aviso de adhesión de parte de cualquier Protectorado Británico ó esfera de influencia Británica, ó de parte de la Isla de Chipre, en virtud de la Convención del cuatro de Junio de mil ochocientos setenta y ocho entre la Gran Bretaña y Turquía.

3º. El Gobierno de Su Majestad tendrá tambien el derecho de terminar separadamente el Tratado en cualquier época, dando aviso de doce meses á tal efecto de parte de cualquier Colonia Británica, posesión ó dependencia que se haya adherido á dicho Tratado.

4º. Se entiende que en todos casos en los cuales las condiciones de dicho Tratado consignan el trato de la nación mas favorecida, esa condición no será tenida como incluyendo las Repúblicas de Centro-América.

5º. Las estipulaciones de dicho Tratado serán aplicables á la India, incluso los territorios de cualquier Príncipe ó Jefe local en la India bajo la soberanía del Gobierno de Su Majestad Británica, con las siguientes reservas:—

1. El Gobierno de la India se reserva el poder discrecional de impedir á cualquier extranjero residir ó permanecer en, ó pasar por, la India, como arriba queda expresado, sin su consentimiento.

2. En lo que toca á los Estados nativos de la India, los derechos de ciudadanos de la República de Honduras, segun Artículos I y IV de dicho Tratado, estarán sujetos á las mismas limitaciones á que están ó estén sujetos los súbditos Europeos de la Gran Bretaña.

3. El derecho de nombrar Consules segun Artículo IX de dicho Tratado en la India quedará limitado á los puertos de las provincias bajo la administración directa del Gobierno de la India.

## CHAPTER III.

## APPOINTMENT TO THE CLERICAL DIVISION.

[Section 59 (II.) and (III.)]

## EXAMINATIONS AND TESTS.—LOWER CLASSES.

1. Candidates for employment in the Clerical Division will be examined in the following subjects:—

2. To qualify for appointment, a candidate must obtain at least half marks in Handwriting, in Arithmetic, in Spelling, and in Simple Composition, &c.; at least 25 per cent. both in Parsing, &c., and Geography; and secure a total of not less than 1,000 marks.

3. Candidates for employment in the Clerical Division in the under-named offices must, prior to registration for examination, comply with the following conditions to the satisfaction of the Board, namely:—

- (a) *Telegraph Operator*.—The production of a certificate of competency from the Secretary or an Inspector or the Electrician of the Post and Telegraph Department, or from any officer duly authorized by the Secretary for the Post and Telegraph Department to sign the same:
- (b) *Assistant in Public Library*.—The production of evidence of having passed the Ordinary Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne (or some examination which the Board may judge equivalent) in Greek, in Latin, and in French or German:
- (c) *Architectural and Engineering Draughtsman*.—The production of a certificate of competency from the Secretary or Inspector-General of the Public Works Department; or for Engineering Draughtsman, from the Chief Engineer, Mines and Water Supply Department.

- (d) *Survey Draughtsman*.—The production of a certificate of competency from the Secretary for Lands or Surveyor-General, or Chief Draughtsman of the Lands Department, or from the Secretary for Mines and Water Supply, or from the Surveyor and Chief Draughtsman, Titles Office, Law Department.

## EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION.

4. Every candidate for appointment to the Clerical Division must, prior to the date of any examination, be between the ages of sixteen and thirty years, and must forward to the Board an application, in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address.

5. Every candidate must forward with his application a certificate of good moral character and industrious habits.

6. The names of all candidates who, in the opinion of the Board, have complied with the requirements of the above regulations shall be entered in a book, to be called the "Register of Candidates."

7. All applications must be lodged with the Board at least thirty clear days before the date fixed for the commencement of any examination.

8. Immediately after an examination has been held, all the entries in the "Register of Candidates" shall be cancelled, and a new series of entries shall be commenced.

9. The Board shall give, in the *Government Gazette*, six weeks' clear notice of the date of every examination, and shall in such notice name the number of candidates to be selected from outside the Public Service for appointment thereat.

10. The Board shall publish in the *Government Gazette*, at least twenty-one clear days before the date of any examination, the list of candidates entitled to present themselves thereat, and a statement of the places where the examination will be held.

11. Every candidate named in the list must, within ten days from the publication thereof, forward to the Board a postal note payable to the Secretary Public Service Board, Melbourne, for Five shillings, being fee for the examination, and must say at which of the named places he desires to be examined. If a candidate fail to comply with this regulation, he will not be allowed to present himself for examination.

