## SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI.

A By-law, Number 6, of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, for fixing the Fee required for the Registration of Dairies under the Health Act Regulations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai hereby make the following by-law:—

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF BALL & WELCH PROPRIETARY LTD., FLINDERS-STREET, MELBOURNE (DRESSMAKING AND TAILORING DEPARTMENTS),

for a period of six weeks from the 19th November, 1900, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

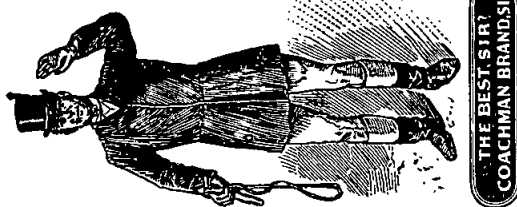

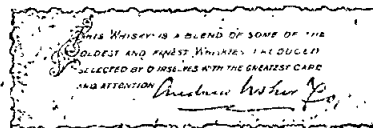

unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors the right of resumption for the public purposes and in accordance with the provisions and conditions hereinafter expressed and contained such parts of the said land as shall from time to time be required by the Governor in Council for the formation and construction of public roads highways or bridges and also such parts of the said land as shall from time to time be required by the Board of Land and Works or the Victorian Railways Commissioner for the construction of railways railway stations or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed and also such parts of the said land as shall from time to time be required for the execution construction completion or extension of any water-works or irrigation works now made or in the course of construction or hereafter to be made under the authority of any present or future laws such parts of the said land when the same may be required for any of the said purposes to be set out by description in a proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and also described in a notice in writing to the lessee his executors administrators or transferees by the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council such notice to be sent through the post office addressed to the occupier of the land Excepting also unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone and all copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon and under the demised land together with liberty to Her Majesty her heirs and successors and her and their agents servants lessees licensees and assigns at any time or times hereafter during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to extract and remove therefrom any gold silver and any auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and for the purpose aforesaid to sink shafts erect machinery carry on any works and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining Provided that the said land is and shall be subject to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals and minerals or of a mining or mineral lease to enter thereon and to mine for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those to which such person had at the time of the passing of the *Land Act* 1890 the right to mine for gold and silver in and upon Crown lands provided that compensation shall be paid to the lessee his executors administrators assigns and transferees by such person for surface damage to be done to such lands by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as provided by law and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry And provided also that the said land may be resumed under section 68 of the said Act And the lessee for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns doth hereby covenant with Her said Majesty her heirs and successors that he the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will observe perform and be bound by the several covenants conditions provisos agreements acts matters and things hereinafter contained (that is to say):—

1. That he or they will during the said term pay unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors the rent hereby reserved by equal half-yearly payments in advance on the days hereinafter appointed for the payment thereof.

2. That he or they will not at any time during the continuance of the term hereby granted without a licence from the Governor search in the land hereby demised for or take therefrom any metal or mineral or mineral ore.

3. That neither he nor they will without the special permit in writing of the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts first had and obtained cut damage or remove or permit to be cut damaged or removed any live pine box or redgum tree growing on the land hereby demised. Provided that no breach of this covenant shall be deemed to have occurred in case of any pine box or redgum tree cut and removed without such permit if it be proved the same was required and actually used for the purpose of fencing such land or constructing thereon any building or improvement.

4. That he or they will during the first five years after the date of these presents plant on the land hereby demised trees of such kind or kinds in such manner and in such numbers as may for the time being be prescribed by regulations of the Governor in Council in that behalf.

5. That he or they will observe perform fulfil and be bound by the stipulations conditions covenants and provisos contained in the Schedule hereto.

