Point Lonsdale.

It is hereby notified that on or after the 1st day of February, 1901, it is intended to establish an occulting white and red light in lieu of the present green and red light on Point Lonsdale. The light house for such light is to be situated nearer the extremity of the Point than the present light-house, and the light is to be elevated about 120 feet above sea level, and will be visible at a distance of 16 miles to seaward.

From seaward the intended light will show white within an arc of 112° between the bearings north 61° east and north 51° west, and will show red between each of such bearings and the coast respectively to westward and eastward of the entrance to Port Phillip.

Somes Island, Port Nicholson: Exhibition of New Light.

NOTICE is hereby given that a new light, now in course of erection on Somes Island, Port Nicholson, will be ready to be exhibited about Wednesday, the 14th February, 1900, from a circular brick tower, painted white.

The colour of the light for the harbour entrance will be the same as the present one, over exactly the same bearings, namely, white in mid-channel, red on the western, and green on the castern shore. A change in the colour has been made over Lambton Harbour, the new light showing white on the western side, over Lambton Harbour and Exans Bay, over an arc of 80° between Gordon Point and Ngahauranga.

The light apparatus is of the second order dioptric, fixed. The height of the light will be 95 feet above the sea-level, and it should be seen from a vessel's deck, in clear weather, for a distance of about sixteen nautical miles.

Vessels making for the port should pick up the white light, and keep in it until past Ward Island.

On the exhibition of the new light the present light and iron tower will be removed.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten pounds (£10) annual

municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) nound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.

Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be tie quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner-or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain. Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings

9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings for each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarra-wonga Urban Waterworks Trust district.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upward (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1900.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of Water Act 1830.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Tan pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show yards, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure. Provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load pro rata upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust, used for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum, in addition to the charges under any previous clauses of this Regulation, providing that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Nine o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are haraby made for the year 1700, and are made payable in equal incitetes half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of Jainary and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be poid quarterly or as the Trist may direct.

13. Such passes or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust max from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to deman i, receive, and recover the said rates.