12. The Board may appoint officers in charge, for the purpose of presiding at local examinations, and may award them such remuneration as may appear to be reasonable.

13. After any examination has been held, the examiners shall, as soon as practicable, forward to the Board a return of the marks obtained by every candidate in every subject, and the total of his marks.

14. The Board shall cause the names of all candidates, up to but not beyond the published number, who have qualified for appointment by passing the required standard of examination to be entered in a book, to be called the "Register of Qualified Candidates," in the order of their merit. If two or more candidates obtain the same number of marks, the order of their merit shall be determined by the number of marks severally obtained for (1) Arithmetic, (2) Handwriting, (3) Spelling, and, if these numbers be also the same, then by lot.

15. Qualified candidates included in the number to be selected for appointment as provided in Clause 9 shall, subsequently to the examination, furnish to the Board, within fourteen days after being notified to that effect, a properly certified extract from some official register of births or other satisfactory evidence of age, and also a certificate of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects from some medical practitioner registered in Victoria, otherwise their names will be removed from the register; or, at the option of candidates, such certificates may be forwarded prior to the examination.

16. If any candidate whose name is entered on the register refuse to accept the appointment to which he is in due course entitled, his name shall be removed from the register. The name of a candidate may also be removed from the register if he fail to reply within seven days to any communication from the Public Service Board respecting his nomination to the Public Service, addressed to him at his last place of residence known to the Board.

## CHAPTER V.

## APPOINTMENT TO THE NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

[Section 59 (v.), (vi.), and (vii.)]

## REGISTRATION AND EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS.

1. Every person applying to be recorded for appointment in the Non-clerical Division of the Public Service must, except in the case of Telegraph Messengers, be between the ages of sixteen and forty-one (or in cases of special duties forty-six) years, and must forward to the Board an application in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address and the particular appointment or the class of appointment which he desires to obtain. Provided always that persons applying to be recorded for appointment to the undermentioned offices must be between the ages specified opposite the description of the office :—

2. Every applicant for a position which has been exempted from examination must forward to the Board with his application a properly certified extract from some official register of births, showing the place and date of his birth, or such other evidence thereof as the Board may consider to be satisfactory, and he must satisfy the Board, by the production of certificates or otherwise, that he is of good moral character and industrious habits, of sound bodily health, and free from physical defects, and possesses the necessary physical strength for the performance of the duties of the office which he seeks. For the position of Telegraph Messenger, however, the Health Certificate may be from some well-known person.

3. Every candidate for examination must forward with his application a certificate of good moral character and industrious habits. (See also Clause 14.)

4. Every applicant nominated for appointment as Telegraph Messenger must be between the ages of thirteen and fifteen years.

5. Every applicant to be recorded for appointment to any office requiring the exercise of skill usually acquired in some mechanical trade or other occupation must satisfy the Board, by the production of certificates, or otherwise, that he possesses the handicraft and experience necessary for the work of the office.

6. The name of every applicant who, in the opinion of the Board, shall have complied with the requirements of the above regulations shall be entered in a book, to be called the "Register of Applicants," together with the date of such compliance.

7. Competitive examinations will be held at such times and places as the Board may consider necessary and desirable, but no examination shall be held until at least six weeks' notice shall have been given in the *Government Gazette*, calling upon applicants to present themselves for examination. The public notice aforesaid shall specifically state the times when, and the places where, the examination will be held, as well as the appointments or classes of appointment the selection for which is to be determined by the results of the examination.

\* These positions are exempt from Examination; but it should be understood that persons appointed to them cannot be subsequently promoted to higher positions until they have passed the prescribed Examination.

8. The subjects of examination shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto, and all applicants to whom the examiners award one-half of the maximum number of marks therein in each subject set forth shall be declared qualified for appointment.

9. The Board shall publish in the *Government Gazette* at least twenty-one clear days before the date of any examination the list of candidates entitled to present themselves thereat, and a statement of the places where an examination will be held; and every candidate named in the list must, within ten days of the publication thereof, forward to the Board a postal note payable to the Secretary, Public Service Board, Melbourne, for Five shillings, being fee for the examination, and must say at which of the named places he desires to be examined. If a candidate fail to comply with this regulation he shall not be allowed to present himself at examination.

10. No person shall be allowed to compete at any examination unless his name is entered in the "Register of Applicants" as an applicant for one of the appointments included in the public notice, and unless he be at the time under the age of forty-one (or in special cases forty-six) years.