6. That these presents are upon this express condition that if at any time and as often as during the said term any part or parts of the said land are required by the Governor in Council for the formation and construction of roads or bridges proposed by the Public Works Department or other public body or officer authorized in that behalf or are required by the Board of Land and Works for the construction of railways railway stations or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed or are required by the Governor in Council or by any corporation

person or persons acting in behalf of the Government of Victoria or by any public water trust or irrigation trust or body constituted under the present or future laws for the purpose of the making execution construction completion or extension of any such railway waterworks or irrigation works which they it or he may already or hereafter be authorized to make carry on execute construct complete or extend it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and by notice in writing to the lessee his executors administrators or transferees or to the occupier of the said land sent through the post office and addressed to the occupier of the said land to set out the part or parts of the said land which shall be so required for any of the said purposes and so soon as the same shall be so set out all interest at law or in equity of the lessee his executors administrators transferees and assigns in such part or parts shall cease but the lessee his executors administrators transferees and assigns shall be entitled to a reduction *pro rata* of all future rent herein reserved in respect of the land so required and set out and also to compensation for the land so required and set out at the rate of

for every acre of such land but no compensation shall be claimed or paid for any damage by reason of the severing of the lands so required taken set out or appropriated from any other lands but he or they shall be entitled to compensation for any actual improvements made by him or them on the said land such compensation to be ascertained by an officer to be appointed by the Governor in Council in that behalf.

7. These presents are upon the condition that in case the rent hereby reserved or any part thereof be not paid in accordance with the covenant for payment hereinbefore contained although no demand for payment has been made or in case the lessee his executors administrators or assigns shall not faithfully observe and perform all and every the covenants and conditions herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to enter forthwith or at any time thereafter upon the land hereby demised and the same to re-possess and enjoy and thenceforth the said term hereby granted shall absolutely cease and determine. And it is hereby agreed and declared that in such case it shall be lawful for Her Majesty and for any bailiff of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming from under or through him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law. And that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same by any person whatsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave or licence in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the lessee his executors administrators and all persons claiming from under or through him or them to Her Majesty and any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of for the entry or trespass or other matters complained of in such action or other proceedings.

8. The term "Governor" in these presents shall mean the Governor or Lieutenant-Governor or other person administering the Government of Victoria for the time being unless such meaning be inconsistent with the context.

declaring it is expedient to appoint such Board: And whereas the Legislative Assembly on the 11th day of October, 1900, passed a resolution declaring that it is expedient to appoint a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a tanner, currier, or leather-dresser other than a tanner of sheepskins (being a process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room): Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that a Special Board be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a tanner, currier, or leather-dresser other than a tanner of sheepskins: such Special Board to consist of ten members and a Chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of the employers and five as representatives of the employees: And His Excellency doth further direct that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order, or instrument, or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Tanners Board.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

13. ## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC GARDEN AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MOORABBIN, AT BRIGHTON (SOUTH-ROAD).

WE, John Ferrier Hamilton, David Abbott, William Mair, Thomas Bent, Alfred Born, Alfred Edward Small, Robert Mills, William Macanish, Joseph John Daly, Mackie John Scobie Gair, and Arthur George Harston, the Trustees of the Reserve for a Public Garden, and for other purposes of Public Recreation, in the Parish of Moorabbin, at Brighton (South-road), in respect of which a Crown Grant has duly issued, do hereby, in view of the provisions thereof, and of section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said Reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon or any specified part or parts thereof:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be divided as follows:—  
1st. The portion enclosed containing the grand stand, pavilion, members' and ladies' reserves, and tennis courts.  
2nd. The playing ground and cycling track.  
3rd. The remainder of the reserve.
2. All persons shall be admitted to the 3rd division free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding fifty (50) in any one year) as international, intercolonial, cup, or other important cricket, football, or tennis matches shall be played, or cycling or other sports held in the reserve.
3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the 1st division, except on production of a ticket issued by the trustees duly authorizing such person in that behalf.
4. Every person paying for admission to the 3rd division or any part thereof, or to the grand stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the trustees to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of avail except on the day for which it is issued.
5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match, or sports, may be required to deposit with the trustees any sum not exceeding £10, which the trustees may determine, by way of

guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and the trustees may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the trustees in reference to the reserve, building, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or remove any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

9. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals, except with the written consent of the trustees.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a recreation ground.
- (d) Being found in any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division of the reserve, and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the trustees, or any person deputed by them, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

14. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the 3rd division and grand stand shall be as follows:—

- (a) For admission of each person to the 3rd division during any international, intercolonial, cup, or other important cricket or football match or sports, such a sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.
- (b) For admission of each person to the grand stand such a sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding 5s., provided always that the trustees may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
