VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURDS DURNG THE MONTH OF OUTOBER, 1900.

THE births of 67 boys and 69 girls, or in all of 136 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of October. 