11. The "Register of Applicants" shall be closed thirty days before the date of examination.

12. Immediately after an examination has been held, all the entries in the "Register of Applicants" made previous to the date of examination shall be cancelled, and a new series of entries shall be commenced.

#### REGISTRATION OF PERSONS QUALIFIED FOR APPOINTMENT.

13. After any examination has been held, the examiners shall, as soon as practicable, forward to the Board a return of all persons declared qualified for appointment. Opposite the name of every person on the return the examiners shall enter the total number of marks awarded to him at the examination, and the return shall be signed by every one of the examiners.

14. Qualified candidates shall, subsequently to the examination, furnish to the Board, within fourteen days after being notified to that effect, a properly certified extract from some official register of births or other satisfactory evidence of age, and also a certificate of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects from some medical practitioner registered in Victoria, otherwise their names will be removed from the register, or, at the option of candidates, such certificates may be forwarded prior to the examination.

15. The names of all persons included in the return of the examiners, the appointment or class of appointment applied for by every such person, the date of the examination, and the number of marks obtained thereat shall be registered in the order of merit in a book to be called the "Register of Persons Qualified for Appointment," the name of the person who obtained the highest number of marks being first registered, the name of the person who obtained the next highest number of marks being registered second, and so on in succession, the name of the person who obtained the lowest number of marks being registered last; provided that the name of any person who obtained less than one-half of the maximum number of marks for each subject specified in the Schedule hereto shall not be registered. If two or more candidates obtain the same number of marks, the order of their merit shall be determined by the number of marks severally obtained for (1) Arithmetic, (2) Hand-writing, (3) Spelling; and if these numbers be also the same, then by lot. Provided further that no name of any person shall remain on the register as that of a person qualified for appointment after he shall have attained the age of forty-one (or in special cases forty-six) years, or for a longer period than two years, except as herein-after provided.

16. The names of qualified candidates exempt from examination under the provisions of Section 58 of the *Public Service Act* 1890 may be retained in their original positions on the register for a further period of one year upon such candidates renewing their applications before the expiry of the first period of two years.

17. The names of candidates for the position of Telegraph Messenger registered after the 4th February, 1898, may remain on the register without renewal of application until applicants attain the age of fifteen years, but no longer.

## APPOINTMENTS.

18. New appointments shall be made from among those persons whose names are registered in the "Register of Persons Qualified for Appointment," according to priority of registration for vacant offices, combined with fitness in each case for the particular office to be filled.

19. If any person decline to accept an appointment which is offered to him, his name shall thereupon be removed from the register. The name of a candidate may also be removed from the register if he fail to reply within seven days to any communication from the Public Service Board respecting his nomination to the Public Service addressed to him at his last place of residence known to the Board.

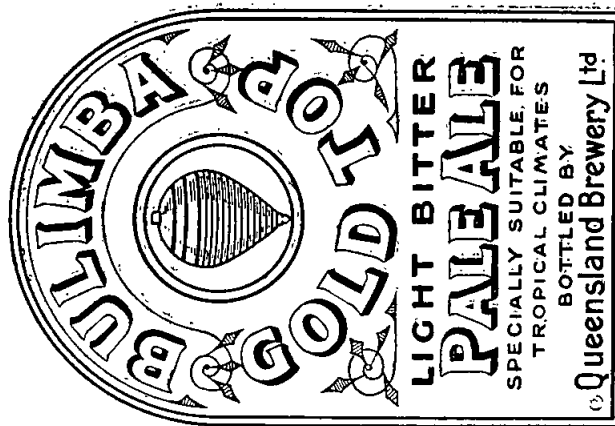

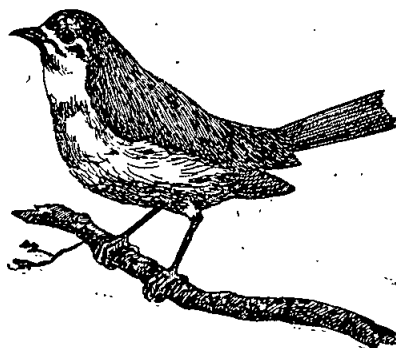

## AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee of any vermin district may, in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate, to be called a "fencing rate," specifying the amount thereof to be paid by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district upon whose boundaries any vermin-proof wire net-fence has been erected by the Board of Land and Works, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the cost of the erection of such fence, or any portion thereof, and for the repair and maintenance of the same: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the North-Western Vermin District has recommended a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing to be the fencing rate payable under the provisions of Part II. of the Act aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing to be the fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence.
