POINT LONSDALE AND SHORTLAND'S BLUFF.—ENTRANCE TO PORT PHILLIP.—INTENDED ALTERATIONS TO LIGHTS.

Point Lonsdale.

It is hereby notified that on or after the 1st day of February, 1901, it is intended to establish an occulting white and red light in lieu of the present green and red light on Point Lonsdale. The light house for such light is to be situated nearer the extremity of the Point than the present light-house, and the light is to be elevated about 120 feet above sea level, and will be visible at a distance of 16 miles to seaward.

From seaward the intended light will show white within an arc of 112° between the bearings north 61° east and north 51° west, and will show red between each of such bearings and the coast respectively to westward and eastward of the entrance to Port Phillip.

Shortland's Bluff.

It is also notified that on or after the above-mentioned date (1st February, 1901) it is intended to alter the western portions of the arcs of visibility of the white lights of the high and low leading lights on Shortland's Bluff, Queensland, to render such white lights visible from seawards clear of Point Lonsdale only.

Further particulars will be published on a future date and before the alterations above described have been effected.

SOMES ISLAND, PORT NICHOLSON: EXHIBITION OF NEW LIGHT.

NOTICE is hereby given that a new light, now in course of erection on Somes Island, Port Nicholson, will be ready to be exhibited about Wednesday, the 14th February, 1900, from a circular brick tower, painted white.

The colour of the light for the harbour entrance will be the same as the present one, over exactly the same bearings, namely, white in mid-channel, red on the western, and green on the eastern shore. A change in the colour has been made over Lambton Harbour, the new light showing white on the western side, over Lambton Harbour and Evans Bay, over an arc of 80° between Gordon Point and Ngahauranga.

The light apparatus is of the second order dioptric, fixed. The height of the light will be 95 feet above the sea-level, and it should be seen from a vessel's deck, in clear weather, for a distance of about sixteen nautical miles.

Vessels making for the port should pick up the white light, and keep in it until past Ward Island. On the exhibition of the new light the present light and iron tower will be removed.

Reported danger between Lizard Island and Howick Group.

NOTICE is hereby given that Coast Pilot Graham, when recently in charge of the s.s. *Karawera*, reported touching a shoal with a depth of about 12 feet at low water springs over it in the following approximate position, viz.:

Summit of Howick Island (186 feet), bearing W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., distant $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

As the vessel was hove-to at the time, owing to thick weather, some uncertainty exists as to the true position, and the danger has been unsuccessfully searched for by H.M.S. *Dart*. However, a danger was reported in this vicinity in former years, and accordingly masters of vessels are cautioned not to go to the northward of the track recommended in that neighbourhood.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten pounds (£10) annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.
2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.
6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made.
9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.
10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings for each stall shall be made.
11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulations were passed by the Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust this 14th day of December, 1899, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

CASTLEMAINE AND BENDIGO WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAW.

IN pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 12th day of January, 1900, cancelled By-law No. 3 (viii.) of the by-laws respecting the Castlemaine and Bendigo District Water Supply, and has substituted the following by-law thereof, viz.:—

- 3 (viii.) For water supplied from the channels to crushing mills the rate shall be One half-penny per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied from the channels to pyrites works, &c., the rate shall be One penny per 1,000 gallons, and has ordered that such alteration of by-law shall take effect from the 1st day of January, 1900.

KOROIT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR THE YEAR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Trust district shall pay for the year 1900:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling or under, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the Borough of Koroit, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of One shilling and sixpence on each pound of such value.
3. Such rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1900.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust district.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upward (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1900.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount as aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show yards, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure. Provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust, used for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum, in addition to the charges under any previous clauses of this Regulation, providing that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Nine o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1900, and are made payable in equal instalments half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:

REGULATION No. 7.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price made, will be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings (10s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork or plastering; or if there be no contract then upon the value of or the any rate charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardeners for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the 1st day of January, 1900, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1900.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate and charges.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.

4. For every water trough, a charge of Ten shillings.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Ten shillings for each horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, a charge of One shilling to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if payable otherwise than by measure.

(2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water), shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January, and first day of July, 1900.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

1. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
